Rainfall normals have been revised and now refer to the standard period 1921-50. Where observations are not available for the whole period, or where the site of the rain gauge has been changed, the normals are partly interpolated.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR FEBRUARY 1953

General.—The general pattern established in the three previous months of cloudy and rather cool conditions persisted. Over the greater part of New Zealand, however, February proved to be considerably drier than the three previous months. In Westland, comparatively warm and sunny weather was again reported, but the rain which fell in that province was welcome, ending a prolonged dry spell in some areas and causing better growth.

Dairy production was falling off in many districts. Cattle were in good condition, but the excess moisture underfoot was causing foot-rot in sheep in many eastern districts. It was a poor season for fattening lambs on account of the excessive growth of grass. In the northern half of the North Island blight continued to affect potato and tomato crops seriously.

Rainfall.—Rainfall was below normal over the greater part of the country, and was less than half the average in southern Northland, Waikato, South Westland, and the Southern Lakes district. A small excess was recorded in western Taranaki, Wellington, and Buller. A moderate excess in the Manawatu and Wairarapa districts and near Wellington City was due to a rather high rainfall on the 12th associated with the passage across the country in this area of a deep depression. In Manawatu and Wairarapa the rain was associated with considerable thunderstorm activity and some local flooding occurred.

A moderate excess was also recorded in the Nelson-Motueka-Takaka area; here the greater part of the rain fell from the 11th to the 13th, and serious flooding was reported in the Motueka River and its tributaries on the 12th.

Temperature.—The pattern of temperature departures was very similar to that of January, but the departures from normal were not as large as in that month. Temperatures were slightly above normal in Westland, but below normal in all other districts. In North Canterbury, Wairarapa, and near Gisborne, temperatures were more than 2° F. below normal.

Sunshine.—As in previous months, sunshine was above normal in Westland; slight surpluses being also recorded in South Canterbury and parts of Central Otago. Elsewhere sunshine was below normal, and the largest deficits were recorded between North Canterbury and Hawke's Bay. Wellington City's sunshine reached a record low value—more than two hours a day below average.

Weather Sequence.—A depression which formed east of Tasmania moved over the central districts of New Zealand at the end of January. The cold front of this depression brought light to moderate rain on the 1st over western and northern districts of the North Island, and over North Westland and Buller, with scattered falls elsewhere. In the ridge of high pressure behind the cold front the weather cleared rapidly on the 2nd.

A deterioration of weather occurred again with a cold front which passed on to Southland from the south on the 3rd and moved slowly northward until it became very weak

over the North Island on the 4th; rain was reported as far north as East Cape in eastern districts, and as far north as Hokitika in western districts.

Behind the front an anticyclone moved on to the country and brought two days of settled weather to all districts. On the 7th, however, a depression near Norfolk Island moved slowly southward, and rain fell on the 7th and 8th in all districts except Canterbury and North and Central Otago. The depression became stationary on the 9th to the north-east of North Cape, and for two days drizzle and light rain were reported from northern and western districts of both islands.

A deeper depression formed near Lord Howe Island early on the 10th and moved south-eastwards, deepening, and crossing the country in the Manawatu-Wairarapa area on the 12th. Rain became general over the whole country, except in Central Otago and parts of South Westland and Fiordland. Southerly winds freshened behind the depression as it moved slowly eastward, and showers persisted in some eastern districts up to the 15th. On this day westerly conditions brought light rain to Southland, and on the 16th rain extended to Westland, Manawatu, and the National Park district, with scattered light falls elsewhere.

On the 17th a weak ridge of high pressure brought fair weather to all districts except Hawke's Bay and Gisborne. During the 18th, however, a deep depression developed rapidly off the Canterbury coast, and general light or moderate rain resulted over the whole country. As the depression deepened and moved slowly eastwards, winds from a southerly quarter became general and temperatures became considerably colder. Winds of gale force were reported from Canterbury, Marlborough, and Wellington. A clearance occurred in the Westland and Auckland Provinces on the 19th, but showers persisted in other districts, and on the 20th showers were still reported from many eastern districts north of Christchurch. By the 21st, however, a ridge of high pressure from an anticyclone over the Tasman Sea brought a welcome spell of four days of fair and milder weather to the greater part of the country.

