WHEREAS by section thirty-three of the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), it is enacted that the boundaries of two or more contiguous rabbit districts may from time to time be altered by the Governor-General in Council in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Board of each of the districts affected:

And whereas the districts known as the "Kiwitea Rabbit District" and the "Oroua Rabbit District" (hereinafter referred to as the said districts) have been constituted under and for the purposes of Part II of the said Act:

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Board of the Kiwitea Rabbit District on the tenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and a similar resolution was passed by the Board of the Oroua Rabbit District on the twelfth day of the same month praying in each case for the alteration of the boundaries of the said districts in the manner described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the said districts in accordance with the said resolutions and in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and redefine the boundaries of the said districts so constituted as aforesaid, and doth hereby declare—

- (1) That the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Kiwitea Rabbit District, shall be added to and form part of the Oroua Rabbit District;
- (2) That the boundaries of the Kiwitea Rabbit District shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto;
- (3) That the boundaries of the Oroua Rabbit District shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto; and
- (4) That this Order in Council shall take effect on the date of the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

FIRST SCHEDULE

AREA EXCLUDED FROM THE KIWITEA RABBIT DISTRICT AND INCLUDED IN THE OROUA RABBIT DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 1,940 acres, more or less, being Sections 1, 1A, 1B, 2, 3, 4, 5, 13, 6, 7, 8, 9, 14, 15, 19, 20, and 21 of Block XIV, Ongo Survey District, and Sections 10, 11, and 12 of Block XIII of the said survey district, together with portion of the Rangitikei River-bed and also the roads intersecting or adjacent to the above-mentioned sections, which said area is bounded by a line commencing at the south-eastern corner of Section 14, Block XIV, Ongo Survey District, and then proceeding in a westerly direction along the south boundaries of the said Section 14, Sections 13 and 12 of the said Block XIV, Section 11 of Block XIII, and the prolongation of the last-mentioned

boundary to a point in the middle of the Rangitikei River; thence towards the north-east, east, and south-east generally along the middle of the Rangitikei River to a point in line with the eastern boundary-line of the aforesaid Section 14 of Block XIV, Ongo Survey District; thence in a southerly direction to and by the eastern boundary of the said Section 14 to the south-eastern corner thereof, the place of commencement.

WHEREAS the Nelson Catchment Board (hereinafter called the said local authority) proposes, pursuant to the provisions of section thirty of the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act, 1941, to raise a loan of six hundred and twenty pounds (£620) to be known as "Works Loan, 1948" (hereinafter called the said loan), for the purpose of carrying out river-protection works in the Wairoa River :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of six hundred and twenty pounds (£620), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows :—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed three (3) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said loan or any part thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.

(4) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces 1927, Amendment
No. 60

B. C. FREYBERG, Governor-General

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto the Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the 25th day of May, 1927.

REGULATIONS

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces 1927, Amendment No. 60.

2. These regulations shall be read with and form part of the Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces 1927, published in the *Gazette* on the 25th day of May, 1927, at page 1555 (hereunder called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.

4. Regulation 129 of the principal regulations, as amended by the Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces 1927, Amendment No. 57, is further amended by adding the following paragraph:—

“(vii) All promotions of officers require the approval of the Minister of Defence.”

5. Regulations 624 to 638 (inclusive) of the principal regulations are revoked and the following substituted:—

“LEAVE—N.Z. REGULAR FORCE

“Leave Categories

“624A. Leave is classified as follows:—

“ Travelling Leave.	Overseas Drafting Leave.
“ Annual Leave.	Overseas Leave.
“ Statutory Holidays.	Business Leave.
“ Week-end Leave.	Retiring Leave.
“ Compassionate Leave.	Sick Leave.
“ Examination Leave.	

“Application of Leave Scales

“624B. The leave scales as herein laid down apply to all ranks of the N.Z. Regular Force.

“624C. All leave will be inclusive of Sundays but exclusive of statutory holidays, and will be on full pay and allowances unless otherwise stated.

