A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Otago Electric-power District so as to include therein the areas described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

(a) All that area in the Otago Land District, being parts of the Taieri, Waihemu, Waikouaiti, and Maniototo Counties, bounded by a line commencing at the north-western corner of Block IV, Rock and Pillar Survey District; thence generally easterly along the northern boundaries of the said Block IV and Blocks IV and III, Highlay Survey District, and Block VIII, Waihemu Survey District, and Run 255 to the south-western boundary of Run 217c; thence generally south-easterly along the south-western boundaries of Runs 217c and 109 to the eastern boundary of Block III, Waihemu Survey District; thence south-westerly along that boundary to the Razorback Track; thence generally south-easterly along the north-eastern side of Razorback Track to the eastern boundary of Block XV, Moeraki Survey District; thence due south to Trig. K, Razorback; thence due west along the southern boundary of Block XV, Moeraki Survey District, to the south-eastern boundary of Section 20, Makareao Settlement; thence generally south-westerly along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 20 and 23, Makareao Settlement, to the middle of the Waihemu River; thence westerly along the middle of that river to and along the southern boundary of Block II, Dunback Survey District, to the eastern boundary of Section 29, Block IV, Dunback Survey District; thence southerly along that boundary to the Middlemarch-Dunback Main Highway; thence north-easterly along the north-western side of that highway to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 32, Block IV, aforesaid; thence south-easterly to and along that boundary and in a straight line through Trig. Q, Block IV, aforesaid to and across the Middlemarch-Dunback Main Highway; thence southerly along the eastern side of that highway to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Block VII, Moeraki Survey District; thence south-westerly to and along that boundary to the western boundary of Block VII aforesaid; thence due south to the northern point of Block I, Dunback Survey District; thence south-westerly, due west and due north along the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of Block VII, Dunback Survey District, to Stoneburn Road; thence generally north-westerly along the southern side of that road to the southern boundary of Block II, Highlay Survey District; thence generally westerly along the southern boundaries of Blocks II and I, Highlay Survey District, to the eastern boundary of Block II, Budle Survey District; thence due south along the eastern boundaries of Blocks II and V, Budle Survey District, and Blocks III and V, Hummock Survey District, to the southern boundary of the said Block V; thence generally westerly along the southern boundaries of Blocks V and II, Hummock Survey District, and Blocks XIII and XII, Strath Taieri Survey District, to the western boundary of Section 14, Block XII, aforesaid; thence northerly along the western boundaries of Sections 14 and 9, Block XII, and Section 13, Block X, Strath Taieri Survey District, to and across the Middlemarch-Dunback Main Highway; thence northerly in a straight line to Trig. K, Block X, aforesaid; thence northerly in a straight line to Trig. O, Block VI, Strath Taieri Survey District; thence north-easterly in a straight line to Trig. W on the eastern boundary of Block XI, Rock and Pillar Survey District; thence due east, due north, and again due east along the western and northern boundaries of Block XII, Rock and Pillar Survey District, to, and due north along the western boundary of Block V, Highlay Survey District, to the southern boundary of Block IV, Rock and Pillar Survey District; thence due west and due north along the southern and western boundaries of the said Block IV to the point of commencement.

As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 125, deposited in the office of the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department, and thereon bordered blue.

(b) All that area in the Otago Land District, being part of the Waihemu County bounded by a line commencing at the north-eastern corner of Block XII, Moeraki Survey District; thence due south along the eastern boundary of that block to the northern boundary of Block VI, Moeraki Survey District; thence due east along that boundary to the north-eastern corner of Block VI aforesaid; thence north-easterly and south-easterly along the northern side of a road bounding Section 31 and part Section 46, Block XI, Moeraki Survey District, to and across and southerly along the eastern side of the Horse Range Road to a closed road in Block IX, Moeraki Survey District; thence generally south-easterly along the eastern side of said closed road traversing the summit of the Horse Range to the southern boundary of Block IX aforesaid; thence due west along the southern boundaries of Blocks IX and VI aforesaid, to and across Switchback Road; thence northerly along the western side of Switchback Road to its junction with Munro Road; thence north-westerly along the south-western side of Munro Road to the western boundary of Block VI aforesaid; thence due north along the western boundaries of Blocks VI and XII aforesaid, to the southern boundary of Section 26, Makareao Settlement, Block XII, aforesaid; thence westerly and generally northerly along the southern and western boundaries of the said Section 26, to its most northern corner; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of Section 28, Makareao Settlement, Block XII, aforesaid, to the western boundary of Block XIV, Moeraki Survey District; thence due north along that boundary to Razorback Track; thence generally south-easterly over Razorback Range by the north-eastern side of Razorback Track to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 3, Block XIV, aforesaid; thence due south to and along the said boundary to the northern boundary of Block XII, Moeraki Survey District; thence due east along the northern boundary of Block XII aforesaid, to the point of commencement.

