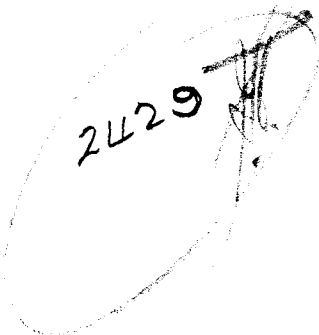

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1082, and shall come into force on the 20th day of October, 1949.

2. (1) Price Orders Nos. 225,* 288,† and 720‡ are hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"The said Act" means the Control of Prices Act, 1947:
"North Island" includes all parts of New Zealand exclusive of the South Island and Stewart Island:

"South Island" includes Stewart Island:
The expression "f.o.b.c.i." means "free on board, cases or other containers included", and the expression "f.o.r.c.i." means "free on rail, cases or other containers included".

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the said Act, when used in this Order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by that Act.

4. The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any rabbits to which this Order is applicable are sold otherwise than by weight.

5. The several prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

6. This Order applies with respect to skinned rabbits, whether cooked or uncooked, that are sold otherwise than in sealed tins or other metal containers.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF RABBITS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wholesalers' Prices

7. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler, for any rabbits to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows :—

- (3) Where delivery is effected by a wholesaler otherwise than f.o.b.c.i. or f.o.r.c.i. as provided in the last preceding subclause, he may add to the appropriate price fixed in accordance with this clause the actual amount of the transport charges incurred in effecting delivery but not exceeding in any case the charges that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by the holder of a goods-service licence under the Transport Licensing Act, 1931, at authorized rates.

8. (1) Where any wholesaler sells any rabbits to which this Order applies that have not been gutted or from which the heads have not been removed the appropriate prices fixed by this Order shall be reduced at the rate of 1 ¹/₄ d. per pound.

(2) Where any wholesaler sells any rabbits to which this Order applies that are not packed in crates or are not frozen the appropriate prices fixed by this Order shall be reduced by the customary charges that would have been incurred had the rabbits been crated or frozen or both crated and frozen as the case may require.

DUTY IMPOSED ON WHOLESALERS

9. Every wholesaler who sells any rabbits to which this Order applies shall state in the appropriate invoice the weight of the rabbits to which the sale relates.

10. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any rabbits to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows :—

11. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any rabbits to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler, or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a special lot or consignment of rabbits or may relate generally to all rabbits to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948.—Principal Order No. 8

In the matter of section 8 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, and in the matter of an application for a principal order dated the 16th day of August, 1949, and duly lodged by the Auckland District Boilermakers, Iron-ship Workers, and Bridge-builders Industrial Union of Workers; the Auckland Bricklayers Industrial Union of Workers; the Auckland Ceramic, Concrete, Builders, and General Labourers Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers; the Auckland Iron and Brass Moulders Industrial Union of Workers; the Auckland Painters and Decorators Industrial Union of Workers; the Auckland Saddlers, Collarmakers, Bagmakers, Sailmakers, and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers; the Auckland Ship, Yacht, and Boat-builders Industrial Union of Workers; the North Island Electrical Trades Industrial Union of Workers; the New Zealand Engineering, Coachbuilding, Aircraft, and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers; the New Zealand Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers.

THE Government Service Tribunal, having heard and considered the application of the applicants, doth hereby order that the following provisions shall take effect on and from the date therein set out in Clause 1 :—

1. APPLICATION OF ORDER

.01 This Order shall apply to Navy Department civilian workers at Naval stores, repair bases, armament depots, oil fuel installations, and on ships.

.02 For the purposes of this Order the term "Worker" shall be limited to a worker engaged under the provisions of Public Service Regulation 150.

.03 This Order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1949.

2. HOURS OF WORK

.01 The ordinary hours of work shall be forty a week and eight a day and shall be worked between 7.45 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. Work shall commence and cease at times fixed by the officer in charge, provided that reasonable notice of any change in such times shall be given to all workers concerned.

.02 A rest period of ten minutes shall be allowed every morning and afternoon.

3. MEAL PERIOD

.01 A meal period of not less than half an hour, and not more than one hour, shall be allowed.

.02 Except when required for urgent or emergency work, a worker shall not be required to work for more than four and one-quarter hours continuously without being granted a meal period.

.03 When a worker is not allowed a meal period at the usual time, he shall be paid at time and one-half rate from the time such period was normally due until the meal period is allowed.

