# Notes on the Weather for July, 1950

General.—On the whole July was a favourable winter month. The Gisborne district must be excepted, however, on account of the damage caused by serious flooding in the Waipaoa River at the beginning of the month.

Two spells of clear frosty weather were experienced, the first in the middle of the month, the second towards the end. Both occurred during the passage of very large anticyclones, the first of which caused barometers to reach their highest values for many

years.

Pastures and autumn-sown cereal crops made little growth, but the preparation of the soil for further sowings has proceeded under very favourable conditions.

Dairy production showed a rapid increase in the north.

Rainfall.—Over most of the North Island rainfall was deficient, the amount being less than half the normal north of Hamilton. Near Gisborne, however, totals were over double the normal amount as a result of heavy rains at the beginning of the month. An area of excess rain extended from East Cape to Southern Hawke's An area. Bay and across the Ruahines to Wanganui. The southern part of the Island also had a slight excess.

In the South Island there was a moderate excess on the West Coast—except the Buller district; also in two narrow belts bordering the northern and southern boundaries of the Canterbury Province. The deficiency over the remainder of the Island was slight, except about Golden Bay.

Temperatures.—Temperatures were slightly below normal in the western part of Northland, but above normal elsewhere. In Central Otago and part of Southland the departure from normal was + 2° F. In general the departures tended to be about 1° F. higher inland than on the coast.

The high country of both Islands was thickly coated with snow about the middle of the month. Frosts were widespread and severe from 17th to 21st, and again from the 26th onwards.

Sunshine.—For the most part sunshine was a little better than the average. The highest figure was Blenheim's 1870 hours, which is equivalent to an hour a day above average. There were slight deficiencies in the southern half of the South Island, and

locally about Wellington and Gisborne.

Weather Sequence.—During the passage of a vigorous depression the centre of which crossed Northland at the beginning of the month, heavy rain fell in the north-eastern part of the North Island and caused severe flooding in the Gisborne district. The weather was mainly fair in the South Island under the influence of an extensive ridge of high pressure stretching from New South Wales across the ridge of high pressure stretching from New South Wales across the South Island and away to the east.

As the northern depression moved away, an anticyclone built and the lottleff depression moved away, an anticycloid of the up to the east of New Zealand on the 5th. By that time conditions had improved in the North Island, but cloudy showery weather soon prevailed due to the passage of two weak troughs associated with depressions centred far to the south-west. On that occasion, however, showers did not extend to the east of the main ranges.

An active cold front moved across rapidly from the south-west on the 9th, the associated low pressure centre passing close to Southland.

Cold southerlies prevailed on the 11th with the approach of an anticyclone. A brief period of clear frosty weather which followed came to an end on the 13th with the arrival of a trough from the west. A depression formed within this trough deepened rapidly, and then moved across South Auckland on the morning of the 14th. Rain became general, while the formation of a secondary depression east of Wairarapa accounted for heavier rainfalls and southerly gales about the Cook Strait region. Snow fell on the high country of the North Island and Marlborough. It became still colder after the passage of a secondary cold front on the 16th and showers also developed over the South Island, except Westland.

With the approach of a very intense anticyclone, the weather began to improve, and by the 18th it had become fine generally except in the Gisborne district where the clearance was delayed until the next day. Widespread frosts of unusual severity were recorded for several days during the passage of this remarkable anticyclone in which the central pressure exceeded 1,045 millibars. As the anticyclone began to move away eastwards on the 22nd the As the anticyclone began to move away eastwards on the 22nd the frontal system, associated with an extensive disturbance centred far to the south-west, began to advance over the South Island. The development of a wave depression off Westland temporarily retarded the front's progress and this resulted in heavy rainfall in Westland. There was also widespread rain northwards to Wellington and Taranaki. After the depression had passed across the South Island, the front resumed its journey northwards on the 25th.

Following the passage of an active cold front, southerlies prevailed on the 26th. A large anticyclone approaching from the west then took charge of the weather until the end of the month. Although showers persisted in the Southland and Gisborne districts until the 29th, elsewhere clear frosty weather prevailed after the 26th. The anticyclone was beginning to move off slowly eastwards on the 31st on the 31st.

# Price Order No. 1184 (Hotel Tariffs)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1184 and shall come into force on the 17th day of August, 1950.
2 (1) Price Orders Nos. 1000\*, 1073†, 1107‡, and 1137§ are hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. In this Order unless the context otherwise requires—

"Accommodation" means the provision of lodging or meals at hotels, and includes the provision of services of the kind normally rendered to guests in hotels of the class

kind normally rendered to guests in hotels of the class concerned.

