Where an engineer has not satisfied the Board's requirements for qualification in one of these main branches, the restrictive or specialist class in which he is accepted is shown.

THE Government Service Tribunal, having heard and considered the application of the applicant doth hereby order:—

TOOL ALLOWANCE

- 1. Nothing in this Order shall apply to any of the following employees:-
- (a) Any person whose conditions of employment are for the time being governed by Principal Order No. 8 or any principal order to which any service organization other than the New Zealand Public Service Association (Inc.) is a party:
- (b) Any person employed in terms of Public Service Regulation 150 or whose conditions of employment are fixed by reference to the Hospital Employment Regulations 1948 (Serial number 1948/62) and amendments thereto, or by reference to any Agricultural Workers Order or to any award or industrial agreement:
- (c) Any person who is employed as a foreman or overseer:
- (d) Any person who is a contractor.
- 2. For the purposes of this order "a six-monthly period" shall mean a period of six calendar months expiring on the last day of March or September in any year, and the word "employee" has the same meaning as in the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948.
- 3. Any employee who is a tradesman, an apprentice, or a leading hand shall be paid a tool allowance at the rate hereinafter specified, provided—
 - (a) He has worked at his trade as an employee for more than half the normal working hours in a six-monthly period; and
 - (b) He possesses sufficient privately owned tools of trade to carry out all phases of his work efficiently.

Government Service Tribunal.—Principal Order No. 14

In the matter of section 8 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, and in the matter of an application for a principal order dated the 6th day of March, 1950, and duly lodged by the Wellington, Nelson, Westland, and Marlborough Local Bodies' Other Labourers and Related Trades' Industrial Union of Workers and the New Zealand Engineering, Coachbuilding, Aircraft, and Related Trades' Industrial Union of Workers.

THE Government Service Tribunal, having heard and considered the application of the applicants, hereby orders that the following provisions shall take effect on and from the dates respectively therein set out in

APPLICATION OF ORDER

1. (a) This Order shall apply to Marine Department workers at Westport Harbour.

(b) For the purposes of this Order the term "worker" shall be limited to a worker engaged under the provisions of Public Service Regulation 150.

(c) This Order, with the exception of clause 8, shall be deemed to

have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1949.

(d) Clause 8 shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of July, 1948.

HOURS OF WORK

2. (a) Subject to the provisions of clause 3 hereof the ordinary hours of work shall be forty a week and eight a day and, subject to the provisions of clause 14 hereof and sub-clause (b) below, shall be worked between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

(b) For work on dredges or tugs or where work is affected by tidal conditions the ordinary hours of work shall be worked between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. and, subject to the provisions of clause 5 (j) hereof, shall be

worked consecutively.

(c) When dredging, or when a dredge has left the wharf, or working-steam has been raised, the ordinary hours of work shall be inclusive of meal_period.

(d) A rest period of ten minutes shall be allowed every morning and

afternoon.

WET PLACES

3. (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 2 hereof, in all "wet places" six hours shall be deemed a working-day, and such hours shall be paid for at time and one-third rate.

(b) For the purposes of this clause a worker working in mud or water to such a degree that, in the opinion of the officer in charge, getting muddy or wet becomes unavoidable, shall be deemed to be working in a " wet place."

MEAL PERIOD

- 4. (a) A meal period of not less than half an hour, and not more than one hour, shall be allowed.
- (b) Except when required for urgent or emergency work a worker shall not be required to work for more than four and one-half hours continuously without being granted a meal period.

(c) When a worker is required to commence work before 6 a.m. he

shall be allowed a meal period between 7 a.m. and 9 a.m.

(d) When a worker is not allowed a meal period at the usual time he shall be paid at time and one-half rate from the time such period was normally due until the meal period is allowed.

(e) When a worker is working overtime supper and crib time shall

be paid for at the rate appropriate to the time.

OVERTIME

5. (a) This clause shall not apply to watchmen/night firemen whose conditions of overtime are prescribed in clause 14 hereof.

(b) Overtime rates shall apply to all time worked outside or in excess

of the ordinary hours specified in clause 2 hereof.

- (c) Overtime worked on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, shall be paid for at time and one-half rate for the first three hours and double time rate thereafter, computed on a daily basis.
- (d) All time worked on a Sunday shall be paid for at double time
- (e) A worker required to commence work before the normal commencing time shall be paid at double time rate for all time worked until normal commencing time.

(f) A worker who is required to work overtime for less than two hours shall have the option of being paid for the overtime actually worked or of working and being paid for a minimum of two hours.

