1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,-

"Committee" means the Oraka Rural Fire Committee constituted by these regulations:
"District" means the Oraka Rural Fire District:
"Minister" means the Commissioner of State Forests:
Words importing persons include companies and other incorporated bodies:

Words importing the singular number include the plural, and vice versa.

2. The Oraka Rural Fire Committee shall be a body corporate having perpetual succession and a common seal, with power to make, alter, and renew the same, and with power to purchase, take, on hire or otherwise acquire, hold, transfer, and lease property, real and personal, to sue and be sued in any Court, and to do and suffer all that bodies corporate may lawfully do and suffer.

MEMBERS

3. The Committee shall consist of three members, who shall be appointed in the following manner :-

- (a) One member shall be appointed by N.Z. Forest Products, Limited, by writing signed on its behalf by one director and the secretary thereof:
 (b) One member shall be appointed by Redwood Forests, Limited, by writing signed on its behalf by one director and the secretary thereof:
 (b) the office of a member of the Committee appointed under

- and the secretary thereof:
 (c) If the office of a member of the Committee appointed under subclause (a) or subclause (b) of this regulation shall become vacant under Regulation 6 hereof, the same shall be filled up by his appointor, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of Regulation 8 (2) hereof:
 (d) One member (herein referred to as the sawmillers' representative) shall be appointed either by a resolution passed by a majority of those present at a meeting of the proprietors of sawmills operating within the district or by a majority vote by ballot of those present at such a meeting, as those so present by resolution determine:
 (e) On the appointment of the sawmillers' representative, every proprietor aforesaid shall, in respect of both a resolution and a ballot, have one vote if his annual production shall not exceed 250,000 board feet comprised in his annual production. feet he shall be entitled to one vote for every complete 250,000 board feet comprised in his annual production. For the purposes of this subclause, a proprietor's annual production shall be deemed to mean the total quantity, in board feet, of sawn timber produced by him in the district during the period of twelve months ending the 31st March in the year in which the appointment is to be made; and a board foot shall be deemed to mean a piece of sawn timber 12 inches square by 1 inch thick: (f) A statutory declaration by any such proprietor or by his or its secretary or auditor shall be conclusive proof of such annual production:
- or its secretary or auditor shall be conclusive proof of such annual production :
 (g) A company may vote on the appointment of sawmillers' representative by a director, officer, or servant of the company thereunto authorized by writing signed by a director, secretary, or manager of the company. A partnership shall vote by some one of its partners, and failing agreement between them the Returning Officer shall decide the choice by lot. shall decide the choice by lot.

4. (1) The Secretary of N.Z. Forest Products, Limited, shall be the Returning Officer for the first appointment of the saw-millers' representative, and shall convene the necessary meeting, conduct such ballots, and take such other steps as may be required for that appointment, and shall also convene the first meeting of

the committee. Thereafter the Secretary of the Committee shall be the Returning Officer. A Returning Officer acting under this regulation shall have power, without limitation to the generality of the powers and authorities vested in him thereby, to do and perform all or any of the following acts, matters, and things :---

- (a) He may convene any meeting by notice published once in some newspaper circulating in the district, or in such other manner as he may think fit, and may fix the time

(2) A Returning Officer shall be entitled to be indemnified out of the funds of the Committee against all costs, charges, and expenses incurred by him in and about carrying out the duties and powers imposed or conferred upon him under these regulations.
(3) The decision and determination of the Returning Officer in all matters falling within the scope of his duties and powers aforesaid shall be final and conclusive.
5. Subject to the provisions of these regulations as to resignation and forfeiture of office, a member shall hold office for five years commencing from the date of his appointment, and thereafter until his successor has been appointed. A retiring member shall be eligible for reappointment.

MEETINGS 10. The Committee shall meet for the despatch of business at such time and place as it may appoint, and a meeting may be summoned at any time by the Chairman. 11. (1) The first meeting of the Committee shall be held at a time and place to be appointed in that behalf by the Secretary of N.Z. Forest Products, Limited. For the purpose of carrying out its obligations under the Act to promote and carry out measures for the prevention, detection, control, and suppression of fires in the district the Committee may, without limitation to the generality of the powers conferred on it by the Act as the Fire Authority for the district, from time to

