

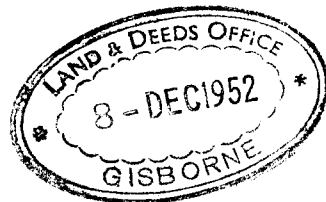

Application of Dogs Registration Act 1908 Extended to Chatham Islands County

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, by Proclamation issued pursuant to the Dog Registration Act Amendment Act 1895 on the 17th day of February 1896, that part of the Colony of New Zealand called the Chatham Islands was excluded from the operation of certain portions of the Dog Registration Act 1880 specified in the said Proclamation:

And whereas section 1 of the Dogs Registration Act 1908 provides that all Proclamations which originated under the Dog Registration Act Amendment Act 1895 shall enure for the purposes of the Dogs Registration Act 1908 as fully and effectually as if they had originated under the corresponding provisions of that Act:

And whereas it is considered desirable to make provision with regard to the registration of dogs in Chatham Islands County:

Now, therefore, pursuant to section 32 of the Dogs Registration Act 1908, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Willoughby Moke Norrie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare that the operation of the Dogs Registration Act 1908 is hereby extended to Chatham Islands County, and the said Proclamation issued on the 17th day of February 1896 is hereby revoked:

And I further declare that this Proclamation shall take effect as on and from the 1st day of January 1953.

Varying a Proclamation Proclaiming a Tribal District Under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, I, Sir Humphrey Francis O'Leary, the Administrator of the Government of New Zealand, hereby vary the Proclamation made on the 17th day of November 1950 and published in the *Gazette* on the 23rd day of November 1950 at page 1999, declaring certain parts of New Zealand to be a tribal district for the purpose of the said Act, by excluding from the Schedule thereto the description of the Rangiriri Tribal District and substituting therefor the description appearing in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

RANGIRIRI TRIBAL DISTRICT

ALL that area in the North Auckland and South Auckland Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at Trig. Station 72 in Block IV, Awaroa Survey District; thence proceeding north-easterly along a right line to Trig. Station 98 in Block V, Maramarua Survey District, a right line to the northernmost corner of Section 131, Koheroa Parish (Block I, Maramarua Survey District), a right line to Trig. Station B in Block XIV, Opaheke Survey District, and a right line to the south-western corner of Lot 5 on the plan numbered 9284 deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland (Block XV, Opaheke Survey District); thence easterly along a right line to the intersection of the middle of the Pokeno-Miranda Road with the western boundary of the Wharekawa Survey District; thence south-easterly along a right line to Trig. Station 135 (Rataroa) in Block VIII, Wharekawa Survey District, a right line to the north-western corner of Section 28, Block VII, Piako Survey District, along the south-western boundaries of the said Section 28, parts Sections 4 and 5 of the said Block VII, part Section 12 of Block VII aforesaid, and Lot 2 of the said Section 12, along the abutment of a public road, another part of the south-western boundary of the said Section 12, the abutment of another public road, and a further part of the south-western boundary of the said Section 12, and the south-western boundary of Section 5, Block XI, Piako Survey District, and along the western boundary of Section 1, Block XV, Piako Survey District, to Trig. Station 2042 (Ratawera), being a point on the boundary of Te Au-o-Waikato Tribal District as described in *New Zealand Gazette* of 1950 at page 884; thence south-westerly along the boundary of that district to the confluence of the Mangawara Stream with the Komakorau Stream, being a point on the boundary of the Taniwharau Tribal District as described in *New Zealand Gazette* of 1950 at page 855; thence north-westerly generally along that district boundary to Trig. Station 72, the point of commencement.

Price Order No. 1429 (Dry Cleaning and Pressing Charges)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1429, and shall come into force on the 5th day of December 1952.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

2. This Order applies with respect to the charges that may be made at any place in the North Island of New Zealand and also in the Provincial Districts of Nelson, Marlborough, Westland, and Canterbury in the South Island of New Zealand, for pressing and for dry cleaning and pressing any of the items of apparel specified in the Schedule hereto.

FIXING MAXIMUM CHARGES FOR PRESSING AND FOR DRY-CLEANING AND PRESSING WORK TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Dry Cleaning and Pressing

3. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum charge that may be made or received by any person for the dry cleaning and pressing (whether or not delivered) of any of the items of apparel specified in the Schedule hereto shall be the appropriate charge specified in the said Schedule.

(2) In respect of dry cleaning and pressing articles made of gaberdine material an additional charge of 6d. per article, over and above the charges specified in the Schedule hereto, may be made.

(3) Where with respect to any dry-cleaning and pressing work the items of apparel are required to be returned to the customer within twenty-four hours from the time they were left for dry cleaning and pressing a further charge not exceeding 1s. for each item so required may be made. Any charge made pursuant to this subclause shall be shown separately on the charge docket.

(4) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this clause, a minimum charge of 2s. 6d. may be imposed with respect to any lot of dry-cleaning and pressing work irrespective of the number or kind of articles in respect of which the work is performed.

(5) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this clause, higher prices may be charged for special treatment involved in removing stains such as those caused by ink, paint, tar, or chemicals, when extra costs are incurred in regard to the particular garment or garments under treatment: Provided that any such higher prices shall not exceed the actual additional costs incurred over and above those incurred when no such special treatment is involved.

Pressing Only

4. (1) The maximum charge that may be made or received by any person where any of the items of apparel specified in the Schedule hereto are pressed but not dry cleaned shall be determined as follows:—

(a) Where the item of apparel is being pressed for the first time or has been washed by the customer and handed in in an unpressed state for pressing the maximum charge shall be an amount equal to 66⅔ per cent of the charge fixed in the Schedule hereto for dry cleaning and pressing that article.

(b) In all other cases the maximum charge shall be an amount equal to 60 per cent of the charges fixed in the Schedule hereto for dry cleaning and pressing that article.

(2) Where the charge fixed by subclause (1) hereof is not an exact number of threepences it shall be computed to the nearest threepence.

Provision for Special Prices

5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any person concerned may authorize special maximum charges in respect of any pressing or dry-cleaning and pressing work to which this Order applies, where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges are incurred by that person. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to any particular dry-cleaning and pressing work or may relate generally to all dry-cleaning and pressing work performed by that person while the approval remains in force.

Price Order to be Exhibited

6. Every person who performs any dry-cleaning or pressing work to which this Order applies and every agent of any such person shall keep a copy of this Price Order or a statement of the charges fixed thereby prominently displayed in his premises in such a position that customers may examine the Price Order or statement without having to ask for its production and without having to obtain permission to examine it.
