PURSUANT to the Electric-power Boards Act 1925, I, Bernard Cyril, Baron Freyberg, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby alter the boundaries of the Otago Electric-power District so as to include therein the area described in the Schedule hereto.

The Rabbit Skins Levy Fixation Order 1952 (Notice No. Ag. 5247)

PURSUANT to section 13 of the Rabbit Nuisance Amendment Act 1947, and having regard to the recommendations of the Rabbit Destruction Council, the Minister of Agriculture hereby makes the following Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Rabbit Skins Levy Fixation Order 1952.

The rate of the levy to be charged for the purposes of the Rabbit Nuisance Amendment Act 1947, in accordance with that Act and the said regulations, on rabbit skins of whatever class produced and sold in New Zealand shall be 200 per centum of the price paid or payable by the purchaser of the skins in respect of every sale made or effected during the period commencing on the 1st day of June 1952, and ending on the 31st day of May 1953, both days inclusive, by a broker by auction or by a rural vendor directly to a wholesale trader as respectively defined in the said regulations.

"(2) Every other person who has attained the age of twenty-five years shall be entitled to be registered under this Act, if he satisfies the Board that he is of good character and reputation and—

"(a) That he holds a recognized certificate as defined in the next succeeding subsection and has had not less than three years' practical experience in New Zealand in the valuing of land within the ten years immediately preceding the making of his

application; or

"(b) That he has passed an examination or examinations approved by the Board and has had not less than three years' practical experience in New Zealand in the valuing of land within the ten years immediately preceding the making of his application:

experience in New Zealand in the valuing of land within the ten years immediately preceding the making of his application:

"Provided that the Board shall permit the registration of any other person who has attained the age of twenty-five years and who makes application for registration within one year after the commencement of this Act, and who satisfies the Board that he is of good character and reputation, that he has had three years' practical experience in New Zealand in the valuing of land within the ten years immediately preceding the making of his application, and is a fit and proper person to be registered as a valuer.

"(3) For the purpose of this subsection the term 'a recognized certificate' means a certificate, diploma, degree, or licence granted by a university, college, board, or other authority (whether in New Zealand or elsewhere) and recognized by the Board as furnishing sufficient evidence of the possession by the holder thereof of the requisite knowledge of land valuing."
