PURSUANT to section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act, 1945, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby vary the Proclamation made on the 16th day of December, 1947, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the 8th day of January, 1948, at page 11, declaring certain parts of New Zealand to be a tribal district for the purposes of the said Act, by excluding from the Schedule thereto the description of the Maniapoto Tribal District and substituting therefor the description appearing in the Schedule hereto.

MANIAPOTO TRIBAL DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Auckland and Taranaki Land Districts, bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Waihekura Stream in Block III, Marokopa Survey District; thence proceeding easterly along a right line in the direction of Trig. REGULATIONS

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations (No. 2) 1950, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1908, on the 12th day of June, 1922, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the 15th day of the same month at page 1583, as the same are enuring under the Government Railways Act, 1949 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 16 of the principal regulations, as substituted by regulation 2 of the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1947 (No. 2),* is hereby further amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclauses:—

“(1) Subject to the following provisions of this regulation, no candidate for employment shall be engaged as a probationer in any occupation if his age at the date of his engagement is less than the minimum or more than the maximum for the occupation as specified hereunder:—

“(1A) In the case of any male candidate for employment as a clerical cadet who has passed the University Entrance Examination or the School Certificate Examination or who holds higher educational qualifications, the maximum age of the candidate at his or her last birthday before the date of the engagement of the candidate as a probationer may be extended by the General Manager to twenty years.

“(1B) In the case of any male candidate for employment as an engineering cadet, an apprentice, or a clerk, or of any female candidate for employment in any occupation in the Salaried Division, the maximum age of the candidate at his or her last birthday before the date of the engagement of the candidate as a probationer may, in special circumstances, be extended by the General Manager at his discretion.

“(1C) In the case of male candidates for employment as cleaners, preference may be given to any candidate who has not passed his twentieth birthday at the date of engagement.

“(1D) In the case of male candidates for employment as porters, labourers (Traffic Branch or Permanent Way), bus drivers, service car drivers, or garage attendants, preference may be given to any candidate who has not passed his thirty-fifth birthday at the date of engagement.”

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 22, and substituting the following regulation:—

“22 (1) The periods of probation in the case of probationers of the classes specified in this subclause shall be as follows:—

	Period of Probation (Computed From Date of Taking Up Duty as a Probationer).
Male probationer in Salaried Division ..	3 years.
Probationer mechanician	3 years.
Probationer junior mechanician	3 years.
Female probationer in Salaried Division ..	2 years.
Probationer apprentice	6 months.
Any other probationer	1 year.

“(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in subclause (1) of this regulation the General Manager may, in special circumstances, extend any of the probationary periods specified in that subclause for such period as he deems fit.

“(3) In respect of any probationer (other than a probationer mechanician, probationer junior mechanician, or probationer apprentice) who has any period of service as a temporary employee immediately prior to his engagement as a probationer, the probationary period specified in subclause (1) of this regulation may be either waived by the General Manager or reduced to such period as the General Manager shall determine.

“(4) Except as provided in subclause (3) of this regulation, no previous period of employment in the Department shall be taken into account in calculating the period of probation.”

4. Paragraph (e) of subclause (1) and subclause (2) of regulation 23 of the principal regulations, as set out in regulation 5 of the Government Railways Staff (Amending) Regulations 1946,† are hereby revoked.

5. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 83, and substituting the following regulation:—

“83. The General Manager or any officer authorized by him either generally or specially in that behalf may grant to any person free travel on the railways (including the free use of sleeping-berths).”

6. Regulation 4 of the Government Railways (Staff) Amending Regulations 1950‡ is hereby amended by omitting the words “in excess of £860,” and substituting the words “in excess of £1,080.”

Price Order No. 1199 (Barley)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1199, and shall come into force on the 14th day of December, 1950.
2. (1) Price Order No. 1120* is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. In this Order—

- “Grower”, in relation to barley, means a person engaged in the business of growing barley for sale:
- “Grower’s station”, in relation to any grower, means the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower’s premises:
- “Wholesale distributor”, in relation to barley, means any person who purchases barley from a grower for sale to a merchant distributor or who acts as the agent of the grower in the sale of his barley to a merchant distributor:
- “Merchant distributor”, in relation to barley, means any person who purchases barley from a grower or a wholesale distributor and who sells barley or any product containing barley either whole or processed to a retailer or to a consumer:
- “Retailer”, in relation to barley means any person who purchases barley from a merchant distributor for sale to a consumer:
- The expression “f.o.r.s.e.” means “free on rail, sacks extra”, and the expression “f.o.b.s.e.” means “free on board, sacks extra”:
- The expression “f.o.r.s.i.” means free on rail, sacks included” and the expression “f.o.b.s.i.” means “free on board, sacks included”.

