Authorizing the Nelson City Council to use Water for the Purpose of generating Electricity and to erect certain Electric Lines

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the **P** URSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to the Nelson City Council (hereinafter referred to as the licensee), a licence subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of Long Gully Creek (hereinafter referred to as the said stream), situated in Section 9, Block VIII, Waimea Survey District, and to take and use therefrom for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding 0.26 cubic feet per second at any one time, and to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines hereinafter described.

CONDITIONS

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Water-power Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same shall be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

This licence is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS

Water shall be used under this licence solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the said stream at a point in Section 9, Block VIII, Waimea Survey District, as indicated on the plan marked S.H.D. 17, deposited in the office of the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this licence, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan S.H.D. 17 :---

- (a) Headworks consisting of a dam and intake giving a static head of 100 ft. :
- (b) Pipe-lines leading from a point in the said stream in the said Section 9 to the power-house hereinafter described:
 (c) Pelton wheel and power-house in the said Section 9 with all
- necessary equipment for generating electricity: (d) Tail-race leading from the said power-house to the said

- stream : (e) Electric lines leading from the said power-house across Sections 9, 8, and 2, Block VIII, Waimea Survey District, and across the Roding River and a public road to a dwelling situated in Section 2, Block VIII, Waimea Survey District, the said lines being more particularly delineated by black lines on the aforesaid plan S.H.D. 17.

5. DURATION OF LICENCE

This licence shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1958, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other public source of supply, whichever is the earlier.

6. System of Supply

The system of supply shall be classified under paragraph (j) of clause 21–01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The generating voltage and the transmitting voltage shall be approximately 250 volts direct current.

7. RENTAL

For the purpose of assessing the rental or annual sum payable in respect of this licence, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the State Hydro-electric Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed. The present plant is rated at 1.3 kilowatts.

SPECIAL ORDER

by way of special order, as follows :--"The drainage district as extended and defined by Order in Council dated the 30th day of January, 1946, is hereby subdivided into four subdivisions, to be called the Ngatea-Pipiroa Subdivision, the Waitakaruru Subdivision, the Puhanga Island Subdivision, and the Miranda Subdivision, and that the boundaries of such sub-divisions be the respective boundaries set out in the Schedule hereto; and that the number of trustees to be elected for the Ngatea-Pipiroa Subdivision shall be four trustees and for the Waitakaruru Subdivision shall be one trustee, and for the Puhanga Island Subdivision shall be one trustee, and for the Miranda Sub-division shall be one trustee. division shall be one trustee.

" SCHEDULE

" Boundaries of the Ngatea-Pipiroa Subdivision "ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, in the County of Hauraki Plains, bounded by a line commencing at a point in Block X, Thames Survey District, where the left bank of the Piako River meets the Firth of Thames; thence running in a southerly direction generally up the said left bank to its junction with the northern end of the eastern side of the Puhanga Canal; thence southerly generally along the said eastern side to a point

All that area in the Auckland Land District, in the County of Hauraki Plains, bounded by a line commencing at a point in Block X, Wharekawa Survey District, where the right bank of the Waitakaruru Stream meets the middle of the Waitakaruru-Makoro Canal; thence south-easterly generally along the middle of the said canal to a point in line with the northern boundary of part Section 31, Block IV, Piako Survey District; thence along a right line, being the production westerly of the aforesaid boundary, to Section 31, Block IV, Piako Survey District; thence along a right line, being the production westerly of the aforesaid boundary, to the middle of a public road running along the western bank of the said canal; thence south-easterly along the middle of the said public road to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Section 84, Block IV, Piako Survey District; thence along a right line to and along the said north-western boundary, the north-western boundary of Section 40, and the north-eastern boundary of Section 2, both of Block VIII, Piako Survey District, to the south-western corner of Section 3 of Block VIII aforesaid; thence along the centre of a drain through Section 2 aforesaid to a point on the south-western boundary of that section, 630 links from its north-western corner; thence along that boundary and a right line across a public road to the south-eastern corner of Section 5, Block III, Piako Survey District aforesaid; thence along the generally north-western side of that road to the southern corner of Section 33 of Block VII, Piako Survey District aforesaid; thence north-westerly generally along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 33, 34, and 9, Block VII, Section 3, Lot 1 of Section 1, and Section 14, Block III, both blocks being of Piako Survey District aforesaid; along a right line across another public road, to and along the north-eastern side of the public road passing through Waitakaruru No. IB 2A No. 2 Block, and a right line, being the production of the north-western end of the last-mentioned roadside, across railway land, and another public road and a right line, being the production of its western end, to the middle of the Pokeno-Paeroa Main Highway; thence north-easterly generally along the middle of the said main highway, and a right line, being the Paeroa Main Highway; thence north-easterly generally along the middle of the said main highway, and a right line, being its pro-duction to and along the right bank of the Waitakaruru Stream, to the point of commencement.