- (g) A worker who is called back after ceasing work for the day shall be paid for a minimum of two hours at the appropriate rate.
- (h) Time worked by a worker called back to work after 9 p.m. shall be paid for at double time rate.
- (i) A worker while employed on sea watches, when the ordinary hours of work are not worked consecutively, shall be paid for time worked, at the rate and on the conditions appropriate to the time.
- (j) Where tidal work (other than dredging) is worked in two four-hour shifts and the break between shifts is more than the normal meal period, time worked shall be paid for at ordinary time rate for the first four hours, time and one-half rate for the second four hours, and double time rate thereafter, computed on a daily basis.
- (k) A worker who works for twenty-four hours continuously (inclusive of intervals for meals) shall not then be required to continue working without his consent. If he does continue working he shall be paid at double time rate for all time worked on the second day, or until he has had a break of at least eight hours.
- (l) A worker who works for more than sixteen hours continuously (inclusive of interval for meals) shall continue to be paid at not less than the appropriate overtime rate for all overtime worked until he has had a break of at least eight hours.
- (m) Overtime worked in excess of four and one-half hours without a break for a meal (supper and crib time included) shall be paid for at half ordinary time rate in addition to the rate appropriate to the time.
- (n) Where practicable, workers shall be given not less than one hour's notice that overtime is required to be worked, and in the case of dredging shall be informed not later than one hour before ceasing work that overtime is intended to be worked on the following day.
 - (o) Time off shall not be granted in lieu of payment for overtime.
- (p) When computing overtime a fraction of a quarter-hour shall be deemed to be a complete quarter-hour.
- (q) The rate for "wet place" overtime shall be computed on the ordinary "wet place" rate of time and one-third, i.e.:—
 - (i) Time and one-half rate ... $= T1\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{3} = T2$. (ii) Double time rate ... $= T2 \times 1\frac{1}{3} = T2\frac{2}{3}$.

HOLIDAYS

- 6. (a) Provided he has worked for the Department at any time during the fortnight ending on the day on which the holiday occurs, a worker shall be allowed the following holidays on pay: New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anniversary Day of the Province of Nelson (or a day in lieu thereof by arrangement).
- (b) A worker who has worked for more than one employer during the fortnight ending on the day on which the holiday occurs is entitled to one payment only for the holiday and payment will be by arrangement between the officer in charge and the other employer or employers.
- (c) When any of the above holidays, except Anzac Day, falls on a Saturday or Sunday it shall be observed on the following Monday, and in the event of another holiday falling on such Monday, such other holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Tuesday.
- (d) Payment for each such holiday allowed shall be for eight hours at ordinary time rate.
- (e) Time worked on any of the above holidays shall be paid for at double time rate in addition to the holiday payment due under subclause (d) above.
- (f) A worker who meets with an accident in the course of his employment with the Department (and whether or not receiving accident compensation) is entitled to payment for any of the above holidays (but not in addition to accident compensation) which occurs during the period of incapacity provided he had worked for the Department at any time during the fortnight ending on the day of the holiday.
- (g) A worker who has been certified as fit to resume work on any of the above holidays, following sick leave or absence because of an accident, and who reports for duty on the working day immediately following such holiday, shell be paid for such holiday.
- following such holiday, shall be paid for such holiday.

 (h) Workers shall be granted one day's leave on pay to attend the annual departmental picnic.

ANNUAL HOLIDAYS

- 7. (a) The principle of the Annual Holidays Act, 1944, shall be applied, provided that every worker after completing ten years' continuous service with the Department shall be granted three weeks' holiday every year.
- (b) For annual holidays purposes, a year shall be deemed to commence on 1st January and end on 31st December.
- (c) Workers shall normally be required to take their annual holidays when work ceases for the Christmas New Year holidays.
 - (d) Annual holidays shall not be accumulated.

(b) Skilled Labourer—For the purposes of this Order a skilled labourer shall be deemed to be a worker who possesses and uses a degree of skill, derived from partial artisan training or extra experience, which is not possessed by or required of an ordinary labourer.

(c) A worker while employed as an assistant on a tug or launch shall be paid at not less than deckhand's rate, with a minimum of two hours

at the rate appropriate to the time.

(d) A worker (other than a leading hand) required to attend to overseas vessels outside normal working hours shall be paid at skilled labourer's rate while so employed.

(e) A worker while employed as a cook or steward on a vessel required to steam to another port shall be paid at not less than deckhand's rate.

(f) Every worker shall be paid the appropriate rate for the classification of work upon which he is usually employed, provided that where a worker is required to perform work carrying a rate of wages higher than the worker's usual rate, he shall be paid such higher rate while so employed. Where the worker at his own request is employed on work attracting a rate of wages lower than the worker's usual rate, he shall be paid at such lower rate while so employed.