4. The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any barley to which this Order is applicable is sold otherwise than by weight.
5. The several prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.
6. In computing the weight of any lot of barley to which this Order applies that is sold on the basis of sacks extra the weight of the sacks shall be excluded.
7. In computing the weight of any lot of barley to which this Order applies that is sold on the basis of sacks included the weight of the sacks shall be included.
8. Where any barley to which this Order applies is sold on the basis of sacks extra the maximum amount that may be charged for the sacks, shall be: For 48 in. by 26½ in. sacks, 3s. 1d. each; for 46 in. by 23 in. sacks, 2s. 8d. each.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

9. (1) This Order does not apply to—
 - (a) Malting barley, that is barley sold for malting purposes;
 - (b) Black skinless barley or white skinless barley; or
 - (c) Any machine-dressed barley that is sold by a distributor or a reseller for seed purposes.
- (2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all barley grown in New Zealand.
- (3) The provisions of this Order fixing growers’ prices shall apply only with respect to barley grown from seed sown on or after the 1st day of March, 1950.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF BARLEY TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Growers’ Prices

10. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any grower for any barley to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows:—

When grown in the South Island: 6s. 8½d. per bushel f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station.

When grown in the North Island: 7s. 8½d. per bushel f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station.

- (2) Where any barley is delivered by a grower otherwise than f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station, the price that may be charged by the grower shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause, increased by the amount of the charges (if any) incurred by the grower in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of the charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the barley f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station.

Wholesale Distributor’s Prices

11. (1) The maximum price (sacks included) that may be charged or received by any wholesale distributor for any barley to which this Order applies that has been grown in the South Island and is sold to a merchant distributor in the North Island shall be the sum of the following amounts:—

- (a) The price actually paid or payable to the grower;
- (b) The amount of any transport, grading, or branding charges actually incurred by the wholesale distributor;
- (c) An amount not exceeding ¼d. per bushel on account of brokerage actually incurred;
- (d) An amount calculated at the rate of 3½d. per bushel;
- (e) An amount calculated at the rate of 8d. per bushel with respect to sacks of the size 48 in. by 26½ in. or 9d. per bushel with respect to sacks of the size 46 in. by 23 in.:

Provided, that the total amount calculated in accordance with paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) shall not in any case exceed an amount equivalent to the appropriate f.o.b.s.i. price set out hereunder, where the barley is sold in sacks of the size 48 in. by 26½ in. or that amount increased by a 1d. per bushel where the barley is sold in sacks of the size 46 in. by 23 in.

- (g) The amount of any through-store charges actually incurred by the wholesale distributor but not more in any case than an amount calculated at the rate of 3½d. per bushel with respect to barley taken into store on or before the 31st day of May or 2½d. per bushel with respect to barley taken into store after the 31st day of May: Provided that where any through-store charges have previously been incurred any subsequent through-store charges shall not in any case exceed 2½d. per bushel irrespective of the date on which the barley was taken into store:

- (3) Where with respect to any barley sold by a wholesale distributor the purchaser desires full details of the various charges comprised in the total amount payable, full details of each such charge shall be made available to him by the wholesale distributor: Provided that where any charges are incurred pursuant to paragraph (g) of subclause (1) or paragraph (e) of subclause (2) of this clause the amount of such charges shall be stated separately on the relevant invoice.