As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 121, deposited as aforesaid, and thereon bordered blue.

(c) All that area in the Otago Land District, being part of the Maniototo County bounded by a line commencing at Dansey Pass, being the north-eastern corner of Run 206b; thence generally south-easterly along the eastern boundaries of Runs 206b, 206d, 206e, and 203c to Kakanui Peak; thence generally south-westerly along the south-eastern and southern boundaries of Runs 203c and 203b to Swinburn Peak; thence due north and due west along the eastern and northern boundaries of Block VIII, Swinburn Survey District, to the eastern boundary of Block IV, Swinburn Survey District; thence due north and due west along the eastern and northern boundaries of the said Block IV to and north-westerly along the western boundary of Section 18, Block I, Swinburn Survey District, to and across Scotts Lane; thence north-easterly along the northern side of Scotts Lane to Pigroot Back Road; thence north-westerly along the southern side of that road and the southern boundary of Section 5, Block I, aforesaid, to the eastern bank of the Kyeburn; thence northerly along the eastern bank of the Kyeburn to a point in line with the southern boundary of Block XII, Kyeburn Survey District; thence due west across the Kyeburn and along the southern boundaries of Blocks XII and I, Kyeburn Survey District, to and across a road on the western boundary of Block I aforesaid; thence generally northerly and easterly along the western side of that road and the western and northern boundaries of the said Block I to the western boundary of Section 5, Block IV, Kyeburn Survey District; thence northerly and easterly along the western and northern boundaries of Section 5 aforesaid to Trig. B; thence by a straight line to the south-western corner of Section 33, Block V, Kyeburn Survey District; thence generally easterly along the southern boundaries of Section 33 and part 15 and its extension to the Kyeburn; thence generally north-easterly along the middle of the Kyeburn and the north-western boundary of Run 206b to Dansey Pass, the point of commencement.

As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 124, deposited as aforesaid, and thereon bordered blue.

(d) All that area in the Otago Land District, being part of the Maniototo County bounded by a line commencing at the north-eastern corner of Block X, Upper Taieri Survey District; thence due south along the eastern boundary of the said Block X to its south-eastern corner; thence due west along the southern boundary of Block X aforesaid to the eastern boundary of Block XIV, Upper Taieri Survey District; thence due south along that eastern boundary to the southern boundary of Block XIV aforesaid; thence due west along the southern boundaries of Blocks XIV and XIII, Upper Taieri Survey District, to and across the Waipiata-Styx Main Road; thence generally northerly along the western side of that main road to the middle of the Taieri River; thence south-easterly along the middle of the Taieri River to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section 24, Block X, aforesaid; thence north-easterly and northerly to and along the eastern boundaries of Sections 24, 1, and 20, Block X, aforesaid, to the southern corner of Section 9, Block VI, Upper Taieri Survey District; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of the said section 9 to a point in line due west of the north-eastern corner of Block X aforesaid; thence due east along that line to the point of commencement.

As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 123, deposited as aforesaid, and thereon bordered blue.

(e) All that area in the Otago Land District, being part of the Maniototo County bounded by a line commencing at the north-western corner of Block I, Rock and Pillar Survey District; thence due east along the northern boundary of the said Block I to Shepherds Hut Creek; thence generally south-easterly along the middle of that creek to the eastern boundary of Section 26, Block I, aforesaid; thence southerly along that boundary to and across

Gorge Road; thence generally south-westerly along the southern side of Gorge Road and the eastern boundaries of Sections 55 and 17 to the south-eastern corner of Section 17, Block I, aforesaid; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of Section 17 to Gorge Road; thence generally westerly along the southern side of Gorge Road to its junction at Hamilton with the Hamilton-Waipata Road; thence generally westerly along the southern side of the Patearoa-Hamilton Road to the western boundary of Block I aforesaid; thence due north along that boundary to the point of commencement.

As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 122, deposited as aforesaid, and thereon bordered blue.

(b) All that area in the Wellington Land District, being portion of the Featherston County, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the sea-coast in line with the western boundary of Section 1, Block VI, Onoke Survey District; thence to and along the western and northern boundaries of that section to the western boundary of Section 21, Western Lake District; thence northerly along the western boundaries of Sections 21, 32, 36, 40, 45, 51, 58, 59, and 60, Western Lake District, to the southern boundary of Section 104, Western Lake District; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly along the southern, western, and northern boundaries of Section 104 aforesaid to the western boundary of Section 60, Western Lake District aforesaid, thence northerly along the western boundaries of Sections 60, 71, 72, 73, and 74, Western Lake District, to the southern boundary of Section 99, Block I, Onoke Survey District; thence westerly along that southern boundary to the western boundary of Section 99 aforesaid; thence north-easterly generally along the north-western boundaries of Section 99 aforesaid and Section 100, Block V, Wairarapa Survey District, to the southern side of Cross Creek Road; thence easterly along the southern side of the said road to the eastern boundary of Section 107, Block V, Wairarapa Survey District; thence southerly along that eastern boundary and the eastern boundaries of Section 104, Block V, Wairarapa Survey District, and Section 81, Western Lake District, and the

