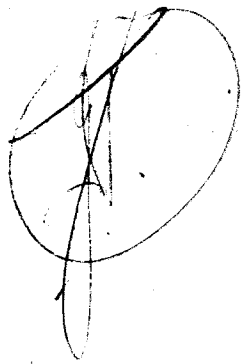

Proclaiming a Tribal District under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act, 1945

[L.S.] B. C. FREYBERG, Governor-General
A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section six of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act, 1945, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the parts of New Zealand described in the Schedule hereto to be a tribal district for the purposes of the said Act, and do hereby assign to the said district the name "Arawa No. 2 Tribal District."

SCHEDULE

THE ARAWA NO. 2 TRIBAL DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, comprising the Rotorua County, part of the Taupo County, and part of the Whakatane County, bounded by a line commencing at Trig. Station No. 27 (Puwhehua), being the eastern corner of Block VII, Tapapa East Survey District; thence north-westerly along a right line in the direction of Trig. Station No. 146 (Te Weraiti), being the western corner of Block IV, Opoutihi Survey District, to its intersection with the production of a right line between the north-eastern corner of Section 2, Block XI, Waihi South Survey District, and Trig. Station 1039 (Otanewainuku), situated in Block XVI, Otanewainuku Survey District; thence easterly to and along the last-mentioned right line to the said Trig. Station 1039 (Otanewainuku), being a point on the boundary of the Arawa No. 1 Tribal District, as described in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1948, on page 215; thence along the southern and eastern boundaries of that district to the sea-coast; thence south-easterly along the sea-coast to a point on the production of a right line between Mount Edgecumbe Trig. Station in Block XIII, Rangitaiki Upper Survey District, and the westernmost corner of Allotment 110, Rangitaiki Parish, in Block VI, Awaateatua Survey District; thence southerly to and along the said right line to Mount Edgecumbe Trig. Station aforesaid; thence southerly along a right line to Trig. Station H, in Block V, Galatea Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station 38a, in Block IX, Kaingaroa Survey District; thence southerly along a right line to the northernmost corner of Kaingaroa No. 1A North Block and the western boundary of that block to its westernmost corner; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Paeroa East No. 3c Block, along the southern boundary of Paeroa East No. 3a Block and its production to the middle of the Torepatutahi Stream, down the middle of that stream and the Waikato River to its confluence with the Whangapoa Stream; thence north-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station F (Ngautuku), in Block VI, Te Atiamuri Survey District; thence

westerly along a right line in the direction of the confluence of the Waikato and Waipapa Rivers to its intersection with a right line between the mouth of the Waihora Stream in Lake Taupo and Trig. Station No. 807 (Uraura), in Block VII, Ngautuku Survey District; thence northerly along the last-mentioned right line to Trig. Station 807 (Uraura) aforesaid, along a right line to Trig. Station No. 27 (Puwhehua), being the point of commencement; excluding the Borough of Rotorua, as described in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1946, on page 1085.

THE following copy of a Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor-General of Australia, published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* on the 4th day of March, 1948, and relating to the recognition in all Courts in Australia of decrees and orders made under Part I of the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) Act, 1947, is published for general information.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 8 of the Matrimonial Causes Act, 1945, that the validity of any judgment, decree, or order made by virtue of any law enacted or made by any legislature or other authority having power to make laws with respect to matrimonial causes for any part of His Majesty's dominions outside Australia, or for any other country which is declared by Proclamation to be a law substantially corresponding to the provisions made with respect to Australia by Part II of that Act shall, by virtue of that Act, be recognized in all courts in Australia:

And whereas it is further provided by section 8 of the Matrimonial Causes Act, 1945, that a Proclamation shall not be made under that section with respect to any law of any such part of His Majesty's dominions or of any other country unless the Governor-General is satisfied that adequate provision is made by the law of that part or country for the recognition by the Courts of that part or country of the judgments, decrees, and orders which are given or made in pursuance of the provisions of Part II of that Act:

Now, therefore, I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, being satisfied that adequate provision is made by Part I of the Act of the Dominion of New Zealand known as the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) Act, 1947, for the recognition by the Courts of the Dominion of New Zealand of the judgments, decrees, and orders which are given or made in pursuance of Part II of the Matrimonial Causes Act, 1945, do hereby declare Part I of the Act of the Dominion of New Zealand known as the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) Act, 1947, to be a law substantially corresponding to the provisions made with respect to Australia by Part II of the Matrimonial Causes Act, 1945.