.04 When a worker is working overtime, supper and crib time shall be paid for at the rate appropriate to the time.

4. OVERTIME

.01 Overtime rates shall apply to all time worked outside or in excess of the ordinary hours specified in clause 2.01 hereof.

.02 Overtime worked on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive shall be paid for at time and one-half rate for the first three hours and double time rate thereafter, computed on a daily basis.

.03 All time worked on a Sunday shall be paid for at double time rate.

.04 A worker required to commence work before the normal commencing time shall be paid at double time rate for all time worked until normal commencing time.

.05 A worker who is required to work overtime for less than two hours shall have the option of being paid for the overtime actually worked or of working and being paid for a minimum of two hours.

.06 A worker who is called back after ceasing work for the day shall be paid for a minimum of two hours at the appropriate rate.

.07 Time worked by a worker called back to work after 9 p.m. shall be paid for at double time rate.

.08 A worker who works for twenty-four hours continuously (inclusive of intervals for meals) shall not then be required to continue working without his consent. If he does continue working he shall be paid at double time rate for all time worked on the second day, or until he has had a break of at least eight hours.

.09 A worker who works for more than sixteen hours continuously (inclusive of interval for meals) shall continue to be paid at not less than the appropriate overtime rate for all overtime worked until he has had a break of at least eight hours.

.10 Overtime worked in excess of four and one-quarter hours without a break for a meal (supper and crib time included) shall be paid for at half ordinary time rate in addition to the rate appropriate to the time.

5. HOLIDAYS

.01 Provided he has worked for the Department at any time during the fortnight ending on the day on which the holiday occurs a worker shall be allowed the following holidays on pay: New Year's Day, Day after New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anniversary Day.

.02 A worker who has worked for more than one employer during the fortnight ending on the day on which the holiday occurs is entitled to one payment only for the holiday and payment will be by arrangement between the officer in charge and the other employer or employers.

.03 When any of the above holidays, except Anzac Day, falls on a Saturday or Sunday it shall be observed on the following Monday, and in the event of another holiday falling on such Monday, such other holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Tuesday.

.04 Payment for each such holiday allowed shall be for eight hours at ordinary time rate.

.05 Time worked on any of the above holidays shall be paid for at double time rate in addition to the holiday payment due under subclause .04 above.

.06 A worker who meets with an accident in the course of his employment with the Department (and whether or not receiving accident compensation) is entitled to payment for any of the above holidays (but not in addition to accident compensation) which occurs during the period of incapacity provided he had worked for the Department at any time during the fortnight ending on the day of the holiday.

.07 A worker who has been certified as fit to resume work on any of the above holidays, following sick-leave or absence because of an accident, and who reports for duty on the working-day immediately following such holiday, shall be paid for such holiday.

.08 Workers who attend the Dockyard picnic (if held on a working day) shall be granted one day's leave on pay for that purpose, provided the picnic day has been approved by the Public Service Commission.

6. ANNUAL HOLIDAYS

.01 The principle of the Annual Holidays Act, 1944, shall be applied, provided that every worker after completing ten years' continuous service with the Department shall be granted three weeks' holiday every year.

.02 For annual holidays purposes, a year shall be deemed to commence on 1st January and end on 31st December.

.03 Workers shall normally be required to take their annual holidays when work ceases for the Christmas-New Year holidays.

.04 Annual holidays shall not be accumulated.

8. ALLOWANCES

In addition to the rate of pay appropriate to the time at which the work is performed, allowances as prescribed hereunder shall be paid to workers required to work under the conditions listed :—

9. DIRTY WORK PAYMENTS

.01 A worker while employed on one or more of the following types of work shall be paid 2s. a day or part of a day :—

- (a) Repairing or cleaning smoke-box doors, uptakes, and inside funnels.
- (b) Work inside furnaces, back-ends, and through man-holes.
- (c) Overhauling winches, grabs, traction engines, locomotives.
- (d) Overhauling, repairing, and reconditioning chlorosulphonic smoke producing apparatus.
- (e) Installing and overhauling storage batteries.
- (f) Repairing damage done by fire whilst the dirt of the fire is still present.
- (g) Repair work performed on board ship.
- (h) Diesel repair work.
- (i) Cleaning or painting galleys, pantries, heads, wash-places, or corking, including slushing and flattening.
- (j) Burning off galvanizing.
- (k) Burning out and cleaning pipes and fittings of an offensive nature.
- (l) Handling or working with creosote or red lead.
- (m) Work where the conditions are unhealthy, or more injurious to clothing or dirtier than the ordinary workshop conditions.

