NOBEL PEACE PRIZE

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th 1954, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Council of the International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University professors of Political Science and of Law, of History, and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, § 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to § 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, qualified persons are requested to apply to the Office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Oslo.

The Sharebrokers Act 1908—Amendments to the Rules of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand

HIS Excellency the Governor-General in Council has been pleased to approve the following amendments to the rules of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand.

AMENDMENTS TO RULES

That Rule 2 be amended by adding thereto the following proviso:

"The President may in his discretion appoint or request his Exchange to appoint a member of such Exchange to act as a substitute delegate in his stead at any meeting of which he, the President, is Chairman, and such substitute delegate shall for the duration only of that meeting have the same rights of speaking and voting as if he had been appointed a delegate by the members of the Exchange. In the event of such appointment, the President shall exercise only his personal casting vote."

That Rule 23 be amended to read as follows:

"(23) Anything in these Rules to the contrary notwithstanding, an Executive shall be appointed at each Annual Meeting. Such Executive for the year next following each Annual Meeting shall consist of the President elected at such Annual Meeting and one member of each of the Metropolitan Exchanges.

In the event of any member so elected being unwilling or unable to act (as to which the Committee of the Association shall be the sole judge) the Metropolitan Exchange the member of which is so unwilling or unable to act shall appoint another of its members in the place of such first-mentioned member."

That Rule 46 be amended by repealing the existing Rule 46 and substituting therefor the following Rule:

"46. (1) The rates of brokerage for the whole of the affiliated Exchange shall be:

BROKERAGE

(a) *Bonds Debenture and Debenture Stock—*

On New Zealand Government Stock and Debentures	½ per cent.
On Stock and Debentures of Other Government and Local Bodies	½ per cent.
On all other Stock and Debentures	1¼ per cent.
On Company Bonds (not secured Debentures)	1½ per cent.

(In the above cases only the brokerage shall be calculated on the nominal value, and if the date of maturity is within twelve months of the date of the sale, then the brokerage shall be one-half the above rates.)

(b) *Shares and Stock (Listed)—*

On all shares up to 6d.	¼d. per share.
On all shares over 6d. and up to 2s.	¾d. per share.
On all shares over 2s. and up to 5s.	1d. per share.
On all shares over 5s. and up to 11s.	2d. per share.
On all shares over 11s.	1½ per cent.

(The brokerage under this and subsequent subsections is calculated on actual sale price and not on nominal value.)

(c) *Shares, Stock, Bonds, Debentures, and Debenture Stock (Unlisted)—*

Listed brokerage rates plus 33⅓rd per cent.

(d) *Syndicate Shares—*

On Syndicate Shares 2½ per cent.

(e) *Rights to New Issues.—*The Executive shall be empowered to fix a rate of brokerage in respect of any particular issue or issues, but unless so fixed the rate shall be:

To *Sellers*: The brokerage shall be double the above rates on the sale price of the Rights.

To *Buyers*: The brokerage shall be at the rates as set out in subsections (a), (b), and (c) above on the purchase price of the rights plus the amount required to be paid to the Company to convert the rights into transferable shares.

(2) In any case in which brokerage calculated in accordance with the provisions of the preceding section of this Rule is less than 5s. then a brokerage of 5s. may be charged.

(3) The above rates in respect of sales of Shares, Stock, Debentures, and of Debenture Stock already issued are in all cases chargeable to both buyer and seller.

(4) Subject to the provisions of Rule 81 (b), all Stamp Duty and Transfer fees shall be paid by the purchaser."

That Rule 53 be amended by adding thereto the following words: "A member may not act as principal for the purpose of evading these Rules, nor adopt any other procedure or a like purpose".

That Rule 123 be amended by deleting from the second paragraph thereof the words: "At any time within the period of five years immediately preceding the sending of any such communication as aforesaid".

