#### NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR APRIL 1953

General.—Over the greater part of the country the weather in April was dull and rather stormy. Winds from a westerly quarter were unusually strong for this time of the year, especially from Cook Strait southward. On the 11th southwesterly gales of unusual violence swept over Southland, Otago, and Canterbury; tornadoes also caused some local damage at Auckland City on the 1st and at Greymouth on the 20th

the 20th.

Pasture-growth was reported to be good, but the prevailing wet conditions were generally unfavourable for lambs, which were slow in fattening except in the Gisborne area, where weather conditions were appreciably better. From Canterbury there were reports of blight damage to the potato crop.

Rainfall.—Over the greater part of the country rainfalls were above normal. More than double the average value was recorded from southern Hawke's Bay to Cape Palliser and from Banks Peninsula to Timaru. There was a slight deficiency in the far north and in Taranaki, Gisborne, Manawatu, and eastern Nelson.

Considerable thunderstorm activity was reported on the 10, the 20th, the 24th, and the 30th. On the 20th thunderstorms covered a particularly wide area extending from the Bay of Plenty to South Westland.

Temperatures.—Over the greater part of the country temperatures were below normal, and in many districts from North Canterbury to Taranaki the deficit exceeded 1° F. Temperatures were warmer than usual from Hamilton northward, and over the greater part of Northland they were more than 1° F. above average. In Central Otago, Southland, and Fiordland temperatures were also a little above normal.

Sunshine.—In Gisborne sunshine was somewhat above average but all other districts received less than usual. In Taranaki, Wellington, Westland, and Otago some areas experienced a deficiency equivalent to more than one and a half hours a day. New Plymouth and Dunedin both experienced the least sunny April on record.

Weather Sequence.—At the beginning of the month a frontal depression was centred west of Northland, and an anticyclone was situated to the south-west of Southland. As the two pressure systems moved slowly eastward, an easterly to south-easterly current covered the whole country for four days. General rain soon developed over the North Island and there were some considerable falls about Auckland City, Coromandel, Gisborne, and Hawke's Bay. Some light rain also spread to eastern and northern districts of the South Island.

The weather remained unsettled during the passage of another depression whose centre crossed Nelson and Marl-

The weather remained unsettled during the passage of another depression whose centre crossed Nelson and Marlborough on the 7th. Heavy rains were recorded over Nelson and the Bay of Plenty on the 6th and on the following day

near Wellington City. After the passage of a cold front on the 9th, stormy south-westerly conditions prevailed until the 14th. Gales caused minor property damage over a considerable part of the country, chiefly during the passage of two depressions along the east coast during the 10th and 11th. South-westerly gales were particularly severe on the 11th, especially in Canterbury, Otago, and Southland, where there was widespread damage to trees, farm buildings, small craft and power transmission lines; a small railway-station near Winton in Southland was blown over. Showers occurred in all parts of the country on the 9th and 10th but were mainly confined to the South Island from the 11th to the 13th. The only heavy rain reported over this period of south-westerly conditions was in eastern Southland on the 12th; this caused the Waipahi River to flood on the 13th.

By the 15th an anticyclone had moved on to the country; frosts were reported in all parts of the South Island and in many North Island districts. The weather was settled generally for a day but the anticyclone moved away rather rapidly. A series of deep depressions now passed to the south bringing westerly conditions to the greater part of the country for several days. Rain commenced in Fiordland on the 16th, and had spread to all western districts by the 18th; it continued in these areas on the 19th and some scattered falls were at the same time reported in eastern districts. The rain was heavy in Fiordland and Westland; on the 18th the river at Hokitika was reported in flood. This was also a period of continuous strong winds in the Cook Strait area.

A cold front which passed over the country on the 20th and 21st brought a temporary change to south-westerlies. Snow was reported to low levels in Central Otago and gales caused minor damage in Auckland, Taranaki, and Wellington Provinces. Rain fell in all parts of the country on the 20th; on the 21st and 22nd it was again mainly restricted to western districts south of Auckland City. During the next three days a slow-moving cold front brought light rain to the remainder of the South Island and to central districts of the North Island.

North Island.

Another cold front which moved on to Southland on the 27th made very slow progress and several depressions formed on it during its passage over the country. The last of these depressions was centred to the west of Northland at the end of the month. Rain was particularly heavy over the west coast of the South Island on the 28th and 29th and over the Auckland Province on the 30th; in other districts the passage of the front was accompanied by moderate rain. By the end of the month a ridge of high pressure was bringing more settled conditions to Southland, Otago, and South Westland.

The qualifications, involving University degrees and recognized certificates or approved examinations, are taken from the person's application for Practising Certificate and have not been verified or checked against the person's registered particulars.

Column 2.—This gives the postal address, either business or residential, as on the application for Annual Practising Certificate.

Column 3.—This shows the date of original registration.

Column 4.—This shows the class of engineering in which the Board has accepted the engineer's training and experience as a qualification for registration. Engineering is classified only in the three main branches of Civil, Electrical, and Mechanical. Where an engineer has not satisfied the Board's requirements for qualification in one of these main branches, the restrictive or specialist class in which he is accepted is shown

It is also to be noted that corporate membership of one of the recognized British Engineering Institutions entitles the holder to be styled as a "Chartered Engineer," but this information is omitted from the list.

