PURSUANT to section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945 I, Bernard Cyril, Baron Freyberg, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby revoke the Proclamation made on the 10th day of July 1947, and published in the *Gazette* on the 17th day of July 1947, at page 872 proclaiming the Takitimu Tribal District and the Proclamation made on the 24th day of March 1950, and published in the *Gazette* on the 30th day of March 1950, at page 330, varying the first mentioned Proclamation.

*Proclaiming a Tribal District Under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945*

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, I, Bernard Cyril, Baron Freyberg, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby declare the parts of New Zealand described in the Schedule hereto to be a tribal district for the purposes of the said Act, and hereby assign to the said district, the name "Takitimu Tribal District."

SCHEDULE

TAKITIMU TRIBAL DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Gisborne Land District, being Part Waiapu County, Waikohu County, Uawa County, and Part Cook County, bounded by a line commencing at Paritu, being a point on the sea coast in Block XIII, Paritu Survey District; thence north-westerly along a right line in the direction of the junction of the Hangaroa and Ruakituri Rivers to the middle of the Mangarangi Stream; thence northerly up the middle of that stream to the northernmost corner of Mangapoike No. 2D Block, in Block IV, Opoiti Survey District and a right line to the north-western corner of Whakaongaonga 2c 2 Block; thence north-westerly, northerly, and north-easterly generally along the generally eastern side of the road forming the south-western boundaries of Sections 46, 45, 44, 51, again 44, and 48 all of Block XVI, Hangaroa Survey District, the western boundaries of Section 3, Block XIII of that Survey District, Section 1, part 5, 6, 10, 8, part 3, part 2, the southern boundary of part Section 21, all of Block VIII, Hangaroa Survey District, and the south-eastern boundary of part Hangaroa Matawai No. 2c; thence south-westerly along the north-western side of the road forming the north-western boundary of Hangaroa Village, and the production of that side to the middle of the Hangaroa

River; thence down the middle of that river to a point in line with the generally northern side of the Gisborne Waikaremoana Road; thence south-westerly along a right line to the northern side of that road; thence westerly generally along the northern side of that road to the middle of the Kawaimango Stream in Block I, Hangaroa Survey District; thence south-westerly up the middle of that stream to the eastern boundary of Lot 21 of Tahora 2F, Section 2 Block; thence northerly along that boundary and the eastern boundary of Lot 24 of Tahora 2c 1 Section 3 Block; thence westerly generally along the northern boundary of that Block, the northern boundary of Lot 23 of Tahora 2c 1 Section 3 Block; thence north-westerly and southerly along the north-eastern and western boundaries of Lot 18 of Tahora 2F, Section 2 Block, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to its intersection with a right line between Trig. Stations Puketapu and Maungapohatu; thence north-westerly along that right line to Trig. Station Maungapohatu; thence north-easterly along a right line in the direction of Maungatapere Trig. Station to its intersection with the western boundary of Tahora Block; thence northerly along that boundary to a point in line with the northern boundary of Small Grazing-run 89; thence to and along that boundary, the northern boundaries of Small Grazing-run 90, Sections 2 and 3, Block XII, Moanui Survey District, Sections 4, 1, and 2, Block IX, Motu Survey District, and Section 2, Block V, Motu Survey District, to Pokaikiri Trig. Station; thence along a right line to Trig. Station 149A; thence easterly generally along the southern boundary of Whakapau-pakahi No. 2 Block to and down the middle of the Whakapau-pakahi Stream to its confluence with the Motu River in Block II, Motu Survey District; thence north-easterly generally down the middle of the Motu River to a point on the production of a right line between Trig. Station Tuanui-o-te-kahakaha in Block X, Arowhana Survey District, and Trig. Station 140 (Pungarehu) in Block II, Ngateretere Survey District; thence north-easterly to and along the said right line to Trig. Station Tuanui-o-te-kahakaha and along a right line to Trig. Station Arowhana in Block IV, Arowhana Survey District; thence northerly along a right line in the direction of Kapua Trig. Station in Block V, Hikurangi Survey District, to the western boundary of Huiarau No. 3 Block; thence southerly along the said western boundary of Huiarau No. 3 Block to the westernmost corner of Huiarau No. 1 Block; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundaries of Huiarau No. 1 Block, Small Grazing-run 98 and Section 1, all of Block V, Tutamoi Survey District, and Section 1, Block VI, Tutamoi Survey District; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundaries of the last-mentioned Section 1, Section 2, Block V aforesaid and Sections 2 and 1, Block IX, Tutamoi Survey District, to the southern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence southerly, south-easterly, and south-westerly along the generally eastern boundaries of Waipaoa No. 2 Block to the northern corner of Waipaoa No. 3B Block; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of that block and its production to the middle of the Waingaromia River; thence south-westerly generally down the middle of that river to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Lot 11 on the plan numbered 1696 deposited as aforesaid; thence to and along that boundary and the north-eastern boundary of Lot 3 on the said plan numbered 1696 and its production to the middle of Waiapu Inland Road; thence north-easterly generally along the middle of that road to the middle of a public road; thence southerly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the