- (a) Establish, maintain, equip, and staff observation posts and look-outs :
- (b) Enter into arrangements, whether temporary or for some prescribed period and on such terms as to costs, ex-penses, and otherwise as it shall think proper, with forest owners, sawmillers, or other persons in respect of all or any of the matters mentioned in subclause (a) hereof, or for the supply or use of fire-fighting equipment and apparatus, vehicles, and labour:
- (c) Enter into arrangements, whether temporary or for some prescribed period and on such terms as to costs, ex-penses, and otherwise as it shall think proper, with any Department of State or with owners or proprietors of aircraft for the establishment and maintenance of aerial magnitude of the stablishment and maintenance of aerial
- aircraft for the establishment and maintenance of aerial reconsistance and patrol:
 (d) Provide and maintain telephones, broadcasting apparatus, signalling apparatus, and other means of communication:
 (e) Provide and maintain first-aid posts and equipment:
 (f) Generally, take all such other measures as the Committee may consider necessary for the prevention, detection, control, and suppression of fires, or for diminishing the danger to life and property arising from fire.

Accounts

16. (1) Proper books of account and other books shall be kept by the Committee, in which shall be entered correct records of all moneys received and paid by it. (2) All such accounts shall be subject to audit by an auditor

(2) All such accounts shall be subject to audit by an auditor duly appointed by the Committee for the purpose. At the close of each year ending on the 30th day of June the Committee shall cause to be prepared a statement showing the total receipts and expenditure of the Committee during that year, together with a balance-sheet showing its assets and liabilities, which shall be audited and certified by the auditor as to the correctness thereof. (3) Within thirty days after the close of each such year the Committee shall transmit, or cause to be transmitted, two copies of the aforesaid audited statement of receipts and expenditure and balance-sheet, together with a report of the activities of the Committee to the Minister.

Minister. (4) The Committee shall cause a copy of its estimate prepared under section 33 of the Act to be furnished to the Minister.

Administration of Funds

17. (1) All moneys received by the Committee shall be paid into such bank as the Committee may direct to the credit of an account to be called the "Oraka Rural Fire Committee Account." (2) No moneys shall be paid out of such account except by cheque signed by any two of the following persons :---

 (b) The Secretary of the Committee :
 (c) One other member of the Committee to be appointed for the purpose by the Committee.

(3) All reasonable expenses properly incurred by the Com-mittee may be paid out of moneys in the said account.

TRAVELLING-ALLOWANCES

18. It shall be lawful for the Committee, if it thinks fit, to pay to any member thereof the amount reasonably and actually ex-pended by him by way of travelling expenses in attending the meetings of the Committee or in the performance of his duties as a member thereof.

- (a) Five members shall be appointed by N.Z. Forest Products, Limited, by writing signed on behalf of that company by one director and the secretary thereof. In the event of any member of the Committee appointed as aforesaid ceasing to hold office under Regulation 7 hereof, the said company shall be entitled to fill up the vacancy, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of Regulation 9 (2) hereof:
 (b) One member (herein referred to as the remaining forest owners' representative) shall be appointed either by a resolution passed by a majority of those present at a meeting of owners (other than N.Z. Forest Products, Limited) of forests situated within the district, or by a majority vote by ballot of those present at such a meeting
 - majority vote by ballot of those present at such a meeting,
- (c) One member (herein referred to as the sawmillers' representative) shall be appointed either by a resolution passed by a majority of those present at a meeting of sawmill or logging proprietors carrying on business as such within the district, or by a majority vote by ballot of those present at such a meeting, as those so present by resolution determine.
- of those present at such a meeting, as those so present by resolution determine:
 (d) One member (herein referred to as the farmers' representative) shall be appointed either by a resolution passed by a majority of farmers present at a meeting of farmers, or by a majority vote by ballot of those present at such a meeting, as those so present by resolution determine:
 (e) One member (herein referred to as the Government representative) who may be the holder of a specified office in the Public Service shall be appointed by the Minister as representative of the New Zealand Government.

(2) In connection with the appointments to be made pursuant to paragraphs (b), (c), and (d) of subclause 1 of this regulation, the mode of voting shall be as follows :--

- (a) A company or other corporate body entitled to be present and vote at any meeting aforesaid may be present and vote by any director, officer, or servant of that company or corporate body; and his authority to be so present and vote shall be conclusively established by the production by him to the Returning Officer of an authority in writing in that behalf signed by some person purporting to be a director, secretary, or manager of such company or body corporate:
 (b) In the case of partners, joint tenants, or tenants in common, one only of such partners, joint tenants, or tenants.
- the case of partners, joint tenants, or tenants in common, one only of such partners, joint tenants, or tenants in common (as the case may be), shall be entitled to vote; and if more than one be present at a meeting held under subclause (1) of this regulation they shall agree among themselves which of them shall vote, and failing such agreement the matter shall be determined by the Returning Officer by lot.
- (c) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this subclause, every person entitled to vote shall both on a resolution and on a ballot have one vote.