Merchant Distributors' Prices

12. The maximum price (sacks included) that may be charged or received by any merchant distributor for any barley to which this Order applies shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:—

- (a) The price actually paid or payable to the grower (exclusive of the price paid for the sacks) or to the wholesale distributor (sacks included):
- (b) Any transport, branding, dressing, or insurance in transit charges actually and reasonably incurred by the merchant distributor:
- (c) With respect to barley grown in the South Island and transported to the North Island, an amount not exceeding 1 per cent. of the sum of the amounts calculated in accordance with paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof (to cover the estimated loss due to shrinkage and other causes):
- (d) The amount of any through-store charges actually incurred by the merchant distributor but not more in any case than an amount calculated at the rate of 3½d. per bushel with respect to barley taken into store on or before the 31st day of May or 2½d. per bushel with respect to barley taken into store after the 31st day of May: Provided that where any through-store charges have previously been incurred any subsequent through-store charges shall not in any case exceed 2½d. per bushel irrespective of the date on which the barley was taken into store:
- (e) An amount calculated at the rate of 1d. per bushel in respect of each of the months June to September and at the rate of ½d. per bushel in respect of each of the months October to December (in all cases exclusive of the month in which the barley was delivered to the merchant distributor) during which the barley is held by the merchant distributor undelivered: Provided that for the purposes of this paragraph a part of a month shall be deemed to be a complete month; provided, further, that a merchant distributor shall be entitled to an amount under this paragraph only in respect of each of the aforesaid months that first fall within a period of twelve months following the date on which the barley was harvested:
- (f) An amount computed as follows:—

Retailers' Prices

13. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any barley to which this Order applies shall be the sum of the following amounts:—

- (a) The cost of the barley to the retailer at the point at which he takes delivery but not more in any case than the cost that would have been incurred had the retailer purchased the barley in lots of half-ton or more:
- (b) The amount of the transport charges incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery of the barley into his store being not more in any case than the charges that would have been incurred had delivery been effected at common carrier rates:
- (c) An amount calculated at the rate per bushel as follows:—
 - (i) For barley sold in sack lots: 1s. per bushel;
 - (ii) For barley sold in lots of a half-bushel but less than one sack: 1s. 9d. per bushel;
 - (iii) For barley sold in lots of less than half-bushel: 2s. 6d. per bushel.

PROVISION FOR SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

14. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any grower, wholesale distributor, merchant distributor, or retailer may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any barley to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the grower, wholesale distributor, merchant distributor, or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of barley or may relate generally to all barley to which this Order applies sold by the grower, wholesale distributor, merchant distributor, or retailer, while the approval remains in force.

DUTIES IMPOSED ON WHOLESALE DISTRIBUTORS AND MERCHANT DISTRIBUTORS

15. (1) Every wholesale distributor who sells any barley to which this Order applies on the basis of sacks extra shall state separately in the appropriate invoice relating to such sale the price charged for the barley and the price charged for the sacks.

(2) Every merchant distributor who sells for purposes other than seed purposes any barley that has been machine dressed by him shall keep for a period of two years a detailed record of the charges incurred by him in machine dressing the barley and of the weight of barley lost in the process of machine dressing.

Price Order No. 1200 (Malting Barley)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order :—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1200, and shall come into force on the 14th day of December, 1950.
2. (1) Price Order No. 1121* is hereby revoked.
(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not effect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.
3. In this Order—
 “Grower”, in relation to barley, means a person engaged in the business of growing barley for sale;
 “Grower’s station”, in relation to any grower, means the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower’s premises;
 “Preferred varieties”, in relation to barley, means barley of any of the following varieties: Spratt Archer, Golden Archer, Plumage Archer, Goldthorpe Spratt, or Kinver Chevalier;
 “Reseller”, in relation to barley to which this Order applies, means any person (other than a grower) who sells any such barley:
 The expression “f.o.r.s.e.” means “free on rail, sacks extra.”
4. The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any barley to which this Order is applicable is sold otherwise than by weight.
5. In computing the weight of any barley to which this Order applies the weight of the sacks in which the barley is contained shall be excluded.
6. The maximum price that may be charged for the sacks in which any barley to which this Order applies is contained shall be: for 48 in. by 26½ in. sacks, 3s. 1d. each; for 46 in. by 23 in. sacks, 2s. 8d. each.
7. The several prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

8. (1) This Order applies only with respect to barley sold for malting purposes.
(2) The provisions of this Order fixing growers’ prices shall apply only with respect to barley grown from seed sown on or after the 1st day of March, 1950.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF BARLEY TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

9. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any grower for any barley to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows :—

(2) Where any barley is delivered by a grower otherwise than f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station, the price that may be charged by the grower shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause, increased by the amount of the charges (if any) incurred by the grower in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of the charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the barley f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station.