.02 For the purposes of subclause 9.01 (m) above, the following work shall be deemed to be unhealthy or more injurious to clothing or dirtier than the ordinary workshop conditions :—

- (a) Repair work on catamarans.
- (b) The slipping of boats or ships where the workers concerned are necessarily in contact with mud or water.
- (c) Repair work with timber which has been in contact with crude or fuel oil, creosote, or tar.
- (d) Handling old wires or dirty new wires.
- (e) Work on staging under wharves.
- (f) Repair work on used ice chests, meat safes, and compactums.
- (g) Handling of oil fuel pipes.
- (h) Work requiring the handling of, or coming into contact with, furnace or Diesel oil.
- (i) Repair work on steam and electric cranes, hydraulic press or donkey boilers, oil fuel or foamite pumps, the large air compressor, machinery in blacksmith's and boiler-shop.
- (j) Dismantling or repairing dirty machinery or equipment.
- (k) Installation of pipe lines under wharves.
- (l) Such other dirty work as the officer in charge may decide.

.03 A worker while cleaning, scrubbing, chipping, or painting the outside of a ship's hull shall be paid at a rate of not less than 4s. 2d. an hour on and from 1st April, 1949, and 4s. 3d. an hour on and from 1st June, 1949, but shall not be paid any of the Dirty Work payments prescribed herein.

.04 A worker while chipping preparatory to painting (other than on the outside of a ship's hull) for one hour or more shall be paid at a rate of not less than 4s. an hour on and from 1st April, 1949, and 4s. 1d. an hour on and from 1st June, 1949.

.05 A worker while cleaning a fire-tube or water-tube boiler in any ship shall be paid at a rate of not less than 4s. 3d. an hour on and from 1st April, 1949, and 4s. 4d. an hour on and from 1st June, 1949, but shall not be paid any of the Dirty Work payments prescribed herein.

.06 Time worked by a worker while employed on repair work in the "danger-space" in gun turrets or in or on oil tanks, pipes, pumps, and the like, and necessarily in contact with crude, furnace or Diesel oil, or an abundance of hydraulic oil, shall be paid for at half ordinary time rate, in addition to the rate appropriate to the time.

.07 A worker while cleaning the insides of oil tanks and necessarily in contact with crude, furnace, or Diesel oil shall be paid not less than 5s. an hour.

.08 Time worked by a worker while employed on repair work in a bitumen painted tank involving contact with liquid or soft bitumen shall be paid for at half ordinary time rate in addition to the rate appropriate to the time.

10. MEAL ALLOWANCE

.01 Provided that he does not go home for a meal, a worker shall be paid a meal allowance of 2s. 6d. for each meal when required to work on after the following times :—

Mondays to Fridays inclusive	{ 5.30 p.m. 9.45 p.m.
Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays prescribed in clause 5 hereof	{ 12 noon. 5.30 p.m. 9.45 p.m.

.02 A worker required to work all night and continue working into the next day shall be paid for normal meals occurring during such period of continuous work.

.03 At the expiration of each four and one-quarter hours continuous overtime, a worker shall be paid meal allowance, or on request be provided with a hot meal.

11. HEAT, COLD, AND CONFINED SPACES

.01 For the purposes of this clause " confined space " shall be deemed to mean a confined space which lacks adequate ventilation, or the dimensions of which necessitate working in a stooped or cramped position, or which is productive of unusual discomfort.

.02 A worker while required to work in a confined space shall be paid an allowance of 3d. an hour, provided that this allowance shall not be payable if the worker is entitled to any of the allowances prescribed in clause 9 hereof or subclauses .03, .04, or .05 below.

.03 A worker while required to work in a confined space where the temperature is below 40° F. shall be paid an allowance of 4d. an hour, and shall be allowed to leave the confined space at least once in every two hours for a period of ten minutes.

.04 A worker while required to work in a compartment or confined space where the temperature exceeds 110° F. shall be paid at ordinary time rate in addition to the rate appropriate to the time, and shall be allowed a five minute break in every hour.

.05 A worker while working in a confined space where welding or burning is being done shall be paid at half ordinary time rate in addition to the rate appropriate to the time.