ALLOWANCES

- 9. (a) Explosives.—A worker while loading or unloading explosives to or from a depot magazine shall be paid an allowance of 2s. a day.
- (b) Gumboots.—A worker shall be paid an allowance of 1s. 6d. for every working-day on which he is required to wear gumboots for not less than four hours.
- (c) Tool.—A tradesman, provided he has worked not less than three days of the working week at his trade and possesses sufficient privately-owned tools of trade to carry out all phases of his work efficiently, shall be paid tool allowance as follows:—

- (d) Welding.—A worker employed on oxy-acetylene or electric welding (except on spot, stud, or butt welding machine) for less than four hours a day shall be paid an allowance of 1s. 3d. for that day, or when so employed for not less than four hours a day shall be paid an allowance of 2s. for that day.
 - (e) Dirty Work:
 - (i) Time worked by a worker while employed on any of the following types of work shall be paid for at one-quarter of ordinary time rate in addition to the rate appropriate to the time—
 - (a) Inside and under boilers.
 - (b) Inside tanks and pockets.
 - (c) Beneath engine-room or boiler-room plates, backends, furnaces, crank-pits, and up-takes.
 - (d) Cleaning boiler-tubes, smoke-boxes, or bilges.
 - (e) Plaster lagging of boilers or steam pipes.(f) Work with tar or preservative emulsions.
 - (g) Inside bunkers, chain lockers, hoppers, or chutes during survey inspections or overhauls.

- (ii) The officer in charge and the union representative shall agree upon the rate to be paid for time worked where in the opinion of the officer in charge any work being performed is of an unusually dirty, dusty, unpleasant, or dangerous nature or, in the case of boilers, where the temperature is excessive. Such rate shall not exceed ordinary time rate in addition to the rate appropriate to the time.
- (f) Ship-work :- While employed on repair work aboard ship (other than on the types of work provided for in subclause (e) above) tradesmen and their recognized assistants shall be paid allowances as follows:-
 - .. 1d. an hour. (i) Ship-work
 - (ii) Dirty work 2s. a day.

PROTECTIVE CLOTHING

- 10. (a) Overalls.—A worker while employed on dirty work, as detailed in subclause 9 (e) hereof, shall be supplied with overalls.
- (b) Gumboots.—A worker while working in water shall be supplied with gumboots.
- (c) Oilskins.—Leading seamen and deckhands while required to work in the rain shall be supplied with oilskins.

PAYMENT OF WAGES

- 11. (a) All workers shall be paid fortnightly in the Department's time.
- (b) Accident compensation shall be paid fortnightly to injured workers entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1922, provided satisfactory medical certificates and addresses of such workers are supplied to the officer in charge.

TRAVELLING PROVISIONS

- 12. (a) Daily.—Where a worker is required to work more than one mile outside the Borough of Westport he shall be conveyed by the Department to and from work in the Department's time or be paid an allowance of 1s. 6d. a day in lieu of such transport.
- (b) Other.—A worker while working away from Westport, thus necessitating his absence from home overnight, shall be paid allowances as follows:-
 - (i) 10s. for each of the first two nights ashore, and 7s. 6d. a night ashore thereafter:
 - (ii) 2s. 6d. for each meal not supplied by the Department; and
 - (iii) Sea-going allowance at the rate of £6 a month (computed on a daily basis) provided the worker is a member of the crew of a vessel proceeding to or from another port.

TERM OF EMPLOYMENT

- 13. (a) Employment shall be deemed to be weekly employment and deduction shall be made from the weekly wages only for time lost through the worker's own default or absence from work through no fault of the employer.
- (b) Not less than one week's notice shall be given by either party of the termination of the employment. Nothing in this clause shall prevent the Department from dismissing any worker for wilful misconduct or other sufficient reason: Provided that a worker so dismissed may appeal against such dismissal in the manner prescribed by the Public Service Commission.

WATCHMEN/NIGHT FIREMEN

- 14. Notwithstanding the provisions of clauses 2 and 5 hereof, the following special conditions shall apply to watchmen/night firemen :-
 - (a) Hours of Work.—The ordinary hours of work shall be forty a week and eight a day (inclusive of meal period) and shall be worked consecutively commencing at any time on any five days of the week.
 - (b) Overtime.
 - (i) Time worked in excess of the hours prescribed in subclause (a) above shall be paid for at time and one-half rate for the first three hours and double time rate thereafter, computed on a daily basis.
 - (ii) A watchman/night fireman who is required to work overtime for less than two hours shall have the option of being paid for the overtime actually worked or of working and being paid for a minimum of two hours.
