HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to the Whangarei Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as the licensee) a licence, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the First Schedule hereto; and further doth hereby revoke the Orders in Council referred to in the Second Schedule hereto, authorizing the licensee to erect and maintain electric lines in the Borough of Whangarei, and in part of the County of Whangarei.

CONDITIONS

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

The licence hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and with all regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor: provided that the licensee shall not, by virtue of this clause be required, except in the normal course of alteration, repair, or maintenance, to reconstruct in conformity with the regulations hereinbefore mentioned any electric lines or works which conformed to the regulations in force at the time of the construction thereof.

3. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

Bulk supply shall be received from the North Auckland Electric-power Board at the licensee's substation at Kensington, at a nominal pressure of 11,000 volts between phases, and from Wilson's (N.Z.) Portland Cement, Limited, at the licensee's substation in Walton Street, at a nominal pressure of 22,000 volts between phases.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a) and (f) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The primary distribution voltages shall be 11,000 volts between phases, and 2,200 volts between phases.

4. DURATION OF LICENCE

Unless sooner lawfully determined, this licence shall continue in force until the 13th day of June, 1963.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to John Morrell Bristowe Collier, of Bell's Junction, Mataroa, Farmer (hereinafter referred to as the licensee), a licence subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of the Koukoupo Creek (hereinafter referred to as the said stream), situated in Section 1, Block V, Maungakaretu Survey District, and to take and use therefrom for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding 36 cubic feet per second at any one time, and to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines hereinafter described.

CONDITIONS

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

The conditions to be implied in all licences by the Water-power Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

This licence is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS

Water shall be used under this licence solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the said stream at a point in Section 1, Block V, Maungakaretu Survey District, as indicated on the plan marked S.H.D. 83, deposited in the office of the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this licence, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan S.H.D. 83:—

- Headworks consisting of a dam and intake giving a static head of approximately 18 in.:
- Water-race leading from such headworks to the power-house hereinafter described:
- Water wheel and power-house with all necessary equipment for generating electricity, situated in Section 1, Block V, Maungakaretu Survey District:
- Tail-race leading from the said power-house to the said stream:
- Electric lines leading from the said power-house to the licensee's residence, a wool-shed, a cow-shed, and a cottage, and across the Koukoupo Road to the shearer's cottage, all situated in Section 1 aforesaid, the said lines being more particularly delineated by means of black lines on the aforesaid plan S.H.D. 83.

5. DURATION OF LICENCE

Unless sooner determined, this licence shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1970, or until electrical energy is available from an electric-power board or other public source of supply, whichever is the earlier.

6. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, and shall be alternating current at a normal rated pressure of 230 volts.

7. RENTAL

For the purpose of assessing the rental or annual sum payable in respect of this licence, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the State Hydro-electric Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed. The present plant is rated at 2 kilowatts.

8. NO RIGHT TO WATER CONFERRED

Nothing in this licence shall of itself confer upon the licensee any right to water.

Authorizing the Taupo Town Board to Use Water for the Purpose of Generating Electricity, and to Erect and Use Electric Lines in the Town District of Taupo and Portion of the County of Taupo

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to the Taupo Town Board (hereinafter referred to as the licensee), a licence subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of the Hinemaia Stream, situated in Tauhara South B Block and part No. 1 Opaawa, Block I, Waitahanui Survey District, in the County of Taupo, and to take and use therefrom for the purpose hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding 600 cubic feet per second at any one time, and to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines hereinafter described.

CONDITIONS

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Water-power Regulations 1934, and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

This licence is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS

Water shall be used under this licence solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the said stream at a point in Tauhara South B Block and part No. 1 Opaawa, Block I, Waitahanui Survey District, as indicated on the plans marked S.H.D. 70 and 71 respectively, deposited in the office of the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purpose of this licence, the positions of the said works, except those referred to in paragraph (e) hereof, being indicated on the aforesaid plan S.H.D. 71:—

- (a) Headworks consisting of a dam and intake giving a static head of approximately 80 ft.:
- (b) Pipeline leading from the intake aforesaid to the power-house hereinafter referred to:
- (c) Water-turbine and power-house with all necessary equipment for generating electricity situated in Tauhara South B Block, Block I, Waitahanui Survey District:
- (d) Tail-race leading from the said water-turbine to the said stream:
- (e) The electric lines described in the Schedule hereto.

5. DURATION OF LICENCE

This licence shall, unless sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1979.

6. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (c), and (f) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The generating voltage shall be 3,300 volts between phases, and the transmission voltage and primary distribution voltage shall be 11,000 volts between phases.

