PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant, subject to the condition hereinafter set forth, a licence authorizing The Colonial Sugar Refining Company, Limited, a duly incorporated company, having its registered office at Auckland (hereinafter referred to as the licensee), to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto.

CONDITIONS

1. Implied Conditions

The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. Licence Subject to Regulations

The licence hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and with all regulations made or to be made in amplification of amendment thereof or in substitution therefor: provided that the licensee shall not, by virtue of this clause, be required, except in the normal course of alterations, repair, or maintenance, to reconstruct in conformity with the regulations hereinbefore mentioned any existing electric line or work which conformed to the regulations in force at the time of the construction thereof.

3. System of Supply

The system of supply shall be a direct-current system as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21–01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935.

4. DURATION OF LICENCE

Unless sooner lawfully determined, this licence shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1970.

- (c) By omitting from subclause (1) of clause 8 the figure "9d." in relation to oranges and the figure "10d." in relation to grapefruit and substituting the figures "10d." and "11d." respectively.
- (d) By inserting after the word "Greymouth" in paragraph (a) of subclause (1) of clause 7 the word "Westport".

"Retailer", in relation to barley means any person who purchases barley from a merchant distributor for sale to a consumer:

The expression "f.o.r.s.e." means "free on rail, sacks extra", and the expression "f.o.b.s.e." means "free on board, sacks extra":

The expression "f.o.r.s.i." means free on rail, sacks included" and the expression "f.o.b.s.i." means "free on board, sacks included".

4. The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any barley to which this Order is applicable is sold otherwise than by weight.

5. The several prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

Principal Order No. 12 of the Government Service Tribunal

In the matter of section 8 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, and in the matter of an application for a principal order dated the 30th day of November, 1949, and duly lodged by the New Zealand Federated Hotel Restaurant and Related Trades' Employees' Industrial Association of Workers.

THE Government Service Tribunal having heard and considered the application of the applicant, doth hereby order that the following provisions shall take effect on and from the dates respectively therein set out in clause 1:--

APPLICATION OF ORDER

1. (a) This Order shall apply to Tourist and Health Resorts Department workers at tourist hotels, hostels, camps, huts, and related establishments and locations.

- (b) For the purposes of this Order, the term "worker" shall be limited to a worker engaged under the provisions of Public Service Regulation 150.
- (c) This Order, with the exception of clause 3, shall be deemed to have come into force on the 18th day of March, 1949.
- (d) Clause 3 shall be deemed to have come into force on the 24th day of December, 1948.
- (e) Except as otherwise provided in this Order and in any related administrative provisions that may be approved by the Public Service Commission, the rates of wages and conditions of employment of workers under this Order shall be as prescribed from time to time in the New Zealand Licensed Hotels' Employees Award (hereinafter referred to as the award).

HOURS OF WORK

- 2. (a) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the award, the manager of any of the establishments listed in subclause (c) below may employ a worker, as set out therein, on seasonal duties for up to eight hours a day on any or all of the seven days of the week without payment of overtime: Provided that such worker shall, at the termination of his employment, be paid one-quarter of his full week's wages for each day of eight hours worked in excess of his normal five days a week.
- (b) Time worked in excess of eight hours a day shall be paid for at overtime rate.
 - (c) Establishment—

- (d) A worker employed in terms of subclause (a) above shall, on termination of employment, be provided with free transport on the following basis:

Provided that this subclause shall not apply to a worker who-

- (i) Is discharged on the grounds of incompetence within one week of commencing work, or misconduct or default within thirteen weeks of commencing work; or
- (ii) Of his own volition and through no fault of the employer, terminates his employment within thirteen weeks of commencing work.

Principal Order No. 13 of the Government Service Tribunal

In the matter of section 8 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, and in the matter of an application for a principal order dated the 6th day of December, 1949, and duly lodged by the New Zealand Musicians' Industrial Union of Workers.

THE Government Service Tribunal having heard and considered the application of the applicant, doth hereby order that the following provisions shall take effect on and from the dates respectively therein set out in clause 1:—

APPLICATION OF ORDER

- 1. (a) This Order shall apply to players of the National Orchestra of the New Zealand Broadcasting Service.
- (b) For the purposes of this Order the term "player" shall be limited to a player engaged under the provisions of Public Service Regulation 150.
- (c) This Order with the exception of subclause 5 (a), shall be deemed to have come into force on the 19th day of February, 1949.
- (d) Subclause 5 (a) shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of July, 1948.

