“No additional charge in respect of any half-cases of the kind No. 8 sold otherwise than in the North Auckland or Auckland Land Districts or in respect of any other type of container may be made.”

(b) By adding to clause 9 the following subclause:—

“(6) In computing the price per pound under paragraph (a) of subclause (1) hereof, the retailer may add the sum of 2d. in respect of each half-case in which the tomatoes are delivered to him and on which he has incurred a container charge to cover the estimated loss on resale of half-cases.”

(c) By omitting paragraph (c) from clause 11.
