1. This notice may be cited as the Rangiora Milk Delivery Notice 1948.
2. This notice shall come into force on the Monday following the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.
3. The Rangiora Milk Delivery Notice 1942† is revoked as from the date this notice comes into force.
4. The scheme set out in the Schedule hereto is hereby provided for the said district.

SCHEDULE

THE RANGIORA MILK DELIVERY SCHEME, 1948

(1) FOR the purposes of this scheme, unless the context otherwise requires,—

- “The district” means the Borough of Rangiora as indicated by zones marked on the plan;

(3) On the death or resignation of any member of the committee, the vacancy created thereby shall be filled by appointment in the manner in which the vacating member was appointed.

(4) The functions of the committee shall be to receive and investigate complaints affecting the administration of this scheme, to advise the Minister on any matters that may be referred to the committee by the Minister or that may be considered by it of its own motion, and to make recommendations to the Minister for amending this scheme.

(5) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this scheme, the committee may regulate its procedure in such manner as it thinks fit.

Price Order No. 850 (Oatmeal and Rolled Oats)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 850, and shall come into force on the 8th day of March, 1948.

2. (1) Price Order No. 774* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. With respect to oatmeal and rolled oats sold in sacks, the several maximum prices fixed by this Order do not include the price of the sack, for which an additional charge may be made.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies with respect to all oatmeal and rolled oats sold otherwise than under the trade names of Creamoats, Milk Oaties, Otienuts, Cream O'Groats, Otis, Oatlets, Oatina, or Oto.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF OATMEAL AND ROLLED OATS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Manufacturers' Prices

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause and of clause 8 hereof, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any manufacturer for any oatmeal or rolled oats to which this Order applies that is sold to a wholesaler shall be:—
