WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), has recommended that the lands described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Altering the Boundaries of the Tauranga and Thames Valley Electric-power Districts

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Tauranga and Thames Valley Electric-power Districts by excluding the area described in the First Schedule hereto from the Tauranga Electric-power District and including such area in the Thames Valley Electric-power District, and do hereby declare that the altered boundaries of the Tauranga and Thames Valley Electric-power Districts shall be those described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto respectively.

FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, being part of the County of Ohinemuri, bounded by a line commencing at a point (Te Ararimu) in Block I, Katikati North Survey District, where the southern boundary of the Waihi No. 5 Block meets the sea, and running in a south-westerly direction generally along the northern boundary of Crown Land, the northern side and western extremity of a public road, the south-western boundary of Lot 1 on D.P. 22631, to and along the north-western boundaries of Section 8, Block I, Katikati North Survey District, Ohinemuri Nos. 17A 2A and 17A 2B Blocks, Lot 1 on D.P. 32351, being part of Ohinemuri No. 17A 2C Block and part of Sections 6 and 7, Block I, aforesaid, the south-western boundary of Lot 1, aforesaid, the north-western boundary of Section 3, Block I, aforesaid, a right line across the East Coast Main Trunk Railway, to and along another part of the said north-western boundary and a right line, being its production across the Waihi-Tauranga Main Highway, and along its south-western side to the northernmost corner of Section 12, Block I, Katikati Survey District; thence along the north-western and south-western boundaries of Section 12, aforesaid, and the generally western boundaries of Section 17, Block I, and Section 31, Block IV, Katikati Survey District, to and along the northern boundaries, of Lot 1 on D.P. 30035, being part of Section 11, Block IV, aforesaid, part Lot 3 and Lot 2 on D.P. 23590, being part Section 15, Block IV, aforesaid, a right line across a public road, to and along the northern and western boundaries of Lot 1, on D.P. 23590, aforesaid, to and along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 30 and 28, Block IV, aforesaid, and the north-eastern boundary of Section 4, Block VII, Aroha Survey District; thence north-easterly by a right line in the direction of the mouth of the Waihi Stream to its intersection with the western boundary of portion of the Borough of Waihi (Waihi Beach Reserve); thence, south-easterly generally along the said borough boundary and the shores of the Bay of Plenty, to the point of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 82, deposited in the office of the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department, and thereon outlined in red.

SECOND SCHEDULE

TAURANGA ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District comprising the County of Tauranga, parts of the County of Rotorua, the Boroughs of Mount Maunganui and Te Puke, and part of the Borough of Tauranga, bounded by a line commencing at a point in Block I, Katikati North Survey District, on the shores of the Bay of Plenty known as Te Ararimu, and being the south-eastern corner of Waihi No. 5 Block, and running south-easterly along the general line of the coast to a point due north of Trig. Station J—1; thence running due south along a right line through the aforesaid Trig. Station J—1 to the north-eastern corner of Section 2, Block XI, Waihi South Survey District; thence due westerly along another right line to its intersection with the middle of the Waitahanui River, and running south-westerly generally up the middle of the said Waitahanui River to a point, being the production north-easterly of the north-western boundary of Section 1A, Block II, Rotoma Survey District; thence along a right line, to and along the said north-western boundary and the north-western boundaries of Sections 2, 3, 4, and 5, of the said Block II, and being the eastern side of Hannon's Road, to its intersection with the northern boundary of Block VI, Rotoma Survey District; thence due west along the northern boundaries of the said Block VI and Block V, Rotoma Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of Block IV, Rotoiti Survey District; thence northerly generally along the eastern boundary of the said Block IV, to and along the north-eastern boundaries of Te Rotoiti Nos. 5B, 5A, and part No. 4 Blocks, and crossing intersecting public roads, to and along the eastern boundary of Section 1, Block IV, aforesaid, and the eastern boundary of Section 1, Block XVI, Maketu Survey District, to its intersection with the right line between the north-eastern corner of Section 2, Block X, Waihi South Survey District, and Trig. Station 1039 (Otanewainuku); thence due west along the aforesaid right line to its intersection with the middle of the Paraiti or Mangorewa River; thence up the middle of that river to a point, being the production southwards of the eastern boundary of Section 8, Block IV, Rotorua Survey District; thence along a right line, to and along the eastern and northern boundaries of the said Section 8, and along the southern side of Matai Road to a point, being the production south-easterly of the north-eastern boundary of Section 7, Block IV, Rotorua Survey District; thence along a right line across Matai Road and along the said north-eastern boundary and its production to the middle of the Whataroa Stream; thence down the middle of the said stream to a point due east of Trig. Station 1039 (Otanewainuku); thence due west along a right line, through the aforesaid Trig. Station to its intersection with another right line between Trig. Stations 27 (Puwenua), and 146 (Te Weraiti); thence north-westerly and northerly along the last-mentioned right line, to Trig. Station 146 (Te Weraiti)

