HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Judicature Amendment Act, 1913, it is enacted that each Division of the Court of Appeal shall sit and exercise its jurisdiction separately, save that in respect of any sitting of either Division the Governor-General in Council may, on the certificate of two Judges (of whom the Chief Justice shall be one), that any appeal or other proceeding is of special difficulty or importance, authorize all Judges of the other Division to sit together with those of the former Division for the hearing and determination of that appeal or proceeding:

And whereas at the sitting of the Second Division of the Court of Appeal, which commenced on Monday, the 12th day of June, 1950, a case stated between His Majesty the King and Robert James Johnson stood for hearing and determination:

And whereas the Court decided that such hearing and determination should stand adjourned until Monday, the 11th day of September, 1950, at the hour of 11 o'clock in the forenoon:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir Humphrey Francis O'Leary, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of New Zealand, and the Honourable Ernst Peterson Hay, a Judge of the Supreme Court of New Zealand, have certified that the said case stated presents a question of special difficulty and importance:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in him in that behalf as aforesaid, and acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Judges of the Second Division of the Court of Appeal to sit with the Judges of the First Division of that Court at the aforesaid sitting for the hearing and determination of the said case stated.

Scheme Fixing Prices and General Conditions Relating to the Sale of Milk by Treating Houses for Use in All Milk Price Districts

PURSUANT to powers conferred by section 6 of the Marketing Amendment Act, 1937, the Minister of Marketing hereby fixes prices and general conditions relating to the sale of milk and margins for various services rendered in the collection, treatment, and distribution of milk:—

1. This scheme may be cited as the Treating House Scheme, 1950.
2. (1) In this scheme—
 - “Approved association or organization” means an association or organization of milk producers named in the Second Schedule hereto in relation to a milk price district, whether or not the association or organization has been approved under the provisions of Part VII of the Milk Act, 1944;
 - “Director” means the officer of the Marketing Department known as the Director of Marketing, and includes any officer of that Department purporting to act for the Director;
 - “Price Order” means a Price Order made under the Control of Prices Act, 1947, and includes any Price Order made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor;
 - “Treating House” means a milk-treating house named in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (2) A reference in this scheme to a milk price district shall be deemed to be a reference to the appropriate milk price district named and described in the Third Schedule hereto.
- (3) For the purposes of this scheme, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - “Accommodation Milk” means milk which is purchased by a vendor otherwise than under a contract for the supply of milk approved for the purposes of this scheme by the Director and binding the purchaser throughout a period to purchase either all his requirements of milk or a certain daily quantity of milk from a treating house;
 - “Bottling” means the placing of milk in cartons or sterile bottles and the immediate and hygienic sealing thereof in a treating house or other premises approved by the Director for this purpose;
 - “Commercial user” means a person who buys milk for sale for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances) and including an institution under the control of any Hospital Board or a separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals Act, 1926;
 - “Consumer” means a person who buys milk for purposes other than resale;
 - “Gallon” means 10½ lb. by weight or 160 fluid ounces by measure;
 - “Milk” has the same meaning as in regulations made or subsisting under the Food and Drugs Act, 1947, but does not include cream;
 - “Pasteurization” means the treating of milk by heat in accordance with any of the methods described in regulations made or subsisting under the Food and Drugs Act, 1947;
 - “Shop Dairy” means a shop where milk is sold over the counter for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise, and where the milk so sold is sold in the form in which it was received into the shop dairy;
 - “Vendor” means a person who resells milk, and includes one who resells milk to the occupier of a shop dairy but does not include—
 - (a) A treating house, or
 - (b) A person who resells milk for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances).
3. (1) This scheme applies to all milk acquired by a treating house from an approved association or organization and sold after 31st August, 1950:—
 - (a) To consumers, commercial users, or shop dairies; and
 - (b) To vendors for resale to consumers, commercial users, or shop dairies.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding subclause this scheme shall not apply to milk sold for use in the manufacture of any goods.
4. The prices to be charged by every treating house for milk to which this scheme applies shall be as follows:—
 - (a) When the milk is sold to shop dairies for resale, or to commercial users or consumers, the prices shall be the prices fixed by the appropriate Price Order current in the milk price district.
 - (b) When the milk is sold to a vendor the price per gallon shall be the price fixed by the appropriate Price Order current in the milk price district for milk sold to a shop dairy for resale.
5. (1) The prices to be charged by a vendor shall be the prices fixed by the appropriate Price Order current in the milk price district.
- (2) Where any of the services prescribed in the First Schedule hereto have been performed by a vendor who has resold any milk, other than accommodation milk, the vendor shall be entitled to claim an amount equal to the sum of the margins as prescribed in the said schedule in respect of any services so performed less the difference between the maximum amount that the vendor, in accordance with subclause (1) of this clause, is entitled to charge and the price at which he may be charged in accordance with clause 4 (b) hereof.
- (3) Any such claim shall be made in a form approved by the Director and shall reach him not later than the tenth day of the month following that in which the said services are claimed to have been performed.
- (4) If it appears that the services have been performed, and that the claim is otherwise in order, the Director may allow the claim and pay to the claimant the amount of his claim:

