NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JULY, 1949

General.—This month was the mildest July on record. In the first half the weather was dominated by a series of westerly depressions. After the only spell of settled weather, in the middle of the month, a series of wave depressions from the Tasman Sea travelled across the Dominion.

Temperatures in May and June were also above normal. Following three months of mild weather, the countryside has taken on an appearance more appropriate to spring than mid-winter. In some places fruit trees and shrubs are flowering a month ahead of the normal date. Pastures and autumn-sown crops have maintained good growth. In Southland the ground has remained too wet for cultivation.

Rainfall.—In the North Island rainfall was above normal in an area bounded by the Waikato River in the north and the Ruahine-Tararua mountain chain in the east; also in Northern Wairarapa. There was less than half the average rainfall in the eastern part of Northland, the Bay of Plenty, Hawkes Bay, and Gisborne. In the latter district, it was the driest July since records began over seventy years ago.

It was a wet month in the South Island except for a narrow strip of the east coast, and in parts of Nelson and Marlborough. Prior to the 14th, a number of stations in western districts of the North Island had recorded thirty consecutive rain-days, and a few places as many as forty.

Temperatures.—For the country as a whole it was the mildest July on record. Mean temperatures were well above average; in many places the figures almost reached the average for September. The temperature anomaly exceeded 2° F. everywhere; in Central Otago it was as much as 5° F.

Sunshine.—The duration of bright sunshine was slightly in excess east of the main ranges; elsewhere totals were below average, with a substantial deficit in Taranaki, Manawatu, and the West Coast. Hokitika's 74.1 hours was the lowest July total since 1917.

Weather Sequence.—For almost the whole of the first half of July a ridge of high pressure lay to the north of New Zealand, while a series of westerly depressions travelled eastwards across the country. For the most part it was a period of very changeable weather with frequent rain, often heavy in the west. East of the ranges, the weather was mainly fair and mild except for some cool rain on the 2nd and again on the 8th, following the passage of two deep depressions in the south.

After crossing the South Island on the night of the 10th, a vigorous cold front passed off to the north-east on the afternoon of the 11th. Temperatures fell sharply following the change to south-westerly winds and some snow fell in the South Island. There was a rapid clearance on the 14th following the passage of another cold front from the south-west.

Except for overcast skies about the central provinces and some light rain in the Taranaki and Manawatu districts on the 17th and 18th, the weather remained fine while an intense anti-cyclone moved slowly eastwards across the Dominion.

A depression over Victoria on the 19th moved rapidly south-eastwards and passed south of Stewart Island on the 21st. The associated cold front produced heavy and widespread rain except in coastal districts of Canterbury and Hawkes Bay. Due to the formation of a wave depression in the Tasman Sea, this front became stationary for a time over North Auckland before returning southwards as a warm front. After the depression centre had passed over Otago during the night of the 24th, the front again advanced northwards as far as Auckland, while a wedge of high pressure produced a temporary improvement in the South Island. Early on the 27th the front was again over Taranaki on its way southwards, as another wave depression developed in the Tasman Sea. The latter slowly occluded and moved on to the Dominion, while yet another wave on the same frontal system developed off the Australian coast. This third member of the series moved rapidly across the Tasman Sea to pass over the South Island on the night of the 30th. The weather showed little improvement on the 31st, due to the persistence of a shallow low pressure system off Westland.

Price Order No. 1058 (Milk and Cream) (Various Milk Price Districts)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1058, and shall come into force on the 1st day of September, 1949.
2. (1) The Price Orders specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order—
 - “Commercial user” means a person who buys milk or cream for sale for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances) and includes an institution under the control of any Hospital Board or a separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926;
 - “Consumer” means a person who buys milk or cream for purposes other than resale;
 - “Ounce” means fluid ounce as defined in the Weights and Measures Proclamation 1946.*
 - “Shop dairy” means a shop where milk or cream is sold for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise, and where the milk or cream so sold is sold in the form in which it was received into the shop dairy.

(2) References in this Order to milk price districts shall be deemed to be references to the milk price districts described in the Second Schedule hereto.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies with respect to all milk and cream wherever produced that is sold in any of the milk price districts described in the Second Schedule to this Order—

- (a) To the occupier of any shop dairy; or
- (b) By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer.

