WHEREAS by subsection (6) of section 5 of the Education Lands Act, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), it is provided that notwithstanding anything contained in any other Act, the Governor-General may from time to time, by proclamation, declare that any school-site or part of a school-site which in his opinion is no longer required for that purpose shall be vested in His Majesty; and thereupon the school-site, or part thereof, as the case may be, shall vest in His Majesty freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date of the proclamation.

Now, therefore, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by subsection (6) of section 5 of the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Nelson Education Board as a site for a public school, shall be vested in His Majesty the King, freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date hereof.

**W**HEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Commission Act, 1946, the Local Government Commission has approved as final, a scheme bearing date the 6th day of July, 1950, providing for the inclusion of the areas described in the Schedule hereto in the Thames Valley Electric-power District:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to give effect to the final scheme:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the local Government Commission Act, 1946, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the Thames Valley Electric-power District so as to include the areas described in the Schedule hereto; and with the like advice and consent doth hereby declare that the alteration of boundaries hereinbefore made shall be deemed to have been effected under the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925.

(a) ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, being part of the County of Matamata, containing approximately 24,000 acres, bounded by a line commencing at Uraura Trig.