During the latter part of this period, a series of westerly depressions was passing far to the south and causing scattered light rain in parts of Southland. On the 25th a depression of this series formed off the Southland coast, and the associated cold front moved north-eastwards over the country. Some damage was done by lightning in Invercargill, and damage was reported in Dunedin from a violent squall. General rain was reported over the South Island, and in southern and western districts of the North Island. By the 27th a clearance had occurred except in some eastern districts, and on the 28th an anticyclone centred to the east brought fair weather to the greater part of the country. In the Bay of Plenty, however, the moist northerly winds brought considerable rain; while in eastern Southland and coastal Otago a small local depression caused unsettled weather.

Price Order No. 1457 (Boot Repair Charges)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1457, and shall come into force on the 27th day of March 1953.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1413* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not effect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. In this Order—

“Sewn” means sewn by machine.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. (1) Except as provided in the next succeeding subclause this Order applies with respect to the prices that may be charged for the boot and shoe repairs specified in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to repairs to soles where the sewing is done by hand or to any repairs effected with crepe rubber.

FIXING PRICES THAT MAY BE CHARGED FOR BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRS

5. (1) The maximum that may be charged anywhere in New Zealand for boot and shoe repairs of any of the kinds specified in the Schedule hereto shall be the appropriate price specified in the said Schedule.

(2) The maximum prices fixed in the Schedule hereto apply with respect to repairs effected with plastic compounds as well as to repairs effected with leather.

(3) In respect of repairs effected with compound rubber the maximum prices fixed in the Schedule hereto shall be decreased by the sum of 1s. for soles and by the sum of 6d. for heels when the heel measurement is 2½ inches or more.

Price Order No. 1456 (Seed Potatoes)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. (1) This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1456, and shall come into force on the 27th day of March 1953.
- (2) Price Orders Nos. 1382* and 1402† are hereby revoked.
- (3) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.
2. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - “The said Act” means the Control of Prices Act 1947:
 - “Certified seed potatoes” means seed potatoes that have been certified as “mother seed” or as “commercial seed”, in accordance with the scheme for the certification of seed potatoes that is in operation under the control of the Department of Agriculture, and that are packed in containers labelled with the official certification tag of that Department; and “uncertified seed potatoes” means all seed potatoes that have not been so certified and packed:
 - “Distributor”, in relation to any lot of potatoes, means a wholesaler, as defined in the said Act, who sells those potatoes otherwise than to a retailer for purposes of retail sale:
 - “Group”, in relation to certified seed potatoes, means the group into which any potatoes have been classified by the Department of Agriculture in accordance with its scheme for the certification of seed potatoes:
 - “Grower”, in relation to potatoes, means a person engaged in the business of growing potatoes for sale:
 - “Seed potatoes” includes all potatoes that are sold, offered, or exposed for sale as seed potatoes provided, however, that no potatoes shall be deemed to be seed potatoes unless the container in which they are sold, exposed, or offered for sale, is clearly marked with (a) the words “seed potatoes” and (b) the variety and grade of the potatoes, and provided further that except for certified seed potatoes no potatoes shall be deemed to be “seed potatoes” if they exceed 4½ ozs. individually in weight.
 - “Standard-sized”, in relation to certified seed potatoes, refers to potatoes that comply with the standard prescribed by clause 6 hereof:
 - The expression “f.a.q.”, in relation to uncertified seed potatoes, means potatoes of fair average quality, as determined in accordance with the rules laid down in clause 9 hereof.
 - The expression “f.o.r.s.e.” means “free on rail, sacks or other containers extra”.
- (2) Terms and expressions defined in the said Act, when used in this Order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by that Act.
- (3) The several prices, allowances, and margins of profit fixed by this Order shall apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.
3. Subject to any general or specific directions that may be given by or on behalf of the Tribunal, any expenses that are reasonably incurred by a distributor, wholesaler, or retailer in undertaking the transport of any potatoes at his own expense, not exceeding in any case the cost that would have been incurred by him if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates, may be regarded for the purposes of this Order as if they were transport charges paid by him, and the maximum price of the potatoes shall be determined accordingly.
4. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received for the sacks in which any lot of potatoes to which this Order applies are packed shall be computed as follows:—
 - For cornsacks of a size 48 in. by 26½ in., 46 in. by 26½ in., 44 in. by 26½ in., 46 in. by 23 in., or 41 in. by 23 in.: At the rate of 30s. per ton of potatoes:
 - For all other sacks: At the rate of 11s. per ton of potatoes.
- (2) Where any potatoes to which this Order applies are packed in sacks the maximum price that may be charged or received for the potatoes shall be computed on the gross weight of the potatoes and the sacks.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

