Notes on the Weather for June, 1951

General.—June was sunny but cold with light rainfalls. In general, it was a good month for stock, although in parts of the North Island the cessation of pasture growth resulted in some local shortages of cattle fodder. In the Hawke's Bay and Gisborne districts it has been an adversariant.

shortages of cattle fodder. In the Hawke's Bay and Gisborne districts it has been an adverse year for young sheep, and some further losses were reported during the past month.

In inland Canterbury, frozen ground further hindered the cultivation programme already delayed by an exceptionally wet autumn; near the coast it was still too wet for ploughing.

Rainfall.—Over most of the country rainfall was only about half the average. The deficiency was small, however, in Southland and near Banks Peninsula, while in the northern half of the Auckland Peninsula there was a slight surplus. Totals were exceptionally low in the Canterbury foothills and in parts of Westland.

Some minor flooding was reported from the far north on the 10th.

10th.

Temperatures.—With mean temperatures 3° to 4° F. below normal, Canterbury experienced the coldest June for at least forty years. Temperatures elsewhere were also below normal, mainly by about 2° F., though in the centre of the North Island and in the far north they were within 1° F. of the normal. For the country, as a whole, it was the coldest June since 1945.

Frosts were much more numerous and severe than is usual in carly winter. Eventionally low temperatures were recorded in

early winter. Exceptionally low temperatures were recorded in the early morning of the 30th. In spite of the prevailing coldness snowfalls were relatively light and were confined to the higher

country.

Sunshine.—It was a sunny month with totals generally at least equivalent to half an hour a day above normal. In Canterbury and Westland the surplus was, in places, better than an hour and a

half a day.

In Wellington City the sunshine total did not quite reach the average, but the Gisborne district was the only one reporting a

significant deficiency.

Weather Sequence. -At the beginning of the month anticyclones weather sequence.—At the beginning of the month anticyclones were centred over south-eastern Australia and south of New Zealand, while an extensive depression near the Chatham Islands moved slowly away eastwards. The weather was clear and frosty in the eastern half of the South Island, but cold and showery elsewhere. Any further clearance was delayed temporarily by the passage of a depression in the far south which resulted in more widespread shower activity on the 3rd and 4th,

Fine weather predominated from the 5th to the 9th as the anticyclone from the west moved centrally across the Dominion.

During the 9th easterlies freshend in the far north and rain developed there during the night. Next day, an occluded warm front preceded by a very extensive rain-band moved south-eastwards over the North Island. On the 11th the depression with which this frontal system was associated crossed Nelson and Marlborough, rain having extended to the northern half of the South Island. The warmer air which invaded the North Island was soon repelled by a cold front on the 12th cold front on the 12th.

An intense anticyclone brought clear, cold weather on the 13th, but it soon began to lose intensity. Barometers continued to fall steadily for several days with the approach of a large and complex disturbance from the Tasman Sea. An active cold front reached Southland on the night of the 14th, and then proceeded slowly northwards to become stationary near Cook Strait until the passage of a low-pressure centre across the North Island on the 18th. Another cell of the main disturbance, after lying stationary west of Southland for several days, crossed southern New Zealand on the 19th. Cold southerlies advanced northwards during the 20th and 21st, followed by heavy showers in the South Island and as far as East Cape. Next day a ridge of high pressure extended across the centre of the Dominion, but conditions remained very disturbed to the north and south. On the 22nd the centre of a deep depression passed close to North Cape causing widespread rains and strong easterly winds in Northland, and later to a lesser extent from Cook Strait to East Cape. Cloudy, showery weather also persisted on the Southland coast. On the 26th it become showery on the whole of the east coast while southerlies freshened again in the South Island ahead of a wedge advancing across the south Tasman Sea. At the same time rain set in over Northland and gradually spread southwards to the Waikato due to the passage of a depression across the north Tasman Sea. An intense anticyclone brought clear, cold weather on the 13th, the north Tasman Sea.

With rising barometers the weather began to improve generally on the 28th, although it continued rather showery on the east coast of the North Island and in the far south. Temperatures remained very cold and severe frosts were recorded in most districts. At the end of the month an intense anticyclone was centred over the North Island.

Price Order No. 1272 (Second-hand Sacks and Bags)

URSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:-

PRELIMINARY

- 1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1272, and shall come into force on the 27th day of July, 1951.
- 2. (1) In this Order-
- "Cleaned" in relation to sacks or bags, means that all the dirt and other foreign matter that is capable of being removed from the
- sack or bag by appropriate mechanical means has been so removed.

 "Repaired," in relation to sacks or bags, means that all holes, tears, and broken seams have been repaired in a way that restores the normal strength and utility of the sack or bag for the purpose of holding produce or other commodities for which it is to be used. "Sound," in relation to sacks or bags, means that the texture of the sack or bag is of sufficient strength to enable it to support its filled weight when lifted by means of a hook in the method normal to the handling of produce or other commodities.

 "Second-hand sack merchant" means any person who in the normal course of his business purchases empty sacks and bags, cleans or repairs them where necessary, and resells them to any person either for the purposes of resale by that person or for use by him in his business in his business.
- "Selling as a distributor," in relation to sacks or bags, means selling to any person who purchases for purposes of resale. "Selling as a reseller," in relation to sacks or bags, means selling to any person for purposes other than resale.
- (2) References in this Order to the class, description, grade, or type of any second-hand sacks or bags shall be deemed respectively to be references to the class, description, grade, or type of any such sacks or bags as set out in the Tables hereto:—

Grade A: Means sacks which have previously been used for grain only, on not more than one occasion, and which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, breaks, and similar defects and from discoloration.