“Bona fide Home

“624D. For the purpose of these regulations, the expression ‘bona fide home’ means any place in New Zealand which is—

“(a) The place of residence of the wife of a married officer or soldier or, in the case of a widower or officer or soldier divorced or separated (legally or otherwise) and having custody of children, the place of residence as laid down in (c) below.

“(b) (i) The place of residence of the parents or recorded next-of-kin of an unmarried officer or soldier living in camp; or

“(ii) The place of enlistment, provided subparagraph (b) (i) above does not apply.

“(c) The actual place of residence for the time being of an unmarried officer or soldier not living in camp: Provided, however, that if, prior to being employed on full-time service, he normally resided with his parents or in a place of residence maintained by him for his own use (*i.e.*, not as lodger) his home shall be regarded as the place of residence of his parents or the original place of residence maintained, as the case may be.

“Marital Status

“624E. (a) The expression ‘married officers or soldiers’ includes the following:—

“(i) Married officers or soldiers living under normal domestic relationship with their wives.

“(ii) Widowers with children.

“(iii) Officers or soldiers divorced or separated (legally or otherwise) and having custody of children.

“(iv) Officers or soldiers who have a ‘reputed wife’ and for whom the married scale of pay and allowances has been approved.

“(b) The expression ‘unmarried officers or soldiers’ includes all those not classed as married in the terms provided above.

“Responsibility of Commanding Officers

“625. Commanding Officers will be responsible that the interests of their subordinates regarding leave are preserved, and that any leave missed through the exigencies of the service is made up without unnecessary delay.

“Free Travelling Warrants

“626. (a) Free travelling return warrants from station to bona fide home may be issued at the scale set out below, provided that the journey in one direction, by the most direct surface route, is in excess of fifty miles:—

“Single officers or soldiers: One warrant per annum.

“Married officers or soldiers: Two warrants per annum.

“Regular Force Cadets and recruits under nineteen years of age under training in training establishments: Three warrants per annum.

“Recruits over nineteen years of age under training in training establishments may, with the approval of the Adjutant-General, be granted three warrants per annum.

“(b) In addition to the issue of warrants under (a) above, a free travelling return warrant from station to bona fide home may, where the medical officer certifies that in the interest of the Service it is necessary that sick leave be spent at home, be granted in conjunction with sick leave under the conditions as laid down in (a) above.

“(c) Where officers or soldiers return from service overseas they may be granted a free travelling warrant from port of disembarkation to their bona fide home, provided that the period of overseas service is twelve months or more.

“(d) The class of travelling warrant issued will be as laid down in Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations.

“Notification of Address

“627A. Officers or soldiers prior to proceeding on authorized leave will notify their Commanding Officer of their address while on leave, and will subsequently advise any change of address during such leave.

“Quitting the Dominion

“627B. Officers or soldiers will not quit the Dominion without permission from Army Headquarters. Application for such permission will be forwarded through the usual channels.

“Travelling Leave

“628. When the time taken in travelling by officers or soldiers on annual leave visiting their bona fide homes and returning to station is in excess of forty-eight hours, such excess time will be granted as travelling leave and will not be reckoned as part of their annual leave.

“Annual Leave

“629A. Annual leave will be granted as follows:—

“(a) Regular Force cadets and recruits under nineteen years of age undergoing training in a training establishment: Thirty days per annum (excluding travelling leave).
Others: Twenty-four days per annum (excluding travelling leave).

“(b) On the approval of the Adjutant-General, recruits over nineteen years of age undergoing training in a training establishment may be granted leave as for cadets under nineteen years of age. Instructions will be issued from time to time to cover each group of cases.

“Annual Leave Period

“629B. (a) The annual leave period will be from 1st April in any year to 31st March in the following year. All leave due for such period must be taken before the 30th April following such leave period, except as provided in Regulation 629C, or unless approval for deferment is given by the Adjutant-General.

“(b) Annual leave for the leave period during which an officer or soldier is retired will be calculated proportionately on a daily basis according to service during that leave period to the date of commencement of retiring leave.

“Accumulation of Annual Leave

“629C. If an officer or soldier desires to accumulate annual leave, he may be allowed to do so for two years only, subject to his giving notice to his Commanding Officer before the 31st July in the year on account of which he desires to accumulate his leave.