4. (1) The Secretary of N.Z. Forest Products, Limited, shall be the Returning Officer for the first appointment of the remaining forest owners' representative, the sawmillers' representative, and the farmers' representative, and shall convene such meetings, conduct such ballots, and take such other steps as may be required for the first appointments, and shall also convene the first meeting of the Committee. Thereafter, the Secretary of the Committee shall be the Returning Officer.
(2) A Returning Officer acting under subclause (1) of the first secretary secre

(2) A Returning Officer acting under subclause (1) of this regulation shall have power, without limitation to the generality of the powers and authorities vested in him thereby, to do and perform all or any of the following acts, matters, and things :---

- (a) He may convene any meeting by notice published once in some newspaper circulating within the district, or in such other manner as he may think fit, and may fix
- (b) He may determine what persons are competent to vote on any resolution or ballot for the appointment of any representative or class of representative, and may act on such evidence as to ownership, title, existence of partnership or co-tenancy, and other matters as he thinks sufficient. sufficient :
- (c) He may regulate the procedure at any meeting, appoint scrutineers, and generally do all such things as he may think proper or expedient for carrying out the objects of the meeting:
 (d) He may make and keep such minutes, records, voting lists, and other material as he thinks proper.

(3) A Returning Officer shall be entitled to be indemnified out of the funds of the Committee against all costs, charges, and expenses incurred by him in and about carrying out the duties and powers imposed or conferred upon him under these regulations.
(4) The decision and determination of the Returning Officer in all matters falling within the scope of his duties and powers aforesaid shall be final and conclusive.

5. Every person appointed as a Government representative under Regulation 3 hereof shall hold office during the pleasure of the Minister, and every such appointment shall be made by noti-fication published in the *Gazette*, and shall take effect on the date of notification or such later date as may be stated therein.

6. Subject to Regulation 5 hereof and to the provisions of these regulations as to resignation and forfeiture of office, a member shall hold office for five years commencing from the date of his appointment, and thereafter until his successor has been appointed. A retiring member shall be eligible for reappointment.

7. The office of a member of the Committee shall become vacant and the vacancy shall be deemed to be a casual vacancy if the member-

- (a) Dies; or
 (b) Resigns his office by writing under his hand delivered to the Secretary or Chairman of the Committee; or
 (c) Becomes a bankrupt or makes any composition with his creditors for less than twenty shillings in the pound or makes an assignment of his estate for the benefit of his creditors: or
- makes an assignment of his estate for the benent of his creditors; or
 (d) Becomes of unsound mind; or
 (e) Is convicted on indictment or is sentenced by the Supreme Court on a plea of "guilty" to any charge of an indictable offence, or is sentenced by any Court for any offence to imprisonment without the option of a fine or to reformative detention under any Act; or
 (f) Is absent without leave from three consecutive meetings of

- (f) Is absent without leave from three consecutive meetings of the Committee; or
 (g) Acts in contravention of Regulation 8 hereof; or
 (h) Being a director, officer, or servant of an incorporated company which has taken part in his appointment to the Committee ceases to hold office or employment under that company.

8. A member of the Committee shall not vote or take part in the discussion of any matter before the Committee in which he may receive remuneration from the Committee in the terms of any contract or as salary or wages, or as the rent or hire of property or equipment.

9. (1) Every casual vacancy shall be filled by the appointment by the Committee of some fit person representing the interest affected to the Committee for the residue of the term for which the member whose office has become vacant was appointed :

Provided always that in the case of an appointment to fill a casual vacancy in the office of the Government representative on the Committee, the appointment shall be made by the Minister; and, provided further, that if the member whose office has become vacant was at the time of his appointment to the Committee a director, officer, or servant of an incorporated company which took part in his appointment, the casual vacancy shall be filled by an appointment made by that company and not by the Committee: Committee :

(2) In any case where a casual vacancy has not been filled within a period of three months, the Minister may appoint to the Committee some fit person to represent the interest affected for the residue of the term for which the member whose office has become vacant was appointed.

