Declaring Land in Taranaki and Southland Land Districts, Vested in the Auckland and Southland Education Boards as Sites for Public Schools, to be Vested in His Majesty the King

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by subsection (6) of section 5 of the Education Lands Act, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), it is provided that notwithstanding anything contained in any other Act, the Governor-General may from time to time, by Proclamation declare that any school-site or part of a school-site which in his opinion is no longer required for that purpose shall be vested in His Majesty; and thereupon the school-site, or part thereof, as the case may be, shall vest in His Majesty freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date of the Proclamation.

Now, therefore, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by subsection (6) of section 5 of the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the First Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Auckland Education Board, and the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, being areas vested in the Southland Education Board, as sites for public schools, shall be vested in His Majesty the King, freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date hereof.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Fire Services Act, 1949, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council made on the 13th day of May, 1936, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the 14th day of May, 1936, at page 884, and doth hereby in lieu thereof make the following Order prescribing the time and method of election of members of the Auckland Metropolitan Fire Board.

1. This Order may be cited as the Auckland Metropolitan Fire Board Election Order, 1950.

2. In this Order—

“The said Act” means the Fire Services Act, 1949:

“The Board” means the Auckland Metropolitan Fire Board:

“City Member” means a member of the Board elected to represent the Auckland City Council:

“Local Authority” means a local authority other than the Auckland City Council the district of which is within the Auckland Metropolitan Fire District:

“Local Authority Member” means a member of the Board elected to represent the local authorities as hereinbefore defined.

3. For all elections under this Order the Returning Officer shall be the secretary of the Board for the time being.

4. The electors of the city members shall be the members of the Auckland City Council.

5. Every city member shall be elected by resolution passed at a special meeting of the Auckland City Council.

6. Unless an extraordinary vacancy otherwise requires, the next election of city members shall be held on some day in the month of February, 1951, and subsequent elections shall be held on some day in the same month of every third year thereafter.

7. In the case of an extraordinary vacancy in the office of a city member, the Returning Officer shall give notice in writing thereof to the Auckland City Council, and an election to fill the office so vacated shall be held not later than one month after the date when such notice is given.

8. It shall be the duty of the Mayor of the City of Auckland to cause a meeting of the Auckland City Council to be held for the purpose of conducting an election under this Order whenever necessary.

9. It shall be the duty of the Town Clerk of the Auckland City Council immediately following any election by the Auckland City Council under this Order to give notice of the result thereof in writing to the Returning Officer who shall notify the Minister of Internal Affairs accordingly.

10. Unless an extraordinary vacancy otherwise requires, the next election of local authority members shall take place by means of meetings to be held on some day in the month of February, 1951, and subsequent elections shall be held on some day in the same month of every third year thereafter.

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11. In the case of an extraordinary vacancy in the office of a local authority member, an election shall take place by means of meetings to be held on some day not later than one month after the giving of the notice hereinafter required to be given by the Returning Officer.

12. (a) In the month of December in every year immediately preceding the year in which an election of local authority members is to take place; and

(b) So soon thereafter as he has knowledge of any extraordinary vacancy in the office of a local authority member; the Returning Officer shall give notice in writing of the necessary election to each of the local authorities and shall in such notice set out the number of votes exercisable by each of the local authorities in terms of subsection (2) of section 23 of the said Act.

13. Each of the local authorities may nominate candidates (not exceeding in number the number required to be elected) by resolution, a sealed copy of which, together with written consent of each nominee to his nomination, shall be lodged with the Returning Officer not later than the last day in January in every year in which an election of local authority members is to take place and not later than ten days after the Returning Officer has given notice of an election to fill an extraordinary vacancy in the office of a local authority member.

14. The Returning Officer shall thereupon prepare a list of nominated candidates and send a copy thereof to each of the local authorities which shall, at a meeting held on some day in the month of February in every year in which an election of local authority members is to take place or at a meeting held not later than one month after the Returning Officer has given notice of an election to fill an extraordinary vacancy, by resolution allocate its prescribed number of votes to each of two of the candidates where two candidates are required to be elected or to one of the candidates where only one candidate is required to be elected and lodge a sealed copy of such resolution with the Returning Officer within forty-eight hours after the passing of the resolution.