“Approval of Annual Leave

“629D. (a) Applications for annual leave not exceeding seven days may be approved by Unit Commanders.

“(b) Applications for annual leave in excess of seven days may, on the recommendation of the Unit Commanders, be approved by District (or equivalent) Commanders.

“Statutory Holidays

“630A. (a) The following days will be observed as statutory holidays:—

“ Christmas Day.	Easter Monday.
“ Boxing Day.	Anzac Day.
“ New Year's Day.	Sovereign's Birthday.
“ Good Friday.	Labour Day.
“ Holy Saturday.	Anniversary Day of the Province.

“(b) If leave for a statutory holiday cannot be given, equivalent leave must be granted within one month or the leave will be forfeited.

“(c) Statutory holidays occurring during the retiring leave of an officer or soldier will not be granted in addition to retiring leave.

“Week-end Leave

“630B. Leave on Saturdays and Sundays and at night during the week may be granted by Unit Commanders, where military requirements permit, without being a debit against annual leave.

Compassionate Leave

“ 631. Compassionate leave may be granted under the following conditions on the approval of District (or equivalent) Commanders. Such leave will not be a charge against annual leave except as provided in (c) below :—

- “(a) An officer or soldier may be granted three days’ leave, plus travelling leave, in the case of the death of his mother, father, wife, child, sister, or brother.
- “(b) On production of satisfactory proof that his wife is about to be or has been recently confined, three days’ leave, plus travelling leave, may be granted to an officer or soldier living away from his *bona fide* home.
- “(c) Any leave granted in excess of three days, plus travelling leave, will be deducted from annual leave or, if there is no balance of annual leave available, will be granted as leave without pay.

Examination Leave

“ 632. Examination leave may be granted on approval of the Adjutant-General to cover the actual period of an examination. Such leave will not be granted for the purpose of study prior to an examination and will not, unless the Adjutant-General so directs, be reckoned as a charge against annual leave.

Overseas Drafting Leave

“ 633A. Overseas drafting leave, plus travelling leave, may be granted on the following scale to an officer or soldier proceeding overseas without being a charge against annual leave :—

- “(a) If married and living at home and being accompanied overseas by his wife at public expense : Seven days.
- “(b) If married and stationed away from home and being accompanied overseas by his wife at public expense : Fourteen days.
- “(c) In all other cases and only where service overseas is to exceed six months : Up to seven days, provided that a married officer or soldier stationed away from home may be granted up to fourteen days if the absence overseas is to be twelve months or more, and, with the approval of the Adjutant-General, up to seven days if the absence is substantial but less than six months.
- “(d) Applications for Overseas Drafting Leave may, except where otherwise provided in (c) above, be approved by District (or equivalent) Commanders.

Overseas Leave

“ 633B. On the approval of the Adjutant-General, officers or soldiers returning to New Zealand after service overseas may be granted leave in accordance with the following scale :—

- “(a) One day’s special leave for each two months’ service overseas, provided that such absence is in excess of six months.
- “(b) Where the period of service overseas is in excess of one year, up to twenty-one days’ leave, plus leave as in (c) below, may be granted for each complete year of absence overseas. This leave will be inclusive of special leave as in (a) above, and any balance of annual leave due. Leave for incomplete years will be calculated proportionally on a daily basis.
- “(c) Leave to enable them to spend the full period of overseas leave as in (b) above at home, provided they travel by the most direct surface route (or equivalent) from port of disembarkation to their home.
- “(d) Service overseas shall be calculated from the date of embarkation in New Zealand to the date of disembarkation on return to New Zealand.

Business Leave

“ 634. Special business leave may be granted to an officer or soldier on approval of the Adjutant-General. Application for such leave will be dealt with on its merits and, if approved, leave will be without pay or as a deduction from annual leave.

Retiring Leave

“ 635. On approval of the Adjutant-General special leave of absence may be granted on the following scale to all officers or soldiers on retirement, provided that the sick leave taken in the twelve months preceding retirement has not exceeded three months :—

- “(a) Retiring on superannuation or compensation in lieu of superannuation : Three months.
- “(b) Discharged for own purposes and not receiving gratuity—
 “Under ten years’ service : No leave.
 “Ten years and under twenty years : One month.
 “Twenty years’ service and over : Six weeks.