.06 A worker while employed on hot-slab work, hot-plate flanging and dishing, and heavy angle-iron smithing shall be paid an allowance of 3d. an hour : Provided that this shall not apply to work done on anvils.

12. PROTECTIVE CLOTHING

.01 **Gauntlet Gloves.**—A worker while working at an oven or over a slab where the heat is excessive shall be supplied with gauntlet gloves.

.02 **Goggles.**—Workers are required to wear goggles while employed on chipping work where the job can easily be seen, and also while using grinding machines. Goggles shall be supplied by the Department.

.03 **Gumboots.**—A worker while working in water, oil, or mud, shall be supplied with gumboots. When gumboots are handed in by a worker who no longer requires them, the Department shall disinfect the boots before they are issued to another worker.

.04 **Leather Jackets.**—A welder while employed on overhead welding or burning shall be supplied with a leather jacket.

.05 **Oilskins and Sou'westers.**—An oilskin and sou'wester shall be supplied to a worker required to work in the rain on the following duties : A rigger berthing or docking a ship ; a worker fuelling or defuelling a ship ; a runabout driver. At the discretion of the officer in charge an oilskin and sou'wester may be supplied to a worker while employed on tail-end work in exceptionally wet weather where it is essential that the work should proceed.

.06 **Rubber Aprons.**—A worker while handling charged storage batteries shall be supplied with a rubber apron.

.07 **Rubber Gloves.**—A worker while working in an ablution chamber shall be supplied with rubber gloves.

.08 **Oil and Tar Work.**—A worker while cleaning oil tanks or tarring down rigging shall be supplied with adequate protective clothing.

13. PAYMENT OF WAGES

.01 Wages shall be paid weekly and within working hours.

.02 On dismissal a worker shall be paid all moneys due to him. When a worker leaves of his own accord, all moneys due to him shall be paid within two hours.

.03 All waiting time beyond the times prescribed in subclauses .01 and .02 above shall be paid for at ordinary time rate.

.04 A worker commencing work more than five minutes after the appropriate commencing time shall be deemed to have lost time as follows :—

If over five minutes but not more than fifteen minutes late, loses fifteen minutes' time.

If over fifteen minutes but not more than thirty minutes late, loses thirty minutes' time.

Further deductions on a similar basis at fifteen minute intervals, shall be made for later commencement of work.

.05 A worker ceasing work more than five minutes before the appropriate ceasing time shall be deemed to have lost time as follows :—

If over five minutes but not more than fifteen minutes early, loses fifteen minutes' time.

If over fifteen minutes but not more than thirty minutes early, loses thirty minutes' time.

Further deductions on a similar basis at fifteen minute intervals shall be made for earlier cessation of work.

.06 A worker required to report for work at a specified time not less than four hours before the cessation of normal working hours, shall, if there is no work available, be paid for a minimum of four hours at the rate appropriate to the time, provided that, if ordered by the officer in charge, the worker shall stand by the job.

14. TRAVELLING PROVISIONS

.01 **Daily Travelling.**—If a worker is required to work at a place other than his normal place of employment and thereby necessarily incurs travelling expenses greater than he would ordinarily incur in travelling to and from his normal place of employment, he shall be reimbursed by the Department for such extra expense. The worker shall also be paid at ordinary time rate for any extra time necessarily spent in travelling to and from the new place of work.

.02 A worker shall be conveyed at the expense of the Department—

.021 From his home to his work when required to commence work after the cessation of public wheeled traffic or before the ordinary starting time of such traffic; or

.022 From his work to his home when required to work continuously until after the cessation of public wheeled traffic, and cease work before the ordinary time of starting of such traffic.

For the purposes of this subclause, "public wheeled traffic" shall be deemed to mean trams, buses, trains, or ferries ordinarily used by workers in travelling to and from their work.

.03 **Other than Daily Travelling.**—If a worker is required to work at a place other than his normal place of employment thus necessitating his absence from home overnight, the following provisions shall apply:—

.031 The worker shall be refunded actual and reasonable expenses so incurred upon production of satisfactory receipts for amounts exceeding 5s.

.032 The worker shall also be paid an allowance of 2s. a night during such absence.

.033 During the continuance of the work, the worker shall be refunded his return fare to and from his headquarters once every two weeks if the place of work is less than fifty miles from his headquarters, or once every two months if the place of work is fifty miles or more from the worker's headquarters.

