Note.—At stations where departures from normal are in parentheses, the temperature record has been maintained for less than ten years, the rainfall record for less than twenty years. Rainfall normals have been revised and now refer to the standard period 1921-50. Where observations are not available for the whole period, or where the site of the rain-gauge has been changed, the normals are partly interpolated.

Notes on the Weather for August 1953

General—August was a cloudy and mild month, and it was particularly wet for northern districts of both Islands. In eastern districts of the North Island lambing commenced under rather favourable conditions. In most other districts stock were wintering well, but in many parts of Northland the ground was waterlogged and feed was short.

On the 17th several small tornadoes caused local damage in Auckland, Waikato, and Taranaki. In Marlborough heavy rains fell on three occasions, and by the 27th large slips blocked the railway and main roads.

Rainfall—Rainfall was above normal in northern and eastern districts of the South Island, in Central Taranaki, and over most of the Auckland province. There was a substantial surplus in the lower Waimea Valley, in the far north, and on the Kaikoura coast; in the two latter districts is was the wettest August for over thirty years.

A few places had less than half the average rainfall, including the Manawatu and Rangitikei districts and the area between Napier and Gisborne.

Temperature—In eastern districts of both Islands and in the far south temperatures were about normal. Elsewhere August was considerably warmer than usual, especially in Westland and the far north.

Falls of snow to low levels were reported in Grey Valley, Westland, on the 18th and in south-western Southland on the 19th. Exceptionally heavy snow in the Alps on the 13th caused power failures in Westland.

Sunshine—August was a little sunnier than usual for Gisborne, southern Hawke's Bay, and Wairarapa; elsewhere sunshine was below normal. The deficit was about an hour a day or more in the far north, and over most of the South Island except on the Southland coast and in coastal districts north of Ashburton, where it was somewhat less.

Weather Sequence—At the end of July an anticyclone centred to the east covered the whole country. Pressure still remained comparatively high for the first few days of August, but scattered rain was reported on the 1st and 2nd, mainly associated with the slow north-eastward passage of a weak

Following the formation of a very shallow depression west of Nelson on the 3rd, considerable rain occurred in northern districts of both islands. There were several particularly heavy falls in the far north, and some roads were flooded. On the 5th and 6th scatterred light rain persisted in Northland, but elsewhere the weather was fair. For the next five days westerly conditions prevailed. Eastern districts received very little rain, and there were some fair intervals elsewhere, except on the West Coast, where the weather continued unsettled with frequent rain throughout this period.

the weather continued unsettled with frequent rain throughout this period.

During the passage of a depression across the North Island on the 13th and 14th rain became general, except in the far south-west. There were substantial falls in northern and eastern districts of both Islands, accompanied in most of these areas with winds of gale force. A temporary return to westerly conditions caused a clearance in eastern districts on the 15th and in most other areas on the 16th.

Rain became general again as a depression moved across the country on the 17th and 18th, and a north-easterly gale caused some damage in Auckland. Two weak troughs of low pressure then brought rain, mainly to the central provinces and the far south. By the 21st an anticyclone covered the whole country. Showers persisted in parts of Westland and Northland, but elsewhere fair weather predominated until the 25th. 25th.

A complex depression which had formed in the south Tasman Sea then moved north-eastward. During its slow passage across Northland from the 25th to the 28th, there

passage across Northland from the 25th to the 28th, there were heavy rains in the eastern part of this district, and also in Auckland. The easterly winds associated with the depression also brought heavy rain to parts of Canterbury and to Marlborough. Elsewhere rain was confined mainly to coastal districts, and the far south was not affected.

With an anticyclone centred to the east, fair or fine weather prevailed in many districts for the last three days of the month. Over the northern half of the North Island, however, there was further rain associated with the approach of a depression from the Queensland coast, and some heavy falls were again reported in Northland and Coromandel. In Westland, too, the weather remained unsettled on account of the passage of a deep depression far to the south-west.

Board of Trade Notice No. 73—Public Inquiry into Import Duties on Pipes, etc.

1. The Board of Trade proposes to inquire into and report upon the question of what rates of import duty should be imposed under the following tariff items:

Tariff Item 216: Drainage-pipes, drainage-tiles, conduit-pipes, and chimney pots, of earthenware, concrete, or similar materials.

 (5) Knees, bends, elbows, junction or inspection boxes including covers therefor, and other

including covers therefor, and other fittings, n.e.i., for pipes, piping, tubes, or tubing, viz.:

(a) Of brass or other copper alloy.

(b) Of cast iron for rain-water, soil, and similar pipes.

(6) Knees, bends, elbows, junction or inspection boxes including covers therefor, and other fittings, n.e.i., for any of the above-mentioned pipes, piping, tubes, or tubing, shall be classed under the same item of the Tariff as the pipes, piping, tubes, and tubing for which they are fittings.

Price Order No. 1492 (Tires and Tubes Imported into New Zealand)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following Price Order:

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1492, and shall come into force on the 2nd day of October 1953.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

2. This Order applies with respect to all new tires and new tubes imported into New Zealand of the kind described in the Schedule

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES OF GOODS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wholesalers' Prices

3. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received at any place in New Zealand by any wholesaler for any tires or tubes to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price specified in the Schedule hereto.
(2) The maximum wholesale prices specified in the said Schedule shall be reduced by a discount equal to 5 per cent thereof where payment

is made on or before the 20th day of the calendar month next following the calendar month in which delivery is made by the wholesaler.

(3) The maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are exclusive of sales tax.

Fixing Special Prices for Sales to Local Authorities

- 4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum price that may be charged or received by any person for any tires or tubes to which this Order applies sold to a local authority shall be the appropriate wholesale price (including discount) specified in the Schedule hereto increased by an amount equal to:

 - (a) 22.5 per cent in the case of car and motor-cycle tires;
 (b) 21.0 per cent in the case of truck, bus, low-loading, trailer, and electric truck tires;
 (c) 23.5 per cent in the case of tubes; and

 - (d) 21-0 per cent in the case of tractor, grader, earth-mover, implement, and industrial tires where such tires are subject to sales tax, and 1-0 per cent where such tires are exempt from sales tax.
 - (2) The maximum price fixed in the preceding subclause is inclusive of sales tax where applicable and is not subject to any discount.

Retailers' Prices

- 5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum price that may be charged or received at any place in New Zealand by a retailer for any tires or tubes to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price specified in the Schedule hereto.

 (2) With respect to tires the maximum prices specified in the said Schedule shall be reduced by the amount of the discount specified in the Schedule where payment is made in cash or on or before the 20th day of the calendar month next following the calendar month in which delivery is made by the retailer.

 (3) With respect to tubes the maximum prices specified in the said Schedule are not subject to any discount.

 (4) With respect to car tires the maximum prices fixed as aforesaid are inclusive of the cost of fitting the tires.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

6. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorize special prices in respect of any tires or tubes to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of tires or tubes or may relate generally to all tires or tubes to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.