production of the last-mentioned boundary to the shores of Lake Wairarapa; thence north-easterly, easterly, and southerly generally along the shores of Lake Wairarapa, the left bank of the Ruamahunga River, and the eastern shores of Onoke Lake, to the sea-coast at Palliser Bay; thence westerly generally along the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, and the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby authorize the Poverty Bay Electric-power Board (hereinafter with its successors and assigns referred to as the licensee), subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto; and, further, for the purposes of section 76 of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, subject to the said conditions, doth hereby authorize the licensee to construct the said electric works; and, further, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council dated the 1st day of November, 1926, and published in the *Gazette* on the 4th day of the same month at page 3123, authorizing the licensee to use electric lines.

#### CONDITIONS

##### 1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS

The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this licence except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

##### 2. LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

The licence hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and with all regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof respectively: Provided that the licensee shall not by virtue of this clause be required except in the normal course of alteration, repair, or maintenance, to reconstruct in conformity with the regulations hereinbefore mentioned any electric lines or works which conformed to the regulations in force at the time of the construction thereof.

##### 3. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

Bulk supply at a normal pressure of 11,000 volts between phases shall be received from the State Hydro-electric Department's substation at Patutahi, or from such other additional point or points of supply as may be mutually arranged between the Minister in Charge of the State Hydro-electric Department and the licensee.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (h) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The primary distribution voltages shall be 11,000 volts between phases, and 6,600 volts between phases. The system of supply described in paragraph (c) shall be direct current.

#### 4. DURATION OF LICENCE

This licence shall, unless sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 1st day of November, 1968.

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1275, and shall come into force on the 9th day of August, 1951.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1234\* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. In this Order the expression "case" or "case-lot" means a lot consisting of four dozen tins of any one kind of condensed milk to which this Order applies, as packed by the manufacturer in a case or other container.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies only with respect to condensed milk manufactured by New Zealand Products, Ltd., and marketed under the brands of "Highlander," "Nestles," and "Ideal."

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF CONDENSED MILK TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

*Manufacturer's Prices*

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum prices that may be charged or received by the manufacturer for any condensed milk to which this Order applies that is sold by the manufacturer to a wholesaler shall be—

- (b) By a discount of 2½ per cent. thereof where payment is made after seven days from the date of invoice but on or before the 20th day of the month following the month in which delivery is made to the wholesaler.

(3) In respect of deliveries in quantities of not less than six cases to wholesalers carrying on business at Auckland, Gisborne, Napier, Hastings, New Plymouth, Hawera, Wanganui, Palmerston North, Wellington, Blenheim, Nelson, Westport, Greymouth, Hokitika, Christchurch, Timaru, Oamaru, Dunedin, or Invercargill, the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are fixed as for delivery (in accordance with the provisions of subclause (5) hereof) to the wholesaler's store at his place of business, or, at the option of the wholesaler, at the local depot of a common carrier nominated in that behalf by the wholesaler.

(4) In respect of deliveries in quantities of not less than six cases to a wholesaler carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the cities or boroughs specified in the last preceding subclause, the maximum prices fixed by subclauses (1) and (2) hereof are fixed as for delivery (in accordance with the provisions of subclause (5) hereof) to the wholesaler's store or the depot of a common carrier in such one of the places specified in subclause (3) hereof as is nearest or most convenient of access to the wholesaler's place of business.

(5) The references in subclauses (3) and (4) hereof to the delivery of any goods to which this Order applies shall be deemed to be references to delivery by sea (where the place of delivery is at a port) and, in any other case, shall be deemed to be references to delivery by sea at the port nearest or most convenient of access to the place of delivery, and thence by rail to the place of delivery.

(6) Where any goods to which this Order applies are, by arrangement between the manufacturer and the wholesaler, delivered otherwise than in accordance with the last preceding subclause, the wholesaler shall be liable for the payment of any transport charges incurred in excess of the charges that would have been incurred if delivery had been effected in accordance with that subclause.

*Price Order No. 1276 (Solder and Wiping Metals Sold by Way of Wholesale or Retail)*

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1276, and shall come into force on the 9th day of August, 1951.

*APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER*

2. (1) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to the prices that may be charged by a manufacturer of solder or wiping metal whether sold by him to a wholesaler, a retailer, or a consumer.

(2) Except as provided in subclause (1) hereof, this Order applies with respect to all solder and wiping metal sold by way of wholesale or retail.

**FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES OF SOLDER AND WIPING METAL TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES**

*Wholesalers' Prices*

3. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any solder or wiping metal to which this Order applies shall be the amount paid by the wholesaler to the manufacturer for the solder or wiping metal increased by 5d. per pound.

(2) Where the premises of the wholesaler are situate elsewhere than at the place of manufacture of the solder or wiping metal the price fixed by subclause (1) hereof may be increased by the appropriate proportion of the freight charges incurred by the wholesaler in obtaining delivery into his store being not more in any case than the charges that would have been incurred if delivery had been effected by the holder of a goods service licence under the Transport Act, 1949, at authorized rates.

(3) Where solder or wiping metal is purchased by a wholesaler from another wholesaler the maximum price that may be charged by the purchasing wholesaler for the solder or wiping metal shall not exceed the amount that could have been charged if the solder or wiping metal had been purchased by the purchasing wholesaler from a manufacturer.

*Retailers' Prices*

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any solder or wiping metal to which this Order applies bought from a wholesaler shall be the amount paid by the retailer to the wholesaler for the solder or wiping metal increased by 7d. per pound.

(2) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any solder or wiping metal to which this Order applies bought from a manufacturer shall be the amount paid by the retailer to the manufacturer for the solder or wiping metal increased by 1s. per pound.

(3) Where freight charges are incurred by a retailer in obtaining delivery into his store of any solder or wiping metal to which this Order applies the appropriate price fixed by this clause may be increased by the appropriate proportion of the freight charges being not more in any case than the charges that would have been incurred if delivery had been effected by the holder of a goods service licence under the Transport Act, 1949, at authorized rates.

(4) Where solder or wiping metal is purchased by a retailer from another retailer the maximum price that may be charged by the purchasing retailer for the solder or wiping metal shall not exceed the amount that could have been charged if the solder or wiping metal had been purchased by the purchasing retailer from a wholesaler.

*Reduced Price for Lots of 7 lb. or More*

(5) Where the weight of any lot of solder or wiping metal sold by a retailer is 7 lb. or more the maximum retail price fixed by the preceding provisions of this clause shall be reduced by 3d. for each pound of the lot sold.

5. If in respect of any solder or wiping metal sold by a wholesaler or retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of this Order is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

**SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED**

6. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any solder or wiping metal to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of solder or wiping metal or may relate generally to all solder or wiping metal to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

## Price Order No. 1277 (Phosphatic Fertilizers)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1277, and shall come into force on the 9th day of August, 1951.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1214\* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

## APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) Subject to the next succeeding subclause, this Order applies with respect to phosphatic fertilizers of the following kinds manufactured in New Zealand and sold for use in New Zealand:—

- (a) Superphosphate of the grade commercially known as 44/46 (existing stocks);
- (b) Serpentine superphosphate comprising 15 cwt. of 44/46 grade superphosphate and 5 cwt. of ground serpentine rock;
- (c) Superphosphate compound comprising 15 cwt. of 44/46 grade superphosphate, 2 cwt. of ground serpentine rock, and 3 cwt. of finely ground phosphatic rock;
- (d) Reverted superphosphate comprising 15 cwt. of 44/46 grade superphosphate and 5 cwt. of carbonate of lime.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to any phosphatic fertilizers sold in a quantity of less than one ton.

## FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF PHOSPHATIC FERTILIZERS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) The prices for phosphatic fertilizers fixed by this Order are fixed in respect of sales of the following classes, namely:—

- (a) Sales to a user—that is to say, to a person purchasing for his own use and not for the purpose of resale;
- (b) Sales to a storekeeper—that is to say, to a person (not being a merchant, dairy company, or farmers' organization as hereinafter mentioned), purchasing solely for resale to users;
- (c) Sales to a merchant—that is to say, to a person purchasing for resale to storekeepers or to users;
- (d) Sales to a dairy company, as defined in section 2 of the Dairy Industry Act, 1908, purchasing solely for resale to persons being suppliers of milk or cream to the company;
- (e) Sales to an incorporated farmers' organization, having a retail department conducted on a co-operative basis, and purchasing phosphatic fertilizers solely for the purpose of resale to its members.

(2) The prices for phosphatic fertilizers fixed by this Order are fixed in respect of sales for cash or for credit until a date not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month of delivery.

(3) Where any sale is made on terms allowing credit for a longer period than that mentioned in the last preceding subclause, the purchaser shall be entitled, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the contract of sale, to the benefit of the prices fixed by this Order if in fact payment is made not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month of delivery.

(4) The prices fixed by this Order include the price of the containers.

5. (1) Where any phosphatic fertilizers manufactured in the South Island are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at Burnside, Hornby, or Ravensbourne, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the First Schedule hereto.