.034 Travelling time (other than daily travelling in terms of subclause .01 above) shall be paid for at ordinary time rate, but not to a greater amount than eight hours in respect of any one day or any one journey which commences on one day and finishes on the next day: Provided that where travelling time (whether or not in excess of eight hours in any one day or journey) occurs during normal working hours, the worker shall be paid for such normal working hours as if he had actually worked during that time.

.035 Payment of ordinary wages and for travelling time shall not be made concurrently in respect of the same hours.

.036 Travelling time in terms of subclause .034 above shall be paid for in addition to payment for any time actually worked by the worker on the day (or days) on which he also travels.

.04 **General.**—If a worker is required to work at a place other than his normal place of employment, and has to travel by boat or train, the Department shall refund actual and reasonable costs of his meals during such travel, except where the cost of any meal is included in the fare.

.05 Travelling accommodation shall be first class when this is available.

15. TERM OF EMPLOYMENT

.01 Not less than four hours' notice given by either party shall terminate the employment: Provided that any worker may be summarily dismissed for misconduct. A worker so dismissed shall have the right of appeal to the Disputes Committee or, where such a Committee has not been appointed, appeal may be made to the Head Office of the Department through the local officer in charge.

.02 A tradesman who is discharged or leaves of his own accord after having been employed for one week or more shall be allowed up to two hours to recondition his tools or, in lieu thereof, may be paid for two hours at ordinary time rate: Provided that such tool conditioning time shall be included in the period of notice specified in subclause .01 above, and not additional thereto.

Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948.—Principal Order No. 7

In the matter of section 8 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, and in the matter of an application for a principal order dated the 22nd day of August, 1949, and duly lodged by the Auckland and Suburban Local Bodies' Labourers and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers.

THE Government Service Tribunal, having heard and considered the application of the applicant, doth hereby order that the following provisions shall take effect on and from the dates respectively therein set out in clause 1 :—

1. APPLICATION OF ORDER

(a) This Order shall apply to the following State Hydro-electric Department workers at King's Wharf Power-station, Auckland : Foremen, firemen, greasers, trimmers, bunker attendants, and labourers.

(b) This Order shall not apply to shift engineers or fitters.

(c) For the purposes of this Order the term " worker " shall be limited to a worker engaged under the provisions of Public Service Regulation 150.

(d) This Order, with the exception of clause 7, shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.

(e) Clause 7 shall be deemed to have come into force on the 13th day of November, 1948.

2. HOURS OF WORK

(a) The ordinary hours of work shall be forty a week and eight a day, and, subject to the provisions of clause 3 hereof, shall be worked between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

(b) A rest period of ten minutes shall be allowed every morning and afternoon.

(c) Workers shall be allowed during working-hours reasonable time to bathe and change their clothes.

3. SHIFT-WORK

(a) Five shifts each of eight hours (inclusive of crib-time) shall constitute a normal week's work, and, notwithstanding the provisions of clause 2 hereof, shall be worked at any time on Mondays to Fridays inclusive : Provided that where three shifts a day are worked the first shift for the week shall commence at 11 p.m. on Sunday, and the last shift shall cease at 11 p.m. on Friday.

(b) Shift-workers shall be paid an allowance of 2s. 6d. a shift : Provided that where shifts are not rotated the allowance shall not be paid to the day shift-workers.

4. OVERTIME

(a) Overtime rates shall apply to all time worked outside or in excess of the ordinary hours specified in clause 2 hereof, or, in the case of shift workers, in excess of the ordinary shift hours.

(b) Overtime shall be paid for at time and one-half rate for the first four hours and double time rate thereafter computed on a daily basis : Provided that any work commencing before midnight and continuing on past midnight into the next day shall be deemed to be continuous for the purpose of computing overtime.

(c) Overtime worked on a Saturday afternoon or on a Sunday shall be paid for at double time rate. The first hour of shift-work from 11 p.m. to midnight on Sundays shall be paid for at double time rate.

(d) Where overtime continues on after midnight a worker shall—

(i) Either be conveyed to his home at the expense of the Department, and be paid for such travelling time at the appropriate overtime rate ; or

(ii) Be paid at the appropriate overtime rate as though he had actually worked until 7 a.m.

