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Land Set Apart as Provisional State Forest Declared to be Subject to the Land Act, 1948

A PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by subsection (2) of section 19 of the Forests Act, 1949, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting on the joint recommendation of the Minister of Lands and of the Minister of Forests, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portion of a provisional State forest reserve set apart by Proclamation dated the 16th day of March, 1920, and gazetted on the 25th day of that month, is required for settlement purposes; and, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, such land shall, from and after the day of the gazetting hereof, cease to be provisional State forest land, and shall become Crown land available for sale, lease, reservation, or other disposition under the provisions of the Land Act, 1948.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS

3. The Te Awamutu Borough Council shall be the Milk Authority of the said district.

4. The Waipa County Council shall be entitled to have one representative on the Milk Committee of the Te Awamutu Borough Council, and from time to time to nominate a person for that purpose.

5. The Te Awamutu Borough Council shall from time to time appoint to the Milk Committee of the Borough Council the person nominated by the Waipa County Council pursuant to clause 4 hereof.
