ALTERATIONS TO

SCALE OF CHARGES

Alterations to the Scale of Charges Upon the New Zealand Government Railways

In pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1949, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, William Stanley Goosman, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations to the General Scale of Charges made on the 13th day of April, 1939, and published in the Supplement dated the 19th day of April, 1939, to the New Zealand Gazette of the 13th day of April, 1939, and the Local Rates Scale of Charges made on the 12th day of May, 1948, and published in the Supplement dated the 19th day of May, 1948, to the New Zealand Gazette of the 13th day of May, 1948, in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic, and do hereby declare that such alterations shall come into force on the 15th day of May, 1950.

25. Boy Scouts, Girl Guides, &c.

Omit this regulation, and substitute the following:-

1. Members of the following organizations, in parties of not less than six in number, travelling in uniform to attend parades or instruction camps, may be issued special excursion tickets (Regulation 6):—

Boy Scouts.
Boys' Brigade.
Girl Guides.
Girls' Life Brigade.
Navy League Sea Cadets.

Each application for tickets must be accompanied by a certificate in the following form:—

2. Members of the organizations mentioned in paragraph 1 hereof under fifteen years of age included in a party, or forming a party travelling under the provisions of this regulation, may be granted half the adult concession fare.

- I. The following tickets may be issued to sporting and athletic teams, golf, rowing, and rifle clubs, and such other parties as may be approved by the Department consisting in each case of not less than six adult passengers travelling
 - (a) Single tickets, at four-fifths of the ordinary single fare (Regulation 2); or(b) Return tickets, at the special excursion fare (Regulation 6).

Omit paragraph 4, and substitute the following:-

4. Tickets issued under the provisions of this regulation will have the same availability as ordinary tickets (Regulation 2). The minimum charges will be:—

27. Theatrical, Concert, and Circus Companies

 - (a) Single tickets, at four-fifths of the ordinary single fare (Regulation 2); or
 (b) Return tickets, at the special excursion fare (Regulation 6).

30. Judges Proceeding to Shows, Exhibitors, Attendants, Owners, or Travelling in Charge of Live-stock, Racehorses, or Polo Ponies

1. Judges of Exhibits Proceeding to Shows

Subparagraph (a): Omit the words "first-class" wherever shown.

Subparagraph (b): Omit "one month," and substitute "three months."

3. OWNERS OR TRAINERS TRAVELLING IN CHARGE OF RACEHORSES Subparagraph (b): Omit "two months," and substitute "three months."

3a. Jockeys and Trotting Drivers Travelling to and from Race and Trotting Meetings

Jockeys and trotting drivers travelling to attend race and trotting meetings for the purpose of riding or driving thereat, or returning home after having ridden or driven at such meetings, may, on production of a certificate in the following form, together with their membership-cards signifying membership of the New Zealand Jockeys' Association in the case of jockeys, and the New Zealand Owners' and Breeders' Association in the case of trotting drivers, be granted tickets at the following fares:-

(a) Single tickets, at four-fifths of the ordinary single fare (Regulation 2).(b) Return tickets, at the special excursion fare (Regulation 6).

Paragraph 5, through booking, Dunedin, Ravensbourne, and Portobello: Subparagraph (b): Omit "7s.," and substitute "7s. 6d."

LUGGAGE, PARCELS, ETC.