aforesaid, and another right line from aforesaid Trig. Station, to Trig. Station 909 (Waianuanu); thence along the north-eastern boundaries generally of part Okauia No. 1, Maurihiro A (Crown Land), Maurihiro B, and Waiharakeke East No. 5, 1A, 1C 2B 2, and 1C 1A Blocks, part Section 20, Block III, Wairere Survey District, on D.P. 28359, and Lot 5 on D.P. 25781, being part of the said Section 20, to the northernmost angle in its northern boundary; thence along right lines from hill to hill, along the summit of the range forming the western boundary of the Tauranga Confiscation District to a point on the right line between Trig. Station 567 (Te Aroha) and Trig. Station Ngakuriawhare (in Block I, Katikati North Survey District); thence along the said right line to Trig. Station 567, aforesaid; thence north-easterly generally along a right line to the western corner of Section 3, Block VII, Aroha Survey District, and along the south-western boundaries of Section 3, aforesaid, Section 3, Block VIII, Aroha Survey District, Section 1, Block XII, Katikati Survey District, part Section 25 and Section 34, Block IV, Katikati Survey District, to the southern corner of the last-mentioned Section; thence along the eastern boundary of the said Section 34, the southern boundary of Section 26, Block IV, aforesaid, a right line across a public road, to and along the southern and eastern boundaries of Section 27, Block IV, aforesaid, and the eastern boundary of Section 2, Block XII, of the said Survey District, to and along the southern boundaries of parts Section 50, Block IV, Aroha Survey District, to the Waihi-Tauranga Main Highway; thence along the south-western side of that highway to a point, being the production south-westerly of the south-eastern boundary of Lot 9, on D.P. 28257, being part of Section 2, Block I, Katikati North Survey District; thence along a right line across the said highway, to and along the said south-eastern boundary, and another right line across the East Coast Main Trunk Railway, to and along the south-eastern boundaries generally of Lots 2, 5, and 4 on the said D.P. 28257, and part Section 5, Block I, Katikati North Survey District, to the southern boundary of part Lot 1, on D.P. 28882, being part Waihi No. 5 Block, thence along the said southern boundary to the point of commencement; excluding thereout that part of the Borough of Tauranga which constituted the Borough of Tauranga as originally proclaimed. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.D.H. 80, deposited in the office of the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department, and thereon outlined in orange.

THAMES VALLEY ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, comprising the Counties of Hauraki Plains, Thames, Ohinemuri, and Piako, parts of the Counties of Coromandel, Matamata, and Waikato, and the Boroughs of Te Aroha, Paeroa, Morrinsville, Thames, Matamata, Waihi, and Putaruru, bounded by a line commencing at a point where the right bank of the Miranda Stream meets the Firth of Thames; thence running easterly along the sea-coast to the southern boundary of the Thames Borough; thence along the southern western and part of the northern boundaries of the said borough to the sea-coast; thence northerly along the sea-coast to the mouth of the Waikawau River and up the middle of that river to its source; thence along a right line to the northern head of the Tairua Harbour; thence south-easterly generally along the sea-coast to a point (Te Ararimu) in Block I, Katikati North Survey District, where the southern boundary of Waihi No. 5 Block meets the sea; thence south-westerly and south-easterly by the Tauranga Electric-power District as described in the Second Schedule hereto to a point, being the intersection of the right line between Trig. Stations 146 (Te Weraiti) and 27 (Puwhenua) and the line running due west from Trig. Station 1039 (Otanewainuku); thence along a right line to Trig. Station 27, aforesaid; thence south-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station 807 (Uraura), and along another right line in the direction of the mouth of the Waihora Stream (Lake Taupo) to the middle of the Waikato River; thence westerly and northerly generally down the middle of the said river to its intersection with a right line between Trig. Station 807 (Uraura), aforesaid, and Trig. Station 1427 (Maungatautari); thence north-westerly along the said right line to the last-mentioned Trig. station and along another right line to the easternmost corner of Section 11, Block II, Maungatautari Survey District; thence northerly generally along the north-eastern boundaries of the said Section 11, Block II, aforesaid, the north-eastern boundaries of Lots 2, and 1 on D.P. 24663, being part of Pukekura No. 17 Block, and part Pukekura No. 17D 1 Block as shown on D.P. 3948 and the south-eastern boundary of Pukekura No. 18B 2 Block, the north-eastern boundaries of the said No. 18B 2 Block, and Pukekura Nos. 18B 1A, 18B 1B, 18B 1C Blocks, the south-eastern boundaries of Allotments 226, 187, 186, 185, Crown Land, 184, 234, and 227, Pukekura Parish, and the last-mentioned boundary produced to the middle of the Waikato River; thence up the middle of the said river and the middle of the Mangahanene Stream, to and along the eastern boundaries of part Lot IV on D.P. 3300, and part Lot IV on D.P. 22363, being part Hinuera No. 2 Block, to and along the southern side generally of the Cambridge-Hinuera Road to a point, being the production south-easterly of the north-eastern boundary of Lot 7A, on Deeds Plan C 36; thence along a right line across the said road, to and along the said north-eastern boundary, a right line across a public road, to and along the north-eastern boundary of Lot 1 of Section 3, Whitehall Settlement, the abutment of a public road, the north-eastern boundaries of part Section 2 and part Lot 1, of Section 2, Whitehall Settlement, Section 5, Block VII, Cambridge Survey District, a right line across a public road, to and along the north-eastern boundaries of Lot 2 of Section 2, Whitehall Settlement, and Lots 2 and 1 on D.P. 22739, being part of Section 1 of the aforesaid settlement, to and along the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of Lot 1 on D.P. 22079, being part of the aforesaid Section 1, along the north-western boundary of Lot 2 on D.P. 22079 aforesaid, and a right line, being its production across Te Miro Road; thence along the north-eastern boundaries

