Levy on Main-Crop Potatoes

PURSUANT to section 15 of the Potato Growing Industry Act 1950, the Potato Board resolves that as from the 1st day of March 1953—

1. The amount of the levy shall be 13s. per ton.

2. The levy shall be payable in respect of main crop potatoes which are grown in New Zealand in districts other than the North Auckland, South Auckland, Taranaki, or Gisborne Land Districts or in the Waimarino County of the Wellington Land District.

3. The levy shall be payable on those potatoes described in (2) above which are sold by a grower for purposes of human consumption or for replanting irrespective of quality, size, and condition except—

(a) Certified seed potatoes packed in containers labelled with the official certification tag of the Department of Agriculture, provided that the maximum certification grading size of such potatoes does not exceed 6.5 ozs.

(b) Potatoes other than certified seed potatoes which are sold for replanting, provided that the largest tubers do not exceed 4½ ozs. in weight.

(c) Potatoes sold for shipment to the Pacific Islands and described in the Potato Trade as "Island Smalls".