10. The powers of the Committee shall not be affected by any vacancy in the membership thereof, nor shall the proceedings of the Committee be invalidated by reason only of the subsequent discovery that some defect existed in the appointment of any member or that any person acting as a member was not validly a member thereof.

MEETINGS

11. The Committee shall meet for the despatch of business at such time and place as it may appoint, and a meeting may be summoned at any time by the Chairman.

12. The Minister may direct a meeting to be convened at any time, and thereupon a meeting shall be so held.

13. (1) The first meeting of the Committee shall be held at a time and place to be appointed in that behalf by the Secretary of N.Z. Forest Products, Limited.

(2) At the first meeting the Committee shall appoint one of its members to be Chairman.

(3) The Chairman shall preside at every meeting of the Committee at which he is present. In the absence of the Chairman from any meeting of the Committee the members present shall select one of their number to be the Chairman of that meeting.

(4) Subject to the provisions of these regulations, the Committee may make such arrangements as it thinks fit for the holding of its meetings, the procedure thereat, and generally for the conduct of its business and the exercise of its functions.

(5) At all meetings of the Committee five members shall form a quorum, and no business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum is present.

(6) The Chairman at any meeting of the Committee may exercise a deliberative vote, and, in the case of an equality of votes, a casting vote.

(7) If any member of the Committee is unable to attend any meeting of the Committee, he may, by writing under his hand or by telegram or by notification by telephone to the Secretary of the Committee, appoint any person to attend that meeting in his stead, and that person shall for all the purposes of that meeting have the same rights and privileges as his appointor would have been capable of exercising and enjoying had he been personally present thereat.

SEAL

14. (1) The seal of the Committee shall be kept in the custody of the Chairman, or of such member or officer of the Committee as it may appoint for the purpose. (2) The seal of the Committee shall not be affixed to any

document except by the authority of a resolution of the Committee and in the presence of two members of the Committee and the Secretary, all of whom shall attest the sealing of the document.

OFFICERS

(1) The Committee may from time to time appoint some fit and proper person to be the Secretary of the Committee, and may at any time remove any person so appointed.
(2) The Secretary of the Committee shall be deemed to be the servant of the Committee, and may receive such salary or other remuneration and allowances as the Committee shall determine.
(3) The position of Secretary may be held conjointly with any other position either as a servant of the Committee or otherwise.
(4) The Secretary shall keep all the necessary records and books of account, and shall have such powers and other duties as the Committee shall determine.

Committee shall determine, and he shall at all times conform to the directions of the Committee.

(5) The Committee may from time to time appoint such other officers and workmen as are necessary and expedient for the proper carrying out of its business, and may pay them such salaries, wages, or other remuneration and allowances as the Committee may determine.

Powers of Committee With Regard to Fire

16. For the purpose of carrying out its obligations under the Act to promote and carry out measures for the prevention, detection, control, and suppression of fires in the district the Committee may, without limitation to the generality of the powers conferred on it by the Act as the Fire Authority for the district, from time to time

- (a) Establish, maintain, equip, and staff observation posts and look-outs :
- (b) Enter into arrangements, whether temporary or for some prescribed period and on such terms as to costs, expenses, and otherwise as it shall think proper, with forest owners, sawmillers, or other persons in respect of all or any of the matters mentioned in subclause (α) hereof, or for the supply or use of fire-fighting equipment and appara-ture while a not be an an apparatus, vehicles, and labour
- tus, vehicles, and labour:
 (c) Enter into arrangements, whether temporary or for some prescribed period and on such terms as to costs, expenses, and otherwise as it shall think proper, with any Department of State or with owners or proprietors of aircraft for the establishment and maintenance of aerial reconnissance and patrol:
 (d) Provide and maintain telephones, broadcasting apparatus, signalling apparatus, and other means of communication:
 (e) Provide and maintain first-aid posts and equipment:
 (f) Generally take all such other measures as the Committee may consider necessary for the prevention, detection, control, and suppression of fires, or for diminishing the danger to life and property arising from fire.
- - danger to life and property arising from fire.

ACCOUNTS

17. (1) Proper books of account and other books shall be kept by the Committee, in which shall be entered correct records of all moneys received and paid by it.

