The New Zealand Naval Regulations 1929* are hereby amended by revoking regulation 238, and substituting the following regulation:-

- "238. Compensation for loss of or damage to uniforms, &c.:-
- "This regulation governs the payment of compensation for loss of or damage to regulation kit or personal effects of officers and men of the Royal New Zealand Navy and of personnel of the Women's Royal New Zealand Naval Service.

``Interpretation

- "2. In this regulation, unless the context otherwise requires,-
 - "' Equipment' includes instructional books, instruments, and tools essential to an officer or rating in the proper performance of his duties:
 "'Investigating officers' means officers appointed to investigate claims for compensation under paragraph 7 of this regulation:

investigate claims for compensation under paragraph 7 of this regulation:

"'Personal effects' means personal effects other than uniform, regulation kit, or equipment:

"'Regulation kit' means articles of kit prescribed for a rating in service regulations:

"'Uniform' means articles of service clothing required by an officer in the proper performance of his duties.

"Cash Payment or Replacement in Kind

"3. Subject to the provisions of this regulation, an officer or rating who suffers any loss of or damage to his uniform, regulation kit, equipment, or personal effects shall be entitled to compensation therefor by way of cash payment or replacement in kind.

" Where Compensation Not Payable

- "4. Compensation shall not be awarded in respect of-
- "(a) Loss of money:
- (b) Loss by theft, except where the articles stolen have been properly accepted for safe custody by the Navy or other service authority:
- "(c) Loss of or damage to articles transported for other than service reasons in any vehicle, ship, merchant vessel, or aircraft:
- "(d) Loss of or damage to articles carried by an officer or rating while on leave unless special circumstances exist, in which cases claims may be forwarded to Navy Office for consideration.

"Procedure for Forwarding Claims

"5.(1) When an officer or rating sustains a loss or damage he is to forward his claim to his Commanding Officer within one calendar month from the date of loss or damage; any neglect to do so within that period may be held sufficient reason for its

"(2) When it is not practicable for a claim to be forwarded to the Commanding Officer within one calendar month, an explanation of the delay is to be noted on the claim.

"(3) When forwarding his claim, the officer or rating is to

- " (a) Complete details of the articles lost or damaged; " (b) The circumstances under which the loss or damage occurred;
- "(c) The names of all persons who in any way contributed
- to the loss or damage; and
 "(d) Details of insurance carried by him in respect of the articles lost or damaged.
- "(4) Separate lists are to be prepared in respect of-
- "(a) Uniform:

- "(b) Regulation kit:
 "(c) Equipment:
 "(d) Personal effects.
- "(5) The lists referred to in the last preceding subparagraph are to provide the following information:—

 - "(a) The date and cost of acquisition of original article; "(b) Whether the article has been replaced or repaired since the loss or damage; and
 - "(c) The date and cost of replacement or repair.
- "(6) Receipts are to be attached where possible but if they are not available the estimated cost is to be stated.

" Undertaking to be Given

- "6. Every claimant for compensation under this regulation shall, on making his claim, enter into an undertaking in the prescribed form to the effect—
 - "(a) That, in the event of compensation being awarded to him in respect of any article, he will, if required, refund to the Crown any amount recovered by him in respect of that article under any policy of insurance (less the premium required to restore the policy to its original cover value), and also any amount recovered by him from any other person in respect of that article, but so that the total amount refunded does not exceed the amount or value of the compensation awarded; and
 - "(b) That, in the event of any article being recovered after compensation has been awarded in respect of its loss, he will, subject to paragraph 12 hereof, forthwith return to the Navy Office the article issued in replacement thereof or reimburse the Navy Office with the value of the article so issued, or, as the case may be, refund the amount of compensation paid in respect of the article so recovered. article so recovered.

" Investigation of Claims

- "7. (1) Every claim for compensation under this regulation shall be investigated by investigating officers appointed for the purpose, who shall not recommend the awarding of compensation on any claim unless they are satisfied that—
 - "(a) The loss or damage is attributable to risks of the service; and
 - "(b) The officer or rating concerned did everything in his power to prevent the loss or damage; and
 - "(c) The officer or rating concerned was in no way responsible for the loss or damage; and
 - "(d) Any articles of uniform, regulation kit, or equipment to which the claim relates were required by the officer or rating concerned for the proper performance of his duties; and
 - "(e) Any articles of equipment to which the claim relates, not being articles on issue from the Navy, were not reason-ably available on service issue.
- "(2) After being investigated by investigating officers as aforesaid, claims are to be dealt with as follows:—
 - "(a) Officers' claims are to be forwarded to Navy Office for consideration as to payment:
 - "(b) Ratings' claims: Claims in respect of loss of or damage to regulation kit are to be dealt with locally in accordance with paragraph 8 of this regulation. All other claims are to be forwarded to Navy Office for consideration. A copy of any claim dealt with locally is to be forwarded to Navy Office.

