Price Order No. 1344 (Amendment No. 1 of Price Order No. 1333) (Barley)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1344, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 1333* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 14th day of February 1952.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By omitting subclause (1) of clause 10 and substituting the following subclause:—

“(1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any grower for any barley to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows:—

“When grown in the South Island: 7s. 7d. per bushel f.o.r.s.e. the grower's station.

“When grown in the North Island: 8s. 7d. per bushel f.o.r.s.e. the grower's station.”
