


Warrant Approving the Provision of Additional Indications of the Presence and Position of Pedestrian Crossings

N terms of regulation 20 of the Traffic (Road Crossing) Regulations 1944, the Minister of Transport doth hereby approve the provision by any controlling authority of additional indication of the presence and position of any authorized pedestrian-crossing by either or both of the devices described in the Schedule hereto, such devices to be placed at such a distance in advance of the pedestriancrossing that the driver of an approaching vehicle receives adequate notice of the pedestrian-crossing.