" Assessment of Claims

- "8. (1) Uniform Regulation Kit and Equipment:
- "(a) Compensation for loss of or damage to uniform, regulation kit, or equipment, shall be calculated on the principle of enabling the officer or rating to re-equip himself with articles lost or damaged, which he is required by regulations to possess or which are necessary for the proper performance of his duty.
- "(b) The basis on which compensation for loss or damage is to be assessed is as follows:—
 - "(i) Articles comprised in the regulation kit will
 - (1) Articles comprised in the regulation kit will be replaced in kind or at the current issuing price:

 "(ii) When articles other than those comprised in the regulation kit are available from service sources, compensation will be based on the current issuing price:
 - "(iii) When articles are not available from service sources, the cash value of the compensation allowed will be assessed on the basis of reasonable current market prices. The value of compensation for articles of costly or elaborate types will be based on the price of similar articles of ordinary utility quality.
- "(2) Personal Effects Lost or Damaged:
- "The compensation awarded for the loss of or damage to personal effects shall in no case exceed—
 - "(a) £20 for any one item:
 - "(b) £150 in the aggregate on any claim by an officer: "(c) £100 in the aggregate on any claim by a rating.
- "Compensation Payable for Damaged or Unserviceable Articles "9. (1) Where any damaged articles of uniform, regulation kit, equipment, or personal effects are considered by the investigating officers to be unserviceable, compensation, if otherwise payable, and subject to the foregoing provisions of these regulations, may be paid as if the damaged articles had been completely destroyed, instead of being paid only in respect of the damage.
- "(2) The amount of compensation under this regulation for damaged articles shall be awarded as recommended by the investigating officers and approved by the Naval Board.

"Commanding Officer's Report of Circumstances Where Claimant Discharged

"10. Where an officer or rating who has made a claim for compensation under this regulation is discharged before the claim has been satisfied, whether by payment or by replacement, a report of the circumstances shall be forwarded by his Commanding Officer to the Navy Office for consideration and for any necessary adjustment in assessing the compensation (if any).

" Death of Claimant

- "11. Where an officer or rating who has made a claim for compensation under this regulation dies before the claim has been satisfied, no compensation shall be payable in respect of any articles of uniform, regulation kit, or equipment:
- "Provided that if the claimant has incurred expenditure in replacing any such articles, a refund of the amount so expended may, subject to this regulation, be awarded to the personal representatives of the claimant.
- "Recovery of Articles in Respect of Which Compensation Has Been Paid
- "12. Where a claim for compensation under this regulation in respect of the loss of any article has been satisfied, whether by payment or by replacement, and that article is subsequently recovered, the officer or rating concerned shall forthwith return to the Navy Office any articles issued in replacement thereof or reimburse the Navy Office with the value of the article so issued, or, as the case may be, refund the amount of compensation paid in respect of the article so recovered:
- "Provided that, if the article so recovered is in a damaged condition, the officer or rating may claim compensation in respect of that damage at any time within thirty days after the date or its recovery.

" Loss Caused by Infectious Disease

"13. Claims in respect of articles destroyed on the order of a competent authority to prevent the spread of an infectious or contagious disease are to be accompanied by a certificate from the competent authority stating the necessity for destroying those articles. Except in special circumstances, these claims need not be otherwise investigated or certified."

At stations where departures from normal are in parentheses, the temperature record has been maintained for less than ten years, the rainfall record for less than twenty years, and the normals are partly interpolated.

Notes on the Weather for September, 1950

General.—Mild temperatures combined with an absence of my conditions made September a very favourable month. In stormy conditions made September a very favourable month. In the South Island the mild, dry weather was very welcome during the lambing season, and high percentages were being recorded. All stock is reported to be in excellent condition. Growth of crops and pastures was somewhat retarded by lack of rain, but conditions

Rainfall.—With few exceptions rainfall was well below normal.

The only areas with a significant excess were the Whangarei and MacKenzie counties. Totals in Gisborne, Northern Hawke's Bay, Taranaki, and South Westland were close to the average.

Taranaki, and South Westland were close to the average.

The remainder of the South Island experienced a very dry month, rainfall generally being under half the average. In several places it was the driest September in the last 25 years.

Temperatures.—Mean temperatures were everywhere above normal. For the Dominion as a whole it was the mildest September for over 20 years. The departure from normal was about 2° F. in the interior of the North Island, but it exceeded 3° F. in Central Otago. In coastal districts tomperatures were in the main less In coastal districts temperatures were, in the main, less

than a degree above normal.

Sunshine.—East of the ranges, and in Northland and Southland sunshine was below the average. The deficiency was small except in Canterbury and in Wellington City where it was equivalent to an hour a day. There was a moderate surplus from Waikato to Manawatu.

Weather Sequence.—Following a brief clearance with the passage of a ridge, the weather deteriorated rapidly on the 2nd with the arrival of the frontal system accompanying a depression located in the Southern Tasman. The development of a secondary depression was responsible for heavier rainfall occurring over the southern half of the North Island.

With a large anticyclone advancing across the North Tasman Sea, the weather cleared in the east on the 5th, and soon afterwards in the north. Barometers remained low to the south and showery westerly conditions prevailed in Westland and coastal Southland. The northern anticyclone moved eastwards past North Cape on the 8th.

Temperatures dropped sharply behind a cold front which crossed the South Island on the 10th. When this front passed off to the north of the morning of the 12th, an intense anticyclone covered the South Island. During the next few days the anticyclone gradually extended over the whole country and most districts enjoyed a spell of settled weather until the 20th. Gisborne district, however, showers persisted until the 17th, while other east coast districts experienced light rains on the 14th and 15th, mainly due to the influence of a remote tropical storm which passed some 500 miles north-east of Auckland on the 15th.

Skies became overcast on the 21st as a shallow trough, accompanied by a broad belt of light rain, began to move slowly eastwards across the country. During its passage, which occupied two days, a shallow low pressure centre developed in the North. The latter remained almost stationary until it slowly dissipated on the 26th, with the result that rain continued intermittently over North Auckland. Elsewhere the weather cleared by the 24th, except for fairly widespread morning fogs.

An anticyclone moved off to the east on the 27th after its centre had crossed the South Island. The approach of a shollow but extensive disturbance from the Tasman Sea brought a general deterioration in the weather. Skies remained overcast and light rains fell over the entire country as the centre of the disturbance moved leisurely across the South Island. Conditions improved in the west and south on the 29th when an anticyclone which had moved up from the south began to intensify east of Otago.
