"21. *Deserters and Absentees.*—A deserter or absentee from one of H.M.N.Z. ships who surrenders or is apprehended at any place outside New Zealand (other than Australia) is, until further orders to serve in a ship or establishment of the Royal Navy, if so directed by an order given by the Naval Board or by the senior New Zealand Naval Officer present, specifically naming him and the appropriate base ship of the Royal Navy in which he is to serve. A warrant under section 50 of the Naval Discipline Act is to be issued by one of the persons specified in that section before the issue of the order directing a deserter or absentee to serve in the appropriate base ship of the Royal Navy and is to be handed to the Royal Naval authorities together with extracts from the Ship's Books, certified in accordance with King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions Article 461, recording that the offender had been serving in the ship at the material date, his absence, and his discharge.

"2. On apprehension or surrender at any place outside New Zealand a deserter or absentee who has been directed to serve in an appropriate base ship of the Royal Navy shall serve in that ship, or any other ship of the Royal Navy to which the Royal Navy authorities shall appoint him, and shall continue to do so until discharged therefrom by those authorities."

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1180, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 1128* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 7th day of August, 1950.

3. (1) This Order applies with respect to all potatoes which, being subject to the principal Order, are sold by a grower for delivery at any time after the commencement of this Order and on or before the 30th day of November, 1950.

(2) For the purposes of this Order no potatoes sold on the basis of f.o.b.s.e. or f.o.r.s.e. shall be deemed to be delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order if—

- (a) In the case of sales f.o.b.s.e. the vessel on which the potatoes are laden leaves the port of shipment at any time before midnight on the 6th day of August, 1950; or
- (b) In the case of sales f.o.r.s.e. the trucks on which the potatoes are laden leave the grower's station at any time before midnight of the said date.

(3) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, potatoes sold f.o.b.s.e. or f.o.r.s.e. shall be deemed to be delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order notwithstanding that they may have been actually laden on board any vessel or trucks before the commencement of this Order.

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order :—
 1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1181, and shall come into force on the 3rd day of August, 1950.
 2. (1) Price Order No. 1110* is hereby revoked.
 (2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to nails of the kinds and gauges specified in the Schedule hereto.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES FOR NAILS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wholesalers' Prices

4. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any nails to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows :—

- (a) For nails sold by a wholesaler whose place of business is situate in any of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, the maximum wholesale price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto :
- (b) For nails sold by any other wholesaler, the maximum wholesale price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto increased by a proportionate part of any freight charges incurred by the wholesaler in obtaining delivery into his premises.

Retailers' Prices

5. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any nails to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows :—

- (a) For nails sold by a retailer whose place of business is situate in any of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, the maximum retail price shall be the approximate price fixed in the Schedule hereto :
- (b) For nails sold by any other retailer, the maximum retail price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto increased by a proportionate part of any freight charges paid by the retailer to the wholesaler from whom the nails were purchased or incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery into his premises.

6. If in respect of any lot of nails sold by a retailer the maximum retail price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be calculated to the next upward halfpenny.

Special Prices Where Extraordinary Charges Incurred

7. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any nails to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of nails, or may relate generally to all nails to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

DUTY IMPOSED ON WHOLESALEERS

8. Every wholesaler who sells any nails to which this Order applies shall specify in the relative invoice with respect to each lot of nails sold the quantity, the gauge, and the length of the nails.