north-eastern boundary of Lot 1 of Small Grazing-run 43A; thence south-easterly and south-westerly to and along that boundary and the south-eastern boundary of the said Lot 1 and its production to the middle of a public road; thence south-easterly and south-westerly generally along the middle of that road to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 1, Block XV, Waingaromia Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and the north-eastern boundary of Section 2, Block XVI, Waingaromia Survey District, to the middle of the Mangarara Stream; thence easterly down the middle of that stream to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Waimata North No. 1A 2 Block; thence south-easterly to and along that boundary, the north-eastern boundary of Section 3, Block XVI, Waingaromia Survey District, and the generally north-eastern boundaries of Lot 2 on the plan numbered 2620 deposited as aforesaid; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundary of Section 2, Block XIII, Uawa Survey District, and its production to the middle of the Pakarae River; thence easterly and southerly generally down the middle of that river to a point in line with the northern boundary of Pakarae No. 1D Block; thence easterly and south-easterly to and along that boundary and the northern and north-eastern boundaries of Pakarae 1A Block to the sea coast; thence southerly generally along the sea coast to Paritu the point of commencement, and including all adjacent islands.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

8. The Board shall have prepared and submitted at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the 31st day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve and the building erected thereon for the purposes of a public hall, and shall also afford settlers and residents of Hina Hina and the surrounding district such facilities for meeting within the said hall as may from time to time be determined by the Board; provided that the Board shall have power to fix reasonable charges for the use of the said hall.

*Declaring Parts of a Tribal District to be Tribal Committee Areas Under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945*

**P**URSUANT to section 14 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, I, Ernest Bowyer Corbett, Minister of Maori Affairs, hereby declare the parts of the Tribal District described in the Schedule hereto to be tribal committee areas for the purposes of the said Act, and hereby assign to each of the several areas the name appearing at the head of the description of each such area.

**SCHEDULE**

**TAKITIMU TRIBAL DISTRICT**

*Whangara Tribal Committee Area*

ALL that area bounded by a line commencing at a point on the sea-coast in Block XI, Whangara Survey District being the north-eastern corner of the Pakarae No. 1A Block; thence south-westerly generally along the sea-coast to the mouth of the Turanganui River; thence north-easterly and northerly generally up the middle of that river and the middle of the Waimata River to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section 7, Block VII, Waimata Survey District; thence along a right line in the direction of the south-eastern corner of Section 7 aforesaid to the middle of the road forming the southern boundary of that section; thence northerly generally along the middle of the road, passing through part Section 7, and forming the eastern boundaries generally of Sections 8, 9, 6, 2, 1, and 5 all of Block VII aforesaid, passing through Small Grazing-run 60 and Section 3, Block III, Waimata Survey District, and Section 1, Block XV, Waingaromia Survey District, to a point in line with the northern boundary of that section, being a point on the south-western boundary of the Hauiti Tribal Committee Areas; thence south-easterly generally along the south-western boundary of that area to the north-eastern corner of the Pakarae No. 1A Block, being the point of commencement, and including Whangara and Tuamotu Islands.

