WHEREAS the Lower Clutha River Trust (hereinafter called the said local authority) proposes, pursuant to the provisions of section twenty-four of the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act, 1941, to raise a loan of one thousand pounds (£1,000), to be known as "Flood Damage Loan, 1948" (hereinafter called the said loan), for the purpose of contributing towards the cost of flood-damage works:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of one thousand pounds (£1,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed five (5) years.

(2) The said loan or any part thereof shall be repaid by annual instalments of not less than two hundred pounds (£200) each.

(3) Interest at a rate not exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum shall be payable on any amount due under the said loan in respect of which default is made by the said local authority for more than fourteen days in the full and punctual payment thereof.

**WHEREAS** by Order in Council made on the sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five (hereinafter called the said Order in Council), and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Waipawa Hospital Board (hereinafter called the said local authority) of a loan of twelve thousand pounds (£12,000), to be known as "Pukeora Sanatorium Engineering Services Loan, 1944" (hereinafter called the said loan):

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not been exercised:

And whereas the authority has lapsed in accordance with the provisions of clause six of the said Order in Council, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to raise the said loan or any portion thereof except in accordance with the provisions of a further Order in Council that may be issued pursuant to section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called the said Act):

And whereas the said local authority is now desirous of raising the said loan, and it is expedient to authorize the said local authority to raise the said loan on the conditions hereinafter set out:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan up to the amount of twelve thousand pounds (£12,000) for the purpose for which the said loan was authorized, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be borrowed shall not exceed twenty (20) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds five shillings (£3 5s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said loan or any part thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.

(4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no such instalment shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procurement fees in respect of the borrowing of the said loan or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

(6) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

**WHEREAS** the several local authorities enumerated in the Schedule hereto, being desirous of raising the respective loans stated opposite their names therein, have respectively complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called the said Act), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loans:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the respective local authorities mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule of the respective loans set out in the second column of the said Schedule, up to the respective amounts specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The terms for which the said loans or any parts thereof may be raised shall be the respective terms (in years) stated in the fourth column of the said Schedule.

(2) The rates of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loans or any parts thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding the respective rates per centum per annum stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule.

(3) The said respective loans or any parts thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the respective terms as determined in (1) above.

(4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no such instalment shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procurement fees in respect of the raising of the said respective loans or any parts thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

(6) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Monday, the fifteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, at eight o'clock p.m., at Pounawea, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Monday in each quarter at the time and place aforesaid, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any five members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman for such meeting.

7. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserves in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made hereunder.

SPECIAL ORDER

In exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Counties Act, 1920, the Rodney County Council resolves, by way of special order, as follows:—

"1. The present division of the County of Rodney into nine ridings is revoked, and in lieu thereof the said county shall be divided into ten ridings, to be called respectively Albert Riding, Arai Riding, Hoteo Riding, Kaipara Riding, Kourawhero Riding, Matakana Riding, Omaha Riding, Puhoi Riding, Tauhoa Riding, and Wellsford Riding, which said ridings are respectively described in the Schedule hereto.

"2. The said Rodney County Council shall consist of ten members, who shall be elected as follows:—

"The electors of each riding shall elect one Councillor.

"3. The alteration hereby made shall take effect on and after the 1st day of April, 1948.

"The present boundaries of the Albert and Hoteo Ridings shall be altered by excluding therefrom certain sections and such excluded sections to constitute the Wellsford Riding.

*Alteration of Closed Season.—Waitakerei Forest Fire District*

WHEREAS by notice published in the *Gazette* of the 24th day of January, 1929, at page 184, an area comprising 57,200 acres in Kumeu, Waitemata, Waitakerei, and Titirangi Survey Districts, Auckland Land District, was declared to be a fire district, and known as the Waitakerei Forest Fire District (hereinafter referred to as the said district):

thence in a westerly direction along the boundary between the Wai-iti and Gordon Survey Districts to the south-western corner of Section 80, Block XV, Wai-iti Survey District; thence along the north-western boundaries of Sections 80, 79, 55, 76, 75, 74, 73, and 3, all in the aforesaid block and survey district; thence along the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of Section 48, the north-western boundary of Section 49, all in Block XV, Wai-iti Survey District; thence along the north-western boundary of Section 7 of 143, Block XVI, Wai-iti Survey District;