Resellers’ Prices

10. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any reseller for any barley to which this Order applies shall not exceed the sum or the following amounts :—

- (a) The price actually paid or payable to the grower by the same or any other reseller;
- (b) Any transport, insurance, storage, or other charges actually and reasonably incurred by the same or any other reseller;
- (c) An amount not exceeding 2d. per bushel.

(2) Every reseller who sells any barley to which this Order applies shall state on the invoice relating to such sale the words “malting barley” and the name of the variety of the barley.

11. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any grower or reseller, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any malting barley to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the grower or reseller. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of malting barley or may relate generally to all malting barley to which this Order applies sold by the grower or reseller while the approval remains in force.

Price Order No. 1201 (Honey)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order :—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1201, and shall come into force on the 14th day of December, 1950.
2. (1) Price Orders Nos. 927*, 984†, and 1011‡ are hereby revoked.
(2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 “The said Act” means the Control of Prices Act, 1947:
 “Honey in the comb” means either—
 (a) Honey sold in standard sections; or
 (b) Cut comb honey—that is, honey containing no visible traces of stored pollen or other impurities stored in clean new combs that have not been used at any time for brood-rearing purposes;
 “Packer” means a wholesaler who sells to another wholesaler honey packed in retail containers, and includes a producer who sells to a wholesaler honey packed in retail containers as aforesaid;
 “Producer” means a beekeeper whose apiary is registered pursuant to the Apiaries Act, 1927;
 “Retail container” means a jar, carton, or tin supplied by the vendor of the honey and containing not more than 10 lb. net weight of honey;
 “Standard case” means a case or other outer container containing in the aggregate approximately 60 lb. of honey packed in retail containers;

“Wholesale free delivery area” means any area within which any wholesaler normally undertakes the free delivery of goods to retailers.

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the said Act when used in this Order have the meanings severally assigned thereto by that Act, unless the context otherwise requires.

4. For the purpose of this Order, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the said Act, any person who sells by retail to any one purchaser for delivery at any one time not less than two standard case lots of honey shall, in respect of the sale, be deemed to be a wholesaler, and the provisions of this Order as to maximum wholesale prices shall apply accordingly with respect to every such sale.

5. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES FOR HONEY SOLD IN RETAIL CONTAINERS

6. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause and of clauses 9 and 10 hereof, the maximum price that may be charged or received for honey packed in retail containers of the kinds described in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be the appropriate price fixed in the second, third, or fourth column of that Schedule.

(2) Where the quantity of honey sold by a packer to a wholesaler or to a retailer in any one transaction is six standard case lots or more the cost involved in effecting delivery to the port (where carriage by sea is entailed) or railway station (where carriage by sea is not entailed) that is nearest or most convenient of access to the wholesaler's or to the retailer's place of business shall be borne by the packer.

(3) The maximum prices fixed in the fourth column of the Schedule hereto are fixed in respect of supplies of honey available to the retailer free of freight charges for delivery at his store from any source whatever.

(4) Where supplies of honey are delivered to a retailer (other than a retailer situate within a wholesale free delivery area) otherwise than free of freight charges as aforesaid the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price fixed as aforesaid, increased by a proportionate part of the freight charges incurred by him in obtaining delivery: Provided that the amount added to the price in respect of freight, pursuant to this subclause, shall not in any case exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per pound.

(5) The several prices fixed by this clause shall include the price of the containers.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES FOR HONEY SOLD OTHERWISE THAN IN RETAIL CONTAINERS OF A KIND DESCRIBED IN THE SCHEDULE HERETO

7. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause and of clauses 8, 9, and 10 hereof, the maximum prices that may be charged or received for honey sold otherwise than in retail containers of a kind described in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be determined as follows:—

(2) The maximum retail prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are fixed in respect of supplies of honey available to the retailer free of freight charges for delivery at his store from any source whatever.

(3) Where supplies of honey are delivered to the retailer otherwise than free of freight charges as aforesaid, the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price fixed as aforesaid, increased by a proportionate part of the freight charges incurred by him in obtaining delivery: Provided that the amount added to the price in respect of freight, pursuant to this subclause, shall not in any case exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per pound.