5. (1) In its application to growers' prices, this Order applies only to seed potatoes that are grown in the South Island, and in its application to other prices, this Order applies to all seed potatoes sold in New Zealand.
- (2) This Order applies to all such potatoes (whether sold before or after the date of the coming into force of this Order) that are delivered to the purchaser on or after that date.

CLASSES OF SEED POTATOES TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

- (3) Seed potatoes to which this Order applies shall be classified A, B, or C as follows:—
 - Class A shall comprise Cliffs Kidney, Doon Early, Epicure, Jersey Bennes, Catriona, Robin Adair, Arran Pilot, Sebago, Glen Ilam, Aucklander Short Top, and Aucklander Tall Top.
 - Class B shall comprise Arran Consul, Arran Banner, Chippewa, Iron Duke, Katahdin, King Edward, Majestic, Up-to-date, Dunbar Standard, and other varieties not specified elsewhere.
 - Class C shall comprise Arran Chief, Dakota, Inverness Favourite, Northern Star (Gamekeeper).

FIXING PRICES OF SEED POTATOES

Specifications of “Standard-sized” Certified Seed Potatoes

6. (1) For the purposes of this Order the standard for certified seed potatoes shall be deemed to be a potato that weighs not less than 2 oz. and not more than 4½ oz.
- (2) If in any sample of one hundred potatoes taken at random from any lot of certified seed potatoes more than eight of those potatoes fail to comply with the standard prescribed by the last preceding subclause, none of the potatoes comprised in the lot shall be deemed to be “standard-sized”.
- (3) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause all certified seed potatoes shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be “standard-sized”.

Growers' Actual Prices for “Standard-sized” Certified Seed Potatoes

7. (1) The actual price (f.o.r.s.e. a railway-station in the South Island), to be charged by any grower for any “standard-sized” certified seed potatoes to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the scale set forth in the Schedule hereto.
- (2) Where any such potatoes are delivered by the grower otherwise than f.o.r.s.e. a railway-station in the South Island, the actual price to be charged by the grower may be increased by the charges (if any) incurred by the grower in effecting delivery, and then reduced by the charges that would have been incurred by the grower if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates to the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower's premises.

Growers' Maximum Prices for Certified Seed Potatoes that are Not “Standard-sized”

8. The maximum price that may be charged by any grower for any certified seed potatoes to which this Order applies that are not “standard-sized” shall be the price that would have been the actual price of those potatoes if they had in fact been “standard-sized.”

Specifications of f.a.q. Uncertified Seed Potatoes

9. For the purposes of this Order uncertified seed potatoes shall be deemed to be f.a.q. or under-grade, as the case may be, in accordance with the following rules:—
 - (a) *Rule as to Size.*—Uncertified seed potatoes that are less than 2 oz. in weight shall be deemed to be under-grade.
 - (b) *Rule as to Quality.*—If in any lot of uncertified seed potatoes more than 6 per cent. by weight of the lot is affected by dry or wet rots (including late blight or frost damage), or by scab, or by second growth or other defects, or if the lot is not reasonably free from earth or from sprouts, all the potatoes in the lot shall be deemed to be under-grade.
 - (c) Uncertified seed potatoes that are not under-grade in accordance with paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) hereof shall be deemed to be f.a.q.

