Amending a Proclamation Setting Apart Land as Permanent State Forest Land

B. C. FREYBERG, Governor-General [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 7th day of July, 1950, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the 13th day of July, 1950, at page 883 (hereinafter referred to as the said Proclamation), an area of land containing 1,361 acres 3 roods, more or less, being Section 1, Block XV, Puketapu Survey District, was set apart as permanent State forest land in terms of section 18 of the Forests Act, 1949, and whereas errors were made in the Schedule to the said Proclamation and it is desireable that these errors be rectified. rectified.

Now, therefore, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 21 of the Forests Act, 1949, do hereby amend the said Proclamation by omitting from the said schedule the words "1,361" and "XV" and substituting the words "1,261" and "XIV" respectively in lieu thereof, and I do hereby further declare that this Proclamation shall take effect as from the date on which the said Proclamation was intended to take effect.