FIXING PRICES OF MILK AND CREAM TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received for any milk or cream to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

- (2) The prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery as follows:—
 - (a) In respect of milk or cream sold by the occupier of a shop dairy: As for delivery to the purchaser at the shop dairy;
 - (b) In respect of milk or cream sold otherwise than at a shop dairy: As for delivery at the premises of the purchaser.
- (3) If any lot of milk to which this Order applies is supplied at one time to a commercial user or a consumer otherwise than in one of the quantities specified in the Third Schedule hereto in respect of sales to those persons, the price of the milk shall be computed at the rate prescribed for the specified quantity that is less than and nearest to the quantity supplied irrespective of the number or type of containers in which the milk is delivered:

Provided that if the quantity of milk supplied in any one lot is less than the smallest specified quantity the price for the lot shall be computed at the rate prescribed in the Third Schedule for the smallest specified quantity.

- (4) The provisions of the last preceding subclause shall, with the necessary modifications, apply to the sale of cream to which this Order applies.
- (5) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day the price that may be charged for the milk to which the account relates shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order in respect of the quantity supplied in each lot:

Provided that if the total quantity of milk supplied to any one purchaser on any one day (exclusive of milk supplied at any one time in a lot of a half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon the maximum price that may be charged for the total quantity shall be computed in accordance with the provisions of this Order as if all the milk supplied on that day had been supplied in one lot.
- (6) Where the quantity of milk supplied at any one time is a lot of a half-pint or less the price of each lot shall be computed separately at the rate prescribed by this Order for a half-pint whether or not an account is rendered to the purchaser of the milk and whether or not the total quantity so supplied on any one day is one gallon or more.
- (7) If the price computed in accordance with this Order for any lot of milk or cream supplied at any one time and sold for cash is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the price for the lot shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.
- (8) Where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk (including milk supplied at any one time in a lot of a half-pint or less) or cream supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day and the total price for all the milk or cream, or milk and cream, to which the account relates is not an exact number of pence or half-pence the total price shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

2. (1) Price Order No. 925* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order—

“Grower”, in relation to maize, means a person engaged in the business of growing maize for sale;

“Grower’s station”, in relation to any grower, means the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower’s premises;

The expression “f.o.b.s.e.” means “free on board, sacks or other containers extra”, and the expression “f.o.r.s.e.” means “free on rail, sacks or other containers extra”.

(2) The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any maize to which the Order applies is sold otherwise than by weight.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies only to maize of the following varieties:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1064, and shall come into force on the 18th day of August, 1949.

2. (1) Price Order No. 737* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Grower”, in relation to maize, means a person engaged in the business of growing maize for sale:

“Grower's station”, in relation to any grower, means the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower's premises:

“Distributor”, in relation to maize, means any person who buys maize from a grower for the purposes of resale:

“Retailer”, in relation to maize, means any reseller other than a distributor:

The expression “f.o.b.s.e.” means “free on board, sacks extra”; and the expression “f.o.r.s.e.” means “free on rail, sacks extra”:

The expression “f.o.b.s.i.” means “free on board, sacks included”; and the expression “f.o.r.s.i.” means “free on rail, sacks included”.

4. Where any maize to which this Order applies is sold on the basis of “sacks extra”, the maximum price that may be charged or received for the maize shall be computed on the net weight of the maize.

5. Where any maize to which this Order applies is sold on the basis of “sacks included”, the maximum price that may be charged or received for the maize shall be computed on the gross weight of the maize and the sacks.

6. Subject to any general or specific directions that may be given by or on behalf of the Tribunal, any expenses that are reasonably incurred by a distributor in undertaking the transport of any maize at his own expense may be regarded for the purposes of this Order as if they were transport charges paid by him, and the maximum price of the maize shall be determined accordingly: provided that transport charges shall not be more in any case than the charges that would have been incurred had delivery been effected at common carrier rates.

7. The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any maize to which this Order is applicable is sold otherwise than by weight.

8. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

9. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, this Order applies with respect to all maize sold in New Zealand.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to maize of the varieties Motiti Island, Marigold, 90 Day, Silver Queen, or Early Butler sold during the months of July to October, inclusive, in any year by a grower exclusively for seed for the purposes of producing maize for green feed.

(3) The provisions of this Order fixing growers' prices shall apply only with respect to maize grown in New Zealand.

(4) Where any maize to which this Order applies is delivered by the grower elsewhere than at one of the ports referred to in paragraph (a) of subclause (2) hereof, or elsewhere than at the grower's station, the maximum price that may be charged by the grower shall be the appropriate price fixed in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause, increased by the amount of the charges (if any) incurred by the grower in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of the transport charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the maize f.o.b.s.e. such one of the aforesaid ports or f.o.r.s.e. such railway station as would have been appropriate in the circumstances of the case.

DISTRIBUTORS' PRICES

11. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any distributor for any maize to which this Order applies shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:—