generally of Sections 76s and 4s, Te Miro Settlement, to a point, being the production south-easterly of the western side of Taylor's Road; thence along a right line across the Maungakawa Road, to and along the north-eastern boundaries generally of Sections 10s, 39s, 38s, and 95s, Te Miro Settlement, and the north boundary of the last-mentioned Section, to a point, being the production south-westerly of the western side of Tauhuroa Road; thence along a right line across the Te Miro Road, to and along the said western side, to and along the north-eastern and northern boundaries of Section 103s and the northern boundaries of Lot 1 of 34s, and 35s, Te Miro Settlement, to Trig. Station 50 (Pukemoremore); thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundaries of Section 3, Block I, Cambridge Survey District, part Pukemoremore No. 3N Block, the abutment of a public road, Pukemoremore No. 2 Block, Lots 3, 2, and 1 of Allotment 147B, Tamahere Parish, on D.P. 14657, a right line across a public road, to and along the north-eastern boundaries of Lots 2 and 1 on D.P. 31453, being part of the land granted to the New Zealand Loan and Mercantile Agency Company, Limited, 1876, Allotment 242, Tamahere Parish, Lot 1 on D.P. 24739, a right line across a public road, to and along the north-eastern boundaries of part Lot 18, on D.P. 2970, Lots 3, 2, and 1 on D.P. 10497, Lots 2 and 1 on D.P. 13035, Lots 4, 3, 2, and 1 on D.P. 14720, a right line across a public road, to and along the north-eastern boundary of part Lot 1 on D.P. 2691, a right line across a public road, the Frankton Junction-Rotorua Railway, and another public road, to and along the north-eastern boundaries of Lots 17, 16, 15, and 14 on D.P. 4160, Lot 2 on D.P. 26563, Lot 5 on D.P. 12436, the north-eastern side of a public road and its production across a public road, to and along the northern boundaries of Lot 6, on D.P. 4950, all the aforesaid Lots being part of the land granted to the New Zealand Loan and Mercantile Agency Company, Limited, 1876, Lot 2 on D.P. 32840 being part Tauhei Nos. 7B and 4A Blocks, the abutment of a public road, Lot 2 on D.P. 26041, being part Tauhei Nos. 4B 2 and 5B 1 Blocks, Lots 7, 8, and 4 on D.P. 24572, a right line across a public road, to and along the north-eastern boundary of the land on D.P. 7615, being part of the land granted as aforesaid; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Lot 5 on D.P. 13199 being parts Taupiri Nos. 474A 2A and 474A 3 Blocks, a right line across a public road, to and along the north-eastern boundaries of part Taupiri No. 474A 2A and Nos. 474A 2B, 474A 2C, and 474A 2D Blocks, Allotment 585, Taupiri Parish, Taupiri No. 474c 1 Block, Allotments 500, 487, 484, parts Allotment 483, and Allotment 485 Taupiri Parish, Allotments 456 and 455 Whangamarino Parish, a right line across a public road, to and along the north-eastern boundaries generally of Allotments 454, 501, 502, Whangamarino Parish, aforesaid, Sections 3 and 2, Block XI, Section I, Block VII, Sections 24 and 23, Block VI, Piako Survey District, Allotment 70A and part Allotment 69A, Maramarua Parish, to a point, being the intersection of the north-eastern boundary of the said Allotment 69A and the southern side of the Paeroa-Pokeno Railway; thence by a right line to Trig. Station 135, Rataroa; thence north-easterly by another right line, to and along the south-eastern boundary of Section 9, Block VIII, Wharekawa Survey District, and the south-eastern boundaries of Lot 3 on D.P. 13319, being part Allotment 74, Lot 2 on D.P. 29999, being part Allotments 75, 76, and 78, a right line across a public road, to and along the south-eastern boundary of part Lot 3, on the said D.P. 29999, being part Allotment 81, and the south-eastern boundary of Allotment 82, the aforesaid Allotments being Koheroa Parish to the right bank of the Miranda Stream; thence along the said right bank to the point of commencement. PURSUANT to the Government Railways Act, 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1950 and shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1908, on the 12th day of June, 1922, and published in the *Gazette* on the 15th day of the same month at page 1583, as the same are enuring under the Government Railways Act, 1949, (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 16 of the principal regulations, as replaced by Regulation 2 of the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1947 (No. 2),* and as amended by Regulation 2 of the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1949† and by Regulation 2 of the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1949 (No. 2),‡ is hereby further amended, by omitting from the line reading "Clerk . . . 20 . . . 50†" of the table comprising part of clause (1), the figures "20" and substituting the figures "30."