(e) A worker required to work shifts for less than three consecutive days, shall be paid at the appropriate overtime rate for all time worked outside the ordinary hours of work prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

5. MEAL PERIOD

(a) Except while employed on shift work, workers shall be allowed one hour for meals between 12 noon and 1 p.m. and, where necessary, between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m.

(b) Any worker other than when on shift, required to work during any portion of his regular meal period shall be paid at time and one-half rate for the time so worked during such meal period.

6. HOLIDAYS

(a) Provided he has worked for the Department at any time during the fortnight ending on the day on which the holiday occurs, a worker shall be allowed the following holidays on pay: New Year's Day, Day after New Year's Day, Anniversary Day of the Province of Auckland, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day.

(b) A worker who has worked for more than one employer during the fortnight ending on the day on which the holiday occurs is entitled to one payment only for the holiday, and payment will be by arrangement between the officer in charge and the other employer or employers.

(c) When any of the above holidays, except Anzac Day, falls on a Saturday or a Sunday it shall be observed on the following Monday, and, in the event of another holiday falling on such Monday, such other holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Tuesday.

(d) Payment for such holidays allowed shall be for eight hours at ordinary time rate, plus any shift allowance which would have been paid had the holiday been an ordinary working day.

(e) Time worked on any of the above holidays shall be paid for at double time rate in addition to the holiday payment due under subclause (d) above.

(f) A worker who meets with an accident in the course of his employment with the Department (and whether or not receiving accident compensation) shall be entitled to payment for any of the above holidays (but not in addition to accident compensation) which occurs during the period of incapacity provided he has worked for the Department at any time during the fortnight ending on the day of the holiday.

(g) A worker who has been certified as fit to resume work on any of the above holidays, following sick-leave or absence because of an accident, and who reports for duty on the working day immediately following such holiday, shall be paid for such holiday.

(h) The principle of the Annual Holidays' Act, 1944, shall be applied, provided that every worker after completing ten years' continuous service with the Department, shall be granted three weeks' holidays every year.

7. WAGES

(b) The ordinary hourly rate for a worker while in charge of at least three workers other than himself, shall be increased by 2d. an hour.

(c) The ordinary hourly rate for a worker while driving a truck or operating a mechanical shovel, grab, loader, and the like shall be increased by 2d. an hour.

8. ALLOWANCES

(a) **Meal.**—Where a worker is required to work not less than two hours' overtime he shall be paid a meal allowance of 2s. 6d.

(b) **Ash Floor.**—While removing ashes on the ash-floor with a barrow or hand shovel a trimmer shall be paid an allowance of 1d. an hour.

(c) **Bunker.**—A worker while employed in a bunker when on fire shall be paid an allowance of 9d. an hour but not in addition to the dirty work and/or heat allowances prescribed in subclauses (d) and (e) below.

(d) **Dirty Work.**—Where, in the opinion of the Station Superintendent any work being performed is "dirty work" an allowance of 3d. an hour (with a minimum of 1s. a day) shall be paid. This classification shall apply to work which is abnormal to ordinary trade or working conditions, and provided the power-station is under steam or cleaning has not been done after steaming, shall include—

- (i) Cleaning of all boiler-drums.
- (ii) Brushing condenser-tubes, cleaning inside circulating pipes and flumes.
- (iii) Cleaning soot-side only of all boiler-tubes.
- (iv) Brushing down the headers of all boilers and C.T.M. economizers.
- (v) Taking off and putting on caps of back headers (only) of W.I.F. boilers and super-heater caps of all boilers.
- (vi) Cleaning the soot-side of the economizers of C.T.M. boilers.
- (vii) Cleaning inside main-feed and corrosion tanks.
- (viii) Repairing stoker grates.
- (ix) Cement-washing drums and tubes.
- (x) Cleaning work inside ash chambers.

(e) **Heat.**—Provided the power-station is under steam, a worker shall be paid an allowance of 6d. an hour while engaged on any of the following classes of work:—

- (i) All work done inside boiler-drums.
- (ii) Work on the soot-side of boiler-tubes or economizers of C.T.M. boilers when down for routine cleanings.
- (iii) Lagging on boilers and on steam-piping on top of boilers.

This allowance shall not be paid for sweeping down boiler tops.

(f) **Paint.**—A worker while painting any part of the economizer-tubes, caps and drums, or boiler tubes with Apexior or such like compound shall be paid an allowance of 3d. an hour.