Provided that where a treating house has agreed in respect of any periods during which this scheme is in operation to act as the Director's agent for payment of claims made under this clause any claim allowed by the Director may be paid to the claimant by any such agent.
6. (1) For each calendar month during the continuance of this Scheme, every treating house shall keep records in such a form as the Director may require or approve showing in respect of milk to which this scheme applies—
 - (a) The total quantity sold by the treating house during the month to commercial users, consumers, and shop dairies, and the total amount paid or payable to the treating house in respect of such sales;
 - (b) The total quantity sold by the treating house during the month to all vendors;
 - (c) The total amounts computed at the prices calculated in accordance with clauses 4 and 5 hereof, paid or payable to or by vendors in respect of milk sold to them;
 - (d) Any other particulars that the Director may require.
- (2) A copy of the said record, or any extract or extracts therefrom or any particulars in relation to this scheme, shall be supplied by the treating house to the Director as and when he may require.
- (3) The Director may require any such copy, extract, statement, or particulars to be certified as correct by the Secretary or other responsible officer of the treating house.
- (4) For each calendar month during the continuance of this scheme, every vendor shall keep records in such a form as the Director may require or approve, showing in respect of milk to which this scheme applies—
 - (a) The daily totals of milk resold by him to commercial users or consumers where such milk has been paid for by cash or by presentation of tokens or coupons;
 - (b) Detailed records showing the daily totals of credit sales to each commercial user or consumer in quantities of under 1 gallon per delivery; and
 - (c) Detailed records showing both the daily totals of all sales to each commercial user or consumer in quantities of 1 gallon per delivery or over, and the daily totals of all sales to each shop dairy for resale; and showing also the names and addresses of the commercial users or consumers or shop dairies to whom milk has been sold.
7. (1) If in any month the total amount paid or payable by vendors to the treating house in respect of milk to which this scheme applies is not equal to the appropriate town milk price for the time being increased by the appropriate service margins specified in the First Schedule hereto in respect of the services performed by any approved association or organization supplying milk to the treating house, and further increased by the appropriate service margins specified in the First Schedule hereto in respect of services performed by the treating house, and further increased by all such amounts as may have been paid by the treating house to vendors under clause 5 hereof, the amount of the deficiency shall be paid to the treating house by the Director.
- (2) If in any month the total amount paid or payable by vendors to the treating house in respect of milk to which this scheme applies exceeds the appropriate town milk price increased as provided in the last preceding subclause, the amount of the excess shall be paid by the treating house to the Director or in accordance with any instructions he may give in that behalf.
8. For the purposes of this scheme, the appropriate town milk price for any milk price district shall be such price as the Minister may from time to time fix for that district under the provisions of the Marketing Act, 1936.