3. (1) Regulation 64 of the principal regulations as enacted by the regulations made on the 7th day of October, 1936, and published in the *Gazette* on the 8th day of the same month at page 1840, and as amended by the regulations made on the 7th day of December, 1939, and published in the *Gazette* on the 14th day of the same month at page 3494, by Regulation 5 of the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1947|| and by Regulation 4 of the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1949‡ is hereby revoked and the following regulation substituted:—

"64. (1) Every administrative officer who in the course of his duty within New Zealand is required to be absent from his headquarters on relief or other duty for a continuous period of twenty-four hours or longer, or a period involving his leaving and returning on successive days, shall, subject to the succeeding provisions of this regulation, be paid an allowance in respect of the time during which he is so absent after the following rates:—

"(a) An administrative officer whose salary does not exceed £999 per annum	30 0
"(b) An administrative officer whose salary exceeds £999 per annum but does not exceed £1,499 per annum	35 0

"Provided that the foregoing rates shall be increased by 2s. in respect of each occasion on which the administrative officer secures sleeping-accommodation in an hotel for one night only.

"(2) For the purposes of this regulation a day means a period of twenty-four hours and every period of absence shall be computed from and to the times of departure from and return to the administrative officer's headquarters. For any part of a day the amount payable shall be one twenty-fourth of the specified daily rate for each hour of absence from headquarters. In computing the period of such absence a fraction of an hour, if half an hour or more, shall be reckoned as one hour; but if less than half an hour shall not be taken into account.

"(3) When in the course of his duty an administrative officer is required to be absent from his headquarters for a continuous period of less than twenty-four hours, leaving and returning on the same day, there shall be paid to him his actual reasonable out-of-pocket expenses, but so that the payment is not greater than he would be entitled to for an absence of twenty-four hours.

"(4) Where an administrative officer, while absent from his headquarters on duty, is provided with—

- "(a) A sleeping-berth by train at night; or
- "(b) Sleeping-accommodation on a sea journey at night; or
- "(c) Breakfast, midday meal, or evening meal on a sea journey,

"the allowance specified in clause (1) of this regulation shall be reduced by one-quarter of one day's allowance for each such occasion:

"Provided that the General Manager may, at his discretion, waive the provisions of this clause, either generally or for such cases as he deems fit.

"(5) An administrative officer when absent from New Zealand in the course of his duty shall be paid a subsistence allowance at such rate as may from time to time be determined by the Minister of Finance."

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 16th day of May, 1949.

4. The annual salary which must be attached to a position held by a person in the Department so as to constitute that person an "administrative officer" as that term is defined in section 2 of the Government Railways Act, 1949, shall be a salary in excess of £860 in lieu of a salary in excess of £825 originally provided for in the said section.