“(c) Invalided : One to three months.
 Except—

- “(i) If discharged within six months of entry for medical reasons which can be certified as having existed prior to entry : Fourteen days.
- “(ii) If discharged within six months of entry for medical reasons where medical disability was wilfully concealed on entry : Only such leave as may be determined by the Adjutant-General.
- “(iii) If discharged for medical reasons attributable to own misconduct or neglect : Only such leave as may be determined by the Adjutant-General.

“(d) Services dispensed with through no fault of own (other than for medical reasons) before reaching the retiring age or on completion of a limited engagement and not receiving a gratuity :—

- “(i) Under five years’ continuous service : Up to one month.
- “(ii) Five years and under ten years : Two months.
- “(iii) Ten years and over : Three months.

- “(e) Officers or soldiers discharged for reasons other than in the preceding subparagraphs shall not receive more than fourteen days’ leave, and, in cases of less than one year’s service, up to seven days only.
- “(f) The Minister may, at his discretion, grant an equivalent payment by way of an allowance in lieu of leave which may be granted under subparagraph (a) above.

Sick Leave

“ 636. Sick leave may be granted to all ranks of the N.Z. Regular Force, excluding soldiers of the Home Service Section, as follows :—

- “(a) Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (h) below, sick leave when granted will be on full pay and allowances and will not be charged against annual leave. Pay will include pay for temporary rank, except where temporary rank is relinquished under subparagraph (m) below.
- “(b) Absence from duty on account of injury or illness, whether or not in hospital, shall be regarded as sick leave.
- “(c) Officers or soldiers absent from duty on account of injury or illness will report their absence to their Commanding Officer. Where such absence is for any continuous period greater than three days, they will cause to be forwarded to their Commanding Officer a medical certificate stating the nature of disability and the probable period of absence from duty. Notwithstanding that such period of three days has not elapsed, a Commanding Officer may, at his discretion, require the forwarding of such certificate.
- “(d) A District Commander (or equivalent) may grant sick leave up to fourteen days. Where an extension or longer period is required, the approval of the Adjutant-General must be obtained.
- “(e) Sick leave up to two months may be granted by the Adjutant-General, but any request for extension of such sick leave or for sick leave for a period exceeding two months shall require the approval of the Army Board.
- “(f) Officers or soldiers who have been absent on sick leave for a continuous period of over three months will not be permitted to return to duty until passed by a Medical Board as fit to resume duty.

“(g) Where officers or soldiers are considered to be physically unfit for service because they are frequently on the sick list or for any other reason, a report by a Medical Board shall be obtained and forwarded to Army Headquarters for further action.

“(h) Sick leave on full pay shall be granted in accordance with the following scale. Leave may be granted in more than one period, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay provided in the scale is intended to cover the whole period of service :—

Length of Service.	Aggregate Period for which Sick Leave on Full Pay may be granted during Service.
Up to 3 months	7 days.
Over 3 months and up to 6 months	14 days.
Over 6 months and up to 9 months	31 days.
Over 9 months and up to 5 years	46 days.
Over 5 years and up to 10 years	92 days.
Over 10 years and up to 20 years	183 days.
Over 20 years and up to 30 years	275 days.
Over 30 years	365 days.

“(j) The following cases shall be dealt with on their merits by the Adjutant-General, and are the only exceptions to the scale laid down in subparagraph (h) above :—

- “(i) Disability due to a wound, injury, or illness, such disability being attributable to the performance of military duty and not due to the fault, negligence, or misconduct of the officer or soldier concerned.
- “(ii) Disability arising out of war service.

“(k) Where, under subparagraph (j) above, any special sick leave is granted which for the time being is in excess of the scale set out in subparagraph (h) above, such excess leave, whenever possible, shall be regarded as in anticipation of sick leave becoming due on completion of a further period of service. Such special sick leave shall not for the purpose of subparagraph (h) hereof be included in the aggregate of sick leave, but such leave shall, nevertheless, be noted on the officer’s or soldier’s leave record.