Growers' Maximum Prices for Uncertified Seed Potatoes

10. (1) The maximum price (f.o.r.s.e. a railway-station in the South Island) that may be charged by any grower for any f.a.q. uncertified seed potatoes to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the scale set forth in the Schedule hereto.
- (2) Where any potatoes to which this clause applies are delivered by the grower otherwise than f.o.r.s.e. a railway-station in the South Island, the maximum price that may be charged by the grower may be increased by the charges (if any) incurred by the grower in effecting delivery, and then reduced by the charges that would have been incurred by the grower if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates to the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower's premises.

Distributors' Prices

11. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding clause, the price (sacks included) that may be charged by any distributor for any seed potatoes to which this Order applies shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts :—

- (a) The price actually paid or payable to the grower by the same or any other distributor for the potatoes and for the sacks, but not exceeding the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order in respect of the sale to the vendor :
- (b) Any grading, transport, or other charges (not including brokerage) actually paid by the same or any other distributor :
- (c) An amount computed at the rate of 5 per cent of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) (less the amount paid for the sacks) and (b) hereof, or at the rate of 15s. a ton (whichever is the greater) :
- (d) Any disbursements actually incurred by the same or any other distributor by way of brokerage, not exceeding in the aggregate $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) hereof.

(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Order, the provisions of this clause as to the computation of distributors' prices shall apply with respect to every sale by a person who is ordinarily engaged in business as a distributor to a person who is ordinarily engaged in business as a wholesaler, notwithstanding that in any such case the purchaser may sell by way of retail any potatoes acquired by him from the distributor.

12. Where any wholesaler who does not normally carry on business as a distributor sells any potatoes to another wholesaler (thus becoming a distributor in respect of that transaction), the price to be charged by the vendor may exceed the maximum price determined in accordance with the last preceding clause by such amount as may be mutually agreed upon by the parties to the transaction : Provided that in any case the maximum price that may be charged by the purchasing wholesaler in accordance with the next succeeding clause shall be determined as if he had bought those potatoes at the price paid by the wholesaler from whom he bought them.

Wholesalers' and Retailers' Prices

13. (1) When any seed potatoes to which this Order applies are sold by any wholesaler or by any retailer in lots exceeding 1 cwt. the price (sacks included) that may be charged or received by the wholesaler or by the retailer shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts :—

- (a) The price actually paid or payable by the wholesaler or the retailer, as the case may be, to the grower or any other person for the potatoes and for the sacks, but not exceeding the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order in respect of the sale to the vendor :
- (b) An amount not exceeding 4s. a ton in respect of any potatoes actually received into the wholesaler's or retailer's store, together with any grading, transport, or other charges actually paid by the wholesaler or retailer :
- (c) An amount equal to $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) (less the amount paid for the sacks) and (b) hereof (to cover the estimated loss due to shrinkage and other natural causes), and a further amount equal to $1\frac{1}{4}$ per cent of the said sum in respect of potatoes actually received into store :
- (d) An amount computed at the rate of £2 5s. a ton (in respect of seed potatoes sold in lots exceeding 1 cwt., but less than a ton), and computed at the rate of £1 10s. a ton for lots of 1 ton or more.

Provided, however, except with respect to sales made in the Franklin County of seed potatoes grown in that county, the maximum wholesale price with respect to potatoes grown in the North Island shall not in any case, except where the provisions of clause 14 hereof apply, exceed £28 10s. per ton for uncertified f.a.q. potatoes or £26 10s. per ton for uncertified undergrade potatoes.

