#### Stone Crushing and Screening Plant Exempted From Annual Licence Fees

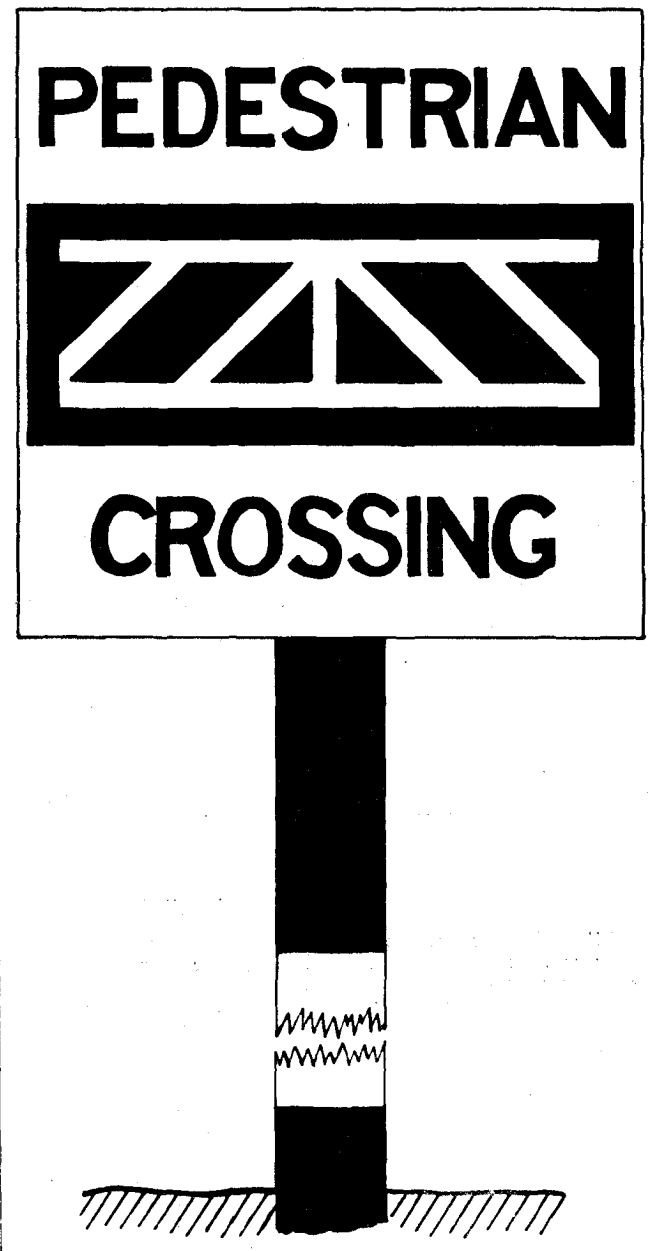
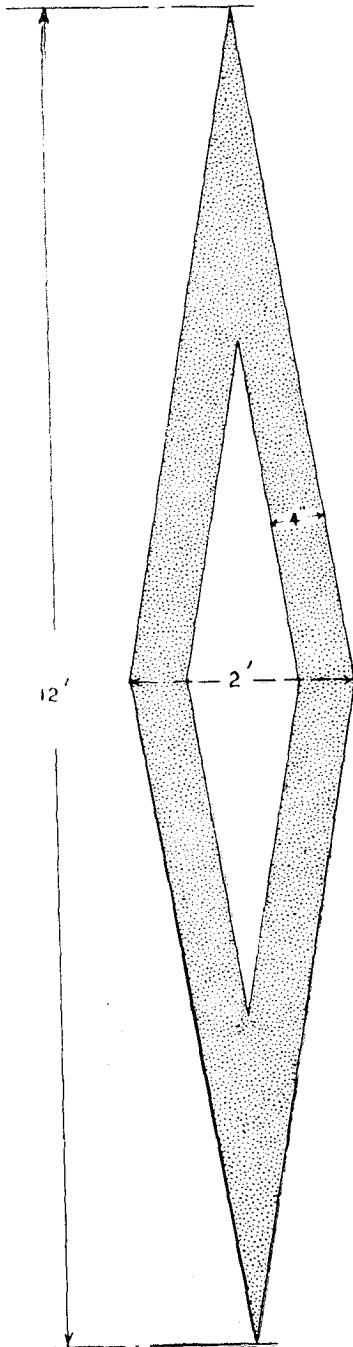
