WHEREAS it is provided by the one-hundred-and-sixty-eighth section of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called the said Act), that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, authorize any local authority or Harbour Board to reclaim from the sea areas not exceeding five acres in extent in any case where he considers that the reclamation will not affect navigation and is for the benefit of the public:

And whereas the Picton Borough Council (hereinafter called the Council) is desirous of reclaiming from the sea certain land at Picton in Queen Charlotte Sound, and the said reclamation is of such a nature as aforesaid, and the Council has applied to the Governor-General in Council for an order authorizing the execution of the said harbour-works:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and is for the benefit of the public:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize and empower the Council to reclaim from the sea at Picton in Queen Charlotte Sound, the land shown edged in red on plan marked M.D. 8896, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, such reclamation to be carried out and constructed in accordance with plan marked M.D. 8896, subject to the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas it is deemed expedient to give effect to the final scheme and to make supplementary provisions for giving full effect to such scheme:

Price Order No. 1029 (Amendment No. 3 of Price Order No. 872) (Seed Potatoes)

PURSUANT to the Control of Price Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1029, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 872* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1949.

3. (1) Price Order No. 891† is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

4. The principal Order is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By adding after clause 3 the following clause:—

“3A. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received for the sacks in which any lot of potatoes to which this Order applies are packed shall be computed as follows:—

“For cornsacks of a size 48 in. by 26½ in., 46 in. by 26½ in., 44 in. by 26½ in., 46 in. by 23 in., or 41 in. by 23 in.: At the rate of 32s. 6d. per ton of potatoes for sacks certified by an official grader appointed by the New Zealand Grain, Seed, and Produce Merchants' Federation as new sacks or at the rate of 28s. 6d. per ton of potatoes for sacks not so certified:

“For fertilizer sacks of a size 40 in. by 24 in.: At the rate of 12s. per ton of potatoes.

(2) Where any potatoes to which this Order applies are packed in sacks the maximum price that may be charged or received for the potatoes shall be computed on the gross weight of the potatoes and the sacks.”

(b) By inserting, after the word “distributor” in paragraph (a) of subclause (1) of clause 10, and after the word “person” in paragraph (a) of subclause (1) of clause 12, the words “for the potatoes and for the sacks.”

(c) By omitting the table to subclause (2) of clause 12 and substituting the following table:—

(c) By omitting the figures "0 5½, 0 5½, 0 6, and 0 6½" where they appear in the respective columns under the heading "Second Grade" opposite the words "Boned beef—all grades" in relation to joints and cuts from "Other cow" and substituting the figures "0 5½, 0 6½, 0 6½, and 0 6½" respectively, and by inserting opposite the said boned beef in the column headed "Frozen Meat" the figure "0 6½".

(d) By inserting in Column C under the heading "Third Grade" in relation to the carcass weight of wether and maiden ewes, the price "0 5½" where the weight of the carcass is 48 lb. and under, and the price "0 5½" where the weight of the carcass is over 48 lb. but not over 56 lb.

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1025, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 952* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 4th day of July, 1949.

3. Clause 6 of the principal Order is hereby amended by revoking subclause (4) and substituting the following subclause:—

"(4) Where sugar is delivered in a lot of less than a half-ton or where sugar is delivered with golden syrup or treacle and the combined weight of the sugar, golden syrup, or treacle so delivered is less than a half-ton the maximum price of the sugar in any such lot shall be the price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause increased as follows:—

- "(a) Where there is one bag of sugar in the lot: By 1s. 8d. per bag;
- "(b) Where the number of bags of sugar in the lot is more than one but not more than seven: By 1s. 4d. per bag;
- "(c) Where the number of bags of sugar in the lot is more than seven but not more than fifteen: By 1s. per bag."

(Main Crop Potatoes)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1026, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 978* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1949.

3. (1) This Order applies with respect to all potatoes which, being subject to the principal Order, are sold by a grower for delivery at any time after the commencement of this Order and on or before the 30th day of November, 1949.

(2) For the purposes of this Order no potatoes sold on the basis of f.o.b.s.e. or f.o.r.s.e. shall be deemed to be delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order if—

- (a) In the case of sales f.o.b.s.e. the vessel on which the potatoes are laden leaves the port of shipment at any time before midnight on the 30th day of June, 1949; or
- (b) In the case of sales f.o.r.s.e. the trucks on which the potatoes are laden leave the grower's station at any time before midnight of the said date.

(3) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, potatoes sold f.o.b.s.e. or f.o.r.s.e. shall be deemed to be delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order notwithstanding that they may have been actually laden on board any vessel or trucks before the commencement of this Order.

MODIFICATION OF PRINCIPAL ORDER WITH RESPECT TO POTATOES THAT ARE SUBJECT TO THIS ORDER

4. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the principal Order the maximum price that may be charged by any grower for any potatoes to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the following scale, namely:—

(a) For Sutton's Supreme, Red Dakota, or King Edward potatoes grown in the South Island and sold for delivery—

Price Order No. 1030 (Tires and Tubes)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1030, and shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1949.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

2. This Order applies with respect to all new tires and new tubes whether imported into New Zealand or manufactured in New Zealand of the kind described in the Schedule hereto.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES OF GOODS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wholesalers' Prices

3. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received at any place in New Zealand by any wholesaler for any tires or tubes to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price specified in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The maximum wholesale prices specified in the said Schedule shall be reduced by a discount equal to 5 per cent. thereof where payment is made on or before the 20th day of the calendar month next following the calendar month in which delivery is made by the wholesaler.

(3) The maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are exclusive of sales-tax.

Fixing Special Prices for Sales to Local Authorities

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum price that may be charged or received by any person for any tires or tubes sold to a local authority shall be the appropriate wholesale price (including discount) specified in the Schedule hereto increased by an amount equal to 24.32 per cent. of that price.

(2) The maximum price fixed in the preceding subclause is inclusive of sales-tax and is not subject to any discount.

Retailers' Prices

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum price that may be charged or received at any place in New Zealand by a retailer for any tires or tubes to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price specified in the Schedule hereto.

(2) With respect to tires the maximum prices specified in the said Schedule shall be reduced by the amount of the discount specified in the Schedule where payment is made on or before the 20th day of the calendar month next following the calendar month in which delivery is made by the retailer.

(3) With respect to tubes the maximum prices specified in the said Schedule are not subject to any discount.

(4) With respect to car tires the maximum prices fixed as aforesaid are inclusive of the cost of fitting the tires.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorize special prices in respect of any tires or tubes to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of tires or tubes or may relate generally to all tires or tubes to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.