(2) All such accounts shall be subject to audit by an auditor duly appointed by the Committee for the purpose. At the close of each year ending on the 30th day of June the Committee shall cause to be prepared a statement showing the total receipts and expenditure of the Committee during that year, together with a balance-sheet showing its assets and liabilities, which shall be audited and certified by the auditor as to the correctness thereof.
(3) Within thirty days after the close of each such year the Committee shall transmit, or cause to be transmitted, two copies of the aforesaid audited statement of receipts and expenditure and balance-sheet, together with a report of the activities of the Committee to the Minister. (2) All such accounts shall be subject to audit by an auditor

(4) The Committee shall cause a copy of its estimate prepared under section 33 of the Act to be furnished to the Minister.

Administration of Funds

18. (1) All moneys received by the Committee shall be paid into such bank as the Committee may direct to the credit of an account to be called the "Tokoroa Rural Fire Committee Account." (2) No moneys shall be paid out of such account except by cheque signed by any two of the following persons :---

(a) The Chairman of the Committee :
(b) The Secretary of the Committee :
(c) One other member of the Committee to be appointed for the purpose by the Committee.

(5) All reasonable expenses properly incurred by the Committee may be paid out of moneys in the said account.

TRAVELLING-ALLOWANCES

19. It shall be lawful for the Committee, if it thinks fit, to pay to any member thereof the amount reasonably and actually expended by him by way of travelling expenses in attending the meetings of the Committee or in the performance of his duties as a member thereof.

And whereas the said body corporate has passed a resolution consenting to such revocation, and has in all respects complied with the provisions of subsections three and four of the said section seven of the said Act :

Now, therefore, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Frey-berg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do berg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby give notice, pursuant to subsection two of section seven of the said Act, that it is my intention to issue an Order in Council under the provisions of subsection one (b) of the said section seven revoking the reservation for recreation purposes over the land described in the Schedule hereto, and declaring that the said land may be disposed of by the said body corporate by way of sale by public auction or private contract at such price and on such terms and conditions as the said body corporate shall determine, but so that the proceeds of any such sale shall be used and applied in or towards the purchase of other land for recreation purposes.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR OCTOBER, 1948 *General.*—Changeable westerly weather prevailed throughout October, except in the first week. There were no settled spells, and frequent rain over the greater part of the country has delayed farming operations. East of the ranges, on the other hand, growth of cereals and pastures has been checked by a combination of low rainfall and strong drying winds. In the north, early vegetables were in some cases badly affected by blight. *Rainfall.*—East of the ranges from Napier southwards to Central Otago rainfall was below normal, totals being less than half in the coastal districts of Canterbury. Nelson, Mariborough, and the eastern part of the Auckland Peninula had small deficiencies. Thus, over the greater part of the country the rainfall was above normal. Totals reached double the normal in an area south-east of Auckland City. *Températures.*—Mean temperatures were about one degree above normal in the Auckland Province; elsewhere the month, as a which, was slightly cooler than usual. On the Canterbury coast, however, several very warm days towards the end of the month helped to carry the mean temperature a little above normal. In Timaru and Dunedin the maximum temperature on the 28th was the highest recorded in any October since 1914. *Sunshine.*—East of the ranges the duration of bright sunshine was, in general, above normal; also in Nelson and Marlborough. Only in parts of Hawke's Bay and South Canterbury was the excess as much as twenty hours. Elsewhere, totals failed to reach the average by small amounts, except in Taranaki, where the deficiency was over thirty hours. *Weather Sequence.*—A coid front which had moved rapidly northwards during the night of the 1st slowed up and became stationary over the Auckland District. Under the influence of a deep depression advancing slowly castwards across the Tasman Sea, rain became general and persisten

pressure gave a temporary clearance on the 11th. Two depressions then moved rapidly south-eastwards past Southland. The trough associated with the first arrived from the west on the night of the 12th and passed away beyond East Cape thirty-six hours later. After a very brief clearance the second trough reached Southland on the morning of the 15th. A secondary cold front following a day later passed off to the north-east on the afternoon of the 17th. Pressures remained relatively high to the north, while a series of deep south-eastward-moving depressions passed in succession to the south of the Dominion. Boisterous westerly conditions continued until the end of the month. Rain was frequent and often heavy, especially in and west of the South Island ranges. Of the associated troughs those which moved across on the 19th and 23rd were particularly active, being accompanied by gales and widespread thunderstorms. During their passage some brief rain penetrated to the Canterbury and Hawke's Bay Plains, but otherwise the weather there remained fair. Towards the end of the month day temperatures became very warm east of the ranges. the ranges.