Price Order No. 1484 (*Laying Mash and Chick Mash*)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1917, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order :

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1484, and shall come into force on the 31st day of July 1953.
2. (1) Price Orders Nos. 1318,* 1339†, and 1378‡ are hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.
3. In this Order :
 - “ Auckland Metropolitan Area ” means the City of Auckland, the Boroughs of Birkenhead, Devonport, Ellerslie, Mount Albert, Mount Eden, Mount Roskill, Mount Wellington, New Lynn, Newmarket, Northcote, Onehunga, One Tree Hill, Otahuhu, and Takapuna, and the Road District of Panmure Township.
 - “ Wellington Metropolitan Area ” means the Cities of Wellington and Lower Hutt, the Boroughs of Eastbourne and Petone, and the district known as Stokes Valley.
 - “ Christchurch Metropolitan Area ” means the City of Christchurch and the Boroughs of Riccarton and Lyttelton.
 - “ Dunedin Metropolitan Area ” means the City of Dunedin and the Boroughs of Green Island, Port Chalmers, St. Kilda, and West Harbour.
 - “ Standard mash ” means laying mash or chick mash that has been manufactured to conform to the formula set out in the First Schedule to this Order.
 - “ Merchant ” means a person who in the customary course of his business sells mash both to retailers and to consumers, and with respect to sales made by a manufacturer to a retailer or to a consumer, includes a manufacturer.
 - “ Retailer ” means a person who sells mash only to consumers.
 - “ Ton ” means 2,000 lb.
 - “ Bushel ” means 20 lb.
 - The expression “ f.o.r. ” means “ free on rail ”, and the expression “ f.o.b. ” means “ free on board ”.
 - “ Delivered ” means delivered to the premises of the purchaser.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies with respect to any poultry food sold as mash in New Zealand.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF MASH TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Manufacturers' Prices

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any manufacturer carrying on business at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any standard mash to which this Order applies, shall be the appropriate price specified in the said Schedule, and with respect to any other mash, shall be the appropriate price fixed for No. 1 laying mash or No. 1 chick mash (as the case may be) reduced at the rate of £7 per ton, unless a special approved price is in force with respect to such mash.
- (2) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any manufacturer carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any mash to which this Order applies, shall be the price that may be charged by the manufacturer carrying on business at the nearest specified place increased by the amount of the freight charges that would have been incurred had the mash been conveyed at current rates from such nearest place to the premises of the manufacturer.
- (3) The prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are fixed as for delivery at the premises of the manufacturer.

Merchants' Prices

6. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any merchant carrying on business at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any standard mash to which this Order applies, shall be the appropriate price specified in the said Schedule, and with respect to any other mash, shall be the appropriate price fixed for No. 1 laying mash or No. 1 chick mash (as the case may be) reduced at the rate of £7 per ton, unless a special approved price is in force with respect to such mash.
- (2) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any merchant carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any mash to which this Order applies, shall be the price that may be charged by the merchant carrying on business at the nearest specified place increased by the amount of any freight charges actually incurred between the place of purchase and the merchant's store.

Retailers' Prices

7. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer carrying on business at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any standard mash to which this Order applies, shall be the appropriate price specified in the said Schedule, and with respect to any other mash, shall be the appropriate price fixed for No. 1 laying mash or No. 1 chick mash (as the case may be) reduced at the rate of £7 per ton, unless a special approved price is in force with respect to such mash.
- (2) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any mash to which this Order applies, shall be the price that may be charged by the retailer carrying on business at the nearest specified place increased by the appropriate proportion of any freight charges actually incurred between the place of purchase into the retailer's store.

GENERAL

8. (1) The prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order are fixed with respect to mash packed in sacks of the following sizes : 48 in. by 23 in., 46 in. by 23 in., and 41 in. by 23 in.
- (2) Where any mash is packed in sacks or bags of any other size the said prices shall be reduced by 7s. 6d. per ton.
- (3) The prices fixed by this Order are net and include the cost of the sacks or bags.

PROVISION FOR SPECIAL PRICES

9. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any manufacturer, merchant, or retailer, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any mash to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the manufacturer, merchant, or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of mash, or may relate generally to all mash to which this Order applies sold by the manufacturer, merchant, or retailer while the approval remains in force.

10. Where the price computed in accordance with the provisions of this Order is, in the case of a manufacturer or merchant, not an exact number of pence, it may be computed to the next upward penny, and where, in the case of a retailer, it is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, it may be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

DUTY IMPOSED ON VENDORS OF MASH

11. Every vendor of mash to which this Order applies shall state in the appropriate invoice relating to the sale the kind of mash to which the sale relates, that is to say, whether it is No. 1 or No. 2 laying mash, No. 1 or No. 2 chick mash, or mash that is other than standard mash.
