

 (d) For the purposes of this Order a male employee who is
- entitled to be paid the minimum salary or wage prescribed for married male employees shall be deemed to be an "adult male employee" in receipt of that minimum
- adult male employee in receipt of that infinitum salary or wage.
 (e) Subject to the provisions of the preceding clause (d) hereof, for the purpose of this Order a "junior employee" shall be deemed to be an employee of either sex who is under the age of twenty-one years.
 (f) The increase provided for by this Order shall apply to the unexcluded portion of the prescribed minimum remuneration of each employee.

This Order is made for the purpose of conforming with the Interim General Wage Order made on the 10th day of June, 1950, by the Court of Arbitration pursuant to the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1950, and subject to the provisions of clause (d) of paragraph 2 hereof this Order shall be interpreted so as to give effect to the provisions of that Interim General Order.

I N pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1949, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, William Stanley Goosman, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations to the Local Rates Scale of Charges made on the 12th day of May, 1948, and published in the Supplement dated the 19th day of May, 1948, to the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 13th day of May, 1948, in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. (1) This Order applies only with respect to Cheddar cheese that is sold by a retailer within four months after the date of its manufacture.

(2) For the purposes of this clause the date of the manufacture of any cheese shall be deemed to be the date indicated on the cheese in accordance with the requirements of the Dairy-produce Regulations 19387.
