The Potatoes (Transportation) Order 1948, No. 1

PURSUANT to powers conferred on the Primary Industries Controller by the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939,* and duly delegated to me by the said Controller, I, Keith Bell Longmore, the Acting-Director of the Internal Marketing Division of the Marketing Department, do hereby order and direct solutions. as follows:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Potatoes (Transportation) Order 1948, No. 1, and shall come into force on the 11th day of February, 1948.
 - 2. This Order applies to the following railway-stations:-
 - (a) Every station between Levin and Taumarunui (not inclusive) on the Auckland-Wellington Main Trunk railway-line:
 - (b) Every station between Marton and Fordell (both inclusive)
 - on the Wellington New Plymouth railway-line: (c) Every station between Palmerston North and Woodville
 - (b) Every station between Fainlerston North and Woodvine (both inclusive) on the Wellington Palmerston North Woodville railway-line:

 (d) Every station between Palmerston North and Foxton (both inclusive) on the Palmerston North Foxton railway-line.
- 3. While this Order continues in force no person shall, except with the permission of an officer of the Internal Marketing Division of the Marketing Department, consign any potatoes for carriage by rail, or cause any potatoes to be so consigned, from any station to which this Order applies to any place not being a station to which this Order applies. this Order applies.

WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), has recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Kreyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a scenic reserve under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

Vesting the Control of a Scenic Reserve in the Everett Road Scenic Board

B. C. FREYBERG, Governor-General

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zeeland doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule below (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act) in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

The Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Taranaki Land

The Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Taranaki Lan District (ex officio),
The Chairman of the Inglewood County Council (ex officio),
The Mayor of the Borough of Inglewood (ex officio),
Ronald Henry Wilson,
John Alexander Ross,
Frederick Bracegirdle,
John Robson Gray Sutherland, and
William Charles Deem,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Everett Road Scenic Reserve Board (herein referred to as the Board), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

- 1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held in the Borough Council Chambers, Rata Street, Inglewood, at half-past two o'clock p.m. on Wednesday, the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Wednesday in the months of June and December in each year at eight o'clock p.m., or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.
- such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

 2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

 3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

 4. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

 5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

 6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

 7. (a) The Board may make such rules as it deems necessary:—

 (i) Governing trading within the reserve; and

- - (i) Governing trading within the reserve; and
 (ii) Controlling or limiting the taking of collections within the reserve for any objects other than the improvement of

the reserve.

(b) The Board may, with the approval of the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation, make such rules as it deems necessary for the good conduct of the public frequenting the reserve, and may set apart areas for camping-grounds or other purposes, and may fix reasonable charges for the use thereof in accordance with a scale to be approved from time to time by the Minister.

8. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

9. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

10. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.