Type 2.—Being sacks suitable for chaff, bran, or pollard.

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, sound (thoroughly brushed on both sides in the case of flour sacks), and free from discoloration and from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than minor breaks in the texture not exceeding two in number or 1 square inch in aggregate area; provided that no such break shall exceed 3 in. in length, and all breaks have been repaired.

Type 3.—Being sacks suitable for stock food or potatoes.

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than breaks in the texture and holes not exceeding three in number or 12 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such break or hole shall exceed 12 in. in length, and all breaks and holes have been repaired.

Type 4.—Being sacks suitable for coal, coke, or vegetables, other than potates or onions.

Grade A: Means used produce sacks which are suitable for holding coal, coke, vegetables, or other like commodities, and which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding six in number or 25 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall have a diameter exceeding 6 in. or a length exceeding 18 in., and all tears and holes have been repaired.

Grade B: Sacks of the above types shall be deemed to be Grade B if they comply with the requirements of Grade A of the respective

CLASS C-SUGAR-SACKS

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding six in number or 25 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall exceed respectively 18 in. in length or 6 in. in greatest diameter, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

Grade B: Sacks of the above types shall be deemed to be Grade B if they comply with the requirements of Grade A of the respective twoe except that they have not been cleaned.

CLASS D-CHAPMAN WHEAT-SACKS

Type 1.—Being sacks suitable for grain or fertilizer or meat-meal.

Grade A: Means sacks previously used for wheat which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, breaks, and similar defects and

from discoloration.

Type 2.—Being sacks suitable for lime, stock foods, or potatoes.

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, brushed, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding two in number or 2 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall exceed respectively 6 in. in length or greatest diameter, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

Being sacks suitable for coal, coke, or vegetables, other than potatoes or onions.

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding six in number or 25 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall exceed respectively 18 in. in length or 6 in. in greatest diameter, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

Grade B: Sacks of the above types shall be deemed to be Grade B if they comply with the requirements of Grade A of the respective type except that they have not been cleaned.

CLASS E-FERTILIZER SACKS

Type 1.—Being sacks suitable for meat-meal or reuse for fertilizer.

Grade A: Means sacks which are brushed, cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding two in number or 2 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall exceed 6 in. in length or greatest diameter respectively, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

e 2.—Being sacks suitable for lime, stock food, or potatoes.

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding three in number or 12 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall exceed 12 in. in length or greatest diameter respectively, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

Type 3.—Being sacks suitable for coal, coke, or vegetables, other than potatoes or onions

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding six in number or 25 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall have a diameter exceeding 6 in. or a length exceeding 18 in., and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

Grade B: Sacks of the above types shall be deemed to be Grade B if they comply with the requirements of Grade A of the respective types expected.

CLASS F-SUGAR-BAGS

Type 1.—Being once-shot sugar-bags.

Grade A: Means bags which are cleaned and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding three in number or 12 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no tear or hole shall exceed 12 in. in length, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

Grade B: Bags of type I shall be deemed to be Grade B if they comply with the requirements of Grade A of that type except that they have not been cleaned or repaired.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to all sales of empty second-hand sacks and bags of any of the classes, descriptions, grades, or types specified in the Schedule hereto.

FIXING MAXIMUM SELLING-PRICE OF SECOND-HAND SACKS AND BAGS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

- 4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any person for second-hand sacks or bags to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price in the Schedule hereto.
- (2) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any person selling as a distributor for any second-hand sacks or bags to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto reduced as follows:—

For sacks or bags in Classes A, B, C, D, and E ... For sacks or bags in Classes F and G ... By 11d, each. By 1d. each. . .

- (3) Where any person (other than a second-hand sack merchant) selling as a reseller incurs transport charges into his store with respect to any sacks or bags purchased by him, the maximum prices fixed in the Schedule hereto may be increased by a proportionate amount of such charges, being not more in any case than the charges that would have been incurred if delivery into the reseller's store had been effected by the holder of a goods-service licence under the Transport Act, 1949, at authorized rates.
- (4) The maximum prices fixed as aforesaid are fixed as for delivery by the vendor free-on-board or free-on-rail at the port or railway-station (as the case may be) that is nearest or most convenient of access to the vendor's premises.
- (5) Where any sacks or bags to which this Order applies are delivered by a vendor otherwise than free-on-board or free-on-rail as aforesaid, the maximum price that may be charged by the vendor shall be the maximum price fixed as aforesaid, increased by any transport charges incurred by the vendor in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of the transport charges that would have been incurred if he had delivered the sacks or bags free-on-board or free-on-rail as aforesaid.
- 5. Subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any person concerned, may authorize special prices or margins of profit in respect of any sacks or bags to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extra-ordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of sacks or bags or may relate generally to all sacks or bags to which this Order applies sold while the approval remains in force.

NOBEL PEACE PRICE

All proposals of candidates for the Noble Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1952, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified:

(a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Council of the International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University professors of Political Science and of Law, of History, and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, § 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may be referred to.

According to § 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, qualified persons are requested to apply to the Office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Oslo.