Road Traffic By-laws Over Roads Within the Bounds of the Royal New Zealand Air Force Station and Civil Airport at Taieri, Dunedin

PURSUANT to section 54 of the Transport Act 1949, I, Thomas Lachlan Macdonald, Minister of Defence, and Minister in Charge of Civil Aviation, being the Minister responsible for the control of roads within the boundaries of the Royal New Zealand Air Force Station and the Civil Airport, in the County of Taieri, for the purposes of said section 54, do hereby make the following by-laws controlling and prohibiting certain classes of traffic in respect of the aforementioned roads.

## BY-LAWS

- 1. These by-laws shall be known as the Taieri Air Force Station and Airport Roads Traffic By-laws 1953.
- 2. These by-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of June 1953.
- 3. These by laws shall apply at all times to the roads constructed within the boundaries of the area of land occupied by the Royal New Zealand Air Force Station and the Civil Airport at Taieri, in the County of Taieri hereinafter referred to as the said station and airport.
- 3. (1) All traffic excepting the classes or descriptions mentioned in subclause (2) hereof are prohibited from using the said roads.
- (2) The following classes or descriptions of traffic are permitted to use the said roads subject to the condition in this and succeeding clauses hereof:-
  - (a) Traffic owned or operated by the Royal New Zealand Air Force or by members thereof (including bona fide visitors to messes and married quarters on the said station and airport).

- (b) Traffic owned or operated by the National Airways
  Corporation of New Zealand or its agents or
  contractors (including their sub-contractors) for the
  purposes of conveying passengers to and from its
  terminal situated within the said station and airport

- contractors (including their sub-contractors) for the purposes of conveying passengers to and from its terminal situated within the said station and airport between the hours of seven o'clock in the morning and seven o'clock in the evening.

  (c) Traffic, being bona fide operated by persons not specified in the preceding subclauses for the purpose of picking-up or setting-down persons about to depart or who arrive by air at the terminal and between the hours referred to in subclause (b) hereof, providing no intermediate stops are made by such traffic between the said terminal and the entrances or exits of the said station and airport.

  (d) Traffic owned or operated by the said National Airways Corporation, its employees, agents, and sub-contractors in the course of the bona fide performance or discharge of functions and duties connected with the activities of the said National Airways Corporation, providing no intermediate stops are made between the entrances or the exits of the said station and airport and authorized parking places as approved by the commanding officer of the said station and airport.

  (e) Traffic bona fide conveying patients, visitors, and staff, including attending medical practitioners, to and from the maternity hospital erected on the said station and airport, providing the most direct route is used and that no intermediate stops are made between the parking place, approved by the commanding officer of the said station and airport, outside the said maternity hospital and the entrances or exits of the said station and airport and providing that traffic conveying visitors to patients may have access over the roads of the said station and airport and providing that traffic conveying visitors to patients may have access over the roads of the said station and airport and providing that traffic conveying visitors to patients may have access over the roads of the said station and earport only during the visiting hours approved by the Dunedin Hospital Board or on special occasions as approved by th

(f) Traffic operated by persons in the lawful exercise or discharge of functions and duties in connection with Air Force or Civil Aviation Branch (Air Department) matters whether arising out of contract or otherwise howsoever.

otherwise howsoever.

(g) Traffic operated by members of the Dunedin Aero Club (including that of bona fide guests of the members) for the purpose of access to and from the aero club buildings, providing no intermediate stops are made between the entrances or exits of the said station and airport and the aero club buildings.

are made between the entrances or exits of the said station and airport and the aero club buildings.

(h) Traffic operated by persons in possession of an authorization to that effect in writing by or by direction of the commanding officer of the said station and airport.

5. All traffic permitted in terms of subclause (2) of the immediately preceding by-law to use the aforesaid roads, shall when using these roads not exceed a speed of fifteen miles

per hour.
6. Any officer or non-commissioned officer of the Royal New Zealand Ar Force in uniform is authorized to stop and detain traffic on the said station and airport for the purpose of ascertaining whether the use of any vehicle constitutes a breach or is in contravention of these by-laws. The driver of any vehicle who fails to stop on demand or otherwise obstructs any such officer or non-commissioned officer will be deemed to be acting in breach or contravention of these by-laws.

7. Any person acting in breach or contravention of these by-laws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

German "Loss Assessments" and "Equalization of Burdens" Laws

THE Minister of External Affairs has been informed that under legislation recently enacted by the Federal German Republic (the Loss Assessment and Equalization of Burdens Laws) persons owning certain classes of property in West Germany or the Western Sectors of Berlin which suffered physical damage during the Second World War may make application for assessment of the extent of such damage as a preliminary to compensation. Damage must be in excess of 500 RM, except in the case of household goods, and applications must be submitted before 18 August 1953. Application forms and information concerning the interpretation or operation of these laws may be obtained from the authorities of the Parish (Gemeinde) in which the property was located or from the nearest German representative overseas. In the case of New Zealand applicants this would be the German Embassy, Sydney.