*Turanganui Tribal Committee Area*

All that area bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Turanganui River; thence proceeding westerly along the sea-coast to a point in line with the north-eastern side of the public road forming the south-western boundary of the public abattoir site (*New Zealand Gazette*, 1902, page 670); thence north-westerly to and along that public road to the middle of Awapuni Road; thence northerly along a right line to the southernmost corner of Section 48, Block II, Turanganui Survey District; thence north-easterly along the north-western side of Cameron Street to the easternmost corner of Section 51, Block II, aforesaid; thence easterly along a right line to a point in the middle of the Waimata River on the production of the south-western boundary of Section 16, Block IV, Turanganui Survey District; thence south-westerly generally down the middle of that river and the middle of the Turanganui River to its mouth, being the point of commencement.

*Tarere Tribal Committee Area*

All that area bounded by a line commencing at a point on the sea-coast in line with the north-eastern side of the public road forming the south-western boundary of the public abattoir site (*New Zealand Gazette*, 1902, page 670); thence south-westerly along the sea-coast and a line to the middle of the mouth of the Waipaoa River; thence northerly generally up the middle of that river to a point opposite the north-western corner of Section 18, Block I, Waimata Survey District; thence easterly generally along the northern boundaries of that section to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence south-easterly to and along the south-western side of the Opotiki-Gisborne Main Highway to a point in line with the northern side of Harper's Road; thence north-easterly along that road and across the Back Ormond Road; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern side of that road to the north-western side of the Waimata Valley Road; thence north-easterly along that road to the easternmost corner of Lot 2 on the plan numbered 2401, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Gisborne; thence easterly and northerly generally along the middle of the road passing through Lot 11 on the plan numbered 804, deposited as aforesaid, and between the said Lot 11 and Lot 6 on the aforesaid plan to a point in the middle of the Waimata River; thence southerly generally down the middle of that river to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 16, Block IV, Turanganui Survey

District, being a point on the boundary of the Turanganui Tribe Committee Area hereinbefore described; thence westerly and southerly generally along the northern and western boundaries of that area to a point on the sea-coast in line with the north-eastern side of the public road forming the south-western boundary of the public abattoir site aforesaid, being the point of commencement

*Parihimanuhi Tribal Committee Area*

All that area bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of the Waipaoa River opposite the north-western corner of Section 18, Block I, Waimata Survey District; thence northerly generally up the middle of that river and the Mangataikehu Stream to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Ahirau No. 21 Block; thence north-easterly to and along that boundary and the south-eastern boundaries of Ahirau Nos. 2c, 2f, and 2g Blocks and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of the Mangarueke Stream; thence easterly generally up the middle of that stream to the south-eastern boundary of Papakoroko No. 4 Block; thence north-easterly along that boundary and the south-eastern boundary of the Papakoroko No. 6 Block; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundary of the Waihora No. 2e No. 1 Block to its southernmost corner; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that block and of the Waihora No. 2e No. 2 Block to the southern boundary of Small Grazing-run 44a; thence easterly along that boundary to the middle of the Hinekiwawahia Stream; thence northerly generally down the middle of that stream and the Kaitangata Stream, to and along the south-eastern boundary of Small Grazing-run 45; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of Lot 2 of Small Grazing-run 43a and its production to the middle of a public road, being a point on the western boundary of the Hauiti Tribal Committee Area hereinbefore described; thence southerly generally along that boundary, to and along the western boundary of the Whangara Tribal Committee Area hereinbefore described, to and along the northern boundary of the Tarere Tribal Committee Area hereinbefore described to a point in the middle of the Waipaoa River opposite the north-western corner of Section 18, Block I, Waimata Survey District, being the point of commencement.
