#### Price Order No. 1388 (Wholesale Groceries and Other Goods)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1388, and shall come into force on the 4th day of July 1952.
2. (1) Price Orders Nos. 920\*, 946†, and 1044‡ are hereby revoked.
(2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,-

"Basic wholesale cost", in relation to any goods, means the actual price paid or payable by a wholesaler for the goods increased by the amount of any disbursements, exclusive of sales tax, actually incurred by the wholesaler in respect of the goods and decreased by any amount that may be receivable by the wholesaler in respect of the return of containers in which the goods are packed:

are packed:

"Bulk container", in relation to any lot of goods, means the container in which the goods were received by the wholesaler:

"Retailer" means a person who buys goods from a wholesaler for the purpose of selling those goods, whether in the form purchased or otherwise, to consumers:

"Wholesaler" means a person who sells goods to a retailer.

(2) The basic wholesale cost shall be calculated in respect of such quantity of goods as is indicated in relation to the goods in the

second column of the First Schedule hereto.

#### APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies with respect to the goods specified in the First Schedule hereto that are not for the time being the subject of a Price Order (other than this Order) fixing the wholesale price of the goods, or in respect of which an authorized wholesale selling-price is not for the time being fixed by the Tribunal, and which are sold by a wholesaler to a retailer.

5. Every wholesaler to whom this Order applies shall, before selling any goods to which this Order applies, forward to the Director of Price Control a return in respect of the goods in the form in the Second Schedule hereto:

Provided that where a wholesaler has furnished a return under this clause in respect of any goods he shall not be obliged unless specially requested to do so by the Director, to furnish a return in respect of other goods of the same kind unless:

(a) Whe having the levels agent of the other goods is then the basic wholesale cost of the goods to which the return already made

(a) The basic wholesale cost of the other goods is less than the basic wholesale cost of the goods to which the return already made

relates; or

(b) The basic wholesale cost of the other goods is more than the basic wholesale cost of the goods in respect of which the return already made relates and the wholesaler proposes to charge more for such other goods.

#### FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICES OF GOODS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

6 (1) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the maximum price that may be charged or received by a wholesaler for any goods to which this Order applies shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:—

(a) The basic wholesale cost:

(b) The maximum percentage of the basic wholesale cost specified in relation to the goods in the First Schedule hereto:
(c) Where indicated in the fourth column of the First Schedule hereto, the premium set out in that column in respect of goods

supplied in amounts less than bulk container lots:

(d) The amount of any discount customarily allowed by the wholesaler for payment before a specified date calculated in relation to the total of the items specified in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) hereof:

(e) The amount of any sales tax paid by the wholesaler in respect of the goods.

(2) If the maximum price calculated in accordance with this clause for any goods to which this Order applies is not an exact number of

farthings the maximum price calculated in accordance with this clause for any goods to which this Order applies is not an exact number of farthings the maximum price may be calculated to the next upward farthing.

7. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any goods to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of goods or may relate generally to all goods to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler while the approval remains in force.

#### Price Order No. 1390 (Phosphatic Fertilizers)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited at Price Order No. 1390, and shall come into force on the 3rd day of July 1952.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1277\* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before

the coming into force of this Order.

#### APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) Subject to the next succeeding subclause, this Order applies with respect to phosphatic fertilizers of the following kinds manufactured or prepared in New Zealand and sold for use in New Zealand:—

(a) Superphosphate:

(a) Superphosphate:
(b) Serpentine superphosphate comprising 15 cwt. of superphosphate and 5 cwt. of ground serpentine rock per ton:
(c) Superphosphate compound comprising 15 cwt. of superphosphate, 2 cwt. of ground serpentine rock or limestone, and 3 cwt. of finely ground Nauru or Ocean Island rock phosphate per ton:
(d) Reverted superphosphate comprising 15 cwt. of superphosphate and 5 cwt. of carbonate of lime per ton:
(e) Super Nauru compound comprising 15 cwt. of superphosphate and 5 cwt. of Nauru or Ocean Island rock phosphate per ton:
(f) Finely ground Nauru or Ocean Island rock phosphate.
(e) Nathing in this Order shell apply with respect to any phosphatic fertilizers sold in a quantity of less than one ton.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to any phosphatic fertilizers sold in a quantity of less than one ton.

#### FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF PHOSPHATIC FERTILIZERS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) The prices for phosphatic fertilizers fixed by this Order are fixed in respect of sales of the following classes, namely:—
(a) Sales to a user—that is to say, to a person purchasing for his own use and not for the purpose of resale:
(b) Sales to a storekeeper—that is to say, to a person (not being a merchant, dairy company, or farmer's organization as hereinafter mentioned), purchasing solely for resale to users:
(c) Sales to a merchant—that is to say, to a person purchasing for resale to storekeepers or to users:
(d) Sales to a dairy company, as defined in section 2 of the Dairy Industry Act 1908, purchasing solely for resale to persons being suppliers of milk or cream to the company:
(e) Sales to an incorporated farmers' organization, having a retail department conducted on a co-operative basis and purchasing

(a) Sales to a dary company, as demied in section 2 of the Darry Industry Act 1906, purchasing solely for resale to persons being suppliers of milk or cream to the company:

(e) Sales to an incorporated farmers' organization, having a retail department conducted on a co-operative basis, and purchasing phosphatic fertilizers sixed by this Order are fixed in respect of sales for cash or for credit until a date not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month of delivery.

(3) Where any sale is made on terms allowing credit for a longer period than that mentioned in the last preceding subclause, the purchaser shall be entitled, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the contract of sale, to the benefit of the prices fixed by this Order if in fact payment is made not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month of delivery.

(4) The prices fixed by this Order include the price of the containers.

5. (1) Where any phosphatic fertilizers manufactured in the South Island are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at Burnside, Hornby, or Ravensbourne, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Where any phosphatic fertilizers manufactured in the North Island are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at Aramoho, Otahuhu, Smart Road (New Plymouth), Te Papapa, or Westfield, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

(3) Where any phosphatic fertilizers are sold for delivery elsewhere than at one of the places mentioned in subclauses (1) and (2) of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price fixed in the First or Second Schedule hereto, whichever is appropriate, increased by the amount of the freight charges between the place of manufacture and the place of delivery: Provided that the amount added to the price in respect of freight charges shall not in any ca

delivery.

(4) In every invoice, debit-note, or similar document issued by a vendor to a user in respect of the sale of any phosphatic fertilizers there shall be shown separately—

(a) The price of the phosphatic fertilizers fixed in accordance with this Order; and

(b) The additional amount (if any) payable by the purchaser in respect of freight charges.

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price

Order:

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1389, and shall come into force on the 4th day of July 1952.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1331\* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Price Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

# APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) This Order applies with respect to all New Zealand grown lemons (other than Meyer lemons) sold by way of retail.

(2) The provisions of this Order as to maximum retail prices shall apply notwithstanding that any such lemons are sold otherwise than by weight.

#### MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES

4. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum retail price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any lemons to which this Order applies shall be computed as follows:—

(a) For lemons sold at any place in the North Island, north of a straight line drawn from Tirua Point on the West Coast to Young Nick's Head on the East Coast: At the rate of 1s. 5d. per pound.

(b) For lemons sold elsewhere in the North Island: At the rate of 1s. 6d per pound.

(c) For lemons sold in the South Island: At the rate of ls. 7d. per pound.

(2) If in respect of any lot of lemons sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the next upward

halfpenny.

(3) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any lemons to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this subclause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of lemons or may relate generally to all lemons to which this Order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

#### DUTY IMPOSED ON RETAILERS

5. Every retailer who offers or exposes any such lemons for sale in any shop shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the lemons to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the retail price per pound of the lemons Dated at Wellington, this 3rd day of July 1952.
