For the purposes of the enforcement of an award or industrial agreement any provision of which has been suspended by this Order in Council, any officer of the industrial union or association concerned who is authorized in writing in that behalf by the union or association shall be entitled to interview at his place of employment any person employed in or about the exhibition under that award or industrial agreement at such time or times as may be agreed upon by and between that officer and the employer of that person, and for this purpose any such officer shall be entitled at any time to have access to the Register of Passes issued by the Wellington Manufacturers' Association.

6. Nothing in this Order in Council shall be deemed to affect any provisions in an award or industrial agreement requiring workers subject to the award or industrial agreement to be members of a union.

Price Order No. 1178 (Australian Wheat)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1178, and shall come into force on the 28th day of July, 1950.
2. (1) Price Orders 1116* and 1163† are hereby revoked.
(2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation hereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.
3. In this Order—
“Wheat Committee”, means the Wheat Committee established pursuant to the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944‡:
“Distributor”, in relation to wheat, means any person who purchases wheat from the Wheat Committee for the purpose of resale:
“Retailer”, in relation to wheat, means any reseller other than a distributor:
The expression “c.i.f.” means “cost, insurance, and freight”.
4. The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any wheat to which this Order is applicable is sold otherwise than by weight.
5. The several prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.
6. Where any wheat to which this Order applies is sold on the basis of sacks extra the maximum price that may be charged or received for the wheat shall be computed on the weight of the wheat without the sacks.
7. Where any wheat to which this Order applies is sold on the basis of sacks included the maximum price that may be charged or received for the wheat shall be computed on the total weight of the wheat and the sacks.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

8. This Order applies with respect to all Australian wheat sold in the North Island of New Zealand or the Land Districts of Marlborough or Nelson (excluding the Buller, Inangahua, and Murchison Counties) for other than milling purposes.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF WHEAT TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wheat Committee's Prices

9. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received by the Wheat Committee for any wheat to which this Order applies that is sold to a distributor for the purposes of resale shall be 9s. 4d. per bushel, sacks extra, delivered at the distributor's nearest port.
(2) Where any wheat is delivered otherwise than c.i.f. the distributor's nearest port, the maximum price fixed by subclause (1) of this clause may be increased by the amount of the transport charges incurred in effecting delivery, being not more in any case than the charges that would have been incurred at common carrier rates had delivery been effected from the distributor's nearest port.

Distributors' Prices

10. Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum price that may be charged or received by any distributor for any wheat to which this Order applies shall be the sum of the following amounts:—
(a) The cost of the wheat to the distributor at the point at which he takes delivery:
(b) The amount of any wharfage and transport charges actually and reasonably incurred between the point at which delivery is taken by the distributor and his premises: Provided that transport cost shall not be more in any case than the charges that would have been incurred had delivery been effected at common carrier rates:
(c) With respect to wheat transported inland by rail, an amount not exceeding 1 per cent. of the sum of the amount calculated in accordance with paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof (to cover the estimated loss due to shrinkage or other causes):
(d) The amount of any storage, handling, or additional shrinkage costs actually incurred but not exceeding in any case 3½d. per bushel:
(e) An amount calculated at the rate per bushel as follows:—
(i) For wheat sold in lots of 1 ton or more: 4d. per bushel.
(ii) For wheat sold in lots of ½ ton or more but less than 1 ton: 5d. per bushel.
(iii) For wheat sold in lots of one sack or more but less than ½ ton: 7d. per bushel.
(iv) For wheat sold in lots of ¼ bushel or more but less than one sack: 1s. 3d. per bushel.
(v) For wheat sold in lots of less than ¼ bushel: 2s. per bushel.

Provided that where a distributor sells any wheat to which this Order applies on the basis of sacks included the amount fixed in each of subparagraphs (i), (ii), or (iii) of paragraph (e) hereof may be increased by 8d. per bushel.

Provided, further, that with respect to wheat sold in lots of one sack or more the maximum price shall not exceed the appropriate price set out hereunder for sales made on the basis of sacks included or the appropriate price set out hereunder reduced by 8d. per bushel for sales made on the basis of sacks extra.

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1176, and shall come into force on the 27th day of July, 1950.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1033* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) Subject to the next succeeding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all superphosphate of the grade commercially known as 44/46 superphosphate manufactured in New Zealand and sold for use in New Zealand.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to any superphosphate sold in a quantity of less than one ton.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF SUPERPHOSPHATE TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) The prices for superphosphate fixed by this Order are fixed in respect of sales of the following classes, namely:—

(a) Sales to a user—that is to say, to a person purchasing for his own use and not for the purpose of resale:

(b) Sales to a storekeeper—that is to say, to a person (not being a merchant, dairy company, or farmers' organization as hereinafter mentioned), purchasing solely for resale to users:

(c) Sales to a merchant—that is to say, to a person purchasing for resale to storekeepers or to users:

(d) Sales to a dairy company, as defined in section 2 of the Dairy Industry Act, 1908, purchasing solely for resale to persons being suppliers of milk or cream to the company:

(e) Sales to an incorporated farmers' organization, having a retail department conducted on a co-operative basis, and purchasing superphosphate solely for the purpose of resale to its members.

(2) The prices for superphosphate fixed by this Order are fixed in respect of sales for cash or for credit until a date not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month of delivery.

(3) Where any sale is made on terms allowing credit for a longer period than that mentioned in the last preceding subclause, the purchaser shall be entitled, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the contract of sale, to the benefit of the prices fixed by this Order if in fact payment is made not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month of delivery.

(4) The prices fixed by this Order include the price of the containers.

5. (1) Where any superphosphate manufactured in the South Island is sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at Burnside, Hornby, or Ravensbourne, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Where any superphosphate manufactured in the North Island is sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at Aramoho, Otahuhu, Smart Road (New Plymouth), Te Papapa, or Westfield, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

(3) Where any superphosphate is sold for delivery elsewhere than at one of the places mentioned in subclauses (1) and (2) of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price fixed in the First or Second Schedule hereto, whichever is appropriate, increased by the amount of the freight charges between the place of delivery and such one of the said places as is nearest or most convenient of access to the place of delivery: Provided that the amount added to the price in respect of freight charges shall not in any case exceed the amount that would have been incurred had delivery been effected by the holder of a goods-service licence under the Transport Licensing Act, 1931, at authorized rates.

(4) In every invoice, debit-note, or similar document issued by a vendor to a user in respect of the sale of any superphosphate there shall be shown separately—

(a) The price of the superphosphate fixed in accordance with this Order; and

(b) The additional amount (if any) payable by the purchaser in respect of freight charges.