" Boundaries of the Puhanga Island Subdivision

"All that area in the Auckland Land District, in the County of Hauraki Plains, bounded by a line commencing at a point in Block II, Waihou Survey District, where the left bank of the Plako River meets the northern end of the eastern side of the Puhanga Canal; thence easterly, southerly, and westerly generally along the said left bank to the southern end of the eastern side of the Puhanga Canal; thence in a northerly direction along the said eastern side to the point of commencement.

" Boundaries of the Miranda Subdivision

WEATHER SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1947

General.—December was a warm dry month with much settled weather. Shearing and haymaking have made excellent progress under favourable conditions. Towards the end of the month pastures were rapidly drying off and milk production was beginning to decline. Stone fruits have ripened well, and the season was reported to be about three weeks in advance of normal. In Canterbury, root crops have been seriously affected by the continued dry weather.

One severe storm whose centre passed close to Southland on the 26th was responsible for widespread gales, the barometer at Campbell Island (south of New Zealand) falling to the unusually low value of 951.6 millibars (28.10 in.) at 6 p.m. on that day.

Rainfall.—Over most of the country rainfall was well below average, the North Canterbury and Gisborne areas being especially dry. Totals were, however, somewhat above average on the Southland coast, the Bay of Plenty, and about the Southern Alps. In the latter area most of the rain fell during the Christmas period, 12-07 in. being recorded at Milford Sound on the 25th. Over the Nelson and Auckland provinces the rainfall was about normal, although the distribution was rather patchy.

Of numerous thunderstorms during the month most were of an isolated local character, but those which occurred in the Auckland Province on the 8th and 9th, in South Otago on the 19th, and in Canterbury on the 21st were more widespread.

Temperatures.—Mean temperatures for the month were above normal. In Central Otago and on the West Coast the excess amounted to two to three degrees, elsewhere it was about a degree less.

Light frosts were reported from the South Island on the 3rd and on the 30th.

Sunshine.—In the southern half of the North Island the duration of sunshine was rather less than the average, Palmerston North being an exception. Nelson, Marlborough, and the Buller District had moderate surpluses, but elsewhere totals did not differ greatly from the average.

Weather Sequence.—An active cold front travelled slowly up the North Island during the first two days of the month, while an anticyclone moved eastwards across the South Island. The weather remained unsettled in the North and gradually deteriorated elsewhere as an extensive and complex disturbance approached from the Central Tasman Sea. North-easterlies prevailed, bringing rain to most places, and some heavy falls to the Coromandel Peninsula and the Bay of Plenty from the 5th to the 7th. After moving on to New Zealand the disturbance slowly lost intensity. The weather cleared in the South Island during the 8th, when an anticyclone was building up over the Island. The clearance extended to most of the North Island on the following day, although some local thunderstorms were reported from the interior. About the Auckland Peninsula and Gisborne showers persisted until the 10th.

A large anticyclone was over New Zealand from the 11th to the 17th, this period being one of brilliantly fine summer weather. On the night of the 15th, however, some brief showers on the Southland coast resulted from the passage of a weak cold front.

With the approach of a depression from the north on the 18th north-easterlies became strong and rain developed in North Auckland. Scattered light rain later extended to other parts of the Auckland Province, but the depression gradually filled up to the north-west of North Cape. Some heavy local thunderstorms were reported from South Otago on the afternoon of the 19th.

A cold front, accompanied by a band of heavy rain, reached Southland at midday on the 20th. Moving steadily north-eastwards it passed off the country on the morning of the 22nd, being followed by a change to cold southerly winds, but a rapid clearance in the weather. Light rains which occurred in western and southern districts of the South Island on the 23rd and 24th were due to a dying depression from the South Tasman Sea.

On the 25th barometers began to fall sharply in the south with the approach of a rapidly deepening depression. Northerlies increased to gale force from Taranaki and Hawke's Bay southwards. On the morning of the 26th the centre was not far west of Southland, and and moving away rapidly on a south-south-eastward course. Although the weather remained fine and hot on the Canterbury and Hawke's Bay Plains, most other districts experienced a period of heavy rain, some very heavy falls occurring in and near the Southern Alps. Following the passage of the cold front on the 26th temperatures became somewhat cooler, and winds backed to the west or south-west. Showers persisted for a time in western districts, but gradually ceased as the winds moderated.

On the 29th the centre of an anticyclone moved across the North Island. A cold front associated with a shallow depression to the south gave some rain in Westland and Southland on the 30th. Travelling north-eastwards with diminishing intensity, the front produced only a few scattered showers over the North Island on the following day.
