PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby grant to the Murchison County Council (hereinafter referred to as the licensee), a licence subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of the Maruia River (hereinafter referred to as the said stream) in Block VIII, Maruia Survey District, in the Land District of Nelson, County of Murchison, and to take and use therefrom for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding one hundred and eighty cubic feet per second at any one time, and to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines hereinafter described.

CONDITIONS

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Water-power Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

This licence is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS

Water shall be used under this licence solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the said stream at a point in Block VIII, Maruia Survey District, in the Nelson Land District, as indicated on the plans marked S.H.D. 23 and S.H.D. 31, deposited in the office of the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this licence, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plans S.H.D. 23 and S.H.D. 31:—

- (a) Headworks consisting of an intake giving a static head of approximately 22 ft.:

- (b) Water-race leading to the power-house hereinafter described;
- (c) Water turbine and power-house with all necessary equipment for generating electricity situated on River Reserve, Block VIII, Maruia Survey District;
- (d) Tail-race from the said power-house to the Maruia River;
- (e) Electric lines leading from the said power-house across Blocks VIII and IV, Maruia Survey District, Block I, Tutaki Survey District, and the Matakītaki River to the licensee's Diesel generating station in the Township of Murchison, the said lines being more particularly shown coloured red on the said plans S.H.D. 23 and S.H.D. 31.

5. DURATION OF LICENCE

Unless sooner lawfully determined, this licence shall continue in force until the 18th day of January, 1963.

6. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a) and (f) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The generating voltage shall be 2,400 volts between phases, and the transmission voltage shall be approximately 11,000 volts between phases.

7. RENTAL

For the purpose of assessing the rental or annual sum payable in respect of this licence, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the State Hydro-electric Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed. The present plant is rated at 150 kilowatts.

8. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. 3d. per unit for lighting purposes and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes: Providing that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes; provided, also, that if accounts are paid within fourteen days after due date the charges shall not exceed 1s. and 4½d. respectively.

9. TIME FOR COMPLETION OF WORKS

The period for completion of the works hereby authorized shall be three years from the date of this licence.

1. Northland Provincial Patriotic District

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, bounded towards the south-west, north, and north-east by the sea, and towards the south-east by the Rodney County, and including all adjacent islands.

2. Auckland Provincial Patriotic District

All that area bounded towards the north-west by the Otamatea County; towards the north-east by the sea; towards the east by the Whakatane County; towards the south by the Rotorua County; towards the south-west by the Matamata, Piako, Waikato, and Raglan Counties; towards the south-west by the sea, and including the Great Barrier County and all the adjacent islands of the Waitemata Harbour, Hauraki Gulf, and Bay of Plenty.

3. Waikato Provincial Patriotic District

All that area bounded towards the north and north-east generally by the Auckland Provincial Patriotic District hereinbefore described; towards the south-east by the Matamata County; towards the east by the Matamata and Taupo Counties; towards the south by the Taumarunui and Ohura Counties to the Mokau River, by that river to the Ngatarawa Road, by that road to the Awakino River, and by that river to the sea; towards the west by the sea, and including all adjacent islands.

4. Bay of Plenty Provincial Patriotic District

All that area bounded towards the north by the Tauranga County and the sea; towards the east by the Matakaoa County; towards the south-east by the Waipua and Waikohu Counties; towards the south and east by the Wairoa County to the 39° parallel of south latitude; towards the south by the 39° parallel of south latitude to the eastern boundary of the Taumarunui County; towards the west by the Taumarunui, Waitomo, Otorohanga, and Waipa Counties; towards the north-west by the Waikato and Piako Counties, and including all adjacent islands.

5. East Coast Provincial Patriotic District

All that area bounded towards the north and east generally by the sea from the westernmost corner of the Matakaoa County to Paritu; towards the south-west by the Wairoa County to the south-eastern boundary of the Bay of Plenty Provincial Patriotic District hereinbefore described; towards the north-west and west by that district, and including all adjacent islands.

6. *Hawke's Bay Provincial Patriotic District*

All that area bounded towards the east generally by the sea from the southernmost corner of the East Coast Provincial Patriotic District, hereinbefore described, at Paritu, to the mouth of the Waimata Stream; towards the south-west by the Wellington Land District to the middle of the Manawatu Gorge; towards the north-west by the Wellington Land District, being a right line to Wharite Trig. Station, by the summit of the Ruahine Range to Trig. Station Otupae, and by a right line to the intersection of the 39° parallel of south latitude by 176° 30' east longitude, being a point on the southern boundary of the Bay of Plenty Provincial Patriotic District hereinbefore described; towards the north, west, and again towards the north by that district to the East Coast Provincial Patriotic District hereinbefore described; towards the north-east by that district, and including all adjacent islands.

7. *Taranaki Provincial Patriotic District*

“Flue-cured leaf” means leaf that has been treated in the kiln for at least three successive days immediately after picking for the purpose of yellowing, fixing colour, drying, and drying mid-ribs:

“Air-dried leaf” means leaf other than flue-cured leaf.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to all raw-leaf tobacco grown in New Zealand during the 1947-48 season: Provided that the Tribunal may, in any case where it considers it proper so to do and subject to such conditions (if any) as it thinks fit, exempt any such tobacco from the operation of this Order.

FIXING AVERAGE PRICES OF RAW-LEAF TOBACCO TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) The average price to be paid by any tobacco-manufacturer for raw-leaf tobacco to which this Order applies shall be not less than—

- (a) For flue-cured leaf 2s. 5½d. per pound.
(b) For air-dried leaf 2s. 2½d. per pound.

(2) For the purposes of this clause the weight of any raw-leaf tobacco shall be deemed to be its weight at the time and place of delivery by the grower to the manufacturer or to his agent in the district in which it is grown: Provided, however, that in any case where the grower and the manufacturer or his agent agree that the moisture-content of the leaf in any lot of tobacco is excessive, then for the purpose of calculating the value of the lot the weight of the lot shall be deemed to be reduced by a reasonable amount to make allowance for the excessive moisture.

5. This Order shall be read subject to the provisions of the Board of Trade (Raw Tobacco Price) Regulations 1943.*
