Constitution of Rural Fire District

B. C. FREYBERG, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 6th day of April, 1949

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Forest and Rural Fires Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute and declare the area described in the First Schedule hereto to be a rural fire district, to be known as the "Matahina Rural Fire District"; and doth hereby specify the trees and other plants situated on the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto as the property for the protection of which the district is constituted; and doth hereby further specify the period between the first day of October in any one year and the thirtieth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive) as a closed fire season in the said district; and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into

force, and that the Matahina Rural Fire District shall become a rural fire district, on the day following publication of this Order in Council in the *Gazette*; and doth hereby prescribe that the said district shall be administered for the purposes of the said Act by a rural fire committee, which shall be known as the "Matahina Rural Fire Committee," and, with respect to the said Rural Fire Committee, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,-

 - "Act" means the Forest and Rural Fires Act, 1947:
 "Committee" means the Matahina Rural Fire Committee constituted by these regulations:
 "District" means the Matahina Rural Fire District:
 "Farmer" means the occupier of land within the district, the whole or substantially the whole of which is used by him for farming purposes:
 "Minister" means the Commissioner of State Forests.
- 2. The Rural Fire Committee Regulations 1949, shall, so far as they are applicable, and with the necessary modifications, apply to the Matahina Rural Fire Committee constituted by these regulations and these regulations shall be deemed to be special regulations for the purpose of those regulations.

MEMBERS

- 3. The Committee shall consist of five members, who shall be appointed in the following manner:—
 - (a) Two members shall be appointed by Whakatane Board
 Mills, Limited, as agent for Timberlands Woodpulp
 Extended, Limited, Timberlands Woodpulp Development, Limited, and Timberlands Woodpulp Estates,
 Limited, by writing signed on behalf of that company
 by one director and the secretary thereof. In the event
 of any member of the Committee appointed as aforesaid
 ceasing to hold office, the said company shall be entitled
 to fill up the vacancy, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of the Rural Fire Committee Regulations 1949:

 (b) One member (herein referred to as the remaining forest owners' representative) shall be appointed either by a resolution passed by a majority of those present at a meeting of owners of forests on lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, or by a majority vote by ballot of those present at such a meeting, as those so present by resolution determine:
 - by resolution determine:

 (c) One member (herein referred to as the sawmillers' representative) shall be appointed either by a resolution passed by a majority of those present at a meeting of sawmill or logging proprietors carrying on business as such within the district, or by a majority vote by ballot of those present at such a meeting, as those so present by resolution determine:
 - (d) One member (herein referred to as the farmers' representative) shall be appointed either by a resolution passed by a majority of farmers present at a meeting of farmers, or by a majority vote by ballot of those present at such a meeting as those so present by resolution determine.
- 4. The General Manager, Whakatane Board Mills, Limited, shall be the Returning Officer for the first appointment of the remaining forest owners' representative, and the sawmillers' representative, and shall convene such meetings, conduct such ballots, and take such other steps as may be required for the first appointments, and shall also convene the first meeting of the Committee. Thereafter, the Secretary of the Committee shall be the Returning

"3. The master of every vessel, upon the completion of the loading or discharge of his vessel shall at once remove his vessel and vacate the berth occupied by the vessel unless he has received permission from the wharfinger to delay such removal.

"4. The payment of a berthage rate shall not be deemed to give the master of a vessel the right to keep such vessel at a wharf.

"5. No berthage rates shall be charged the master of a vessel for Saturdays, Sundays, or for statutory holidays observed by the Council, provided, however, that if any master of a vessel works cargo or embarks or discharges passengers on a Saturday, Sunday, or statutory holiday, then the master or owner of such vessel shall pay the ordinary berthage rates.