(4) The several prices fixed by this clause shall include the price of the containers.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF HONEY SOLD IN THE COMB

8. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause and subject to the provisions of clauses 9 and 10 hereof, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for honey sold in the comb shall be 1s. 9d. per pound or per standard section: Provided that where the gross weight of any standard section of honey in the comb is less than 14 oz. that section shall be sold at the rate of 1s. 9d. per pound.

GENERAL

9. If in respect of any honey the retail price charged in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

10. Subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any person concerned, may authorize special prices or margins of profit in respect of any honey to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by any producer, packer, wholesaler, or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of honey or may relate generally to all honey to which this Order applies sold while the approval remains in force.

Price Order No. 1202 (Milk) (Buller, Kumara-Paroa-Cameras-Kumara Junction, Denniston, Stockton-Millerton, Waituta, and Murupara Milk Price Districts)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. THIS Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1202, and shall come into force on the 14th day of December, 1950.

2. In this Order—

“Buller Milk Price District” means the Buller Milk District constituted under the Milk Act, 1944, by Order in Council dated the 14th day of April, 1948, excluding therefrom all that area within a radius of three miles from the post-office at Westport.

“Kumara-Paroa-Cameras-Kumara Junction Milk Price District” means the district comprising all that area within a radius of six miles from the Kumara Railway post-office:

“Denniston Milk Price District” means the district within a radius of two miles from the post-office at Denniston:

“Stockton-Millerton Milk Price District” means the district within a radius of one mile from the post-office at Millerton:

“Waituta Milk Price District” means the district within a radius of two miles from the post-office at Waituta:

“Murupara Milk Price District” means the district within a radius of ten miles from the post-office at Murupara.

“Commercial user” means a person who buys milk for sale for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise, and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances) and includes an institution under the control of any Hospital Board or a separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals Act, 1926:

“Consumer” means a person who buys milk for purposes other than resale:

“Shop dairy” means a shop where milk is sold for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise and where the milk so sold is sold in the form in which it was received into the shop dairy.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to all milk wherever produced that is sold :—

- (a) To the occupier of any shop dairy within either the Buller, Kumara-Paroa-Camerons-Kumara Junction, Denniston, Stockton-Millerton, Waiuta, or the Murupara Milk Price District; or
- (b) By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer within any of those milk price districts.

FIXING PRICES OF MILK TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received for any milk to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery as follows :—

- (a) In respect of milk sold by the occupier of a shop dairy :
As for delivery to the purchaser at the shop dairy :
- (b) In respect of milk sold otherwise than at a shop dairy :
As for delivery at the premises of the purchaser.

(3) If any lot of milk to which this Order applies is supplied at one time to a commercial user or a consumer otherwise than in one of the quantities specified in the Schedule hereto in respect of sales to those persons, the price of the milk shall be computed at the rate prescribed for the specified quantity that is less than and nearest to the quantity supplied irrespective of the number or type of containers in which the milk is delivered :

Provided that if the quantity of milk supplied in any one lot is less than the smallest specified quantity the price for the lot shall be computed at the rate prescribed in the Schedule for the smallest specified quantity.

(4) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause, where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day the price that may be charged for the milk to which the account relates shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order in respect of the quantity supplied in each lot :

Provided that if the total quantity of milk supplied to any one purchaser on any one day (exclusive of milk supplied at any one time in a lot of a half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon the maximum price that may be charged for the total quantity shall be computed in accordance with the provisions of this Order as if all the milk supplied on that day had been supplied in one lot.

(5) Where the quantity of milk supplied at any one time is a lot of a half-pint or less the price of each lot shall be computed separately at the rate prescribed by this Order for a half-pint whether or not an account is rendered to the purchaser of the milk and whether or not the total quantity so supplied on any one day is one gallon or more.

(6) Subject to the proviso to subclause (4) of this clause, if the price computed in accordance with this Order for any lot of milk supplied at any one time whether sold for cash or on credit is not an exact number of pence or half-pence the price for the lot shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any vendor of milk, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any milk to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the vendor. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified delivery of milk, or may relate to all milk delivered by the vendor while the approval remains in force.

- (b) By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer within any of those milk price districts.

FIXING PRICES OF MILK TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received for any milk to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The prices fixed by this Order are fixed as for delivery as follows :—

- (a) In respect of milk sold by the occupier of a shop dairy : As for delivery to the purchaser at the shop dairy :
- (b) In respect of milk sold otherwise than at a shop dairy : As for delivery at the premises of the purchaser.