WHEREAS by paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 4 of the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) Act, 1944, it is provided that the validity of any decree or order made by virtue of any law passed or made by any legislature or other authority having power to make laws with respect to matrimonial causes for any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom, or for any British protected State, which is declared by Order in Council to be a law substantially corresponding to the provisions made as respects Great Britain by the preceding provisions of the said Act, shall, by virtue of the said Act, be recognized in all British Courts, whether within or without His Majesty's dominions, other than Dominion Courts:

And whereas by paragraph (ii) of the proviso to the said subsection (1) it is provided that an Order in Council as aforesaid shall not be made with respect to any law of any Dominion within the meaning of the Statute of Westminster, 1931, or of any Province or State forming part of such Dominion, or of any British protected State, for the recognition by the Courts thereof of the decrees and orders which are by virtue of the said subsection (1) to be recognized to the extent provided for by that subsection in British Courts other than Dominion Courts:

And whereas the legislature of the Dominion of New Zealand, being a Dominion within the meaning of the Statute of Westminster, 1931, has passed a law entitled the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) Act, 1947, Part I:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that adequate provision is made by the said law of the said Dominion for the recognition by the Courts thereof of the decrees and orders aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) Act, 1947, Part I, of the Dominion of New Zealand is hereby declared to be a law substantially corresponding to the provisions made as respects Great Britain by the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) Act, 1944.

2. This Order may be cited as the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) (New Zealand) Order, 1948, and shall come into operation on the 10th day of February, 1948.

The Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) (New Zealand) Order, 1948

The object of this Order is to declare that a certain law made by the Dominion of New Zealand is a law substantially corresponding to the provision made as respects Great Britain by the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) Act, 1944. Such a declaration will secure recognition in all British Courts, whether within or without His Majesty's dominions, other than Dominion Courts, of the validity of any decree or order made by virtue of the law of the said Dominion.

Price Order No. 889 (Spirits and Beer)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 889, and shall come into force on the 14th day of June, 1948.

2. (1) Price Order No. 387* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Beer” includes ale, beer, stout, porter, and all other malt liquors subject to beer duty under Part III of the Finance Act, 1915:

“Original bottle”, in relation to any sale, means any bottle or other container filled to its normal capacity prior to and not for the purpose of that sale:

“Spirits” means whisky, rum, brandy, or gin:

“Standard measure” means the 1/42nd part of a reputed quart.

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the Licensing Act, 1908, when used in this Order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by that Act.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order, this Order applies with respect to the sale by the holder of a publican's licence or an accommodation licence for consumption on licensed premises of drinks containing spirits or beer either with or without the addition of any flavouring or diluting ingredients of a non-intoxicating nature.

(2) This Order shall not apply to any liquor sold by the bottle and in its original bottle.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF SPIRITS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

5. (1) Except as provided in subclause (2) hereof and subject to the following provisions of this Order, the maximum price that may be charged by the licensee of any licensed premises for any drink containing spirits to which this Order applies shall be—

(a) Where the quantity of spirits contained in the drink is less than a full standard measure, the maximum price of the drink shall be 6d.:

(b) Where the quantity of spirits contained in the drink is a full standard measure, the maximum price of the drink shall be 10d.:

(c) Where the quantity of spirits contained in the drink is equal to two or more full standard measures, the maximum price of the drink shall be 10d. multiplied by the number of full standard measures:

(d) Where the quantity of spirits contained in the drink exceeds a full standard measure but is not an exact number of standard measures, the maximum price of the drink shall be 10d. for each full standard measure.

(2) Where any drink containing a full standard measure of spirits is sold for consumption in a lounge or in the dining-room of licensed premises the maximum price of the drink shall be 1s.,

except in the case of French brandy, for which the maximum price shall be 2s. Where any such drink contains more than a full standard measure the provisions of paragraphs (c) and (d) of subclause (1) hereof shall, with the necessary modifications, apply to the sale thereof. Where any drink containing less than a full standard measure of spirits is sold for consumption in a lounge or dining-room of licensed premises the maximum price of the drink shall be three-quarters of the price authorized for a drink containing the full standard measure.

