Suspending the Operations of Certain Statutes in Connection with the New Zealand Industries Fair

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 6th day of July, 1949

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Exhibitions Act, 1910 (hereinafter called the said Act), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the holding of a public exhibition of works of industry and art to be conducted by the Auckland Manufacturers' Association (Incorporated) in the Bledisloe Hall and adjoining Exhibition Buildings, Hamilton, from the eighteenth day of October to the twenty-fourth day of October (inclusive), one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, and to be known as the New Zealand Industries Fair; and doth hereby declare the said exhibition to be an exhibition within the meaning of the said Act, and doth hereby suspend, subject, however, to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto, all the provisions of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, the Factories Act, 1946, and the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and of all awards and industrial agreements in force under the last-named Act, in so far as such provisions relate to the hours of commencing or ceasing work or to the issue of permits for overtime or extended hours, or to holidays or half-holidays, or to the closing of shops to any person, and so far as such provisions relate to hours of work done or business conducted or service carried out, in, or upon the premises aforesaid during the period aforesaid by or on behalf of the bodies conducting the said exhibition, or by or on behalf of any exhibitor of works of industry or art at the said exhibition, or by any person employed in or about the said exhibition.

SCHEDULE

1. EIGHT hours shall constitute a day's work in or about the exhibition, and, with the exception set out in clause 2 hereof, such hours shall be worked consecutively.

2. No person shall be employed in or about the exhibition for more than four hours without an interval of at least three-quarters of an hour for a meal.

3. Any person employed during any day in or about the exhibition who is employed on such day in excess of eight hours, or before the hour of 8 a.m., or after the hour of 10.30 p.m. (whether such excess employment is in or about the exhibition or otherwise), shall be paid for such excess employment at not less than one-half as much again as the ordinary rate for the first two hours and at not less than twice the ordinary rate thereafter, and any person employed in or about the exhibition on any day that would, but for the provisions of this Order in Council, have been a whole holiday for such person by virtue of any Act or of any award or industrial agreement, shall be paid for all work done on such day at not less than twice the ordinary rate, whether such work is performed wholly in or about the exhibition or otherwise.

4. No male under eighteen years of age and no female shall be employed in or about the exhibition after the hour of 10.30 p.m.

5. For the purposes of the enforcement of an award or industrial agreement any provision of which has been suspended by this Order in Council, any officer of the industrial union or association concerned who is authorized in writing in that behalf by such union or association shall be entitled to interview at his place of employment any person employed in or about the exhibition under that award or industrial agreement at such time or times as may be agreed upon by and between such officer and the employer of such persons, and for this purpose any such officer shall be entitled at any time to have access to the Register of Passes issued by the Auckland Manufacturers' Association.

6. Nothing in this Order in Council shall be deemed to affect any provisions in an award or industrial agreement requiring workers subject to such award or industrial agreement to be members of a union.

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1037, and shall come into force on the 15th day of July, 1949.
2. (1) Price Orders Nos. 867*, No. 933†, are hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. In this Order—

“The said specification” means the New Zealand Standard Specification (No. N.Z.S.S. 521) entitled “New Zealand Standard Specification for Ready-mixed Paint for Undercoats and Finishing Coats for Exterior Use on Woodwork (White and Light Tints)” declared by the Minister of Industries and Commerce under the authority of section 8 of the Standards Act, 1941, to be a Standard Specification:

“Genuine white lead” means white lead that conforms to the New Zealand Standard Specification (N.Z.S.S. 243) for genuine white lead.

4. (1) The maximum prices fixed by this Order with respect to first-quality ready-mixed paint for undercoats and finishing coats and with respect to paint of the type L.Z. are fixed with respect to paint that conforms to the said specification: Provided, however, that paint of the type L.Z. manufactured during a period of short supply of materials from the alternative materials permitted in such a period under the provisions of the New Zealand Standard Specification N.Z.S.S. 521, shall not, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to be first-quality ready-mixed paint.

(2) Any paint to which this Order applies that is packed in containers marked with the words “P.T. Authority No. 1” shall contain a minimum genuine white-lead content as follows:—

- (a) With respect to finishing coats: 10.1 lb. to the gallon of paint.
- (b) With respect to undercoats: 10 lb. to the gallon of paint.
- (c) With respect to G.P. primer: 7.5 lb. to the gallon of paint.