(3) If any lot of milk to which this Order applies is supplied at one time to a commercial user or a consumer otherwise than in one of the quantities specified in the Schedule hereto in respect of sales to those persons, the price of the milk shall be computed at the rate prescribed for the specified quantity that is less than and nearest to the quantity supplied irrespective of the number or type of containers in which the milk is delivered :

Provided that if the quantity of milk supplied in any one lot is less than the smallest specified quantity the price for the lot shall be computed at the rate prescribed in the Schedule for the smallest specified quantity.

(4) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause, where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day the price that may be charged for the milk to which the account relates shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order in respect of the quantity supplied in each lot :

Provided that if the total quantity of milk supplied to any one purchaser on any one day (exclusive of milk supplied at any one time in a lot of a half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon the maximum price that may be charged for the total quantity shall be computed in accordance with the provisions of this Order as if all the milk supplied on that day had been supplied in one lot.

(5) Where the quantity of milk supplied at any one time is a lot of a half-pint or less the price of each lot shall be computed separately at the rate prescribed by this Order for a half-pint whether or not an account is rendered to the purchaser of the milk and whether or not the total quantity so supplied on any one day is one gallon or more.

(6) Subject to the proviso to subclause (4) of this clause if the price computed in accordance with this Order for any lot of milk supplied at any one time whether sold for cash or on credit is not an exact number of pence or halfpence the price for the lot shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal on application of any vendor of milk may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any milk to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the vendor. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified delivery of milk or may relate generally to all milk delivered by the vendor while the approval remains in force.

Price Order No. 1204 (Milk (Main Order))

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1204, and shall come into force on the 14th day of December, 1950.

2. (1) Price Orders Nos. 1156*, 1157†, and 1158‡, are hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. In this Order—

“Commercial user” means a person who buys milk for sale for consumption on his premises (whether in the form in which it is received by him or otherwise, and whether separately or in combination with any other substance or substances) and includes an institution under the control of any Hospital Board or a separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals Act, 1926:

“Consumer” means a person who buys milk for purposes other than resale:

“Shop dairy” means a shop where milk is sold for consumption or use off the premises and not otherwise and where the milk so sold is sold in the form in which it was received into the shop dairy.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies with respect to all milk wherever produced that is sold—

(b) By the occupier of a shop dairy or by any other person to a commercial user or to a consumer at any place in New Zealand except the milk price districts specified in Price Order No. 1202 or Price Order No. 1203.

(b) In respect of milk sold otherwise than at a shop dairy: As for delivery at the premises of the purchaser.

(3) If any lot of milk to which this Order applies is supplied at one time to a commercial user or a consumer otherwise than in one of the quantities specified in the Schedule hereto in respect of sales to those persons, the price of the milk shall be computed at the rate prescribed for the specified quantity that is less than and nearest to the quantity supplied irrespective of the number or type of containers in which the milk is delivered:

Provided that if the quantity of milk supplied in any one lot is less than the smallest specified quantity the price for the lot shall be computed at the rate prescribed in the Schedule for the smallest specified quantity.

(4) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause, where an account is rendered to any purchaser for milk supplied to him during a period comprising more than one day the price that may be charged for the milk to which the account relates shall be computed separately for each lot supplied at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate fixed by this Order in respect of the quantity supplied in each lot:

Provided that if the total quantity of milk supplied to any one purchaser on any one day (exclusive of milk supplied at any one time in a lot of a half-pint or less) is not less than one gallon the maximum price that may be charged for the total quantity shall be computed in accordance with the provisions of this Order as if the milk supplied on that day had been supplied in one lot.

(5) Where the quantity of milk supplied at any one time is a lot of a half-pint or less the price of each lot shall be computed separately at the rate prescribed by this Order for a half-pint whether or not the account is rendered to the purchaser of the milk and whether or not the total quantity so supplied on any one day is one gallon or more.

(6) Subject to the proviso to subclause (4) of this clause, if the price computed in accordance with this Order for any lot of milk supplied at any one time whether sold for cash or on credit is not an exact number of pence or half-pence the price for the lot shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

6. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any vendor of milk, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any milk to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the vendor. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified delivery of milk or may relate generally to all milk delivered by the vendor, while the approval remains in force.