“(l) Where it is necessary for an officer or soldier to be isolated on account of an infectious condition in his household or elsewhere, any such period of isolation shall count against normal sick leave. Absence in these cases shall be supported by a medical certificate.

“(m) In the case of protracted illnesses, an officer or soldier will relinquish temporary rank, if any, after a continuous period of twenty-eight days’ sick leave.

“(n) An officer or soldier who has commenced retiring leave shall not be granted sick leave.

Special Conditions applying to Sick Leave for Home Service Section

"637. (a) Sick leave may be granted in accordance with the scales and conditions laid down in Regulation 636 in the case of soldiers of the Home Service Section, N.Z. Regular Force, where the sickness is *not* a recurrence or aggravation of a disability existing on his enlistment in or transfer to the Home Service Section. An application from the soldier's Commanding Officer for the granting of sick leave under these conditions must be supported by medical certificate to this effect.

"(b) Where sickness of a soldier of the Home Service Section, N.Z. Regular Force, is considered to be attributable to a recurrence or aggravation of a disability existing on his enlistment in or transfer to the Home Service Section, sick leave without pay may be granted in accordance with conditions laid down in Regulation 636.

Recording of Leave

"638. (a) Upon an officer or soldier being enlisted, Army Headquarters will enter the member's leave entitlement on the original and duplicated forms N.Z. 6, and will despatch the duplicate to District, &c., Headquarters, who will notify the unit concerned.

"(b) All leave granted will be published in Routine Orders of the unit to which the officer or soldier is posted.

"(c) Individual leave records will be compiled from Routine Orders. The following records will be maintained:—

"(i) Units will maintain a personal leave sheet, which will be attached to the unit personal file.

"(ii) District, &c., Headquarters will maintain a leave record on form N.Z. 6 attached to the duplicate personal file.

"(iii) Army Headquarters will maintain a leave record on form N.Z. 6 attached to the original personal file.

"(d) Where an officer or soldier is transferred from one unit or district to another, the unit personal file will be despatched direct to the new unit. The duplicate personal file will be forwarded via Army Headquarters to the District, &c., Headquarters to which the officer or soldier has been transferred."

6. Regulation 664 of the principal regulations is revoked.

7. Paragraph 7 of Appendix VIII of the principal regulations, as amended by Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces 1927, Amendment No. 35, is revoked and the following substituted:—

"7. (1) Except as otherwise provided by these regulations, every officer or soldier who has been convicted of an offence under sections 4, 7, 12, 16, 18, or 41 of the Army Act shall be liable, at the discretion of the Army Board, to forfeit any war medal (except one awarded for gallantry) of which he may be in possession or to which he may be entitled, together with any annuity, gratuity, or pension appertaining thereto not already paid.

"(2) Every officer or soldier who is, while subject to military law, convicted on indictment by the civil power, shall be liable, at the discretion of the Army Board, to forfeit any war medal (except one awarded for gallantry) of which he may be in possession or to which he may be entitled, including any medal awarded for long service, meritorious service, or efficiency of which he may be in possession or to which he may be entitled, together with any annuity, gratuity, or pension appertaining thereto not already paid.

"(3) Any officer or soldier who is sentenced to death by court-martial or who is dismissed or removed from the service for misconduct shall forfeit any medal awarded for long service, meritorious service (except one awarded for gallantry), or efficiency of which he may be in possession or to which he may be entitled, together with any annuity, gratuity, or pension appertaining thereto not already paid.

"(4) Any war medal or any medal awarded for long service, meritorious service (except one awarded for gallantry), or efficiency forfeited by an officer or soldier may be restored at the discretion of the Army Board. Restoration of a medal, carrying with it an annuity, gratuity, or pension shall entail restoration of the annuity, gratuity, or pension as from the date of restoration of the medal."

Approval of Flags for the Territory of Western Samoa

IT is notified for public information that the Government of New Zealand, in its capacity of Administering Authority of the Territory of Western Samoa, has approved as the flags of Western Samoa for general use on shore within Western Samoa, first the New Zealand Ensign, and secondly the flag described in the Schedule hereto, the two flags to be flown in conjunction with each other, and when so flown to be of equal dimensions and to display the same shades of blue and red.