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause, the maximum price that may be charged by the licensee of any licensed premises for any brandy sold (otherwise than by the original bottle) for consumption off the licensed premises shall be at the rate of 1s. 4d. a fluid ounce.

(2) In addition to the price fixed in the last preceding subclause a reasonable price may be charged for the bottle in which the brandy is sold to the purchaser, but any charge so made shall be refunded to the purchaser on the return of the bottle.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF BEER TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

7. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order, the maximum price that may be charged or received by the licensee of licensed premises for beer to which this Order applies shall be 7d. for each drink served in a measure containing 12 oz. or more than 12 oz., and 6d. for each drink served in a measure containing less than 12 oz.

(2) Subject to the provisions of subclause (4) hereof, where beer is sold in containers filled from the original bottle for consumption on the premises the maximum price that may be charged or received for any such drink shall be 7d.

(3) On and after the 1st day of August, 1948, and unless otherwise specified by the customer, all beer, except beer sold from its original bottle, or beer served in a lounge or dining-room, shall be served by the licensee of licensed premises in 10 oz. containers, and any container in which beer is served shall be filled as nearly as reasonably possible to its full capacity.

(4) Where any beer is sold for consumption in a lounge or in the dining-room of the licensed premises the maximum price of the drink shall be 1s.

8. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by the licensee of any licensed premises, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any drinks to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the licensee. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a particular drink or may relate generally to drinks to which this Order applies sold by the licensee while the approval remains in force. Any authority given under this clause shall be exhibited in the manner prescribed by clause 9 hereof in respect of Price Orders.

9. On and after the 25th day of June, 1948, every licensee of any licensed premises shall keep a copy of this Price Order or a statement of the retail prices fixed thereby prominently displayed in every place in the licensed premises where drinks are sold in such a position that customers may examine the Price Order or statement without having to ask for its production or without having to obtain permission to examine it.

(Main Crop Potatoes)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 888, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 849* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 11th day of June, 1948.

3. Price Orders Nos. 854† and 879‡ are hereby revoked.

4. The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

5. The principal Order is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By adding after clause 7 the following clause:—

“7A. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received for the sacks in which any lot of potatoes to which this Order applies are packed shall be computed as follows:—

“For corn sacks of a size 48 in. by 26½ in., 46 in. by 26½ in., 44 in. by 26½ in., 46 in. by 23 in., or 41 in. by 23 in.: At the rate of 32s. 6d. per ton of potatoes for sacks certified by an official grader appointed by the New Zealand Grain, Seed, and Produce Merchants' Federation as new sacks, or at the rate of 31s. per ton of potatoes for sacks not so certified:

“For fertilizer sacks of a size 40 in. by 24 in.: At the rate of 17s. 6d. per ton of potatoes.

“(2) Where any potatoes to which this Order applies are packed in sacks the maximum price that may be charged or received for the potatoes shall be computed on the gross weight of the potatoes and the sacks.”

(b) By inserting after the word “item” where it last appears in subclause (1) of clause 16 the words “and shall state separately the price charged for the sacks or other containers.”

(c) By omitting paragraphs (c), (d), and (e) of subclause (3) of clause 17, and substituting the following paragraphs:—

“(c) (i) In the case of potatoes sold at any place within the Auckland Metropolitan Area, the City of Hamilton, or the Land Districts of Taranaki, Wellington, Hawke's Bay, or Gisborne (excluding the County of Opotiki and the Borough of Opotiki) during the months of March to June, 1948 (inclusive), 2½d. per pound:

(ii) In the case of potatoes sold elsewhere in the North Island during the months of March to June, 1948 (inclusive), 2¾d. per pound.”

“(d) In the case of potatoes sold at any place within the Metropolitan Areas of Auckland or Wellington, or within the cities or boroughs of New Plymouth, Wanganui, Napier, or Gisborne during the months of July to November, 1948 (inclusive) (or thereafter while this Order is in force), 2¾d. per pound.

“(e) In the case of potatoes sold elsewhere in the North Island during the months of July to November, 1948 (inclusive) (or thereafter while this Order is in force), 3d. per pound.”
