Amending a Licence Authorizing the Otago Electric-power Board to
Use Electric Lines Within the Otago Electric-power District and Outer Area

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, and the Electric-PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, and the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend, as set forth in the Schedule hereto, the Order in Council dated the tenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and published in the Gazette on the thirteenth day of the same month, authorizing the Otago Electric-power Board to use electric lines within the Otago Electric-power District and the outer area of such district.

SCHEDULE

1. CLAUSE 1 of the Schedule to the said Order in Council is hereby deleted, and the following clause is substituted therefor:-

"1. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

"Bulk supply, at a nominal pressure of 11,000 volts between phases, shall be received from the State Hydro-electric Department's substations situated at Palmerston and at Milton, or from such other additional point or points of supply as may be mutually arranged between the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department and the ligonese. Department and the licensee.

Department and the licensee.

"The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (h) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The transmission voltage shall be approximately 33,000 volts between phases. The primary distribution voltages shall be 11,000 volts between phases and 6,600 volts between phases. The voltage of the series street-lighting system shall not exceed 600 volts."

2. Clause 4 of the Schedule to the said Order in Council is hereby deleted, and the following clause is substituted therefor:

"4. CHARGES ON SALE

"The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 6d. per unit for all purposes, provided that if accounts are paid by due date a cash discount of 10 per centum shall be allowed.

"The licensee may make such minimum charge or charges as may from time to time be authorized by the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department.

" For every time-switch used to control domestic or commercial water-heating, the licensee may charge a rental not exceeding six shillings (6s.) per four-monthly period."

Authorizing Edward William Low, of Longford, Murchison, Farmer, to Use Water for the Purpose of Generating Electricity and to Erect Certain Electric Lines

DURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to Edward William Low, of Longford, Murchison, Farmer (hereinafter referred to as the icensee), a licence, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of an unnamed stream (hereinafter referred to as the said stream), situated in Section 6, Block XIII, Matiri Survey District, and to take and use therefrom for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding two cubic feet per second at any one time, and to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines hereinafter described. described.

CONDITIONS

1. Implied Conditions

The conditions to be implied in all licences by the Water-power Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

This licence is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. Utilization of Water and Location of Headworks

Water shall be used under this licence solely for the purpose of water shall be used under this hence solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the said stream at a point in Section 6, Block XIII, Matiri Survey District, as indicated on the plan marked S.H.D. 51, deposited in the office of the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

PURSUANT to the Forest and Rural Fires Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute and declare the areas described in the Schedule hereto to be a rural fire district, to be known as the "Tuwharetoa Rural Fire District"; and doth hereby specify the trees and other plants situated on the lands in the said areas as the property for the protection of which the district is constituted; and doth hereby further specify the period between the first day of October in any one year and the thirtieth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive) as a thirtieth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive) as a closed fire season in the said district; and doth hereby further declare that this Order in Council shall come into force, and that the Tuwharetoa Rural Fire District shall become a rural fire district, on the day following publication of this Order in Council in the Gazette; and doth hereby prescribe that the said district shall be administered for the purposes of the said Act by a rural fire committee which shall be known as the Tuwharetoa Rural Fire Committee, and with respect to the said Rural Fire Committee doth hereby make the following regulations.

- 2. The Rural Fire Committee Regulations 1949, shall, so far as they are applicable, and with the necessary modifications, apply to the Tuwharetoa Rural Fire Committee constituted by these regulations, and these regulations shall be deemed to be special regulations for the purposes of those regulations.

MEMBERS

- 3. The Committee shall consist of nine members, who shall be appointed in the following manner:-
 - (a) Three members (herein referred to as the Government representatives), who may be the holders of specified offices in the Public Service, shall be appointed by the Minister as representatives of the New Zealand Government. One of the Government representatives shall be an officer of the State Forest Service; one shall be an officer of the Department of Maori Affairs; and one shall be an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey. They shall represent the forest, land development, and other interests of the said Act the Government representations. the purposes of the said Act the Government representatives shall be deemed to represent the Crown as owner of land on which is situated property for the protection of which the Tuwharetoa Rural Fire District is constituted :
 - (b) Four members (herein referred to as the Maori representatives) shall be appointed by a resolution at a meeting of Maori forest owners, which shall be summoned and shall follow the procedure prescribed for a meeting of assembled owners in Part XVIII of the Maori Land Act, 1931:

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

6. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any cow covers to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to specified lot or consignment of cow covers or may relate generally to all cow covers to which this Order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force. approval remains in force.