"THIRD SCHEDULE

- "REGULATIONS FOR THE USE OF THE WHARF
- "6. In these regulations, unless there is something in the context inconsistent therewith or repugnant thereto—
 - "'' Council' shall mean the Takaka County Council; "'' Harbour' shall mean the Harbour of Waitapu; and
 - "'Vessel' shall mean the Harbour of Waltapu; and
 "'Vessel' shall include any description of vessel, whether
 used in navigation or in any way kept or used as a
 hulk or storeship or for any other purpose and not
 propelled exclusively by oars in the harbour of Waltapu.
- "7. Masters of vessels lying alongside the wharf shall be responsible for all damage caused to goods lying on such wharf by water used for washing down the decks or for any other purpose upon such vessel.
- "8. The Council shall not be responsible for the wrong or nondelivery of goods which are erroneously or deficiently marked, or which have old or imperfectly erased marks thereon.
- "9. All goods in respect of which the Council elects not to supply labour, or which shall not be tallied by the Council, shall not be deemed for any purposes to be in the custody of the Council as wharfinger, nor shall the Council be responsible for their safe keeping, or for any damage or loss that may accrue to such goods in any manner whatsoever.
- "10. Any person landing goods on the wharf or bringing goods on to the wharf for shipment shall place such goods as the wharfinger may direct, and no person shall place any goods or other articles in any shed so as to be an impediment to the approach or an obstacle to the removal of other goods from such wharf or shed, or so as to encumber the mooring-posts.
- "11. No person shall embark, disembark, ship, or unship any ballast, timber, coal, produce, or cargo of any description except at such times and place and in such order or mode as may be directed and deemed expedient by the wharfinger for the proper working of the wharf.
- "12. No person shall deposit ballast, coal, coke, or other fuel on the wharf or in the sheds without special permission of the wharfinger.
- "13. The Council shall not be responsible for the safe custody of packages containing acids, chemicals, or other dangerous goods.
- "14. The time allowed to masters of vessels carrying full cargoes to occupy berths at the wharf for the purpose of discharging or loading shall be, exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays, statutory holidays, and the day of removal:—
- "15. The master of a vessel taking in ballast shall be allowed one day for every 50 tons of ballast loaded, unless special permission shall be obtained from the Council for the master to remain longer.
- "16. Cargo landed without the permission of the wharfinger first obtained shall not be deemed to be in the custody of the Council, nor shall the Council be responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to such cargo by the elements or otherwise.
- "17. The master, owner, or agent of every vessel shall give to the wharfinger, or other person deputed by the Council, a copy of the bill of lading, freight list, or manifest of cargo, or other proper account of all goods intended to be shipped on board or unshipped from the vessel, and the name or names of the owners, consignors, or consignees by whom any such goods are shipped or unshipped by such vessel, and from whom such goods are received or are intended to be delivered.
- "18. Shippers and consignees of all goods shipped from or landed on the wharf shall, before shipping or landing such goods, deliver to the wharfinger a full account of all such goods, stating the respective weights or measurements of the same accordingly as freight is payable thereon.
- "19. It shall not be lawful, without the consent of the Secretary of the Council in writing first had and obtained, for any person to ship, unship, or land any goods into or out of or from any vessel within the harbour, except at wharves vested in the Council or at wharves or landing-places which may be appointed from time to time by the Council for such purpose.
- "20. Tame cattle may be landed on or shipped from any wharf subject to the approval of the wharfinger, who shall fix the time at which such cattle must be shipped or landed. Other cattle may be landed on or shipped at such times and places as the wharfinger may from time to time direct.
- "21. All goods of a dangerous and inflammable character shall be removed by the owner, agent, or consignee immediately on being landed, and such owner, agent, or consignee failing to do so shall be responsible for any damage or loss that may accrue from any accident arising therefrom, in addition to being liable to the penalty provided for breach of the regulations, and the Council shall not be responsible for any damage or loss which may accrue to such goods.
- "22. The master of every vessel arriving at the port with kerosene or other material of an inflammable nature on board may land such inflammable goods on the wharf for carting to the town or for transhipment provided such inflammable goods are removed forthwith. In no case will any person be permitted to store such goods on the wharf.