(3) With respect to any paint to which subclause (2) hereof applies there shall be a weight tolerance of 5 per cent.

(2) (a) With respect to paint manufactured by the Nelson Paint Co., Ltd., and with respect to paint to which paragraph (b) of clause 5 applies, the prices fixed by subclause (1) hereof apply with respect to paint sold anywhere in New Zealand.

(b) With respect to paint manufactured by Austral Super Paints, Ltd., for Smith and Smith, Ltd., the prices fixed by subclause (1) hereof apply with respect to paint sold in any of the cities or boroughs of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, Dunedin, Invercargill, Whangarei, Hamilton, Napier, Hastings, Wanganui, Palmerston North, Lower Hutt, Petone, Nelson, Greymouth, or Timaru.

(c) With respect to paint manufactured by British Australian Lead Manufacturers (New Zealand), Ltd., the prices fixed by subclause (1) hereof apply with respect to paint sold in any of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin.

(d) With respect to paint manufactured by N.Z. Paint and Varnish Co., Ltd., the prices fixed by subclause (1) hereof apply with respect to paint sold in the City of Palmerston North or in the boroughs of Napier or Hastings.

(e) With respect to paint manufactured by Pinchin, Johnson, and Co. (New Zealand), Ltd., Best Paints, Ltd., International Paints of New Zealand, Ltd., and Lewis Berger and Sons (N.Z.), Ltd., and with respect to paint manufactured for Taubmans Products, Ltd., William Docker, and R. and E. Tingey and Co., Ltd., the prices fixed by subclause (1) hereof apply with respect to paint sold in the cities of Auckland or Wellington.

(f) With respect to paint manufactured by Proven Paint Products, Ltd., Phillipps and Impey, Ltd., and British Imperial Paints, Ltd., and with respect to paint manufactured for the Farmers' Trading Co., Ltd., and for Hill and Plummer, Ltd., the prices fixed by subclause (1) hereof apply with respect to paint sold in the City of Auckland.

(g) With respect to paint manufactured by Paint Industries, Ltd., and G. H. Jackson and Co., Ltd., the prices fixed by subclause (1) hereof apply with respect to paint sold in the City of Wellington.

(h) With respect to paint manufactured by James Wren and Co., Ltd., the prices fixed by subclause (1) hereof apply with respect to paint sold in the City of Dunedin.

(3) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any paint to which this Order applies sold elsewhere than in one of the respective places mentioned with respect to that paint in subclause (2) hereof shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto increased by a proportionate part of any transport or other charges actually and reasonably incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery into his store: Provided that the amount added in respect of such charges shall not in any case exceed 1s. per gallon.

(4) If in respect of any lot of paint sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

7. Any undercoat or finishing paint (white and light tints) that conforms to the said specification shall, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to be first-quality paint. Any undercoat or finishing paint that is not first-quality shall, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to be second-quality paint, and the maximum prices fixed in the said Schedule for second-quality undercoat or finishing paint shall apply unless on application duly made to the Tribunal a special price has been approved therefor.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

Price Order No. 1038 (Asbestos-cement Products)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1038, and shall come into force on the 15th day of July, 1949.
2. (1) Price Order No. 964* is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Landed cost”, in relation to any goods, means the actual price paid or payable by the importer of the goods increased by the amount of any landing costs incurred by the importer in respect of the goods:

“Landing costs”, in relation to any goods, means the cost incurred by the importer incidental to the importing of the goods from the country of origin into store in New Zealand:

“Prevailing wholesale price”, in relation to any goods, means the price actually charged for the goods by a wholesaler to the retailer purchasing the goods: Provided that in no case shall the prevailing wholesale price exceed the amount that a wholesaler is entitled to charge a retailer for the goods in accordance with the provisions of this Order:

“Wholesaler” includes a manufacturer.

