PURSUANT to section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act, 1945, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby vary the Proclamation made on the 24th day of March, 1950, and published in the Gazette on the 30th day of March, 1950, at page 329, declaring certain parts of New Zealand to be a tribal district for the purposes of the said Act, by excluding from the Schedule thereto the description of the Waipa Tribal District, and substituting therefor the description appearing in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

THE WAIPA TRIBAL DISTRICT

ALL that area in the South Auckland Land District bounded by a ALL that area in the South Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the boundary of the Otorohanga County as described in New Zealand Gazette of 1926 at page 1097, and a right line between Trig. Station T (Rock Peak) in Block I, Orahiri Survey District, and the south-western corner of Orahiri No. Ia Block in Block III, Orahiri Survey District; thence proceeding westerly and north-easterly generally along the said county boundary to Trig. Station Te Ake-o-Hikopiro in Block VI, Pirongia Survey District, and along a right line to Trig. Station Tahuanui in Block II, Pirongia Survey District; thence north-easterly along a right line to the southernmost corner of Section 204, Tuhikaramea Parish in Block XII, Alexandra Survey District; thence easterly along a right line to the southernmost corner of Section 112, Te Rapa Parish in Block VII, Hamilton Survey District, and its production to the middle of the Waikato River; thence south-easterly generally up the middle of that river to the western boundary of the Borough of Cambridge as described in New Zealand Gazette of 1886 at page 985; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly along the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of that borough to the middle of the Waikato River; thence south-easterly and southerly generally up the middle of that river to its confluence with the Waipapa Stream in Block XVI, Wharepapa Survey District; thence westerly along a right line to a point in the middle of the Mangatutu Stream A in line with the southern boundary of the eastern portion of Rangitoto A No. 278 Block in Block XIII, Wharepapa Survey District; thence north-westerly generally down the middle of the Mangatutu Stream and the middle of the Puniu River to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of the Puniu Parish; thence north-easterly to and along that boundary to the middle of the Mangaohoi Stream; thence north-westerly down the middle of that stream and the middle of the Mangapiko Stream to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Allotment 317, Mangapiko Parish, near the north-western corner of the Borough of Te Awamutu; thence westerly along a right line to the confluence of the Waipa and Puniu Rivers; thence southerly generally up the middle of the Waipa River, to and up the middle of the Mangapu Stream to its intersection with the south-eastern boundary of Pukeroa-Hangatiki No. 7c 2 Block in Block VIII, Orahiri Survey District; thence north-westerly along a right line to Te Puhi Trig. Station in Block III, Orahiri Survey District, and a right line to the south-western corner of Orahiri La Block; thence south-westerly along a right line in the direchiri IA Block; thence south-westerly along a right line in the direction of Trig. Station T (Rock Peak) to its intersection with the boundary of the Otorohanga County, the point of commencement.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1250, and shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1951.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1201,* is hereby revoked.
(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

"Packer" means a wholesaler who sells to another wholesaler honey packed in retail containers as aforesaid:
"Preducer" means a keeksaper whose exists is registered.

who sells to a wholesaler honey packed in retail containers as aforesaid:

"Producer" means a beekeeper whose apiary is registered pursuant to the Apiaries Act, 1927:

"Retail container" means a jar, carton, or tin supplied by the vendor of the honey and containing not more than 10 lb. net weight of honey:

"Standard case" means a case or other outer container containing in the aggregate approximately 60 lb. of honey packed in retail containers:

"Wholesale free delivery area" means any area within which any wholesaler normally undertakes the free delivery of goods to retailers.

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the said Act when used in this Order have the meanings severally assigned thereto by that Act, unless the context otherwise requires.

Act, unless the context otherwise requires.

4. For the purpose of this Order, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the said Act, any person who sells by retail to any one purchaser for delivery at any one time not less than two standard case lots of honey shall, in respect of the sale, be deemed to be a wholesaler, and the provisions of this Order as to maximum wholesale prices shall apply accordingly with respect to

every such sale.

5. The maximum prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES FOR HONEY SOLD IN RETAIL CONTAINERS

6. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause and of

9. If in respect of any honey the retail price charged in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

10. Subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any person concerned, may authorize special prices or margins of profit in respect of any honey to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by any producer, packer, wholesaler, or retailer.
