may be discharged from their ships or from the Reserve by order of the Naval Board.

“ (2) Officers who, while undergoing training or service in H.M.N.Z. ships or establishments or at any other time, are considered by the Naval Board to be unsuitable for retention in the Reserves on grounds of—

- “ (d) Being unsatisfactory as regards their physical fitness, but not by reason of irregular or intemperate habits; or
- “ (e) Being unsatisfactory as regards incompatibility of temperament or other defects, not amounting to misconduct and not caused by irregular or intemperate habits,—

may be placed on the Retired List, irrespective of age or service, by order of the Naval Board.

“ (3) The reason for discharge or retirement shall in every case be communicated to the officer.”
