4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this licence, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan S.H.D. 47:—

- (a) Headworks consisting of a dam and intake with a water-race and pipe-line leading to the power-house, hereinafter referred to, giving a static head of approximately 20 ft.:
- (b) A Pelton wheel and power-house with all necessary equipment for generating electricity, situated in Section 4, Block XVI, Matiri Survey District:
- (c) A tail-race leading from the aforesaid power-house to the Upper Mangels River:
- (d) Electric lines leading from the said power-house across Section 4, Block XVI, Matiri Survey District, and across the Upper Mangels River to the licensee's dwelling situated in the said Section 4.

5. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be classified under paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, and shall be a direct-current system.

6. DURATION OF LICENCE

Unless sooner determined, this licence shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1969.

7. RENTAL

For the purpose of assessing the annual rental payable in respect of this licence, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the State Hydro-electric Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be assessed on the maximum generating capacity of the plant installed. The present plant is rated at 1 kilowatt.

WAIPA RACING CLUB (INCORPORATED)

REGULATIONS

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Waipa Racing Club (Incorporated), a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as the said club), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 15th day of September, 1923, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Waipa County, situated in the district of Waikato and known as the Te Awamutu Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

(a) Bookmakers:

(b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents:

(c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association:

(d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support:

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908:

Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Waipa Racing Club (Incorporated) were made and passed by such club on the 29th day of September, 1948, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