7. RENTAL

For the purpose of assessing the rental or annual sum payable in respect of this licence, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the State Hydro-electric Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed. The present plant is rated at 600 kilowatts.

8. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for all other purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include electrical energy used for such purposes directly or indirectly from the source of supply except where used to charge a secondary battery for standby emergency lighting only; and provided further, that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for all other purposes. In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £16 per kilovolt-ampere of maximum demand per year plus ½d. per unit. "Wholesale supply" for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £180 per year.

9. TIME FOR COMPLETION

The period for the substantial completion of the works hereby authorized shall be three years from the date of this licence.

10. RIGHT TO WATER

Nothing in this licence shall of itself be deemed to confer any right to water.

And whereas the Taupiri Drainage and River Board (being a local authority within the meaning of the said Act) has issued securities in respect of the loans specified in the First Schedule hereto:

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"The date of conversion" means the date specified in clause five of this Order:

"Existing securities" means debentures or other securities issued in respect of the loans specified in the First Schedule hereto:

"The local authority" means the Taupiri Drainage and River Board:

"New securities" or "new debentures" means securities or debentures issued in accordance with this Order in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies.

3. This Order shall apply to all existing securities issued in respect of the loans specified in the First Schedule hereto.

4. (1) If the local authority so resolves by a resolution passed and confirmed as provided by subsection two of section nine of the Act, it may, with the consent of the holder of the existing securities to which this Order applies, and subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Order, issue new securities in conversion of such existing securities.

(2) The following provisions of this Order shall come into force if such a resolution is passed and confirmed as aforesaid but not otherwise:

Provided that a certificate signed by the Chairman of the local authority and published in the *Gazette* to the effect that such a resolution has been duly passed and confirmed shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein certified.

DATE OF CONVERSION

5. The date from which the conversion of existing securities into new securities shall be deemed to take effect shall be the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifty.

CONSENT TO CONVERSION

6. The consent of the holder of the existing securities to the conversion thereof in accordance with this Order shall, if given, be specified in writing, and when given shall be irrevocable.

NEW SECURITIES

7. (1) New securities shall be issued to secure an aggregate amount of principal of six thousand two hundred pounds (£6,200).

(2) The aggregate amount of principal secured by the new securities to be issued in accordance with this Order, together with interest thereon computed at a rate not exceeding four and one-quarter per centum (4¼%) per annum during the first six and one-half (6½) years of the term of the loan and a rate not exceeding three and one-quarter per centum (3¼%) per annum during the balance of the term of the loan, shall be repaid by equal half-yearly instalments over a period of twenty-five (25) years, the first half-yearly instalment to fall due and be paid on the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fifty, and subsequent half-yearly instalments to fall due and be paid on every twenty-eighth day of January and July thereafter, the last half-yearly instalment to fall due and be paid on the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seventy-five.

8. (1) New securities for the amount of each half-yearly instalment shall be issued in the form of debentures in the form numbered (1) in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) All new debentures shall be numbered consecutively, and as between the holders thereof shall rank equally.

(3) Every new debenture shall state on its face that the holder has no claim in respect thereof upon the Government or public revenues of New Zealand.

(4) Every new debenture shall be signed by the Chairman, countersigned by the Treasurer or some other officer appointed by the local authority for the purpose, and sealed with the common seal of the local authority.

SURRENDER OF EXISTING SECURITIES AND PAYMENT OF INTEREST THEREON

9. The holder of the existing securities shall surrender the existing securities in exchange for the new securities, and shall be entitled to receive on the date of conversion interest on the existing securities for the period ending on that date.

PLACE FOR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST

10. The principal and interest in respect of new securities shall be payable in New Zealand.

SECURITY

11. (1) As a security for the new securities the local authority shall forthwith, by resolution gazetted (in the form numbered (2) in the Second Schedule hereto), make and levy a special rate upon all rateable property in the Woodlands Drainage District to provide for the payment of the half-yearly instalments of principal and interest in respect of such securities.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the provisions of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of any other Act shall, so far as applicable and with all necessary modifications, apply with respect to such special rate, and with respect to the interest and other charges in respect of such securities, as if such special rate were made and levied in respect of a special loan raised under Part I of the said Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926.

Vesting the Control of a Scenic Reserve in the North Shore Scenic Board

B. C. FREYBERG, Governor-General

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto, being land reserved under the said Act, for the period of five years from the date hereof, unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act, in the undermentioned persons, namely:—

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Tuesday, the sixth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, at half-past one o'clock p.m., at the Birkenhead Borough Council Office, Birkenhead, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business at such time and place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.
2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.
3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
4. Any five members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.
5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.
6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman for such meeting.
7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.
8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.
9. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.