(g) **Wet.**—A worker required to work in heavy rain shall be paid an allowance of 6d. an hour. The Station Superintendent shall be the sole judge as to what constitutes "heavy rain."

9. PROTECTIVE CLOTHING

(a) A worker while required to work in the rain, shall be supplied with a waterproof coat, sou'wester, and leggings.

(b) A worker required to clean boilers shall be supplied with goggles and shall be issued on loan with one boiler suit a year.

(c) Suitable footwear shall be issued on loan to trimmers.

10. PAYMENT OF WAGES

(a) Workers' wages shall be paid weekly, in cash, on any day not later than Thursday.

(b) A worker dismissed shall be paid all moneys due to him within half an hour of such dismissal and be paid for all time he is detained in excess of half an hour.

Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948—Principal Order No. 9

In the matter of section 8 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, and in the matter of an application for a Principal Order dated the 8th day of September, 1949, and duly lodged by the Acting Director of Education.

PRINCIPAL ORDER NO. 9 OF THE GOVERNMENT SERVICE TRIBUNAL

THE Government Service Tribunal having heard and considered the application of the applicant doth hereby order:—

1. *Definition and Scope.*—For the purposes of this Order—

(a) The term "employee" means a schoolmaster or schoolmistress or an assistant schoolmaster or schoolmistress engaged in teaching in a secondary school, combined school, or in an intermediate department of a secondary school or combined school.

(b) The term "salary" means the total remuneration payable to an employee in terms of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1948 (Serial number 1948/194), but does not include lodging-allowances or overtime.

(c) Pursuant to the provisions of section 8 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, the following classes of employees are declared to be "occupational classes"—

(i) Principals of secondary schools or combined schools.

(ii) Assistant teachers in secondary schools or combined schools who are holders of special posts and who receive additional salary in terms of Regulation 110 (1), (2), (3), (4), and (5) of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1948, or who are acting as relieving principals of secondary schools or combined schools.

(d) This Order except where otherwise provided shall be deemed to have come into effect on the 1st day of July, 1948.

2. *Salary Increases.*—

(a) That the salaries applicable to employees in the Education Service shall be increased on and from 1st July, 1948, as follows—

(i) By £10 per annum to those whose salaries do not exceed £175 per annum:

(ii) By £15 per annum to those whose salaries exceed £175 per annum, but do not exceed £274 per annum:

(iii) By £22 per annum to those whose salaries exceed £274 per annum.

(b) That the salaries payable in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (a) of this clause shall be increased on and from 1st June, 1949, as follows—

(i) By £5 per annum to those whose salaries do not exceed £296 per annum:

(ii) By £8 per annum to those whose salaries exceed £296 per annum, but do not exceed £411 per annum:

(iii) By £13 per annum to those whose salaries exceed £411 per annum.

3. *Part-time Employees.*—That the hourly rate of payment applicable to part-time employees in terms of Regulation 115 (4) (a) and (b) shall be increased by 5d. per teaching hour on and after 1st July, 1948, and by 3d. per teaching hour on and after 1st June, 1949.

4. That in accordance with the application made by the Acting Director of Education on behalf of the Public Service Commission, this Order shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to teachers and other persons employed in the Education Department of the Public Service and consisting of a class whose salaries have hitherto been fixed in relation to salaries payable to "employees" as defined in paragraph (a) of clause 1 of this Order.

Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948—Principal Order No. 10

In the matter of section 8 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, and in the matter of an application for a Principal Order dated the 8th day of September, 1949, and duly lodged by the Acting Director of Education.

PRINCIPAL ORDER NO. 10 OF THE GOVERNMENT SERVICE TRIBUNAL

THE Government Service Tribunal having heard and considered the application of the applicant doth hereby order—

1. *Definition and Scope.*—For the purposes of this Order—

(a) The term "employee" means a schoolmaster or schoolmistress or an assistant schoolmaster or schoolmistress engaged in teaching in any public school, technical, or combined school, in a manual training centre, or in the intermediate department of a technical or combined school and includes a training-college principal or lecturer, a teacher in training in a post-primary school, a training-college student, a probationary assistant, a kindergarten teacher (trained or untrained), and a kindergarten trainee employed by a Free Kindergarten Association.

(b) The term "salary" means the total remuneration payable to an employee in terms of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1948 (Serial number 1948/194), and includes the remuneration payable to a teacher in training in a post-primary school and to a kindergarten teacher and trainee, but does not include lodging-allowances or overtime.