15. It shall be the duty of the Mayor or Chairman (as the case may be) of each local authority to cause meetings of such local authority to be held whenever necessary—

(a) For the purpose of nominating candidates (such meetings to be held so that any nomination decided on can be lodged with the Returning Officer within the time specified by clause thirteen hereof):

(b) For the purpose of conducting an election (such meetings to be held within the time specified by clause fourteen hereof.)

16. In the event of an equality of votes, the Returning Officer shall have a casting-vote, or two casting-votes if necessary, to enable the issue to be decided.

17. The Returning Officer shall give public notice of the result of the election and report such result to each local authority and to the Minister of Internal Affairs.

18. No failure on the part of any local authority to hold any meeting as hereby prescribed, or to carry at such meeting a resolution allocating its votes, or to lodge a sealed copy of such resolution with the Returning Officer within the time hereby prescribed, or otherwise to exercise its power of voting shall affect the validity of any election.

19. Every city member shall be deemed to be elected when the notice of his election given by the Town Clerk is received by the Returning Officer, and every local authority member shall be deemed to be elected when public notice of the result of the election is given by the Returning Officer.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR NOVEMBER, 1950

General.—Very mild conditions prevailed for the third month in succession. As in October, easterly winds were predominant and it was not until near the end of the month that there was any sign of the onset of the westerly conditions typical of a normal spring season.

In the North Island there was excellent growth of crops and pastures, and dairy production was maintained at a very high level. On the East Coast, however, excessive rainfall has delayed shearing operations.

In Marlborough, Nelson, and Otago crops and stock have suffered through lack of rain, though in Otago timely rains during the last week afforded some relief.

Rainfall.—Apart from a slight deficiency in parts of the Waikato and Bay of Plenty districts, the rainfall over the Auckland and Hawke's Bay Provinces was well above normal. From Hawke's Bay to East Cape, and also over the Coromandel Peninsula, totals were two or three times the normal. Gisborne experienced its wettest November as well as its wettest spring since records commenced in 1878. Several other East Coast stations set new records for November rainfall.

The provinces of Taranaki and Wellington, as well as the South Island, received less than normal rainfall with the exception of part of South Otago. Near Nelson and Blenheim there has not been a drier November in over 50 years.

Heavy rains caused some flood damage in the Coromandel district on the 19th. The fall of 7.34 in. at Waihi on that day was the highest ever recorded there in November.

Temperatures.—As in the previous two months, mean temperatures were everywhere above normal. In the east and south the departure was above 1 F. increasing to 3 F. over much of the Auckland Province.

Sunshine.—The duration of sunshine was appreciably above normal in the South Island. Between Dunedin and Christchurch, and also on the West Coast, the excess was equivalent to 2 hours or more a day, setting new November records in several places.

At the other extreme, Napier had its lowest November sunshine since records commenced in 1907. The remainder of the North Island also had a substantial deficiency, except between Wellington and Palmerston North where there was a surplus of 20–30 hours.

Weather Sequence.—A period of rain accompanied a cold front which moved across the South Island on the 1st, and next day some scattered hail and thunder occurred on the east coast with the passage of a secondary front. Over the South Island settled weather then prevailed until the middle of the month due to the influence of an extensive ridge of high pressure. Occasional showers

were reported in Southland when depressions were passing in the Sub-Antarctic. In the North Island, however, the weather for the first week was very unsettled, especially in the eastern and northern portions. The cold front which arrived from the south on the 2nd became stationary for a time due to the formation of a depression north-west of Auckland. The latter travelled slowly southeastwards to pass across the Bay of Plenty early on the 4th. Substantial rainfalls were recorded in the east and north, where further heavy rain fell on the 6th when a depression moved north-eastwards from the Central Tasman Sea to fill up slowly north of New Zealand.

On the 8th the high pressure system over the South Island embraced the whole Dominion, bringing improved weather to most of the North Island. In the interior, however, convectional showers, accompanied at times by thunder and lightning, affected many districts in the afternoons.

With the passage of a weak disturbance in the sub-tropics on the 14th, easterlies freshened temporarily and rain fell intermittently throughout the day over the Auckland Province.

The high pressure system moved off to the east with the approach of an extensive cold front which began to travel slowly up the South Island on the 16th, later to become stationary across the centre of the North Island. Except in South Canterbury its passage was accompanied by moderate rain.

