Open Seasons' or Imported Game and/or Native Game in Certain Acclimatization Districts

PURSUANT to the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, the Minister of Internal Affairs doth hereby declare open seasons for imported game and/or native game, of the kinds specified, and in the acclimatization districts specified in the First Schedule hereto, except in the "Excepted Areas" specified in the Second Schedule hereto, during the periods set forth in relation to each district, subject in all cases to the following general conditions and subject to the special conditions specified in relation to each district, and doth hereby call the attention of sportsmen and others to the enactments and provisions and matters set forth or referred to in the Third and Fourth Schedules hereto. Any person taking or killing any imported game or native game otherwise than in terms of this notification (including the general conditions here-inafter set out and the special conditions specified in relation to any acclimatization district), is liable on conviction to a fine of £20.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

RESTRICTIONS

1. No person shall commence shooting earlier than one hour before sunrise or continue shooting later than one hour after sunset on any

day during the open season concerned. 2. (a) No person shall use live birds of any species as decoys nor shall use more than fifteen artificial decoys at any one time (except in the Auckland Acclimatization District, where the number of artificial decoys shall be not more than ten), and no such artificial

decoys shall be spread over a greater area than thirty yards square. (b) No person shall place any artificial decoys within 100 yards of the nearest of any other artificial decoys set out by any other person.

(c) In the Southland Acclimatization District more than three persons shall not take or kill or attempt to take or kill native game over the same set of decoys at any one time.
(d) In the Waimarino Acclimatization District the use of decoys of any type is absolutely prohibited.
(e) In the North Canterbury Acclimatization District artificial decoys may be used only during the period 6th May to 4th June

decoys may be used only during the period 6th May to 4th June, 1950 (both days inclusive).

(f) No person shall in any place during the period in that place of the open season hereby declared, use, in connection with the taking or killing of imported and/or native game, any form of decoying game by the aid of corn, wheat, oats, barley, maize, or any other grain or any products of grain or any other food placed by any person in or near the margin of any river, stream, lagoon, wheat pond, swamp, estuary, or other water. 3. No person shall use or cause to be used any motor-vehicle

in connection with the taking or killing of imported game and/or native game: Provided that this condition shall not be so construed as to prohibit the use of any motor-vehicle for the purpose of

travelling either generally or to or from a rendezvous. 4. No person shall use or cause to be used for the purpose of taking or killing any imported or native game any unmoored floating

taking or killing any imported or native game any unmoored hoating stand, pontoon, hide, mai-mai, or loo, or any boat artificially dressed or covered in any way. 5. No person engaged in shooting from any shelter mai-mai, mudhole, boat, louvre, or other contrivance shall use more than one gun: Provided that a person so engaged may have a second gun in a condition not immediately suitable for use, and held for use only in the event of the first gun becoming damaged or otherwise unfit for use unfit for use.

LICENCE FEES

6. (a) The fee for a licence to take or kill imported game and b. (a) The fee for a here to take or kill imported game and native game in all districts is as set out in Regulation 5, Animals Protection and Game Regulations 1939, and in the licence forms in respect of each district: Provided that licences to take or kill native game only, at a

fee of 15s., which is reducible to 10s, in respect of persons in receipt of an age benefit or a miner's benefit under the Social Security Act, 1938, may be issued in the following districts: Ashburton, Buller, Grey District, South Canterbury, Waimate, Waitaki, and Westland.

ISSUE OF LICENCES

(b) In all acclimatization districts other than the Rotorua Acclimatization District and the Southern Lakes Acclimatization District, the Secretary of the acclimatization society concerned or any person authorized by him in writing is hereby authorized to

(c) In the Rotorua Acclimatization District and in the Southern Lakes Acclimatization District the Under-Secretary of the Depart-ment of Internal Affairs, Wellington, or any person appointed by him for that purpose, is hereby authorized to sign and issue licences.