Scheme Fixing Prices and General Conditions Relating to the Sale of Milk by Approved Supply Associations and Producer Organizations for Use in All Milk Price Districts

PURSUANT to powers conferred by section 6 of the Marketing Amendment Act, 1937, the Minister of Marketing hereby fixes prices and general conditions relating to the sale of milk and margins for various services rendered in the collection, treatment, and distribution of milk :—

1. This scheme may be cited as the Supply Association and Producer Organisation Scheme, 1950.
2. (1) In this scheme—
 - “ Approved association or organization ” means an association or organization of milk producers named in the Second Schedule hereto in relation to a milk price district, whether or not the association or organization has been approved under the provisions of Part VII of the Milk Act, 1944 :
 - “ Director ” means the officer of the Marketing Department known as the Director of Marketing, and includes any officer of that Department purporting to act for the Director :
 - “ Price Order ” means a Price Order made under the Control of Prices Act, 1947, and includes any Price Order made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor :
 - “ Treating House ” means a milk treating house named in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (2) A reference in this scheme to a milk price district shall be deemed to be a reference to the appropriate milk price district named and described in the Third Schedule hereto.
- (3) For the purposes of this scheme, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - “ Accommodation Milk ” means milk which is purchased by a treating house or vendor otherwise than under a contract for the supply of milk approved for the purposes of this scheme by the Director and binding the purchaser throughout a period to purchase either all his requirements of milk or a certain daily quantity of milk from an approved association or organization :
 - “ Bottling ” means the placing of milk in cartons or sterile bottles and the immediate and hygienic sealing thereof in a treating house or other premises approved by the Director for this purpose :
 - “ Commercial user ” means a person who buys milk for sale for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances) and includes an institution under the control of any Hospital Board or a separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals Act, 1926 :
 - “ Consumer ” means a person who buys milk for purposes other than resale :
 - “ Gallon ” means 10½ lb. by weight or 160 fluid ounces by measure :
 - “ Milk ” has the same meaning as in regulations made under the Food and Drugs Act, 1947, but does not include cream :
 - “ Pasteurization ” means the treating of milk by heat in accordance with any of the methods described in regulations made or subsisting under the Food and Drugs Act, 1947 :
 - “ Shop Dairy ” means a shop where milk is sold over the counter for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise, and where the milk so sold is sold in the form in which it was received into the shop dairy :
 - “ Vendor ” means a person who resells milk, and includes one who resells milk to the occupier of a shop dairy but does not include—
 - (a) A treating house, or
 - (b) A person who resells milk for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances).
3. (1) This scheme applies to all milk sold after 31st August, 1950, by an approved association or organization to vendors or treating houses for resale by those vendors or treating houses to consumers, commercial users, or shop dairies.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding subclause this scheme shall not apply to milk sold for use in the manufacture of any goods.
4. The prices to be charged by every approved association or organization for milk to which this scheme applies shall be as follows :—
 - (a) When the milk is sold to a treating house, the prices shall be the appropriate town milk prices increased by the appropriate service margins set out in the First Schedule hereto according to the services performed by the approved association or organization in respect of the milk.
 - (b) When the milk is sold to a vendor the price per gallon shall be the price fixed by the appropriate Price Order current in the milk price district for milk sold to a shop dairy for resale.
5. (1) The prices to be charged by a vendor shall be the prices fixed by the appropriate Price Order current in the milk price district.
- (2) Where any of the services prescribed in the First Schedule hereto have been performed by a vendor who has resold any milk, other than accommodation milk, the vendor shall be entitled to claim an amount equal to the sum of the margins as prescribed in the said Schedule in respect of any services so performed less the difference between the maximum amount that the vendor, in accordance with subclause (1) of this clause, is entitled to charge and the price at which he may be charged in accordance with clause 4 (b) hereof.
- (3) Any such claim shall be made in a form approved by the Director and shall reach him not later than the tenth day of the month following that in which the said services are claimed to have been performed.
- (4) If it appears that the services have been performed, and that the claim is otherwise in order, the Director may allow the claim and pay to the claimant the amount of his claim :