- "23. No person shall discharge or land on the wharf or place in any shed any goods or articles of any description which, in the opinion of the wharfinger, are likely to occasion damage to the wharf or shed connected therewith.
- "24. Any vegetable or animal matter or goods which are in a state of decay or which, in the opinion of the wharfinger, are unfit to remain on the wharf or are harmful to other goods stored on the wharf may be removed from the wharf at the expense of the owner or consignees.
- "25. Any person landing goods, other than perishable products, on the wharf shall remove therefrom or store such perishable products during the business hours of the Council. Perishable products may be placed upon the wharf before or after the business hours of the Council at the risk of the consignees, but the Council will not hold itself responsible in any way for the safety of such perishable products.
- "26. The wharfinger is empowered to take charge of and store cargo and goods if not removed from any wharf by the consignee within the time allotted for the purpose, or cause the same to be delivered to the consignee at his risk and expense.
- "27. The Council shall not be bound to find storage room either in the shed or on the wharf when, in the opinion of the wharfinger, no sufficient accommodation is available. After notification to the owners, shippers, or consignees of any goods or to the vessel's agent that room is not available, the Council shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to the goods by the elements or otherwise during the time such goods may remain on the wharf.
- "28. The Council will not be responsible for any damage sustained by goods while in their custody by fire or by water used in extinguishing fire, or by vermin, unless in case of proved negligence on the part of the Council or its servants.
- "29. No person shall be allowed on the wharf or in the sheds or buildings used therewith unless such person has, in the opinion of the wharfinger, legitimate business thereon.
- "30. The wharfinger shall have the power to close the wharf or any portion thereof whenever in his opinion it is advisable to do so.
- "31. No person shall disobey the orders of the wharfinger when acting in the due performance of his duty, nor in any way obstruct the traffic on the wharf.
- "32. Every boatman, stevedore, porter, carter, cab-driver, motor-driver, or any person employed on the wharf shall be under the control and shall obey the orders of the wharfinger.
- $\lq\lq$ 33. No child of tender years shall be allowed on the wharf unless accompanied by an adult.
- "34. No person shall scribble upon, cut, scratch, or otherwise deface any part of the wharf or any shed thereon or connected therewith.
- "35. All complaints against the wharfinger or any person under his direction must be made in writing to the Chairman of the Council and a copy of each complaint shall first be furnished to the wharfinger.
- "36. No person taking a vehicle on the wharf shall allow such vehicle to be driven at a greater than a walking pace.
- "37. All persons in charge of vehicles, whether for the conveyance of passengers or goods or otherwise shall, when on the wharf or its approaches be under the control of the wharfinger; and such persons shall immediately upon being so ordered by the wharfinger remove such vehicles to any part of the wharf or its approaches to which he may be directed, or shall, if so desired by the wharfinger, remove such vehicle altogether from the wharf, but the wharfinger shall not order such removal without reasonable cause.
- "38. Any person who accidentally or otherwise damages or destroys any of the Council's property shall be liable for the cost of repair or renewal thereof.
- "39. The ordinary business hours of the Council upon the wharf shall be from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., Mondays to Fridays inclusive. Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays are excepted.
- "40. The cost over and above the ordinary cost of day work of all labour, including the wharfinger, during any hours not being ordinary business hours of the Council as above defined, shall be paid by the master or owner of the vessel in addition to the usual charge.
- "41. The following days shall be observed as holidays by the Council and its officers—namely, New Year's Day, 2nd January, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.
- "42. Consignees shall be liable for all wharfage and other charges on all inward cargo, shippers shall be liable for all wharfage and other charges on all outward cargo. All charges shall be paid to the Council at the time of receiving and shipping.
- "43. The Council shall appoint the wharfinger and all other persons necessary for the working of the wharf.
- "44. If any person fails or refuses or neglects to do anything required by these regulations to be done, observed, or performed, or in any manner obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of any thing enjoined, required, or authorized to be done, or wilfully does anything prohibited by these regulations, every such person in each and every case so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds."