SCHEDULE

RED, the first quarter blue and bearing four white five-pointed stars representing the Southern Cross, the size and disposition of the stars being as follows:—

- In this prescription the hoist of the flag from top to bottom is regarded as one hundred and forty-four units.
- Each star has its uppermost point on a vertical line through its centre.

- The star nearest the staff has its top point distant twenty-one units from the upper edge of the flag and its nearest points distant forty-two units from the edge nearest the staff.
- The star nearest the fly has its top point distant eighteen units from the upper edge of the flag and its nearest points distant twenty-two units from the fly edge of the blue quarter.
- The star nearest the fly edge measures fifteen units, the uppermost star and the star nearest the staff measure sixteen units and the lowest star measures twenty units, measured between opposite points.

A drawing of the flag as hereinbefore described is deposited in the office of the Department of Island Territories at Wellington, marked I.T. 69/52, and a copy of the drawing is published herewith.

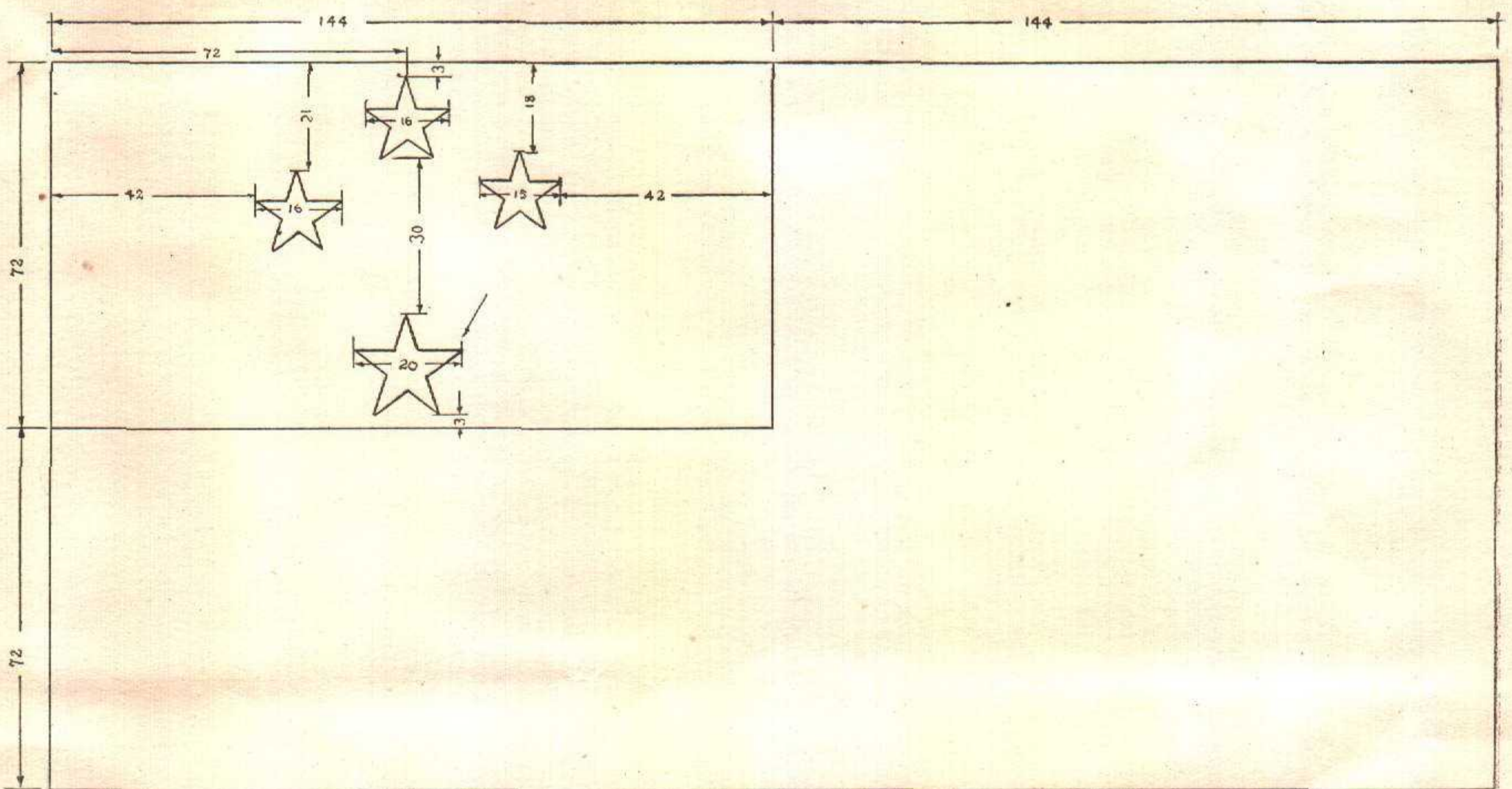
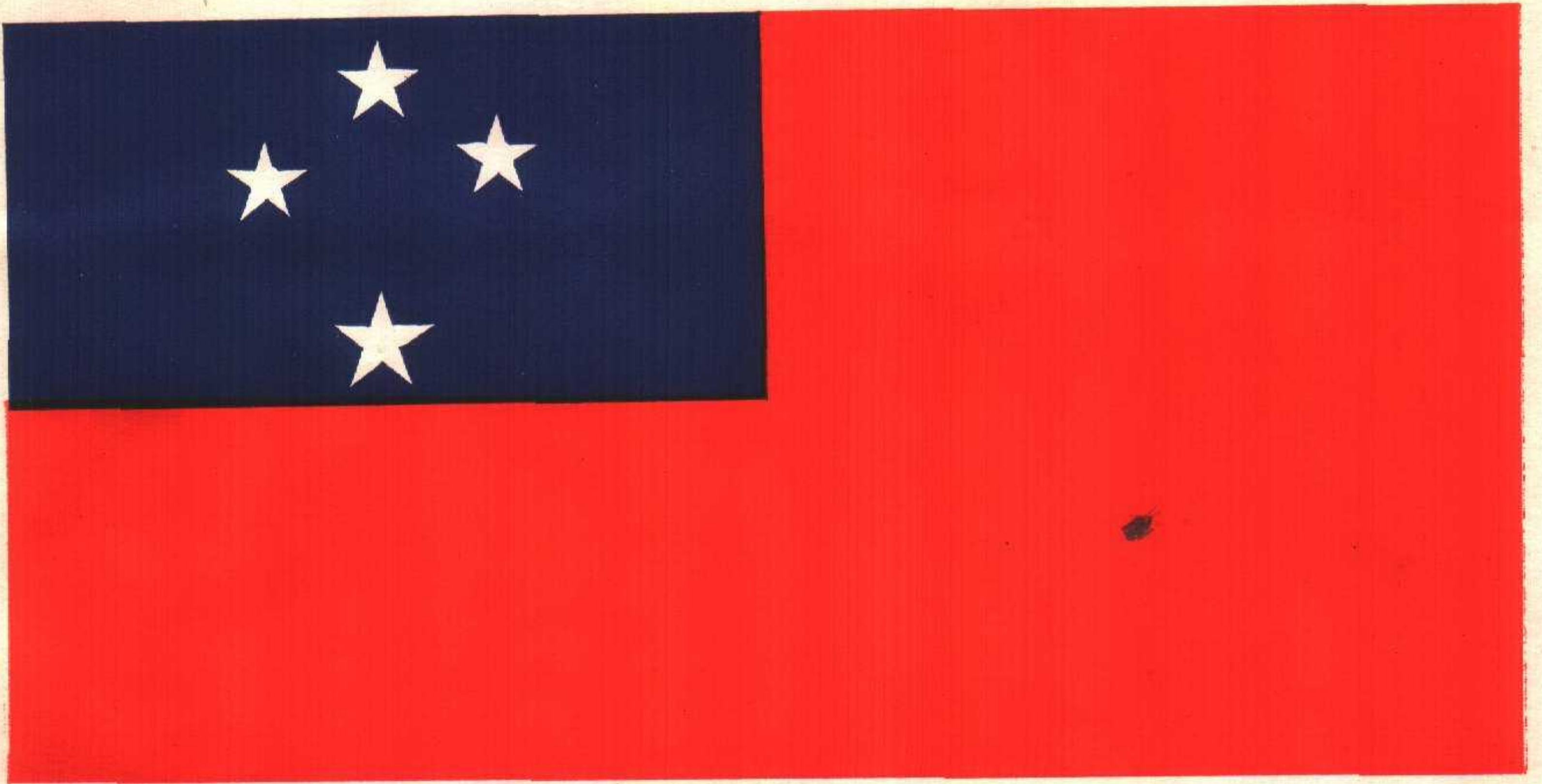


