Price Order No. 1301 (Woolpacks)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1301, and shall come into force on the 19th day of October 1951.
 - 2. (1) Price Order No. 1188* is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Price Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies only with respect to sales by way of retail of 42 in. woolpacks.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF WOOLPACKS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

- 4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any woolpacks to which this Order applies shall be:—
 - (a) For woolpacks sold by a retailer carrying on business at one of the ports of Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, or Dunedin: 18s. 9d. each.
 - (b) For woolpacks sold by a retailer carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the ports mentioned in paragraph (a) hereof: 18s. 9d. each, increased by the appropriate proportion of the freight charges incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery from such one of the said ports as is most convenient of access to his store:

 Provided that where any woolpacks to which this paragraph applies are obtained by the retailer elsewhere than from such one of the said ports as is most convenient.

paragraph applies are obtained by the retailer elsewhere than from such one of the said ports as is most convenient of access to his store, the increase authorized by this paragraph shall not exceed the appropriate proportion of the freight charges that would have been incurred by the retailer if the woolpacks had been obtained from that port and if delivery had been effected at current freight rates.

- (2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are fixed as for delivery f.o.r. or f.o.b. as the case may require.
- (3) Where any woolpacks are delivered by a retailer otherwise than f.or. or f.o.b. the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause increased by the amount of the freight charges incurred by him in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of those charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the woolpacks f.o.r. or f.o.b. as aforesaid.
- (4) Any freight charges imposed by a retailer pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be shown separately on the appropriate invoice.
- 5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorize special maximum retail prices in respect of any woolpacks to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or, for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of woolpacks or may relate generally to all woolpacks to which this Order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

Price Order No. 1300 (Second-hand Sacks and Bags)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

 This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1300, and shall come into force on the 19th day of October 1951.
 (1) Price Order No. 1272* is hereby revoked.
 (2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order-

"Cleaned" in relation to sacks or bags, means that all the dirt and other foreign matter that is capable of being removed from the

"Cleaned" in relation to sacks or bags, means that all the dirt and other foreign matter that is capable of being removed from the sack or bag by appropriate mechanical means has been so removed.

"Repaired," in relation to sacks or bags, means that all holes, tears, and broken seams have been repaired in a way that restores the normal strength and utility of the sack or bag for the purpose of holding produce or other commodities for which it is to be used. "Sound," in relation to sacks or bags, means that the texture of the sack or bag is of sufficient strength to enable it to support its filled weight when lifted by means of a hook in the method normal to the handling of produce or other commodities.

"Second-hand sack merchant" means any person who in the normal course of his business purchases empty sacks and bags, cleans or repairs them where necessary, and resells them to any person either for the purposes of resale by that person or for use by him in his business

in his business.

"Selling as a distributor," in relation to sacks or bags, means selling to any person who purchases for purposes of resale. "Selling as a reseller," in relation to sacks or bags, means selling to any person for purposes other than resale.

(2) References in this Order to the class, description, grade, or type of any second-hand sacks or bags shall be deemed respectively to be references to the class, description, grade, or type of any such sacks or bags as set out in the Tables hereto:—

Type 3.—Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than breaks in the texture and holes not exceeding three in number or 12 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such break or hole shall exceed

and holes not exceeding three in number or 12 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such break or hole shall exceed 12 in. in length, and all breaks and holes have been repaired.

Type 4.—Grade A: Means used produce sacks which are suitable for holding coal, coke, vegetables, or other like commodities, and which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding six in number or 25 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall have a diameter exceeding 6 in. or a length exceeding 18 in., and all tears and holes have been repaired.

Type 1.—Being sacks suitable for grain or potatoes.

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, sound, and free from discoloration and from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding two in number or 2 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall exceed respectively 6 in. in length or greatest diameter, and all such tears or holes have been repaired.

Type 2.—Being sacks suitable for coal, coke, or vegetables, other than potatoes or onions.

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding six in number or 25 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall exceed respectively 18 in. in length or 6 in. in greatest diameter, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

Class D—Chapman Sacks

Type 1.—Being sacks suitable for grain or fertilizer.