(c) Pursuant to the provisions of section 8 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, the following classes of employees are declared to be "occupational classes"—

(i) Principals of technical schools or combined schools and principals and vice-principals of training-colleges.

(ii) Assistant teachers in post-primary schools who are holders of special posts and who receive additional salary in terms of Regulation 110 (1), (2), (3), (4), and (5) of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1948, or who are acting as relieving principals of post-primary schools.

(iii) Lecturers in training-colleges in receipt of additional salaries for performing special duties.

(iv) Head teachers of district high schools of Grade V and higher grade, and head teachers of public schools of Grade VI and higher grade.

(d) This Order, except where otherwise provided, shall be deemed to have come into effect on the 1st day of July, 1948.

2. *Salary Increases*—

(a) That the salaries applicable to employees in the Education Service shall be increased on and from 1st July, 1948, as follows—

(i) By £10 per annum to those whose salaries do not exceed £175 per annum :

(ii) By £15 per annum to those whose salaries exceed £175 per annum, but do not exceed £274 per annum :

(iii) By £22 per annum to those whose salaries exceed £274 per annum.

(b) That the salaries payable in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (a) of this clause shall be increased on and from 1st June, 1949, as follows—

(i) By £5 per annum to those whose salaries do not exceed £296 per annum :

(ii) By £8 per annum to those whose salaries exceed £296 per annum, but do not exceed £411 per annum :

(iii) By £13 per annum to those whose salaries exceed £411 per annum.

3. *Minimum Remuneration*—That the following regulations of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1948 shall be read as follows :—

(i) That in Regulation 34 (2) the rate of £230 per annum shall be replaced by £252 per annum on and from 1st July, 1948, and by £257 per annum on and from 1st June, 1949, and, further, that the rate of £299 per annum be replaced by £322 per annum on and from 1st July, 1948, and by £330 per annum on and from 1st June, 1949 :

(ii) That in Regulation 81 (1) (b) the rate of £285 per annum be replaced by £307 per annum on and from 1st July, 1948, and by £315 per annum on and from 1st June, 1949, and, further, that the rate of £230 per annum be replaced by £252 per annum on and from 1st July, 1948, and by £257 per annum on and from 1st June, 1949 :

(iii) That in Regulation 81 (2) and Regulation 82 (2) the rate of £335 per annum be replaced by £357 per annum on and from 1st July, 1948, and by £365 per annum on and from 1st June, 1949, and, further, that the rate of £305 per annum be replaced by £327 per annum on and from 1st July, 1948, and by £335 per annum on and from 1st June, 1949 :

(iv) That in column (4) of Part II of the Ninth Schedule the rate of £300 per annum shall be replaced by £322 per annum on and from 1st July, 1948, and by £330 per annum on and from 1st June, 1949 :

(v) That in column (3) of Part III of the Ninth Schedule the rates listed ranging from £230 per annum to £255 per annum shall in each case be increased by £22 per annum on and from 1st July, 1948, and on and from 1st June, 1949, be increased in accordance with the provisions of clause 2 (b) hereof :

(vi) That in column (4) of Part III of the Ninth Schedule the rate of £285 per annum wherever it appears shall be replaced by £307 per annum as at 1st July, 1948, and by £315 per annum as at 1st June, 1949 :

(vii) That in column (5) of Part III of the Ninth Schedule the rate of £230 per annum wherever it appears be replaced by £252 per annum as at 1st July, 1948, and by £257 per annum as at 1st June, 1949.

4. *Part-time Employees*—

(a) That the hourly rate of payment applicable to part-time employees in terms of Regulation 94 (1) and Regulation 115 (4) (a) and (b) shall be increased by 5d. per teaching hour on and after 1st July, 1948, and by 3d. per teaching hour on and after 1st June, 1949.

(b) That employees whose normal hours of work are less than twenty-five per week shall receive a *pro rata* increase based upon the appropriate scale of increases provided for in clauses 2 and 3 hereof.

5. *Free Kindergarten Employees*.—That the increases provided for in clause 2 hereof shall be applicable to free kindergarten employees.

6. That in accordance with the application made by the Acting Director of Education on behalf of the Public Service Commission, this Order shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to teachers and other persons employed in the Education Department of the Public Service and consisting of a class whose salaries have hitherto been fixed in relation to salaries payable to "employees" as defined in paragraph (a) of clause 1 of this Order.