"Guest" means a person who, pursuant to an agreement with the licensee to accept and pay for lodging at an hotel, is occupying a bedroom in that hotel, but does not include any person who occupies a room in an hotel in accordance with a contract of service with the licensee. Until a bedroom is vacated it shall be deemed to be occupied and a bedroom shall not be deemed to be vacated until the licensee or his agent is notified by the guest to that effect:

"Hotel" means premises in respect of which a publican's licence, an accommodation licence, or a tourist-house licence has been granted and is for the time being in force under the Licensing Act, 1908, and includes any premises deemed by any enactment to be an inn for the purposes of that Act, but does not include any premises operated for the purpose of providing accommodation for members of the public by the Government of New Zealand.

#### APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies to charges that may be made in respect o. accommodation provided at hotels whether that accommodation is provided to guests or to persons who are not guests.

5. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Order each hotel shall be assigned one of the following grades—

3 star plus. Maximum. 3 star. 5 star plus.  $5 \mathrm{\ star.}$ 2 star. 4 star plus. 4 star. 1 star.

(2) The grade assigned to an hotel shall be the grade specified in the Schedule hereto in respect of that hotel.

(3) If no grade is so specified in respect of any hotel that hotel shall, for the purposes of this Order, be an ungraded hotel.

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Order the maximum charge that may be made or received for accommodation in an hotel shall, according to the grade of the hotel, be at the rate per day specified hereunder:—

(3) Where any meal referred to in subclause (2) hereof is served in an hotel to any person who is not a guest, or who has not agreed to become a guest of the hotel, the licensee may charge that person for any such meal an amount not exceeding 2s. in the case of a dinner or 1s in the case of breakfast or lunch in excess of the amount authorized by the said subclause (2) to be charged for the meal.

(4) Unless an agreement to the contrary is made between the licensee of an hotel and a guest at the hotel the charges specified in subclause (2) hereof may be made for each of the items of

accommodation prescribed in that subclause that are available to the guest, notwithstanding that he may not have availed himself of any such accommodation.

(5) Where a guest occupies a bedroom after 10 a.m. on any day but vacates the bedroom before 7 p.m. on that day he may be charged one-half the amount prescribed in subclause (2) hereof as the daily charge for a bedroom if he vacates the room before 2.30 p.m. on that day, and three-quarters of the amount so prescribed if he vacates the room before 7 p.m. on that day. A bedroom occupied at any time after 7 p.m. on one day and before 10 a.m. on the following day may be charged for at the full daily rate so prescribed. The provisions of this subclause shall, with the necessary modifications, apply to suites and the charges authorized in respect thereof by paragraph (c) of clause 7 hereof.

(6) Where tea, cocoa, or coffee is served with any meal or immediately after any meal no additional charge shall be made therefor.

therefor.

(7) For the purposes of this clause the term "dinner" means the chief meal of the day whenever served and the term "lunch" includes a meal served in the evening if dinner has been served earlier in the day.

# Additional Charges

- 7. (1) In addition to the charges hereinbefore authorized the charges specified in this clause may be made in accordance with the terms thereof.

(ii) In no other case shall an additional charge be

made with respect to a shower-room and in no case may any person be charged for both a bathroom and a shower-

# CHARGES FOR CHILDREN

- 8. The charges fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order are fixed with respect to adults and children not less than ten years of age. The maximum charges that may be made with respect to children under ten years of age shall be:—

    (b) For children two years and under five years: One-quarter the charges fixed by this Order:
    (c) For children five years and under ten years: One-half the charges fixed by this Order.
- 9. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, the Tribunal, on application by the licensee of any hotel or on its own initiative, may regrade any hotel to a higher or lower grade or may assign a grade to any hotel that is ungraded and, upon the grade of any hotel being altered pursuant to this clause, this Order shall be read and construed as if the name of the hotel were included in the Schedule hereto and the altered grade specified therein in respect of the hotel therein in respect of the hotel.

10. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Order where charges higher than those authorized by this Order were being charged by the licensee of an hotel immediately prior to the date of this Order those higher charges may, with the consent in writing of the Director of Price Control granted pursuant to a written application in that behalf by the licensee, continue to be charged by that licensee in respect of accommodation provided at that hotel.

11. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any licensee may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any services to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges are incurred by the licensee. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a particular service or may relate generally to all services to which this Order applies rendered by the licensee while the approval remains in force.