(2) No costs shall be deemed to be landing costs unless the method of assessment of the costs has been previously approved in that behalf by the Director of Price Control.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies with respect to all asbestos-cement products specified in the Schedule hereto that are manufactured in New Zealand and to all asbestos-cement products that are imported into New Zealand.

WHOLESALE PRICES

5. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the maximum price that may be charged or received by a wholesaler for any goods to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows:—

(a) Where the goods are manufactured in New Zealand the maximum price shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto:

(b) Where the goods are imported into New Zealand the maximum price shall be the landed cost increased in the case of corrugated sheets by 1s. per square yard, or in the case of flat sheets by 10d. per square yard.

(2) The prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are fixed subject to the trade terms of sale existing immediately prior to the 17th day of January, 1949, being maintained.

(3) (a) Where with respect to any goods manufactured in New Zealand crating charges are incurred, the prices specified in the Schedule hereto with respect to those goods may be increased by the amount of the crating charges incurred, being not more in any case than the following charges:—

For flat sheets of $\frac{3}{8}$ in. thickness in ton crates: By 2½d. per square yard.

For flat sheets of $\frac{1}{2}$ in. thickness in less than ton crates: By 3d. per square yard.

For flat sheets of a greater thickness than $\frac{1}{2}$ in. the appropriate increase set out above may be further increased by such proportion thereof as the extra thickness bears to $\frac{3}{8}$ in.

For corrugated sheets in ton crates: By 3d. per square yard.

For corrugated sheets in less than ton crates: By 4½d. per square yard.

For mouldings and curved sheets: By 15 per cent. of the appropriate maximum price specified in the Schedule hereto.

(b) Where crating charges calculated in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subclause amount to a sum of less than 11s. 3d. per crate, the charges for each crate may be increased to that sum.

(4) The prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are fixed as for delivery at the premises of the wholesaler.

(5) Where delivery is effected elsewhere than at premises occupied by the wholesaler, he may add to the appropriate price fixed by this Order the reasonable cost of delivery, not exceeding in any case the cost that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by the holder of a goods-service licence under the Transport Licensing Act, 1931 at authorized rates.

6. Every wholesaler who sells any goods to which this Order applies shall state separately in the relevant invoice the following particulars:—

(a) The price charged for the goods:

(b) The discount allowed (if any):

(c) The amount of any crating charges:

(d) The amount of any delivery charges.

RETAILERS' PRICES

7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the maximum price that may be charged or received by a retailer for any goods to which this Order applies shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:—

(a) The prevailing wholesale price of the goods as shown on the relevant invoice:

(b) An amount equal to 17½ per cent. of the sum specified in paragraph (a):

(c) The appropriate proportion of any transport charges or crating charges incurred by the retailer in respect of the goods.

Provided, however, with respect to goods imported into New Zealand the amount calculated in accordance with paragraph (b) hereof shall not in any case exceed 8d. per square yard in the case of corrugated sheets or 6d. per square yard in the case of flat sheets.

(2) Where the retail selling-price for a square yard, a foot, for 100 lineal feet, for a thousand or for any other unit of sale, as the case may be, calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this order—

(a) Is less than 2s. 6d., the price shall be computed to the nearest ½d.

(b) Is more than 2s. 6d. but less than 5s., the price shall be computed to the nearest 1d.

(c) Is more than 5s., the price shall be computed to the nearest 3d.

(3) In computing the price at which a retailer may sell any goods to which this Order applies no account shall be taken of any discount authorized by subclause (2) of clause 5 hereof.

8. Every person, whether a wholesaler or retailer, who imports any goods to which this Order applies, shall on receipt of the goods, forward to the Director of Price Control in such manner as the Director requires, a return in respect of the goods on the form P.C. 13A: Provided that where an importer has furnished a return under this clause in respect of any goods he shall not be obliged, unless specially requested to do so by the Director, to furnish a return in respect of other goods of the same kind unless—

(a) The landed cost of the goods is less than the landed cost of the goods to which the return already made relates; or

(b) The landed cost of the other goods is more than the landed cost of the goods to which the return already made relates and the importer proposes to charge more for such other goods.

9. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorize special maximum wholesale or retail prices in respect of any goods to which this Order applies where for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of goods or may relate generally to all goods to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.