With the approach of a deep cyclonic depression from the northwest, rain spread rapidly over the whole of the North Island on the 18th. Easterlies rose to gale force in exposed positions and heavy rainfalls were recorded over most of the Auckland and Hawke's Bay provinces as the cyclone travelled slowly south-eastwards, finally moving out of range on the 22nd.

After moving up rapidly from the south, an active cold front passed off towards the northeast on the 23rd. An anticyclone then moved on to the North Island, the centre passing North Cape on the 25th. Another cold front accompanied by brief but heavy rain and a change to southwest winds reached Southland on the morning of the 26th. It took about forty hours to cross the remainder of the country, and was followed by an anticyclone the centre of which was over the North Island on the 28th.

North-westerlies rose to gale force about Cook Strait on the 29th when another cold front began to advance up the South Island. It made very slow progress and by the end of the month was lying across North Canterbury. The accompanying belt of rain brought welcome relief to the parched interior of the Otago Province.

Price Order No. 1205 (Amendment No. 1 of Price Order No. 1184)
(Hotel Tariffs)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1205, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 1184* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 21st day of December, 1950.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By inserting in clause 6 the following subclause:—

“(8) The charges authorized by this clause are subject to the modification in respect of charges for bedrooms indicated in the Schedule to this Order.”

(b) By revoking the Schedule thereto and substituting the Schedule to this Order.

Water Aerodrome Established

A WATER aerodrome has been established at Port Nicholson and is all that area enclosed by a line commencing at the northern extreme of Jerningham Point, thence 000° one mile, thence 090° two miles, thence 180° for half a mile, thence 270° to a point 000° of Halswell Point, thence 180° to the northern extreme of Halswell Point.

A licence for the operation of the above water aerodrome was issued by the Air Department to Tasman Empire Airways, Ltd., on the 27th September, 1950, for a period of 12 months, subject to the following conditions:—

- The licensing of the alighting area does not mean that the aerodrome is set aside solely for aviation purposes.
- The licence is to specify that the aerodrome is available for alighting, taking off, and manoeuvring of aircraft only on, at least, one hour's prior notice being given to the Harbour Master by Air Traffic Control and that the portion of the aerodrome required for use by aircraft shall not be cleared until 15 minutes before the actual expected time of arrival or actual departure.
- Air Traffic Control is required to keep the Harbour Master continually advised of variations in the expected time of arrival of aircraft as the advice comes to hand.
- Operations to be confined where reasonably practicable to the enclosed area of Evans Bay.
- The right to take over the licence at any time to be reserved to the Board.

Aircraft Mooring Buoys Established: Three mooring buoys in positions approximately 203° from the outer end of the south slipway wharf in Evans Bay at distances of approximately 600, 1,000, and 1,400 feet. Two mooring buoys in positions approximately 237° from the south-west corner of Miramar wharf at distances of approximately 700 and 1,100 feet.

Lights on Buoys: A fixed red light will be shown as required from the Red Spar buoy in a position 324°, distant 1,300 feet from the north-west corner of Miramar wharf.

A fixed red light on each of the two guide buoys in the vicinity of the Patent Slip Wharf.

When these lights are exhibited it is to be taken as a signal to all vessels that an aircraft is due to land or take off and during this period all vessels must obey the orders of the patrol launches.

Flare Paths: Flare paths may be laid for night air movements and all vessels must keep well clear of the flare path and not attempt to pass through the area.

Signals during Air Operations: Five minutes before an aircraft lands or takes off a white Verey cartridge will be fired from the control launch. This will indicate to all harbour traffic in the vicinity that an air movement is about to take place. All vessels will keep clear of the landing or taking off area as indicated by the positions of control launches. Any vessel having a red Aldis light signal U... directed at her will heave to or change course to avoid encroaching on the landing or taking off area. Vessels will be clear to proceed after the aircraft has taken off or landed and a green Verey cartridge has been fired from the control launch. A square red and yellow chequered flag will be flown from the flagstaff on the Evans Bay Yacht Club Building half an hour before landing or taking off of aircraft.

Warning: All persons are warned that no unauthorized vessel is permitted to go alongside or to moor to any aircraft or aircraft mooring buoy. All vessels must obey instructions from patrol boats when aircraft are due to arrive or take off.