Notes on the Weather for March, 1949

Notes on the Weather for March, 1949

General.—The first half of March was mild and peaceful. Cold, unsettled weather followed the passage of a cyclonic depression on the 19th, but conditions improved again towards the end of the month. Taken as a whole, it was a favourable month. Harvesting suffered little interruption, except in Otago and Southland; while rainfall was sufficient to promote satisfactory growth of pastures.

Rainfall.—Totals were above normal in the far north, in eastern Coromandel, from the Waikato to the Manawatu, over a portion of North Canterbury, and in Otago and Southland. In the Otago Lakes District the rainfall was about three times the normal. Some stations in this region experienced their wettest month for over twenty-five years. Most of this rain fell on the 18th and 19th and established a number of new records for a two-day rainfall. Much damage was caused by slips and washouts.

Although rainfall was below average elsewhere, the deficiency was of little consequence, except in parts of the Gisborne District and near the Kaikouras.

Temperatures.—Over the first part of the month temperatures were mild, but a cold spell followed after the 22nd. The result was that mean temperatures were generally about 1° F. below normal. A slight positive departure was, however, recorded in the far north. Frosts occurred over the South Island on the 8th, while the 28th was a very cold night in both islands.

Sunshine.—Over the greater part of Canterbury, Marlborough, and Wellington the duration of bright sunshine was at least an hour a day above the average. The Nelson and Buller districts had a moderate surplus. Elsewhere totals were near the average, except for a deficiency of some thirty hours in Taranaki and North Auckland.

Weather Sequence.—During the first two days a weak cold front proceeded slowly northwards, producing brief rain in eastern and northern districts. It remained cloudy and rather unsettled in the far north, but fine, though cooler, weather prevailed elsewhere as an anticyclone built up over the South Island.

Heavy rain accompanied an active cold front which moved rapidly from the south on the 7th until its progress was arrested over North

Heavy rain accompanied an active cold front which moved rapidly from the south on the 7th until its progress was arrested over North Auckland. For several days rain fell intermittently in the Auckland Province as the front oscillated back and forth. Heavy falls on the 7th and 8th caused some local flooding about the Coromandel Peninsula. Elsewhere the weather had cleared rapidly with the approach of an intense anticyclone from the South Tasman Sea. Some light frosts were reported in the South. The centre of this system crossed to the east of Canterbury during the 9th.

On the 12th another anticyclone, preceded by a weak cold front, advanced on to the Dominion from the South Tasman. Apart from light falls in the Gisborne and Bay of Plenty districts rainfall from this front was negligible. Morning fogs were widespread on the 13th and 14th. As the anticyclone moved slowly away to the north-east, warm north-westerly winds prevailed. Rain set in on the 15th along the west coast of the South Island, while scattered light rains affected other western districts and Southland during the passage of a weak

the west coast of the South Island, while scattered light rains affected other western districts and Southland during the passage of a weak disturbance in the far south.

Early on the 19th barometers fell very sharply with the approach of a rapidly deepening cyclone from the Tasman Sea. Winds in many places increased to a strong gale and heavy rains caused some flooding in Central and Western Otago. After crossing mid-Canterbury during the same afternoon, the cyclone sped away to the south-east. The weather cleared rapidly, but rain soon developed again in the north, as the front associated with the cyclone returned southwards to the Auckland Peninsula.

A further period of fairly general rain was associated with the passage of a deep disturbance in the far south on the 21st. Cool southwesterlies and showery weather prevailed. Temperatures became much colder on the 23rd following the passage of a secondary cold front which produced widespread hail and thunderstorms. With barometers remaining low to the south-east and an anticyclone stationary over the western Tasman Sea, showery south-westerly conditions continued. There were, however, substantial periods of fair weather in sheltered districts. Although temperatures had been rising gradually, there was another sharp drop on the 27th when the anticyclone began to move eastwards towards New Zealand. Winds turned southerly and frequent wintry showers were reported in most districts.

There was a gradual clearance during the 28th, and sharp frosts occurred that night in both islands. Apart from further brief showers in the Gisborne District fine weather continued until the anticyclone had passed off to the east. Skies clouded over during the 31st and rain developed on the West Coast as a trough approached from the west.