Provided that where an approved association or organization has agreed in respect of any periods during which this scheme is in operation to act as the Director's agent for payment of claims made under this clause any claim allowed by the Director may be paid to the claimant by any such agent.
6. (1) For each calendar month during the continuance of this scheme, every approved association or organization shall keep records in such a form as the Director may require or approve showing in respect of milk to which this scheme applies—
 - (a) The total quantity sold by the approved association or organization during the month to all vendors :
 - (b) Total amounts computed at the prices calculated in accordance with clauses 4 and 5 hereof, paid or payable in respect of such milk to and by vendors :
 - (c) Any other particulars that the Director may require.
- (2) A copy of the said record, or any extract or extracts therefrom or any particulars in relation to this scheme shall be supplied by the approved association or organization to the Director as and when he may require.
- (3) The Director may require any such copy, extract, statement, or particulars to be certified as correct by the Secretary or other responsible officer of the approved association or organization.
- (4) For each calendar month during the continuance of this scheme, every vendor shall keep records in such a form as the Director may require or approve, showing in respect of milk to which this scheme applies—
 - (a) The daily totals of milk resold by him to commercial users or consumers where such milk has been paid for by cash or by presentation of tokens or coupons ;
 - (b) Detailed records showing the daily totals of credit sales to each commercial user or consumer in quantities of under 1 gallon per delivery ; and
 - (c) Detailed records showing both the daily totals of all sales to each commercial user or consumer in quantities of 1 gallon per delivery or over, and the daily totals of all sales to each shop dairy for resale ; and showing also the names and addresses of the commercial users or consumers or shop dairies to whom milk has been resold.
7. (1) If in any month the total amount paid or payable by vendors to the approved association or organization in respect of milk to which this scheme applies is not equal to the appropriate town milk price for the time being, increased by the appropriate service margins specified in the First Schedule hereto in respect of the services performed by the approved association or organization and further increased by all such amounts as may have been paid by the approved association or organization to vendors under clause 5 hereof, the amount of the deficiency shall be paid to the approved association or organization by the Director.
- (2) If in any month the total amount paid or payable by vendors to the approved association or organization in respect of milk to which this scheme applies exceeds the appropriate town milk price increased as provided in the last preceding subclause, the amount of the excess shall be paid by the approved association or organization to the Director, or, in accordance with any instructions he may give in that behalf.
- (8) For the purposes of this scheme, the appropriate town milk price for any milk price district shall be such price as the Minister may from time to time fix for that district under the provisions of the Marketing Act, 1936.

1. In the case of creamery butter to which is assigned one or other of the following respective grades and which is allotted points in grading within the range of the following respective grade points under the Dairy-produce Regulations 1938—

- (a) For "Finest" grade, 94 points or over, the price of 27-2839d. per pound:
- (b) For "Finest" grade, 93 points or over but under 94 points, the basic price of 27-1589d. per pound:
- (c) For "First" grade, 92 points or over but under 93 points, the price of 27-0964d. per pound:
- (d) For "First" grade, 90 points or over but under 92 points, the price of 26-9089d. per pound:
- (e) For "Second" grade, the price of 26-4089d. per pound.

2. In the case of whey butter to which is assigned one or other of the following grades under the said regulations—

- (a) For "First" grade, the price of 26-1589d. per pound:
- (b) For "Second" grade, the price of 25-6589d. per pound.

3. In the case of full-cream cheese to which is assigned one or other of the following respective grades and to which is allotted points in grading within the range of the following respective grade points under the said regulations—

- (a) For "Finest" grade, 94 points or over, the price of 15-10845d. per pound:
- (b) For "Finest" grade, 93 points or over but under 94 points, the price of 15-0772d. per pound:
- (c) For "First" grade, 92 points or over but under 93 points, the basic price of 14-9522d. per pound:
- (d) For "First" grade, 91 points or over but under 92 points, the price of 14-8897d. per pound:
- (e) For "Second" grade, the price of 14-7022d. per pound.

4. From the appropriate price payable by the Commission for any such butter or cheese there shall be deducted for each box of butter or crate of cheese the portion of the insurance premium paid or payable in respect of such box of butter or crate of cheese pursuant to any contract of insurance effected and in force covering such butter or cheese whilst in the process of manufacture or in transit. The portion of insurance premium to be so deducted shall be computed by the Commission, and the computation of the Commission shall be final.

5. Butter shall be packed in boxes each containing a net weight of 56 lb. 2 oz. of actual butter, excluding wrapping-paper. Cheese shall be packed two cheese to each crate. Every cheese shall weigh not less than 70 lb. and not more than 90 lb.