(2) Subject to the provisions of clause 14 of this Order where any potatoes to which this Order applies are sold by any wholesaler or retailer in lots of 7 lb., or 14 lb., or 28 lb., or 56 lb., or 112 lb., the price (inclusive of the price of the sack or other container) shall not in any case exceed :—

(3) Where any such potatoes are sold by any wholesaler or retailer in a lot exceeding 7 lb. but otherwise than in a lot of any of the weights specified in the last preceding subclause, the maximum price per pound of any surplus over 7 lb. or over any multiple of 7 lb. (being less in every case than 7 lb.) shall be such proportion of the price specified for the lot nearest in weight to the total weight of the sale as the surplus bears to that lot.

(4) Where any potatoes are sold in lots of less than 7 lb. the maximum price of the lot shall be computed at the rate per lb. prescribed by subclause (2) hereof for 7 lb. lot sales.

14. Where any seed potatoes to which this Order applies have been specially hand picked and the bag or other container in which they are packed is duly labelled to show (a) that they have been hand picked, and (b) the name or registered trade mark of the distributor or wholesaler in whose store they were hand picked, the maximum prices specified in clauses 11 and 13 hereof may be increased as follows :—

For 7 lb. lots	By 8d.
For 14 lb. lots	By 1s. 1d.
For 28 lb. lots	By 1s. 10d.
For 56 lb. lots	By 3s. 4d.
For 112 lb. lots	By 6s. 3d.
For lots in excess of 112 lb.	By an amount computed at the rate of £6 per ton.

Provided that where with respect to any lot of potatoes the maximum price has been increased by the appropriate charge fixed by this clause for hand picking, no further charge for hand picking shall be made with respect to that lot of potatoes.

15. If in respect of potatoes sold by a wholesaler or a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order or in accordance with an authority under clause 17 hereof is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

16. Subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorize special prices or margins of profit in respect of any potatoes to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of potatoes or may relate generally to all potatoes to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

17. On the recommendation of the Department of Agriculture and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any grower, may in its discretion authorize special prices or margins for any certified seed potatoes of a recently imported or newly bred variety or exempt them entirely from the operation of this Order.

DUTIES IMPOSED ON DISTRIBUTORS AND WHOLESALERS

18. (1) Every distributor and other wholesaler who sells any seed potatoes to which this Order applies shall specify in the relevant invoice with respect to each item the variety and grade of the potatoes comprised in the item.

(2) For the purposes of this clause the term "grade" means, as the case may require, "certified" or "f.a.q." or "under-grade".

DUTIES IMPOSED ON RETAILERS FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS ORDER

19. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale in any shop any potatoes to which this Order applies shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the potatoes to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the following particulars:—

- (a) The words "Certified Seed", or "F.a.q. Uncertified Seed", or "Under-grade Uncertified Seed" as the case may be;
- (b) The name of the variety of potato;
- (c) The retail price per pound.

Price Order No. 1458 (Phosphatic Fertilizers)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1458, and shall come into force on the 27th day of March 1953.
2. (1) Price Order No. 1390* is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) Subject to the next succeeding subclause, this Order applies with respect to phosphatic fertilizers of the following kinds manufactured or prepared in New Zealand and sold for use in New Zealand:—