SANCTUARIES

Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, Section 6

(1) The Governor-General may from time to time, by Warrant

(1) The Governor-General may from time to time, by Warrant under his hand, declare any area described in such Warrant to be a sanctuary, and may in like manner revoke any such Warrant.
 (2) While any such Warrant remains in force it shall not be lawful for any person, except pursuant to an authority granted under section thirty-two of this Act, to take or kill in the area affected thereby any imported game or native game, or for any person, except under such conditions as may from time to time be prescribed by the Minister, to take any dog or firearm into such area, or to discharge any firearm or explosive in such area.
 (3) Every reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act. 1908.

(3) Every reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, shall be deemed to be a sanctuary under this Act.
(4) Every person who unlawfully takes or kills any animal within a sanctuary is liable to a fine of ten pounds for every such offence, and to a further fine of one pound for each animal so taken on billed. or killed.

METHOD OF TAKING RESTRICTED

Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, Section 11

(1) No imported or native game shall be trapped or taken by (1) No imported of native game shall be trapped of taken by means of traps or by any other means than by hunting or shooting, nor shall any trap, net, or snare be erected or set for the purpose of such trapping or taking at any time whatever, except by any person duly authorized under section thirty-one hereof.

(1) In addition to the prohibitions contained in sections 12 and 13 of the Act, no person shall kill or destroy any imported game or native game, or shoot at or attempt to shoot at any such imported game or native game, or show at or attempt to show at any such important game, or native game with any automatic or auto-loading gun, unless it is converted into a gun capable of carrying two cartridges only, or with any rifle, pea-rifle, or punt-gun; nor shall such person use any cartridge of a length exceeding $2\frac{3}{4}$ in. for the purposes above described : Provided that nothing in this clause shall apply to deer, moose, and wapiti.

Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, Section 13

(1) No person shall use any cylinder for the purpose of taking No person shall use any cylinder for the purpose of taking or killing imported or native game in any lake or river; nor shall the apparatus known as a silencer be used on any gun in the taking or killing of imported game or native game.

USE OF MOTOR-VEHICLES, AEROPLANES, AND POWER-BOATS

(See also section 3 of the General Conditions.)

LICENCES

Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, Section 14 (1) and (3) (1) No person shall take or kill any imported game or native game during an open season in any district unless he is the holder

game during an open season in any district unless he is the holder of a licence under this Act to take or kill imported game or native game in such district during that season. (3) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this section, any person in *bona fide* occupation of any land, and any one son or daughter of such person, may during an open season take or kill on that land without a licence (but subject to all other restrictions imposed by or under this Act) any imported game or native game that may lawfully be taken or killed under a licence in the district within the boundaries of which such land is situated, or such first-mentioned person may in writing appoint one other person to take or kill such game in his stead during such open season,

in which case he shall not himself take or kill imported game or native game without a licence while such appointment remains in force.

Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, Section 15

15. Nothing in any licence to take or kill imported game or native game shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill imported game or native game on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land excepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district.

Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, Section 39

39. Except as otherwise expressly provided, nothing in any licence or other authority under this Act shall entitle the holder thereof to enter upon any private land without the consent of the owner or occupier thereof or upon any State forest or provisional State forest State forest.

DISTURBING STOCK

Statutes Amendment Act, 1947, Section 66 (1)

(1) Every person commits an offence and is liable to a fine of fifty pounds who, without the authority of the occupier, goes upon any private land with dog or firearm and disturbs any stock depastured thereon.

FOURTH SCHEDULE

THE public are earnestly requested to assist in preserving for posterity the native birds of New Zealand. Under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, it is illegal for any person to take or kill any protected birds, or have in possession the skins, feathers, or eggs of any such birds, without the consent of the Minister of Internal Affairs. It is also illegal for any person to rake or destroy the pest of any

It is also illegal for any person to rob or destroy the nest of any bird to which the Act applies. Every person who offends against such provisions is liable to a fine of £25 for every such offence. The particular attention of sportsmen is drawn to the recent addition to the list of absolutely protected hirds of the following.