DIAGRAM SHOWING PROPORTIONS

Social Security Act, 1938: The Drug Tariff (September, 1946).—Notice regarding Amendments to Prescription Prices in the New Zealand Formulary

ADDENDUM (May, 1948) to the New Zealand Formulary:—

NEW ZEALAND FORMULARY, PART 2

(Price Rules under clause 7 of the Drug Tariff, September, 1946)

SUBCLAUSE (1) of clause 2 of Part 2 of the Addendum, September, 1946, to the New Zealand Formulary referring to price rules under clause 7 of the Drug Tariff, September, 1946, is revoked, and the following substituted:—

"In respect of pharmaceutical requirements supplied by a contractor in accordance with the said regulations, the Fund shall pay the price and additional fees, if any, computed in accordance with the provisions of clauses 1 to 13 (inclusive), and the First,

Second, and Third Schedules of the Rules of Prescription Pricing issued by the Pharmacy Plan Industrial Committee and approved by the Minister on the 25th day of May, 1948, subject to the following provisos:—

"(i) Except where a container and its contents are priced under these rules as an integral unit, no payment shall be made from the Fund in respect of a glass container supplied pursuant to a second or subsequent order under any particular medical prescription.

"(ii) There shall be deducted from the gross amount payable to any contractor in accordance with these rules a discount of £2 10s. per centum."

This amendment shall take effect with respect to all medical prescriptions and midwifery orders (whatever the date thereof) that are presented to a contractor for fulfilment on or after 1st June, 1948.

Price Order No. 883 (Meadow Hay)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 883, and shall come into force on the 28th day of May, 1948, and shall expire on the 30th day of June, 1948.

2. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"The said Act" means the Control of Prices Act, 1947:

"Distributor", in relation to any produce to which this Order applies, means a wholesaler as defined in the said Act who sells any such produce otherwise than to a retailer for retail sale:

"Grower", in relation to any produce to which this Order applies, means a person engaged in the business of growing any such produce for sale:

The expression "f.o.r." means free on rail.

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the said Act, when used in this Order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by that Act.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to all meadow hay produced in the North Island of New Zealand.

FIXING MAXIMUM GROWERS' AND DISTRIBUTORS' PRICES OF PRODUCE TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Growers' Price

4. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any grower for any produce to which this Order applies shall be £7 10s. per ton f.o.r. the grower's station.

Distributors' Price

5. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any distributor for any produce to which this Order applies shall be the sum of the following amounts:—

- The amount actually paid or payable to the grower:
- The amount of any transport charges incurred by the distributor in obtaining delivery from the grower and effecting delivery to the purchaser, reduced by the amount of any subsidy received by the distributor on account of such charges:
- An amount calculated at the rate of 10s. per ton.

By that section certain moneys are to be applied in the erection or endowment of literary chairs in any college or University in the Province of Otago. In pursuance thereof, such moneys were for many years applied towards the payment of the salaries of certain Professors at the University of Otago. Owing to changed circumstances, such moneys can no longer be applied in that way. The proposed amendment is to enable the moneys previously applied as aforesaid to be applied in future to objects or purposes in part similar to the previous objects or purposes, but taking account of the changed circumstances which now exist. Such altered objects and purposes are, in general, to be for the promotion of secular and religious education in the Province of Otago consistent with the original trust for the advancement of education, so that the community as well as the Church will receive the greatest possible benefit.