HOURS OF WORK

- 2. (a) The ordinary hours of work shall be twenty-five a week and five a day, and shall be worked at any time on any five days of the week Thursdays to Wednesdays inclusive.
- (b) Any call to a studio of the Department either for rehearsal or performance or both, shall count as a minimum of two hours. Any call outside a studio of the Department for rehearsal only shall count as a minimum of two hours. Any call outside a studio of the Department for a performance shall count as a minimum of three hours.
- (c) Players when in local groups may be required to rehearse before and after a public performance or studio broadcast as part of the same call.
- (d) The National Orchestra when functioning as a whole for school concerts may be required to rehearse before and after such school concerts as part of the same call.
- (e) A rest period of fifteen minutes shall be allowed during every rehearsal of not less than three hours.

OVERTIME

- 3. (a) Overtime rates shall apply to all time worked in excess of five hours a day of outside the first five days worked in any week.
 - (b) Overtime shall be paid for at time and one-half rate for the first three hours and double time rate thereafter.
- (c) A player required to work on a Sunday shall be paid one day's pay at ordinary time rate in addition to the week's normal wage.

HOLIDAYS

- 4. (a) Provided he has worked for the Department at any time during the fortnight ending on the day on which the holiday occurs a player shall be allowed the following holidays on pay: New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and the Anniversary Day of the Province of Wellington (22nd January).
- (b) At the discretion of the Director of Broadcasting and subject to the needs of the Department, other provincial anniversary days may be taken as days off by players for the time being in the centres concerned, provided that normal work is performed on five other days of the week in which the anniversary day occurs. Penal rate shall not be paid for time worked on any anniversary day other than that of the Wellington Province.
- (c) A player who has worked for more than one employer during the fortnight ending on the day on which the holiday occurs is entitled to one payment only for the holiday, and payment will be by arrangement between the Department and the other employer or employers.
- (d) When any of the above holidays, except Anzac Day, falls on a Saturday or a Sunday it shall be observed on the following Monday, and in the event of another holiday falling on such Monday, such other holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Tuesday.
- (e) Time worked on any of the holidays prescribed in subclause (a) above shall be paid for at double time rate in addition to the holiday payment.
 - (f) The principle of the Annual Holidays Act, 1944, shall be applied.

- (d) Dress and Instrument—A player shall be paid a dress allowance of £7 10s. a year and provided he provides his own instrument shall be paid an instrument allowance of £2 10s. a year.
- (e) Doubling—A player shall be paid an allowance of 5s. for each day he is required to play an extra instrument. The Department and the New Zealand Musicians' Union shall decide which instruments shall be deemed to be "extra instruments" for the purposes of this subclause.

TRAVELLING TIME AND ALLOWANCES

- 6. (a) Travelling-time shall count as time worked with a maximum of five hours in any one journey which necessitates travelling up to twenty-four hours. Travelling-time on a Sunday or holiday prescribed in clause 4 hereof shall not be paid for at overtime or penal rate.
- (b) While on tour a player shall be paid travelling-allowance at the following rate— $\,$
 - (i) On and from 19th February, 1949: 22s. 6d. a day or part thereof.
 - (ii) On and from 16th May, 1949: At the rate of 30s. a day.
- (c) Every player while on tour shall be entitled to first-class train or steamer-express accommodation: Provided that where such accommodation is not available the player shall travel and be paid the amount (if any) by which the cost of the accommodation actually provided is less than the cost of first-class accommodation.

PAYMENT OF WAGES AND TERM OF EMPLOYMENT

- 7. (a) Players' wages shall be paid weekly. A deduction shall be made from a player's weekly wage only in respect of—
 - (i) Time lost through the player's own default;
 - (ii) Sick or accident leave in excess of the provision approved by the Public Service Commission; or
 - (iii) Absence from work through no fault of the Department.
- (b) Employment shall be deemed to be monthly employment and may be terminated by either party giving not less than one month's prior notice of such termination.