- (a) Superphosphate;
 - (b) Serpentine superphosphate comprising 15 cwt. of superphosphate and 5 cwt. of ground serpentine rock per ton;
 - (c) Superphosphate compound comprising 15 cwt. of superphosphate, 2 cwt. of ground serpentine rock or limestone, and 3 cwt. of finely ground Nauru or Ocean Island rock phosphate per ton;
 - (d) Reverted superphosphate comprising 15 cwt. of superphosphate and 5 cwt. of carbonate of lime per ton;
 - (e) Super Nauru compound comprising 15 cwt. of superphosphate and 5 cwt. of Nauru or Ocean Island rock phosphate per ton;
 - (f) Finely ground Nauru or Ocean Island rock phosphate.
- (2) Nothing in this Order shall apply with respect to any phosphatic fertilizers sold in a quantity of less than one ton.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF PHOSPHATIC FERTILIZERS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) The prices for phosphatic fertilizers fixed by this Order are fixed in respect of sales of the following classes, namely:—
 - (a) Sales to a user—that is to say, to a person purchasing for his own use and not for the purpose of resale;
 - (b) Sales to a storekeeper—that is to say, to a person (not being a merchant, dairy company, or farmer's organization as hereinafter mentioned), purchasing solely for resale to users;
 - (c) Sales to a merchant—that is to say, to a person purchasing for resale to storekeepers or to users;
 - (d) Sales to a dairy company, as defined in section 2 of the Dairy Industry Act 1908, purchasing solely for resale to persons being suppliers of milk or cream to the company;
 - (e) Sales to an incorporated farmers' organization, having a retail department conducted on a co-operative basis, and purchasing phosphatic fertilizers solely for the purpose of resale to its members.
- (2) The prices for phosphatic fertilizers fixed by this Order are fixed in respect of sales for cash or for credit until a date not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month of delivery.
- (3) Where any sale is made on terms allowing credit for a longer period than that mentioned in the last preceding subclause, the purchaser shall be entitled, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the contract of sale, to the benefit of the prices fixed by this Order if in fact payment is made not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month of delivery.
- (4) The prices fixed by this Order include the price of the containers.
5. (1) Where any phosphatic fertilizers manufactured in the South Island are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at Burnside, Hornby, or Ravensbourne, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) Where any phosphatic fertilizers manufactured in the North Island are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at Aramoho, Otahuhu, Smart Road (New Plymouth), Te Papapa, or Westfield, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (3) Where any phosphatic fertilizers are sold for delivery elsewhere than at one of the places mentioned in subclauses (1) and (2) of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price fixed in the First or Second Schedule hereto, whichever is appropriate, increased by the amount of the freight charges between the place of manufacture and the place of delivery: Provided that the amount added to the price in respect of freight charges shall not in any case exceed the amount that would have been incurred had delivery been effected by the holder of a goods-service licence under the Transport Act 1949, at authorized rates: Provided also that where phosphatic fertilizer manufactured at Smart Road is sold for delivery at a place which is nearer or more convenient of access to Aramoho the freight charge shall not exceed that which would have been incurred had delivery been made from Aramoho to the place of delivery.
- (4) In every invoice, debit-note, or similar document issued by a vendor to a user in respect of the sale of any phosphatic fertilizers there shall be shown separately—
 - (a) The price of the phosphatic fertilizers fixed in accordance with this Order; and
 - (b) The additional amount (if any) payable by the purchaser in respect of freight charges.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act 1926 and its amendments, and all other powers it in that behalf enabling, the Carterton Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

“That, for the purpose of providing the principal, interest, and other charges on a loan of three thousand pounds, being part of the General Purposes Amalgamated Loan 1952, of twelve thousand pounds (£12,000) authorized to be raised by the Carterton Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act

for the purpose of making additions to the water reticulation, providing a new municipal building, and carrying out additions and alterations to the State Theatre, the Carterton Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of twenty-one thirty-fifths of a penny ($\frac{21}{35}$ d.) in the pound (£) upon the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property within the whole of the Borough of Carterton; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan and shall be payable yearly on the 1st day of April in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-five (25) years, from the 31st day of May 1953, or until such loan is fully paid off.”

The Carterton Borough Council, at a meeting held on 24th day of March 1953, passed the above resolution.

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act 1926, and of all other powers (if any) it thereunto enabling, the Invercargill City Council hereby resolves as follows:—

“That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of principal, interest, and other charges on the Invercargill City Council Housing Loan 1950 of £17,500, first issue 1953, of £4,000, authorized to be raised by the Invercargill City Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of providing flats for employees and to exercise the powers vested in the Council by section 19 of the Local Legislation Act 1952, the said Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of decimal nought two eight pence (0.028d.) in the pound on the rateable value on the basis of the unimproved value of all rateable property in the City of Invercargill; and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable on the 1st day of May in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-five years, or until the loan is fully paid off.”