6. In computing the weight of butter for which payment is to be made by the Commission the weight of all butter comprised in any consignment submitted for grading under the said regulations shall be ascertained as follows:—

- (a) Each box of butter containing a net weight of 56 lb. 2 oz. of actual butter, excluding wrapping-paper, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be computed at 56 lb.:
- (b) The weight of all butter in any such consignment shall be determined on the basis of the weight as ascertained by the grader of the several boxes selected by him for weighing and set out in the Grader's Certificate issued in respect of that consignment, and the boxes of butter so weighed shall be taken as fixing the average weight for the whole quantity of butter comprised in such certificate, overweights being averaged with underweights in each such certificate in relation to the prescribed weight of 56 lb. 2 oz. per box:
- (c) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the butter comprised in any Grader's Certificate be less than 56 lb. 2 oz. per box, such deficiency shall be deducted from a weight of 56 lb. per box for the purpose of computing payment therefor:
- (d) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the butter comprised in any Grader's Certificate exceeds the prescribed weight of 56 lb. 2 oz. per box, then the amount of such excess shall not be taken into account for the purpose of computing payment therefor.

7. In computing the weight of cheese for which payment is to be made by the Commission, the weight of all cheese comprised in any consignment submitted for grading under the said regulations shall be ascertained as follows:—

- (a) The weight of all cheese in any such consignment shall be determined on the basis of the weight as ascertained by the grader of several crates of cheese selected by him for weighing and set out in the Grader's Certificate issued in respect of that consignment, and the crates of cheese so weighed shall be taken as fixing the average weight for the whole quantity of cheese comprised in such certificate, overweights being averaged with underweights in relation to the respective packed weights as set out in such certificate:

(b) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the crates of cheese comprised in any Grader's Certificate be less than the average of the marked weights thereof as set out in such certificate, then payment shall be made for the cheese comprised in that certificate on the basis of the average weight so ascertained:

(c) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the crates of cheese comprised in any Grader's Certificate exceeds the average of the marked weights thereof as set out in such certificate, then the amount of such excess shall not be taken into account for the purpose of computing payment therefor:

(d) From the total weight computed as aforesaid of the cheese comprised in any Grader's Certificate there shall be deducted by way of shrinkage allowance an amount equal to 2½ per centum thereof, or such greater or lesser amount in respect of any particular brand or class of cheese as the Department may from time to time determine.

8. Ownership of butter and cheese to which Part II of the Dairy Products Marketing Commission Act, 1947, applies, shall pass to the Commission on the 20th day of the month next following the month in which the butter or cheese was graded.

9. Payment of the appropriate price of any butter or cheese which has become the property of the Commission will be made on the 20th day of the month next following the month in which that butter or cheese was graded.

10. The prices fixed by the Commission shall not be paid for any butter or cheese manufactured otherwise than in compliance with the said regulations.

11. The price to be paid by the Commission for any butter or cheese which, with the approval or at the request of the Commission, is manufactured, prepared, or packed in special containers, or in special quantities or otherwise in any special manner shall be the appropriate price payable for that butter or cheese as hereinbefore provided increased by the additional cost incurred in such special manufacture, preparation, or packing. Any such approval or request of the Commission may include a stipulation limiting the additional cost to be incurred and may dispense with the requirements of paragraphs 5, 6, and 7 hereof, and, in that event, payment shall be made for the actual net weight of the butter or cheese exported. The additional cost referred to in this paragraph shall be computed by the Commission and the computation of the Commission shall be final.

Price Order No. 1188 (Woolpacks)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce hereby makes the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1188, and shall come into force on the 8th day of September, 1950.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1008* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Price Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies only with respect to sales by way of retail of 42 in. woolpacks.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF WOOLPACKS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any woolpacks to which this Order applies shall be:—

(a) For woolpacks sold by a retailer carrying on business at one of the ports of Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, or Dunedin: 12s. 6½d. each.

(2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are fixed as for delivery f.o.r. or f.o.b. as the case may require.

(3) Where any woolpacks are delivered by a retailer otherwise than f.o.r. or f.o.b. the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause increased by the amount of the freight charges incurred by him in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of those charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the woolpacks f.o.r. or f.o.b. as aforesaid.

(4) Any freight charges imposed by a retailer pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be shown separately on the appropriate invoice.