Grade A: Means sacks previously used for wheat which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, breaks, and similar defects and are not badly discoloured.

are not badly discoloured.

Type 2.—Being sacks suitable for lime or potatoes.

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, brushed, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding two in number or 2 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall exceed respectively 6 in. in length or greatest diameter, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

Type 3.—Being sacks suitable for coal, coke, or vegetables, other than potatoes or onions.

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding six in number or 25 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall exceed respectively 18 in. in length or 6 in. in greatest diameter, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

Class E-Fertilizer Sacks

-Being sacks suitable for fertilizer or potatoes.

Grade A: Means sacks which are brushed, cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not exceeding two in number or 2 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall exceed 6 in. in length or greatest diameter respectively, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

-Being sacks suitable for lime, coal, coke, or vegetables, other than potatoes or onions. Type 2.-

Grade A: Means sacks which are cleaned, sound, and free from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than tears and holes not ceeding six in number or 25 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such tear or hole shall have a diameter exceeding 6 in. or a length exceeding 18 in,, and all such tears and holes have been repaired.

Type 1.—Being once-shot sugar-bags.

Grade A: Means bags used previously for sugar only, and on not more than one occasion, which are cleaned, sound, and free from discoloration and from holes, tears, and similar defects, other than minor breaks in the texture not exceeding two in number or 2 square inches in aggregate area; provided that no such break shall exceed 3 in. in length, and all such breaks have been repaired.

Type 2.—Being other sugar-bags.

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

- (1) This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1299.
 (2) This Order shall come into force on the 19th day of October 1951.
 (3) This Order No. 1289* is hereby revoked.
 (4) The revocation of the said Price Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.
 - 3. In this Order:-

The expressions "the Auckland Sugar District" and "the Sugar Free Delivery Area" mean respectively the district and area recognized by the sugar trade at the time of the coming into force of this Order as the Auckland Sugar District or the Sugar Free Delivery Area, as the case may be:

The expression "the Central Sugar District" means the North Island of New Zealand other than the Auckland Sugar District: The expression "the Southern Sugar District" means the South Island of New Zealand.

4. (1) While this Order remains in force a manufacturer shall continue, as heretofore, to deliver golden syrup and treacle manufactured by him-

- (a) Free of transport charges within the Sugar Free Delivery Area:
 (b) F.o.b. Auckland or f.o.r. Auckland (in the case of golden syrup or treacle for delivery in the Auckland Sugar District elsewhere than in the Sugar Free Delivery Area):
 (c) F.o.b. Auckland (in the case of golden syrup or treacle for delivery in the Central Sugar District or the Southern Sugar District).
- (2) The last preceding subclause shall not apply except in respect of the delivery by a manufacturer of—

(a) Lots of ½ ton or more of golden syrup or treacle; or
 (b) Lots of ½ ton or more consisting partly of golden syrup or treacle and partly of sugar.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

5. This Order applies with respect to all golden syrup and treacle sold by way of wholesale or retail in New Zealand.

Distributors' Prices

- 6. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum net price that may be charged by a distributor for any sugar to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are fixed with respect to sugar sold in lots of a half-ton or more, and to sugar, irrespective of its weight, sold together with golden syrup or treacle where the total weight of the consignment of sugar and golden syrup or treacle is a half-ton or more.

(3) (a) Where the sugar is for delivery within the Sugar Free Delivery Area the maximum prices fixed by this clause are fixed free of all transport charges.

(b) Where the sugar is for delivery otherwise than within the Sugar Free Delivery Area the maximum prices fixed by this clause are fixed on the basis of f.o.r. or f.o.b. 9. Except with respect to sugar sold by a retail storekeeper, nothing contained in this Order shall be deemed to forbid the making or carrying out of a contract for the sale of any sugar to which this Order applies at a price exceeding the appropriate price fixed by this Order, provided such sale is made subject to the condition that if payment is made by prompt cash in accordance with the customary usage of the trade in the place of delivery the price shall be reduced to the appropriate price fixed by this Order.
